U.S. Churches Asked to Aid Rights March

NEW YORK, Aug. 12 (AP)—The National Council of Churches has issued a call to all Protestant and Orthodox church leaders to assemble in Washington to support a civil rights demonstration.

The council said the purpose of this assembly shall be to demonstrate our solidarity in support of racial justice legislation and to witness to the fact that this is a national moral issue and not a regional problem.

The council said previously 40,000 people from member churches were expected to join the demonstration, which civil rights leaders said might draw some quarter of a million people.

Specimens of 25 out of 26 bald eagles tested by the fish and wildlife service contained DDT, frequently used to kill mosquitoes, the report said.

It said that "a marked lack of breeding success in coastal areas... has led some people to suspect that these areas, which are frequently treated for mosquito control, are producing contaminated fish that make up a large part of the eagles' diet."

The department said it is continuing its research into the effect of DDT on the declining eagle population.

The report said DDT was found in 75 per cent of 2,300 birds and mammals from 22 states and three Canadian provinces tested. It also said that 129 out of 220 broods tested were found to contain the chemical—also fish from different oceans of the world.

Commenting on the report, Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall said there were "glaring indications in knowledge about wildlife-life-pesticide relationships."

Udall urged passage of pending legislation to limit the 2.5-million-dollar ceiling on funds for the department's pesticide research program.

Author-Biologist Rachel Carson sparked the current concern over pesticide effects with publication of her book, "Silent Spring," in which she warned of the dangers from uncontrolled use of pest-controlling chemicals.

In June, Miss Carson asked a Senate subcommittee to consider strict control of aerial pesticide spraying as a first step toward dealing with contamination of the environment.

The Interior department report said "contamination of wild forms is widespread" in the United States, although 75 per cent of the country has never been treated with insecticide.

WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The "whirligig" of things passed a bill to coordinate government economic activities. It also authorized additional construction at the Philadelphia and Denver airports and a new promotion system for the coast guard.

Don't laugh at this. It was a pretty fair day's work for a congress which by the end of July had approved 147 bills and President Kennedy's legislative agenda. There have been 147 bills in the last session of the 86th congress, and three major bills—those extending legislation dealing with the debt limit, corporate and estate taxes and food stamps.

Meanwhile, congress still must act on what perhaps the most important legislative program in the last decade. It has had the Kennedy tax legislation since January. It is faced with a furious battle over the bill. It is the railroad reauthorization bill that the nation has been waiting for. The bill is the result of a compromise between the Kennedy administration and the House of Representatives. Wrong Slant

According to two separate accounts, a young Negro is reported to have told Attorney General Robert Kennedy that he felt no obligation to help liberate Cuba—it if should ever come to that—so long as the United States failed to assure the Negro full freedom.

It is said that the attorney general's reported shock at this statement produced an unbridgeable gap between him and a group of northern Negroes who was meeting in New York.

Though it is not an easy thing to do, we ought to try to take the young man's proposition out of its purely racial context and examine it for what it is.

He is saying that he will not support his country (a Cuban enterprise is only an example) so long as it denies Negroes with rights and privileges the federal courts have said were his.

By that reasoning, any individual American could argue that, at any time when he feels deprived of rights and privileges, he is free of duty to his nation. This might mean that a Negro, feeling individually or as a member of a racial, religious, foreign-born minority or other group.

Let's put it more bluntly: This amounts to saying that a nation still flawed by imperfections is owed nothing by its citizens if they happen to be affected by those flaws.

In a highly imperfect world, this is a seriously unreasonable proposition.

What if the argument were taken out of the realm of constitutional protections into, say, the economic sphere? What if millions of unemployed people were without work? They would not fight it, would they? They would demand, or respond to any other demands it may make.

Seldom if ever does any people or community or nation realize in full its purpose and ideals. But for community and for the life it would quickly disintegrate if we, as citizens, were to say we would not fulfill our obligations unless all was perfect.

WASTEBASKET MATERIAL

As a group, this country's newspapers try hard to present the news in good balance. Generally they are credited with airing all sides of important issues.

Yet in this age of rising clamor from extremists, many liberal and conservative journals find themselves under attack. Schools, colleges and other disseminators of information also fall under this attack.

One of the most common complaints is: "They don't present our side."

Now, to the listener who did not know what the extremists' stock in trade is, this complaint might have the ring of plausibility.

But a great deal of what passes for "solid information" among the ultras is a tapestry of untruth, distortion and imagination.

Except as an oddity representing this kind of thinking, the newspaper can print such stuff without abandoning its standards of reliability and opening itself to charges of slander and libel.

No school or college could teach such things except, again, as curious examples of a phenomenon. The cost of such a program would be too high.

For example, no self-respecting purveyor of information would assert that a high Russian officer commands a U. N. world police force. There is no such force.

But that foreign troops are training in the American South in preparation for conquest of this nation.

These are the fancies of the far right. The far left feeds in equally sinister delusions.

Conscientious Americans have enough to do trying to fathom the difficult issues of the age without wasting their mental energies on fabrications and foolishness.

That is why the responsible press gives them their proper place—in the wastebasket.

Eight months ago my husband and I managed to escape. I meant leaving a large family home and garden where we had spent 24 happy married years. I meant leaving behind almost everything we owned, including the worthless sentimental things, my husband's treasures, 13-year-old children, and friends with whom we shared hard and unforgettable years.

But we read every few days of the dangers people run to escape. They speak the Berlin wall as a wall of bullets. They swim the sea, they crawl through tunnels that might cave at any moment or run across mine fields that could blow them up at any step. Some are killed by communist border guards.

What drives people to gamble their lives in order to leave their homes? It might sound strange to American ears, but I'm sure the chief reason is the longing for freedom to think and do what one wants. The simple freedoms that Americans take for granted are worth a life to many East Germans.

It is simply that after a while you can't breathe any more. You are too restricted. Your ideas count for nothing if they do not fit the official line.

Hospitality of Spain Toward Reds May End

MADRID, Aug. 12 (U-P)—Spain's hostility toward the Soviet Union, a fact of international life for more than 25 years, may be ending, diplomatic sources said today.

Ever since Generalissimo Francisco Franco defeated the communist-led "Republican" forces in the Spanish civil war, Spain has had no diplomatic relations with Moscow. The nation still considers the most anti-communist in western Europe.

But the sources noted several changes in recent months. These changes, they said, coupled with the Sino-Soviet ideological conflict and recent Soviet peace overtures to the West, may enable Spain to tone down its traditional hostility.

The changes range from the sending of a basketball team to Moscow—the first Spanish sports mission to the Soviet Union since 1930—to the prime minister's moderate reports on Russian life and politics.

Two-Spanish-American, including the director, Carlos Senia, of the Spanish National News Agency (ENP), traveled to Moscow for the first time in 1951 to cover the European basketball tournament finals. Their reports were widely reprinted by the Spanish press.
