West Coast Discontinues Burley Flight

BURLEY, July 31—West Coast Airlines has discontinued its service to the Butler-Salt Lake City flight, according to Theral Parish, manager for the airlines at the airport here. The West Coast is switching to Pan Am to replace the present DC-3 and the Burley airport committee has appointed him to accommodate the job, he said.

Last month 165 passengers headed at the Burley airport for Salt Lake City, and the Butler-Salt Lake City flight, Parish said, he believed people going to travel to Salt Lake City were flying to the airport at Twin Falls to board the flight. "Persons' 'washing' tickets" to Salt Lake City may purchase plane tickets to the airport circuit at the Hungry airport," Parish said.

Pan daily flights will be maintained by the airline, and fares are being added Thursday to compensate for the stopped flight to Salt Lake City.

Not Good Enough

If you talk to some political analysts, they will tell you that one of the big things about the American electorate today is that it is so much better-educated than it used to be the case a few decades back.

Everyone knows that a bigger share of U.S. young people finish high school and go to college—and that this constitutes a rising trend. Television, for all its foolishness, is seen as an important positive factor generally.

Yet these acknowledged advances can be misleading. For there are still 68 million Americans who have not finished high school. And, as the National Education Association observes in a study of undereducated adults, even high school graduates are losing jobs to machines.

A worse statistic, some 11 million persons 18 or over are "functional" illiterates who can't really learn marketable skills because they can't read and write as well as average fifth graders.

Admittedly, 450,000 men and women are completing their elementary or high school work in adult public school classes. More than 900,000 others take business, trade, industrial and technical courses.

The fact, however, is that these figures together represent a bit more than two per cent of the undereducated 68 million.

Thirty years ago, Educator Robert M. Hutchins was the center of a controversy over whether people could be educated best for life by pumping them full of information or by sending them in fundamental ideas they could apply to any practical situation. Hutchins favored the idealistic approach. But it was only a question of emphasis, since ideas can hardly exist apart from the great body of knowledge.

The point today would seem to be how many millions of Americans still lack the thinnest underpinning of knowledge, and the tools for its use. Without solid substance here, how can they hope to develop truly useful ideas?

Until these millions—nearly a third of our population—begin acquiring a better grounding in the fundamentals of education, they will be sorely limited in their efforts to be good parents, good workers and good citizens.

MIGHTY EXPENSIVE WORDS

"Without objection, so ordered." Those routine words, offered repeatedly each day from the presiding officer's chair in the United States House and Senate, signal permission to lawmakers to insert into the Congressional Record all manner of odds and ends which may have little to do with lawmaking.

Suddenly, one day not long ago, there was a roar of protest. There were, Wayne Hayes, One-Dollar Democrat. He decided it was time to hold the record to those things which really happen in Congress.

It could have meant an end to the iteration of countless speeches never delivered, as well as of a wide variety of self-serving material designed to impress the folks back home. All, of course, at the taxpayers' expense.

Hayes estimated the extra padding in the Record costs \$250,000 a year to print. That sounds conservative. But two and one-half million a decade is not small change, when the frivolous purpose is considered.

Hayes lost his battle. House members were enraged at leaving this choice outlet for their assorted nonsense.

He promises nevertheless to keep good track of the padding hereafter. It would be interesting to know, too, how the biggest Record-padders vote on measures for general economy in government.

LEFT FOOT FORWARD

The Swedish government has announced that the country will switch to driving on the right side of the road in 1967.

This leaves the British four years in which to mull over the fact that theirs will be the only country in Europe still driving on the left. While they have the weight of tradition on their side, it is one more area in which the British may feel they are being isolated from the continent.

One explanation for their custom is that in the old days, riders kept to the left in order to be able to use their swords to best advantage if they met with any obstacles on the highway.

British drivers, however, face another task, up by France and West Germany, to their entrance into the Common Market. If the British do eventually join with the others, or if the much-discussed channel tunnel is ever built, it is quite possible that British driving habits, along with many other more important things, will have to be changed.

In the meantime, however, they are keeping to the left with their sword arms free.

Draftees Are Brighter Boys Than During World War II

SHIRLETON, July 31—Draft standards have been higher than those—induced during World war II and Korea, the Pentagon's personnel experts believe.

Mental standards for industries were raised last May 1. But the trend toward more selectivity in the armed forces has been the reason why for several years. Soldiers have to be mentally sharper because the equipment they handle is more complex.

Since Korea, only the Army has used the draft. Asked how present draftees stack up against those of the past two wars, the answer is that they are better.

"On the average, the quality of draftees today is better than World war II and Korea because the mental standards in the induction are higher. Therefore, fewer lower mental category personnel can qualify for service. On the average, the quality of the lower category personnel are being induced today because of a smaller draft than in World war II and Korea."



Lack of Congressional Finesse Hurts New Frontier

It is President Kennedy's bad luck that Sam Rayburn died and that he was deemed necessary to succeed him.

Sam Johnson on the 1960 Democratic ticket to hold the Deep South.

"Mr. Sam" and Johnson were congressional leaders who knew their party could be ahead of the leadership in the 88th Congress. The Democratic party enjoys majorities in the house and Senate, and it is clear that the committees occupy the lead in power.

The President is in the White House. He is a Democrat. He has a majority in the New Frontier. His leadership and administration is unable to move the U.S. Senate on the Herschel Jensen bill.

Congress does not function much beyond the routine of convening, voting on bills, and passing legislation.

The President has complicated more than simplified the leadership problems of his legislative agenda. For example: There are three major Kennedy proposals, each with an A-1 priority.

They are tax reduction and reform, education, and railroad-strike legislation.

This is the seventh month of the 88th Congress. All but two of the committee presidents have been available. Fewer than half a dozen bills of any kind have been enacted by this first seven months of the President's term.

What is the problem? The President's record is excellent. He reported his achievement that he had got the country to moving again. If so, it is time he turned again.

He has given his attention to the Democratic leadership.

No economy or system of government or political administration is likely to be a great deal of ill-considered legislation.

It can long endure an absolute stagnation of public affairs. If there is to be progress, the nation with leadership. That invites attention now to the situation in Congress.

Democrats and Republicans

Republicans should be the last to forget that a lot and hope the 88th Congress will change considerably in the final weeks of this session. Then there will be a hurricane of legislative activity.

WASHINGTON, July 31—Mississippians, including a son of Mississippi Tuesday accused the Kennedy administration and Atty. Gen. Robert P. Kennedy of failing to do enough to stop racial violence and troubles throughout the country.



The resignation of Postmaster General J. Edward Day offers President Kennedy another opportunity to nominate a Negro to a post in the cabinet. Kennedy's first choice for that cabinet post may have been a Negro.


