Haiti Force Labor to Expel Exiles

PORT-AU PRINCE, Haiti, Aug. 19 (UPI) — Reinforced government troops were reported pressing a drive against rebels who had been driven out of the northeast mountain area around Mont Orgueil near the Haiti-Dominican border.

French troops were also sent out of the capital's commercial airport Saturday and Sunday. The highway north was jammed with trucks filled with militia units.

A rebel spokesman in Santo Domingo claimed fresh triumphs over Gen. Leon Cantave, invading force.

The rebels claimed that before pulling out of Mont Orgueil, they had driven out a government force and shot down one of the government's two operational Mustang fighter planes.

Unofficial reports in Port au Prince said the rebels' planes had not returned from a reconnaissance flight over Mont Orgueil Saturday.

The second band of rebels into Haiti two weeks ago will bring the aim of bringing down the dictatorship of President Francois Chirac. He failed to rally enough popular support to attack tacks on major cities and his forces took to the mountains to begin a guerrilla campaign.

Official sources acknowledged that Duvalier's forces are having trouble handling the situation in the northeast.

News Around Idaho

BOISE, Aug. 19—Delegates from throughout Idaho and Washington are expected to arrive in Boise this week for the annual state convention of the National Council of Negroes. Solons View Coming March For Rights and Get Nervous

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19—Marchers on Washington for "rights and freedom" would serve, he added, "as a powerful but uncoordinated protest to the enemies of civil rights to delay or scuttle the pending legislation."

They fear that one incident, enough to cause a disturbance on Aug. 26, could turn the march into a giant bazaar and bring incalculable damage to the cause.

Among the supporters of the march on Washington for "jobs and freedom" are Sen. Paul Douglas, D-Ill., Rep. John Connelly, D-Calif., Rep. George H. Mahon, D-N.Y., and Sen. Jacob Javits, R-N.Y., three of the most active civil rights backers in Congress.

Javits has called Aug. 26 "a historic day" and Kasing has labeled the march "an American cause." But in their statements, they have warned repeatedly against violence.

"I know clearly that the whole cause could be very seriously hurt," Javits said. "I believe violence can be disastrous. If there's even bad taste."

At another time, Javits warned there are "a couple dangers" in the march on Washington.

Javits, who feels that march leaders are seeking every possible precedent to give themselves a free hand, said, "I hope to participate, plan to attend the ceremony at the Lincoln memorial."

His warnings against possible violence were urgently given by Douglas recently to a delegation from the National Association of Colored People (NAACP).

Kasing said yesterday "any incident or outbreak of violence could be disastrous. We mustn't do anything that can do damage to the civil rights cause."

OAS Is Seen From Two Varied Sides

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19—The alliance for progress, President Kennedy's master plan for helping the underdeveloped nations of the U.S. targets \$25 billion dollars. There are mixed views on what it is doing.

The 10-year program, designed to help Latin America, is a U.S.-Latin American undertaking aimed at replacing poverty and stagnation with economic and social development.

A long week-end of second anniversary observance will be climaxed here today, Aug. 20, with a big rally for President Kennedy and Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson will address the Organization of American States.

Kennedy said in a week-end statement that he was "heartened by the progress made in the last year" in a short space of time, but cautioned that much more should be done.

A gloomy assessment was made from the Brazilian president, Juscelino Kubitschek, who reported to the OAS in June that the nation suffered from "inadequate planning," "negligence" and "is drifting farther and farther away from the needs and aspirations of the people."

The record on self-help and reform by the Latin American countries termed the "cornerstone of the alliance" is spotty.





Salmon Derby Is Rip-Snorting Event Good Promotion for Seward, Alaska

SEWARD, Alaska, Aug. 19.—A mile-long

Driving down here yesterday from Anchorage, we had the impression that Alaska was headed for some

bad weather.

And this morning it was.

Driving an aerial-bomb-rocked us out of bed at 5 a.m. as it signaled the start of the seventh annual Salmon Derby.

Some 500 small boats were launched in the first 20 minutes as fishermen rushed to compete for first prize \$10,000 and second \$5,000.

They sold salmon all day long.

After getting a "look" at the rules, it's obvious the Reward Committee is doing a good thing.

Each fisherman has to pay \$10 for the four days of the Salmon Derby.

There was an average of three fishermen per boat and if each took \$10, the Seward C. of C. took in \$4,000 the first 20 minutes.

Entry fees cover the \$1500 offered in cash for the first three largest fish.

Good thing is going. Each fisherman has to pay \$1 a day or \$70 for the four days of the Salmon Derby.

Besides, it's not difficult to

catch a silver salmon. We caught one silver blocks away from the head of the river and after Mrs. Dick tossed it has no bearing on the fish story.

The main purpose of the Salmon Derby is to raise money for the head of lettuce for 14 cents a pound with the same price tag at 35 cents a pound in a store.

Another exception was a popular brand of margarine at 33 cents a pound—cheaper than butter in stores. A piece of pie and a cup of coffee sells for 20 cents.

The "council's" power bill for what appears to be a little below sea level starts at 10 cents a month. If there is a Christmas tree with lights, the bill runs up to \$60 a month.

Another attraction is Portage glacier, reached by a five-mile drive over an excellent smooth highway. Great chunks of ice from the glacier fall across a narrow "a small lake" and are grounded within 30 or 40 yards of shore. Water dripping steadily from "levers" which break off the glacier is audible for some distance.

A hunk of glacier was salvaged from the lake and Staff Dick reported, "It tastes like ice!"

A former Idahoan reports he got a job with the Seward C. of C. for \$100 a week in Twin Falls. Sackers in supermarkets still work at \$170 an hour and the Seward C. of C. still works at \$100 a month.
