

Court Told Bet Rule May Return Slot Machines

BOISE, Oct. 15 (AP) — Idaho's supreme court was told today that if the ruling in the pari-mutuel betting case is permitted to stand it could result in again legalizing the use of slot machines. The contention was made in a petition filed on behalf of Gov. Robert E. Smylie asking for a rehearing of the suit, brought by an Idaho stockman and three county fair boards. The bill authorizing pari-mutuel betting on horse racing was enacted by the 1963 legislature over the governor's veto. Smylie refused to sign the bill. The supreme court found that in the law, on grounds the statute is unconstitutional and the lawsuit was brought in an attempt to compel appointment.

In upholding legality of the 1963 law the supreme court found that it did not violate the constitutional ban on lotteries. In doing so it said that the pari-mutuel system of wagering on horse racing is not based solely on chance but that some element of skill is involved.

There is nothing in the Idaho horse racing act, "Smylie's petition said, "which requires any sort of information sheet to be published."

"There is nothing that requires the weight of the jockey, the distance to be run, the prior records of the horses and jockeys, or the breed and sex of horse to be published and/or made available to the betting public. There isn't even a requirement that the course operator make known to the public which horse is which."

The petition said that undoubtedly the commission provided for in the law would act in such a way as to prevent abuse and corruption.

"But respondent contends," the petition went on, "it is the responsibility of the judiciary to provide adequate standards and clear-cut limitations for the general protection of the public within which the administrative branch of government can promulgate forced rules and regulations."

Emissaries Try To End Border War in Sahara

ALGERIA, Oct. 15 (UPI) — Algerian and Moroccan troops fought a new battle today and each side claimed victory as Algerian emissaries met with King Hassan II to prevent the border conflict from spreading. Demo Rebels at Tax Pressure Tactics

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP) — Senate hearings on President Kennedy's tax cut program opened today on a stormy note with one Democratic senator charging pressure tactics had been employed in an effort to force him to support the bill.

An aroused Sen. Albert Gore, D. Tenn., complained that a seven-page telegram sent by William Reek, director of research for the Democratic national committee, to Tennessee communities amounted to "political intimidation."

Senators Hear of Mafia Terrorism

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP) — Senate probes heard testimony today of Mafia terrorism in central Florida's gay playland — killing and racketeering too carefully managed by a national crime syndicate for any local police force to crush. Police Chief Neil G. Brown, Tampa, told the senate investigations subcommittee there have been 23 "gangland slayings" in the Tampa area since 1928, only one of them solved. Brown said the killings show "how the Mafia uses murder to discipline its membership, to revenge itself against violators of its code and to otherwise eliminate opposition to its criminal activities and goals," and how difficult it is to get witnesses to talk.

Of 145 homicides other than gang killings between 1928 and the end of 1952, he said, only four remain unsolved, and every homicide in the 1950-52 period has been solved.

Brown appealed for federal help for the police of all states and cities in the war on organized crime in which, he said, there are too many frustrations now.

He urged Congress to legalize wire tapping, telephone lines, provide federal grants to help finance the training of local police specialists in gang busting techniques, and create a "national clearing house for criminal intelligence" to help all police agencies coordinate efforts.

Brown's testimony started the Senate subcommittee hearings following up on testimony by mobster Joseph Valachi.

Valachi has sworn he was a professional "phone tap" for a national syndicate whose members call it Cosa Nostra, although police call it the Mafia — the term used by Brown.

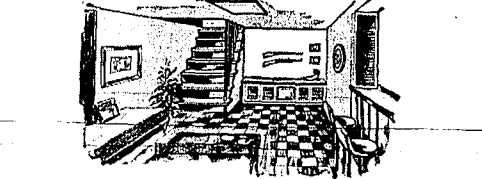

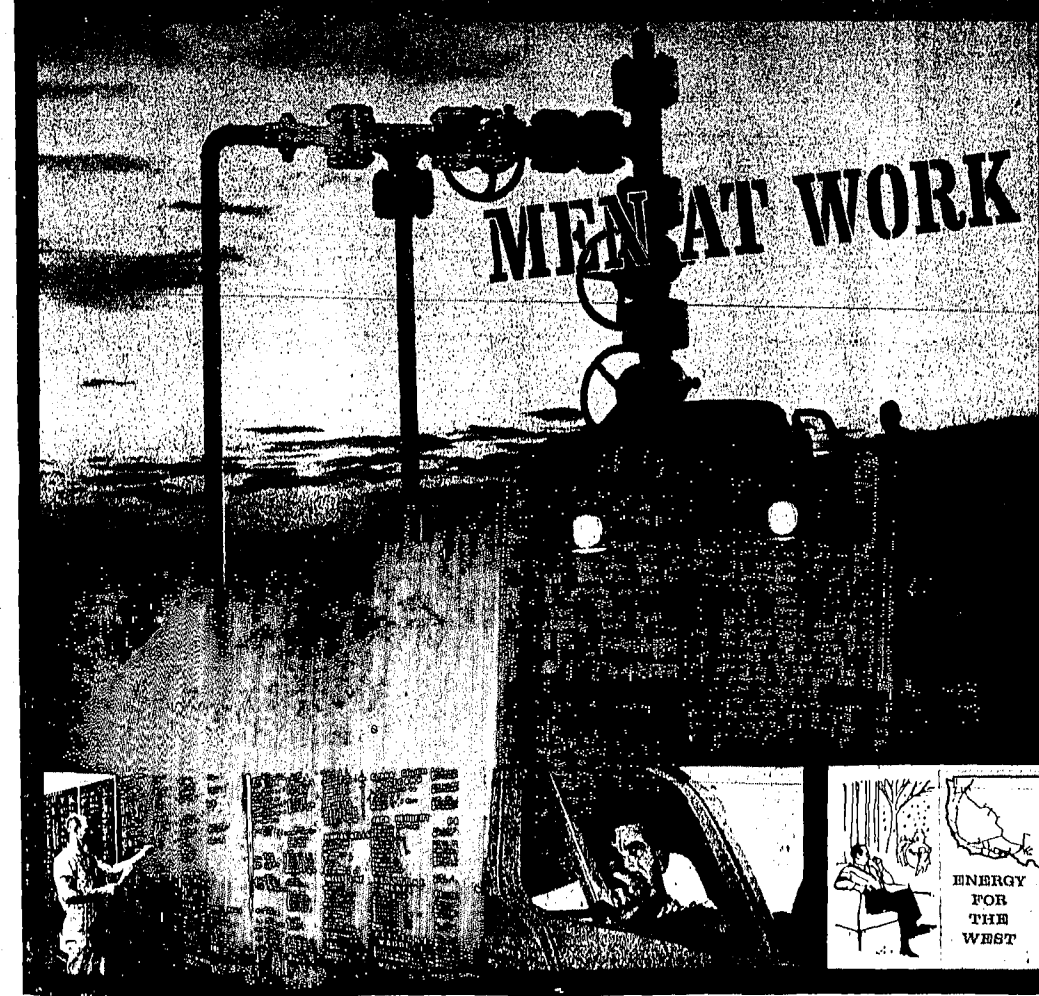

Texas Streaks to Top Rung in AP Football Rating

The Texas Longhorns, who were ranked first in today's Associated Press poll of the nation's college football teams, leading a whole lot last week and a stunning up-climbed into the top spot by knocking off Oklahoma 28-7 Saturday. The 8-0 team is the only one to win all its games.

The special panel of sports writers and broadcasters gave Texas 51 out of 55 first place votes, after waiting through the week-end to see the shock defeat for five of the teams in last week's Top Ten. In addition, there was one tie, and one vote for the Longhorns.

The Longhorns were fourth in the first regular poll three weeks ago, and second a week ago. Oklahoma, leader for the past two weeks, slipped to second place, while the Sooners dropped to third.

Two teams, Pittsburgh and Mississippi, benefited by having an open date, and moved up. Texas, the only other winner among the elite was Wisconsin, which beat Purdue 38-20 and jumped from fifth to second place. Wisconsin got the four first place votes that didn't go to Texas.

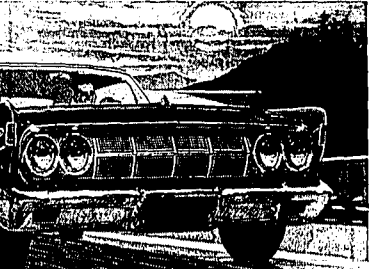
Pitt advanced from sixth to third while Mississippi jumped from 10th to fifth. In addition to the defeat of the Sooners, Alabama was upset by Florida, 10-6. Southern Methodist dumped Navy, 22-28. Southern California was beaten 17-14 by Notre Dame, and Penn State was downed by Army, 10-7. Ohio State was defeated by Illinois, 20-20. Southern California, which was beaten by Oklahoma, dropped clear out of the Top Ten.
