The bullet was fired from the rear of a 1961 Ford pickup truck which was parked in the south of Hagerman. No wallet was on Harold, but Gooding county authorities described Harold to George Eide, Hagerman, owner of the truck, by telephone, and he identified Harold as the employee from the description.

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., July 23—Democratic Gov. Albert D. Rosellini of Washington temporarily sidetracked today a Republican effort to force action on civil rights by the 15th annual governors' conference. Rosellini, presiding as conference chairman, ruled out of order a motion by Gov. Mark O. Hatfield of Oregon to suspend the rules for the introduction of a civil rights resolution. Because of the scheduled arrival of Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson, the principal speaker at tonight's state banquet, Rosellini said there was no time at the session to act on Hatfield's motion.

Class of '43 Has Meeting At Hagerman

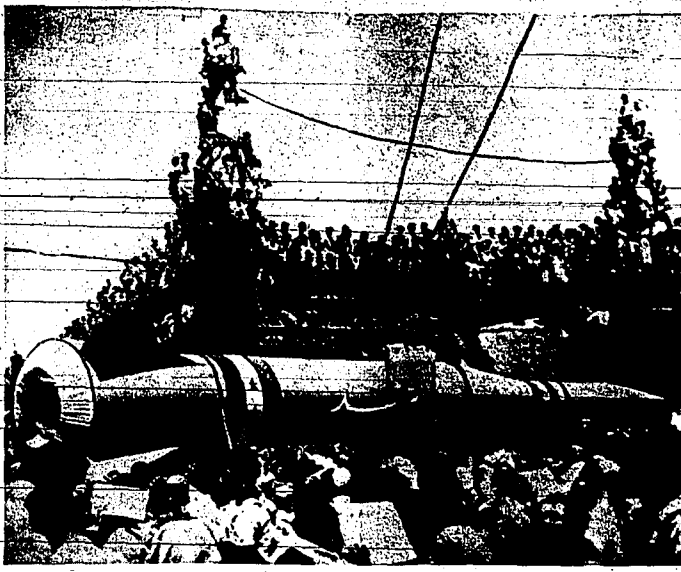

New 2-Stage Rocket Shown By Nasser, Sub Trials Set

CAIRO, July 23 — President Gamal Abdel Nasser today displayed a new two-stage rocket with a claimed range of 200 miles. He also announced that sea trials of the first Egyptian-built submarine will begin within 15 days. Four of the new two-stage rockets were displayed at the military parade marking the 11th anniversary of the overthrow of King Farouk. Also displayed were six new long-range ballistic rockets believed to be Soviet SA2 models. It was announced that the new "Vanguard" rocket has a range greater than anything produced in the United Arab Emirates. This would make it outside the single-stage Kahrer rocket displayed last year. It is claimed to have a range of about 350 miles.

Aide Believes Trouble Is Aggravated

WASHINGTON, July 23 — A defense department official suggested today that South Vietnam's religious troubles have been aggravated by out-power Vietnamese politicians. The Pentagon official, recently back from a tour of the combined Southeast Asian country, said the dispute between the Buddhists and the Catholic-dominated government has not yet hindered the U.S.-supported military effort against communist guerrillas. But he said it might have an effect, if it continues. "Misgovernment and dissidents saw this as an opportunity to keep the pot boiling," the official told reporters. He asked to remain anonymous. The defense official said the religious problems are concentrated mainly in cities such as Saigon rather than in the rural areas where the bulk of Viet Nam's 14 million people live. He challenged estimates that 80 per cent of the country's population is Buddhist.

Soviets Will Keep Mum On U.S. Spy

MOSCOW, July 23 (AP) — The Russians today were expected to keep mum about the latest defection of a U.S. intelligence employee until they can exploit his propaganda value in a press conference. Victor Norris, Hamilton, 44, naturalized American of Arab extraction, defected to Moscow yesterday through the government newspaper. He said he sought political asylum in Moscow because he was "outraged" by U.S. espionage activities in Washington and the Middle East. An "open letter" indicated that Hamilton informed communist officials of elaborate U.S. monitoring systems in the Mediterranean area. He was the third U.S. intelligence employee to go behind the iron curtain in as many years. In Washington, the defense department said Hamilton was let out of the national security agency—NSA—four years ago because he was "outraged" by U.S. espionage activities in Washington and the Middle East. He was an analyst in 1957, but that he had "no knowledge" of American codes. Two other NSA employees, William H. Martin and Herman E. Mitchell, defected to Moscow in 1952, reportedly because of their disgust with U.S. spy methods. Martin later married a Russian girl but told a Western newspaper he was "disillusioned" with communist life. The U.S. embassy in Moscow refused an initial request on Hamilton. But an initial flurry of publicity was expected to be followed by a long period of silence until the Soviets announce a press conference for him. Martin and Mitchell were recruited to newsmen two months after they defected.

MIAMI BEACH, July 23 (AP)—Supporters of Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller for the Republican presidential nomination today feel he has won a "new breath of life" as the National Governor's conference opened here.

Rockefeller has been the main attraction at the conference and is looked upon as the spokesman for the 16 Republican governors. Even his first round defeat in the civil rights fight won him top floor status.

His new wife "Happy" were given the loudest applause by a crowd watching the state chief executives and their ladies enter a floor show.

"It's just like campaigning," Rockefeller's wife said. "It looks like a new breath of life."

Private polls of the GOP governors, however, indicate Rockefeller has a "long, hard fight" ahead of him if he is to win the party's nomination next year.

Mike E. Odell, R, Spokane, made the statement Monday in a hot retort to a resolution passed by the state Democratic central committee Sunday.

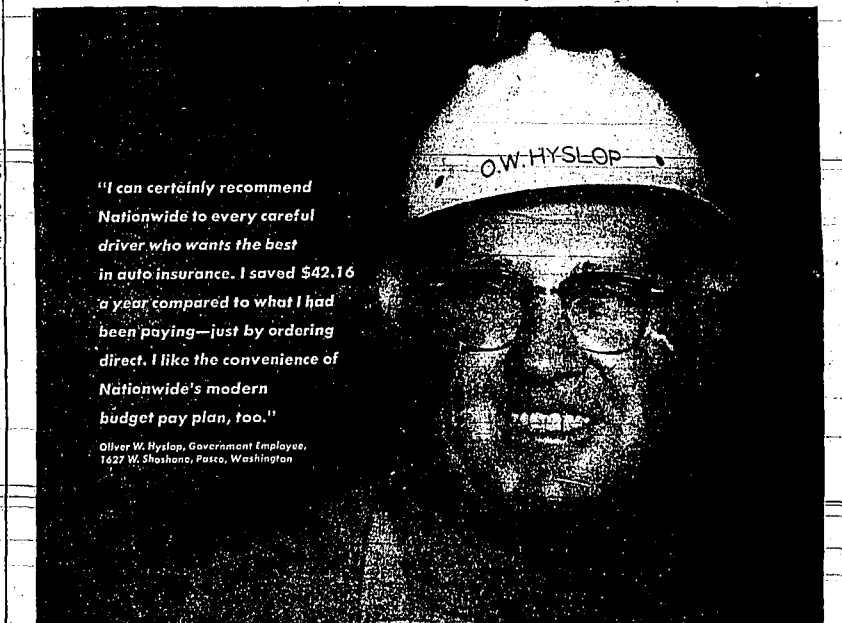

WASHINGTON, July 22 (AP)—Chairman Edwin E. Willis of the House committee on defense and armaments control today called for stiffer rules at the national security agency.

"I would like to thank Dr. Robert Bennett of Detroit for arranging out my hand. It looked like there might be another postponement. Dr. Bennett flew out from Detroit and fixed me up."

On attendant explained it was really the left glove and not the left hand that saved Liston.

"He got hit because he did not move."

"Asked whether he would advise the Patterson to retire, D'Amato said:

"He should continue as long as he has an interest in boxing. The moment he loses the interest, he should quit."

There had been only five quickie knockouts in the long and storied history of the "heavyweight championship. Liston's 2:10 last year was the third fastest."
