

De Gaulle Says France Won't Sign Ban Pact

PARIS, July 29 (AP)—President Charles de Gaulle said today that France will not sign the Moscow agreement on nuclear testing above ground, in space or under water. De Gaulle said that since France would never be a party to such a nonaggression pact would be meaningless. The president was referring to proposals advanced by the Russians in their recent talks with the United States and Britain—that the limited nuclear test ban treaty by the three powers be extended to a European nonaggression pact. Premier Khrushchev has publicly asked for it, and de Gaulle has said that France has agreed to take up this subject with their allies.

SEOUL, July 29 (AP)—North Korean troops killed two American soldiers and wounded another today in a dawn ambush in the demilitarized zone about 20 miles from Seoul, the U. N. command announced. Col. George Creel, U. N. command spokesman, said the Reds launched "a vicious and unprovoked attack" as they rode in a jeep to a guard post near Chongyong-dong. Creel said the American soldiers were hit by machine-gun fire and grenades which apparently came from seven ambush positions just inside the demilitarized zone.

COEUR D'ALENE, July 29 (AP)—Three juveniles worked overtime Sunday to handle the case of 80 youths arrested during disturbances on Coeur d'Alene main street as a result of a gas and fire hose Saturday night.

The youths, many from out of town, were taken from a group of 450 on charges of disturbing the peace, picking up liquor, causing a riot and other offenses.

Saturday night's disturbances, which police Chief Helme Schmitt labeled a major disturbance "a riot," was caused by a portion of the estimated 10,000 youths who were expected to attend the annual Diamond Club boat race. Most of those arrested were from out of town.

When the students crowded onto the main street and failed to move in an orderly fashion, officers "bowed" tear gas bombs along the street and ordered the youths to disperse. Schmitt said everything was under control and family calm will be restored within hours.

There was little damage in the downtown area but some benches and fountains were broken. A city park, the chief said, was in decided contrast to the last week's riot. Some benches were broken and streets littered with debris as police battled for hours to control the youths.

"There were more here than ever," Schmitt said, "but we think they got things under control quicker."

LONDON, July 29 (AP)—Premier Gamal Abdel Nasser says the United Arab Republic will join the partial nuclear test ban agreement initiated by the United States, Britain and the Soviet Union. Nasser is expected to announce his decision in the next few days.

Nasser told a student group in Cairo Sunday night he supports the test ban. He said he would call for more negotiations and a test ban agreement.

The U.S. and Israel join the test ban. The U.S. will ease a source of tension in the Middle East. They have accused each other of trying to develop nuclear weapons.

Medical Scientist Approves Wine as Effective Medicine

NEW YORK, July 29 (AP)—For some 4,000 years physicians have known wine could be effective medicine for many ills but only in the past 20 years or so have scientists understood some of the why and the how of it.

That's reason for both wonderment and hope to Dr. Salvatore P. Lucija who is a highly regarded medical scientist, a professor of medicine, and a conspicuous scientific friend of the wine.

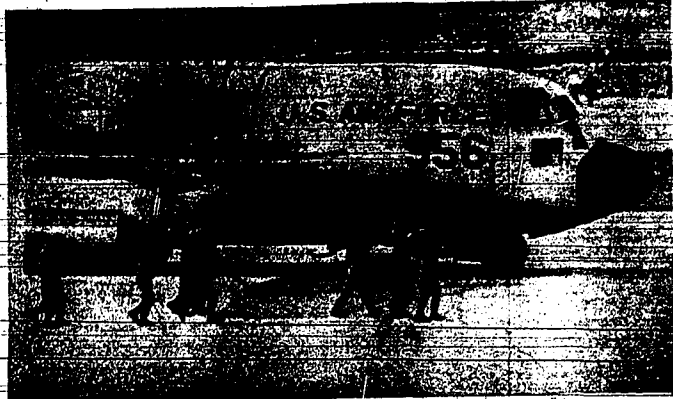

Scientists Wanted to Tell of Bomb

NEW YORK, July 29 (AP)—A group of scientists who developed the atomic bomb and Gen. George C. Marshall tried at the last moment to convince former President Harry S. Truman that Japan should be warned before the first atomic bomb was dropped on the country, it was disclosed yesterday.

The group of 23 scientists was led by Leo Szilard, a brilliant Hungarian physicist, who helped engineer the nation's first controlled atomic chain reaction.

The disclosure appears this week in the current issue of Look magazine.

(Truman, reached in Independence, Mo., refusing to comment on the article.)

The magazine said government files showed the position never got to Truman, who at the time was returning from the Potsdam conference with the British and the Russians.

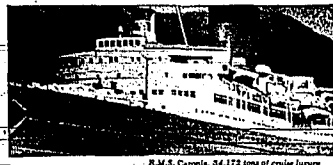
"Every effort should be made to keep our record of warning clear," said Marshall. "We must offset by such warning methods the opportunity which might follow from an ill-considered employment of such force."

President Truman, faced with one of the great moral decisions of human history, was denied access to the petitions of many American nuclear scientists who opposed the dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima without warning," the article said.

The petitions were given to Col. Kenneth D. Nichols, production chief of the Oak Ridge, Tennessee laboratory. He took them on July 25, 1945, (13 days before Hiroshima was bombed)—Major Gen. Leslie R. Brown, head of the atomic bomb program in Washington.
