

## Cold War Eyed by Envoys

LONDON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Rusk and British Foreign Secretary Richard A. Butler agreed today on the need to continue Western probes for new agreements with the Soviet Union.

Rusk came to London for consultations with Butler following the North Atlantic Alliance ministerial meeting in Paris, which also proposed new but cautious steps to ease East-West tensions.

Rusk and Butler got through a dozen items on their agenda Wednesday night and today, informed sources said. They did not seek hard solutions but concentrated themselves with defining areas of agreement between London and Washington.

American sources said Rusk will leave for Washington feeling that his exchanges with Butler and Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home were useful in every respect.

Rusk and Butler analyzed in detail the German and Berlin problem and also reviewed conditions in Southeast Asia, Latin America and Africa—areas of recent activity by the Chinese communists.

## With Snow

Snow was falling again today in northern Idaho, adding to the hazards of driving on roads already slick with snow and ice. State police said snow was reported from the Canadian border with the Moscow area. Motorists were advised to use chains at Lookout pass on U. S. highway 19.

Highways to the Lewiston, Burley and Whitebird hills were free of snow, but wet. Highways were now covered by a thin layer of snow and there was black ice on state route 18 in Kootenai. Fog also was reported.

Across southern Idaho there are patches of fog but major highways generally were bare. Snow on floor was listed on U. S. 89 from Swan Valley to U. S. 83 at Lost Trail pass and U. S. 191 from Ashton north. U. S. 81 had slick spots in the Snake pass area.

## Crash Causes \$7,000 Loss To Property

Damages estimated at \$7,000 to a house trailer and property of Max R. Black, 2121 Elizabeth boulevard, resulted from a two-vehicle accident at 3:45 p.m. Wednesday.

A 1955 Ford driven by Mrs. Wayne B. DeSpain, 47, 735 Eastland drive, struck the left side of a pickup truck while trying to pass it, went across front lawn of 2115 and 2121 Elizabeth boulevard, went through a hedge, hit and extensively damaged Black's trailer house, and took out 32 feet of fence before stopping.

The pickup truck was driven by J. E. Crossley, 65, 753 Hoops street, who was making a left hand turn when his vehicle was struck.

Mrs. DeSpain's car cleared an eight-foot gap of bushes in a hedge between the homes of Gary Lee Watt, 2115 Elizabeth boulevard, and Black, his next-door neighbor, after narrowly missing a tree in Watt's yard. The car struck a small trailer house parked in the driveway alongside Black's house and then took out 32 feet of wood siding. Her car stopped 100 feet from the point of impact with the pickup truck.

The car struck the right front corner of the house trailer, rupturing butane gas lines into the trailer from two small tanks attached to the house. The Twin Falls fire department was called to prevent further damage which might have resulted from leaking butane gas. Furniture in the trailer also was damaged.

Damage to the trailer, which was vacant at the time, was estimated by Black at about \$7,000, not including the furniture plus about \$2,000 damage to his property.

Mrs. DeSpain was bruised but not hospitalized.

No citations were issued pending completion of the investigation by city police.

## McNamara Arrives in Viet Nam For Visit, Reds Press Attacks

SAIGON, Dec. 19 (UPI)—U.S. Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara arrived today for talks with South Viet Nam's new military rulers as communist forces pressed new guerrilla attacks and sabotage forays in this embattled southeast Asian nation. McNamara said he had come here to discuss the problems and progress of U.S. military aid. He quickly plunged into briefings from U.S. military officials on the war against the communists at headquarters of Gen. Paul D. Harkins, commander of U.S. forces in Viet Nam.

## Sun Valley's Season Opens One Day Early

Ski facilities opened Thursday at Sun Valley, one day ahead of the previously announced winter opening. The early opening was ordered because of good skiing conditions, officials said. Some facilities began operating last week-end. Snow depths range from 13 inches on the valley floor to 17 inches on Dollar mountain, 22 inches at the Roundhouse and 28 on top of Bald mountain. The Soldier mountain ski area at Fairfield will be open for skiing Saturday, Sunday and Monday. It will be closed over Christmas and open again Dec. 26 and run daily through New Year's according to Bob Prostenon, co-owner. The area has four lifts operating and the J-bar lift has had minor repairs to speed its operation, Prostenon said.

## Four Hurt in 4-Car Crash Near Filer

FILER, Dec. 19—Four persons were injured in a four-car collision about 11 a.m. Thursday two miles north of here on U.S. highway 30, at Deadman's curve.

The injured and their conditions, reported at Maglo Valley Memorial hospital, are Mrs. Marjorie Roper, 28, Pullman, Wash., fair condition; Donald B. Roper, 28, Pullman, fair condition with lacerations; Laura Roper, 10 months, good condition with bruises, and Jawad T. Agha, 27, an exchange student from Arabia attending Utah State university, Logan, in fair condition with lacerations.

Twin Falls county Sheriff James H. Benham said a 1956 Buick driven by Agha was traveling west on highway 30, went around the curve and collided headon with a 1953 Chevrolet driven by Roper.

The Buick then spun around and was struck in the rear by an eastbound 1963 Chevrolet stationwagon, which in turn was struck from the rear by a 1963 Mercury.

Driver of the stationwagon was Arthur L. Bettzig, 40, Shoshone, Wash., and the driver of the Mercury was Theima J. Stringer, 26, Buhl.

Mr. and Mrs. Roper and their daughter were in the 1953 Chevrolet and Agha was by himself in the Buick. Mrs. Caroline Bettzig, 60, Bettzig's mother, and a passenger in his car, was taken to the hospital for observation.

The Buick and the Chevrolet were demolished. The rear end of the stationwagon and the front end of the Mercury were damaged.

Sheriff Benham said investigation is continuing.

## Mme. Nhu's Ban Law Repealed

SAIGON, Viet Nam, Dec. 19 (AP)—South Viet Nam's new military government has repealed Mrs. Ngo Dinh Nhu's law banning divorce, dancing, prostitution, a bortion, contraceptives and beauty contests.

Mrs. Nhu, then South Viet Nam's first lady, barreled the law through a reluctant national assembly in May, 1962. Premier Nguyen Ngoc Tho canceled it today.

## Ruby's Trial Won't Be Televised

DALLAS, Dec. 19 (AP)—State Dist. Judge Joe B. Brown announced today that no television cameras, no radio recording equipment and no still cameras will be permitted in his courtroom during the trial of Jack Ruby.

Ruby is charged with murdering Lee Harvey Oswald, accused assassin of President Kennedy.

Brown's statement ended the possibility that the trial might go on coast-to-coast live television.

A hearing for a writ of habeas corpus is set in Judge Brown's court Monday. Brown had already served notice that no television, radio or press photo equipment would be permitted during that hearing.

Ruby's murder trial is set for Feb. 3.

It rejected 55 to 28 an amendment by Sen. Wayne Morse, D., Ore., to reduce funds for supporting economic assistance

## Africans Protest Mysterious Death

MOSCOW, Dec. 19 (UPI)—A force of fur-hatted Soviet policemen sealed off the Ghanaian embassy today and hurled back several African students trying to force their way in to protest the mysterious death in the snow of a Ghanaian student. Finding of the frozen corpse of Ghanaian medical student Edmund Asare-Addo under mysterious circumstances triggered an angry demonstration by 400 African students yesterday in Red square beside the sacred Lenin mausoleum and the red brick Kremlin walls. They carried banners saying "Russia is not Alabama."

## Man Asserts Kidnapers Tried Before

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Dec. 19 (AP)—The three men accused of kidnaping Frank Sinatra, Jr., attempted to abduct the singer on two earlier occasions, a cellmate of one of the suspects said today.

"Once in Arizona, we just missed connections," said John William Irwin, 42, according to Robert Dale Howard, 27, Lakeside Calif.

Howard, who is serving a six-month term for failing to support his family, was interviewed by a reporter for the San Diego Union which carried the copyright story.

Irwin also said the two younger suspects spirited Sinatra through the Lake Tahoe road blocks, Howard related. He said Sinatra was placed on the floor of the back seat and covered with a blanket, while one of the two was hidden in the trunk.

"He said the other two told him they were stopped by a patrolman or a sheriff, but waved on when the officer saw only one man in the car," Howard said.

Irwin was turned in by his brother, a school employee who expressed remorse over the notoriety he received.

James Irwin, Imperial Beach, said he notified the FBI at his brother's request. Irwin was arrested Friday at James Irwin's house.

## Reeder Pilot Crashes on Oregon Butte

HUNTINGTON, Ore., Dec. 19—A helicopter owned by Reeder Flying service, Twin Falls, crashed on McCoy butte near Huntington in eastern Oregon Wednesday, but the pilot received only minor injuries.

Robert McLellan, 28, Boise, was treated at a Welser hospital but relatives he expected to return to Boise Thursday.

McLellan, employed by Reeder Flying service, was rescuing burned-over range land near Crane creek on a bureau of land management project.

This was the first full time job McLellan had worked on since being hired this fall by Reeder Flying service. He has had 1,500 hours helicopter flying time experience.

He flew for Hillcrest Flying service, Lewiston, before working on this job. He received his helicopter flying training while serving in the Idaho national guard.

## Chou Works To Secure UAR Support

CAIRO, Dec. 19 (AP)—Communist Chinese Premier Chou En-Lai today renewed his efforts to gain United Arab Republic support for Peking in his third and final conference with UAR President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

Chou scheduled his talks with Nasser following a tour of the Egyptian pyramids.

Political observers said results of the talks will be released Saturday in a joint communique. They said the communique might disclose new efforts on China's part to seek a peaceful settlement of its border dispute with India.

The communist Chinese premier plans to fly to Algeria Saturday at the close of his week-long visit to the UAR, first stop on a two-month goodwill tour of Africa.

Nasser, one of the leaders of the non-aligned bloc; recently appealed for a new effort to end the feud between China and India which led to intense fighting in border areas last year.

The UAR state newspaper Al-Ahram quoted an official Chinese source this week as saying Chou was prepared to meet Indian Premier Jawaharlal Nehru in Peking or New Delhi without pre-conditions.

# Scouts' Needs Explained in Connection With UF Drive

As the Twin Falls United Fund campaign goes into its final phases, many people in the immediate area are faced with the problem of how much to give for the support of its seven agencies, the Boy Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, Salvation Army, Red Cross, YMCA, YWCA and the Arthritis and Rheumatism foundation.

About one-third of the 6,000 Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Explorers in the eight counties of Magic Valley live in Twin Falls, with one-third of the Snake River area Scout council's budget requested from the \$85,000 campaign goal of the United Fund.

It costs about \$10 per boy a year to keep a Cub Scout, Boy Scout or Explorer in Scouting. A Grant Russell, Twin Falls, district chairman for the Southside district, points out there are four levels of Scout financing.

First are the boys themselves, and their costs are simple. They include the boy's handbook, registration fee of 50 cents, with optional items such as uniforms, Boys' Life magazine, camp fees and others.

Second is the pack, troop or post which the boy joins. Its needs are mostly for equipment, program materials, badges, insignias and related items. The national charter granted to the Boy Scouts of America make it clear the unit must give to the public "value received" for any contribution. Usually the unit's money comes from the dues a boy pays each week. In addition circuit tickets are sometimes sold, shows are presented or projects such as scrap collections are held.

Several troops are currently selling Christmas items such as trees and wreaths. This helps the boys learn about the value of money.

The third level of Scout financing is the national council, which maintains standards for Scouting throughout the nation, trains volunteers and professional Scouters and puts on jamborees. No funds for it can be raised at the local council level, but it receives the registration fees from each boy and adult-Scouter.

Throughout the United States divided into activities, advancement of student council presidents were Scouts, 88 per cent school newspaper editors were Scouts, and 89 per cent of senior class presidents had been Scouts. About 70 per cent of the cadets at the three military services academies that year were Scouts, and 85 per cent of the Rhodes scholars in 1959 were Eagle Scouts. Only about 1.3 per cent of all Scouts become Eagle Scouts.

About 74 per cent of the junior officers, captains and below, in the air force were former Eagle Scouts and 76 per cent of the men decorated for valor in the American forces during World War II were former Scouts.

# Successful Miuteman Test Is Held

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla., Dec. 19 (AP)—A Miuteman missile with a new power-packed second stage propelled a nose cone 6,000 miles Wednesday night on a successful test flight.

The three-stage intercontinental range weapon blasted out of an 85-foot-deep underground silo and streaked across a clear sky toward a target area in the south Atlantic ocean near Ascension Island.

The air force announced the success, the second in as many launches for the new second stage, which eventually will become part of the advance Wing IV Miuteman. The rocket flown Wednesday night was basically the earlier Wing II model.

The Zip code used to send to Santa is actually the one for

Fairbanks, Alaska, which is about as close as the postal department can get to the north pole.

# 22 Hitler Helpers Face Trial

FRANKFURT, Germany, Dec. 19 (AP)—Twenty-two alleged "Hitler helpers" of Adolf Hitler go on trial here tomorrow accused of complicity in the murders of an estimated two-and-a-half million to four million people in Nazi Germany's grisliest death factory—Auschwitz.

Although West German courts have convicted more than 5,000 persons of war crimes, the trial of 22 guards, doctors and officials of the infamous concentration camp in Poland is the biggest ever staged by German authorities.

The millions who died at Auschwitz—most of them in gas chambers—were killed in the camp between 1940 and 1945 because they were Jews, communists, Gypsies, anti-Nazi Poles, Soviet prisoners of war, or just plain "enemies of the fuhrer."

Most of the accused in this trial were small fry in Auschwitz. The Poles in 1947 hanged two of the three camp commandants, Rudolf Hoess and Arthur Liebenhenschel. The third and last, Richard Baer, died of circulatory failure last June 7 in a Frankfurt jail while awaiting trial.

The Poles also tried 39 other SS troopers who helped to run Auschwitz. Of the total, 23 were executed, one was freed and the rest sentenced to jail terms of from three to 15 years.

The Frankfurt trial staged at the huge city hall chamber to accommodate some 120 newsmen, the 22 accused, their defense attorneys and court officials, is expected to last from six to eight months.

The opening day will be devoted to reading a condensed version of the indictment—an indictment four times longer than the Bible.

The trial will then be adjourned until after the Christmas holidays, when the court will begin to work its way through 700 prosecution files and 80 volumes of pre-trial testimony.

Eventually, about 250 witnesses are expected to take the stand to testify to the methods of horror thought up at Auschwitz.

The trial was delayed until now because investigations of Nazi crimes in the immediate postwar period were in Allied hands and there was a delay in transferring all records to Ger-

man authorities. The case for trial began building in 1958 when a Frankfurt newspaperman, Thomas Kintzka, obtained some Auschwitz records from a Pole in Wroclaw who found them on a street after the Nazi troops retreated in 1945. Kintzka took the records to Frankfurt Prosecutor General Fritz Bauer, who began a probe that involved the interrogations of 1,300 persons and testimony covering 17,000 typewritten pages over a period of five years.

Only nine of the 22 accused are in custody, headed by Karl Hoecker, 51, adjutant to the last Auschwitz Commander Richard Baer. He was released by the British as a prisoner of war in 1946 without being detected as Baer's adjutant. He had been working as a cashier for the Luebecke savings bank.

Arthur Brethwieser, 53, a former Polish attorney, was sentenced to death by the Poles, later pardoned and released in 1956. He had been found guilty of having mistreated prisoners as head of the clothes depot at Auschwitz. Now he is charged with

helping to kill 1,000 camp inmates with Zyklon B gas. After his release from a Polish prison, he worked as a bookkeeper in Germany.

Another typical charge is that against Oswald Kaduk, 55, accused of drowning 12 inmates in a water barrel. He worked as a medic in a West Berlin hospital after serving a nine-year prison term imposed by a Soviet military tribunal.

## 'Gimmick' of Insurance Firm Noted

Self-employed persons in the area have reported receiving letters from an out-of-state insurance firm not licensed in Idaho, stating that they are unable to obtain disability compensation, reports William Grange, secretary-manager of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce.

"While it is true that the state workman's compensation act does not provide for self-employed persons, most of the major, well-known insurance firms do provide private individual coverage for such people," Grange noted.

Grange added that the insurance department strongly advises people not to purchase insurance from firms which are not licensed in the state of Idaho, since any complications resulting from claims would be handled in the courts of the state in which the insured does not reside.

## Yule Season Frauds Are On Increase

The Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce warns the public to be on guard against fraudulent and misleading sales and promotional schemes that flourish during the Christmas season.

Each year thousands of hurried and unwary Christmas shoppers are victims of sharp operators who step up their activities during the holiday season, said William Grange, executive director of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce.

According to the National Better Business bureau, the seasonal swindlers drain millions of dollars annually from consumers and business men throughout the U. S.

They capitalize on the Christmas rush and the fact that people tend to be more generous, more trusting and less likely to turn down a request at that time of the year.

Grange said holiday shoppers can protect themselves by avoiding fly-by-night operators—and by making Christmas purchases from dealers of known reliability.

Based on past experience, he said, the following schemes can be expected to make their appearance again this year.

They are mail-order bargain offers, mail and phone appeals for donations, attempts to collect on C.O.D. packages supposedly for your neighbor who, the deliverer says, "is not home"; unordered merchandise appeals by unknown charitable organizations with requests for donations; personal appeals by mail from self-described needy individuals, and distribution of courtesy cards for purchasing gifts at discounts.
