

Kennedy Is Considering Trip in West

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20 (UPI) — President Kennedy is considering a swing into the West that would give him a chance to "look over efforts to preserve natural resources, natural wonders and cultural areas—and to get some political exposure in advance of the 1964 campaign."

Under present planning, he would travel into Arizona, the home of Sen. Barry Goldwater, who is the top contender for the 1964 Republican presidential nomination.

"Nothing has been settled," but the trip has reached "the point where the White House is reported

as reliable authority" to have asked the interior department several weeks ago to outline a possible route.

And some advance work on a trip may be undertaken shortly.

The trip may be undertaken in October, or it may take Kennedy by plane, train and auto from Grand Coulee dam in the Northwest to Glen Canyon dam in Arizona. Government air is on tap at all points in October.

Kennedy recently canceled an engagement to appear Oct. 7 in Atlanta at the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the city's birth.

The White House gave a rather explanation that Kennedy might be busy elsewhere at that time.

The trip, one administration official said, would be "oriented primarily to conservation."

News Around Idaho

BOISE, Aug. 20 (UPI)—The national committee of Idaho's Young Democrats asserted today that the chairman of the Western States Young Democratic conference erred in allowing adoption of a resolution supporting the U.S. policy of negotiations with Cuba. Dale Higer, Emmett, said the proposal was defeated by a vote of 12 to 10 but that a delegate from the state of Washington withdrew three no-votes after the balloting and informed the chairman he was abstaining from casting them.

BOISE, Aug. 20 (UPI)—An investigation of the disposal of state-owned cars assigned to the office of Atty. Gen. Alan C. Shepard was completed yesterday by the attorney general's office, his spokesman, Mr. Higer. He suggested that Gov. Robert E. Bogle "should request a grand jury investigation" of the transaction. Shepard declined comment on Bogle's statement.

BOISE, Aug. 20 (UPI)—The department of health said that a moderate outbreak of bacillary dysentery in Twin Falls, Camas, Minidoka and Jerome counties, which resulted in 10 cases of salmonella infection, has been controlled. The department also recommended preventive medicine for the department said a study is under way to determine the cause of the outbreak.

CALDWELL, Aug. 20 (UPI)—Appointment of Terry Conley, 27, as basketball and track coach at Caldwell high school was announced Monday night by the Caldwell school board. For the past five seasons Conley has been coach at Snake River high school in Meridian.

POCATELLO, Aug. 20 (UPI)—Mrs. Hattie Patterson, 67, has pleaded innocent in fifth district court here to a charge of voluntary manslaughter. Patterson, charged with committing the fatal shooting July 19 of her husband, Allen Patterson, 63.

BOISE, Aug. 20 (UPI)—Sen. Len Jordan, R.-Ida., and Rep. Ralph Hargan, D.-Ida., advised Sen. Hubert Humphrey that a delay of about two months in the Senate's action on a bill to establish an order establishing a coast guard reserve training unit in Boise. Smiley had asked for assistance from Idaho's congressional delegation in attempting to gain revision of the order. Jordan said in a statement Monday that he had been in close touch with the commandant of the United States coast guard and he is adding to his message: "Regret cannot furnish more favorable information."

Judge agreed that the family would be represented by another attorney.
