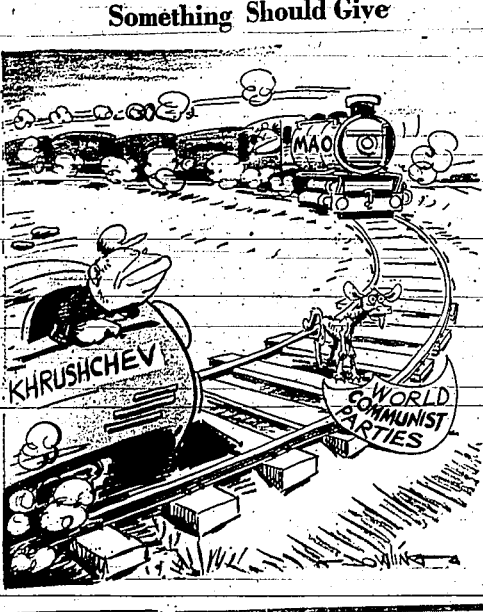

NEW YORK, July 22.—Quas what happens to children who nibble erasers.

They get eraserophagia, that's what. The new disease, eraser nibbling, was spotted recently by radiologists at a dental clinic with X-rays eye. Seems the eraser fragments aren't excreted.

Dr. J. L. Curry and W. A. Howland, Wheeling, Va., saw evidence on X-rays of school children.

To prove that seeing's believing, they first ate an eraser, then took X-ray picture of themselves, duplicating the results.

Reporting to the American College of Radiology, the doctors said the disease was spotted only when children stop eating erasers.

The odd report in the annals of radiology is just one of many fascinating incidental findings.

In a report on such findings, Dr. John L. McClellan, of the College of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, Philadelphia, said:

"In a report to recognize and report unexpected findings in a conventional search has been made of the upper part of the stomach, and there are few talents of more value to the doctor and his patients."

CHAMPION NICKLAUS WINS PGA CROWN

30-Foot Putt Is Key to Breaking Three-Way Jam

DALLAS, July 22 (AP)—Jack Nicklaus, his drowsy utterance with a roar, broke a three-way log jam with a 30-foot-ooter on the 69th hole Sunday and won the 1965 Professional Golfers association championship with a final round 68 for 279. The 210-pound Columbus, O., heavyweight at the age of 29 became the fourth man in golfing history to win the three major American championships—the Masters, Open and PGA. Only Gene Sarazen, Byron Nelson and Ben Hogan reached this goal before him.

Fighting an uphill battle against Australia's Bruce Crampton, the 64-hole leader, and Jimmy Davis—Buckley, Clinton, 75—Nicklaus broke the split and back of his rivals with his magnificent 30-foot putt on the 69th hole Sunday.

Moments later, Ragan, playing a hole ahead of the new champion, hit his drive behind a television tower and had to lift the ball over the steel framework. The shot flew over the green. He took a bogey 5 and finished with 69 for two shots back.

Playing cautiously after that, he parred the 70th and 71st and then scrambled to par 4 on the 72nd after driving into the rough and pitching out safely near the pond that fronts the clubhouse. The crowd roared about 700 yards within three feet of the cup and he holed it for his par.

Crampton, who clung to his lead through the 66th hole of the 72-hole route over the 7,000-acre Dan T. Dillman Athletic club course, finally three-putted the 70th after a 200-yard gambol for his birdie. He finished with 69 for 282 after carrying a two-rodge lead into the final round.
