Move Asked

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 15 (AP)—Negro integration leader Martin Luther King, Jr., charged with parading without a permit during segregation protests, today asked that his trial be moved from local to federal jurisdiction. King's attorneys argued during a closed hearing in city recorder's court that the Atlanta integration leader could not receive a fair trial in the city court. Their request to move the trial to federal court automatically halted the city court trial pending a federal hearing on whether to take jurisdiction on King's case and those of similar cases pending.

Estes Gets 15-Year Sentence in Court

EL PASO, Tex., April 15 (UPI)—U. S. Dist. Judge R. S. Thomason sentenced "bankrupt-fertilizer-king" Billie Sol Estes to 15 years in prison today for committing small fraud and conspiracy "in one of the most gigantic swindles in the history of our country." The 83-year-old Estes took it calmly. "I have not entered in a conspiracy and have not intended to defraud anyone," Estes said in the first words he uttered in his small fraud and conspiracy trial. A jury of 10 men and two women convicted him of four counts of mail fraud and one of conspiracy March 23 in a trial that lasted almost three weeks. He was acquitted on nine other counts of fraud.

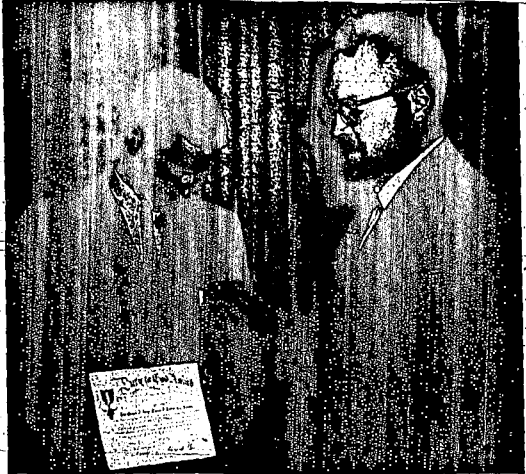

Leaders Eye Policy for Arab Nations

CAIRO, April 15 (AP)— Arab diplomats today prepared an official statement on the Arab Republics for the new United Arab Republic merging Egypt, Syria and Iraq.

As Subh, chairman of the Egyptian executive council, said last night agreement had been reached on basic constitutional arrangements. He said the principles would be published tomorrow.

The new state of 38 million people will have united armed forces and a single foreign policy, and is certain to result in a power re-alignment in the turbulent Middle East.

Iraq officials termed the union one of the most important events in Arab history. They predicted it would lead to eventual union of all Arab nations.

Baby disclosed no details about the constitutional arrangements, but authoritative sources said there would be a two-chamber federal parliament and a general pattern of the U. S. federal system.

Agreement on the principles was reached during a two and a half hour meeting yesterday, the eighth day of negotiations among the three countries. The talks were started following revolts in Syria and Iraq earlier this year by followers of Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

Informed sources said the agreement provides for a nine-member presidential council, with three members from each nation, with Nasser presiding.

The federal government will consist of one house of 180 members with equal representation for all three states in the federation, and another house with one member for each 60,000 persons from each state, the source said.

Syrian Cultural Minister Sami al Guntul said the talks had achieved full agreement on all points of the federation.

No Poison

NEW YORK, April 15 (AP)— Tests of almost 9,000 cans of Tuna salad have produced no signs of contaminated fish, according to the city health department.

More than 2,000 inspectors scoured shelves in about 2,700 stores and restaurants Friday after an announcement that after some brands of the fish were suspected of being salmonella type 2—a deadly poison.

Two Detroit women died last month after eating contaminated tuna. A number of persons here reported eating the same brand but they have been taken ill, according to the department.

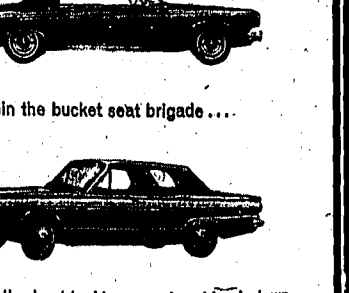

Eden Takes Full Responsibility For Suez Crisis

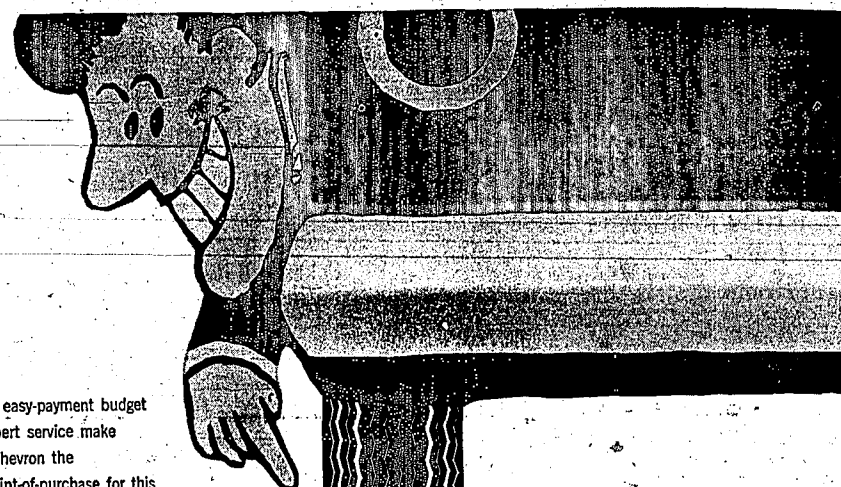
