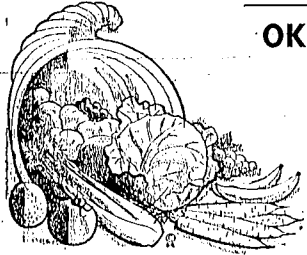

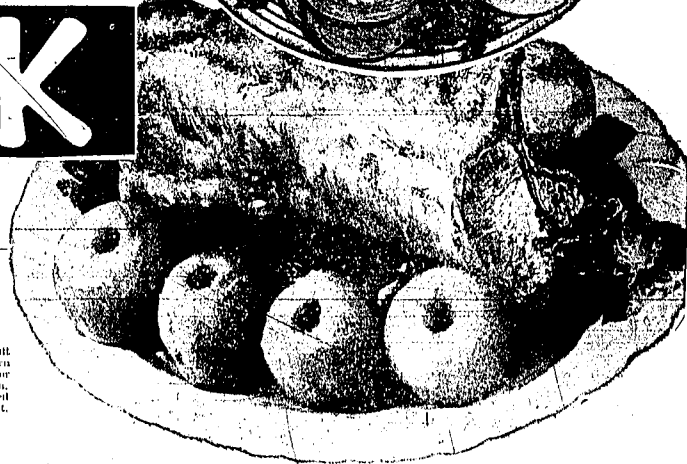

Russ, U. S. Open Talks On Consuls

MOSCOW, Sept. 26 (AP)—The United States and the Soviet Union opened negotiations today on proposals to enlarge each nation's consular activities on the other's territory.

An American team began talks at the Soviet Foreign Ministry on a consular convention which has been discussed periodically since the United States reinstated the Soviet Union in 1953.

Among questions to be discussed was the right of American consular officers to visit American citizens arrested in the Soviet Union.

Similar authority would be given Soviet consular officials in the United States.

Probe Starts Into Nazi's Grave Site

BERLIN, Sept. 26 (AP)—Investigators have dug up the skeleton in the grave marked "Heinrich Mueller" at the West Berlin prosecutor's office disclosed today.

A spokesman said the bones were exhumed yesterday "to make sure they are Mueller's."

The body of Heinrich Mueller, born 1900, killed in action in Berlin May, 1945.

The tombstone on the grave in the "Garrison cemetery" located in the American sector of West Berlin bears the inscription:

"Our beloved father, Heinrich Mueller, born 1900, killed in action in Berlin May, 1945."

The prosecutor's office said an investigation had been underway for some time into Mueller's role in the murder of Jews and other Czechoslovakians by Germany and Nazi-occupied countries.

The spokesman said the exhumation was part of this investigation and did not mean the authorities had any doubts about the fact that it was not Mueller's grave.

The prosecutor's office said it could not confirm rumors printed in a West Berlin newspaper today that Mueller was still alive and working for the Russians. The mass-circulated newspaper Bild Zeitung quoted an unidentified "high ranking official" as saying that the erection of the communist anti-refugee wall "bears the handwriting of Mueller."

Police Pursue Investigation Into Bomb Blast

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Sept. 26 (AP)—Police pushed investigation into the city's latest bombing, apparently a terrorist device, today, while a two-man presidential team scheduled another round of meetings today with white and Negro leaders.

The latest bombing occurred early Wednesday, hours after the arrival of former Army Secretary Kenneth C. Royall and former Army football coach Earl Blaik. Royall and Blaik were sent by President Kennedy to promote racial harmony in this tense city. They described themselves as "friendly guests."

Investigators of the bombing said a minor explosion set off in a clump of bushes and honeysuckle vines was apparently designed to lure people and police onto the street.

Then they would have been caught in the full force of a second blast from a shrapnel bomb.

New Draftee Order Is Judged Okay

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26 (AP)—The defense department is well pleased with the results of President Kennedy's recent order deterring married men from the draft.

Preliminary studies indicate that the order will save 100,000 men annually in military personnel costs. In addition to bringing the army a more up-to-date force and possibly increasing re-enlistment.

These reports, reports that the department has asked for revocation of the order brought a quick denial by Pentagon officials interested in military manpower trends.

In the last two years, the army has drafted approximately 40,000 married men who were entitled to an allotment of \$350 a month not enjoyed by single draftees, who usually outnumber them about 4 to 1.

The additional personnel tax for 40,000 married men thus comes to nearly 40 million dollars a year. Recruiters can get the allotment by marrying while in service. The allotment for a married man would be increased to \$105 a month if his wife had a child.

Wheat Deal Doesn't Have Buyer Yet

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26 (AP)—In all the hubbub over the sale of U.S. wheat to the Soviet Union, at least one element is officially lacking: The big buyer.

Czechoslovakia, a member of the Soviet bloc, has approached the United States on the chance of a wheat deal. But agriculture and state department officials insist that the Soviet Union itself has made no move, either directly or indirectly.

However, action of President Kennedy in requesting two house committees to discuss the matter was open to the interpretation that the government had knowledge that an order was on the way.

The house agriculture and foreign affairs committees will go over the matter with Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman and Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges.

Two farm-minded senators—Robert H. Humphrey, D. Minn., and George T. Allen, R. Va., told newsmen they had heard from commercial and private sources that the communists want to buy as much as 200 million bushels of wheat and a quantity of food grain.

Generally, it has been taken for granted that the communists would buy American grain only if they could get it at the current price at which it is sold to friendly countries under an export subsidy program.

The issue of the numerous provisions cited by the eminent counsel appearing for the parties stood as an ancient curfew, the development of the state constitution, and the issue from which we quote the opinion of the court, the conclusion that a horse race where the pari-mutuel system of wagering is used, does not contravene the constitutional prohibition against lotteries.

The majority opinion said, "It is our firm opinion that the right of authority in the state constitution is in accord with the constitutional provisions, provided logical foundations, and in mind the historical relation between 'lottery' and 'chance' as it has been used."

The court said that the 1903 act does not contravene the state constitution because the pari-mutuel system of betting on horse racing is not a lottery, which constitutes an illegal game of chance, upon which the pari-mutuel system of betting is based.
