Stockholders Vote on Rail Agreement

CELESTINE, Jan. 20.—(UP)—President E. Moran of the Santa Fe Railroad and Southern Railway stockholders voted on a stock agreement giving the Santa Fe control of the Western Pacific did not receive a "mandate" in the election. The Western Pacific management estimated less than 20 percent of the two million outstanding shares in support of the proposal, which calls for Santa Fe to exchange one share of its stock for 1 1/2 shares of Western Pacific.

Three insurgent Western Pacific directors claimed a victory after the vote in San Francisco in their fight to block the Santa Fe bid for control of the Utah-California line.

The opposing vote included blocks of 10 per cent voted by the Southern Pacific and the Northern Pacific. The Santa Fe did not vote in 20 per cent but did the Great Northern vote, the 10 per cent.

The Santa Fe's application for control of the Western Pacific is believed the interest in the supporting recommendation of an ICC trial.

The Southern Pacific, Union Pacific, Santa Fe and Great Northern bought up 50 per cent of the Western Pacific after a protracted struggle started in 1900.

In a statement issued Sunday, Moran said the vote "was a disappointing expression of Western Pacific stockholders' ... repugnance to a small minority of the outstanding stock." He said the vote will not interfere with the present ICC application.

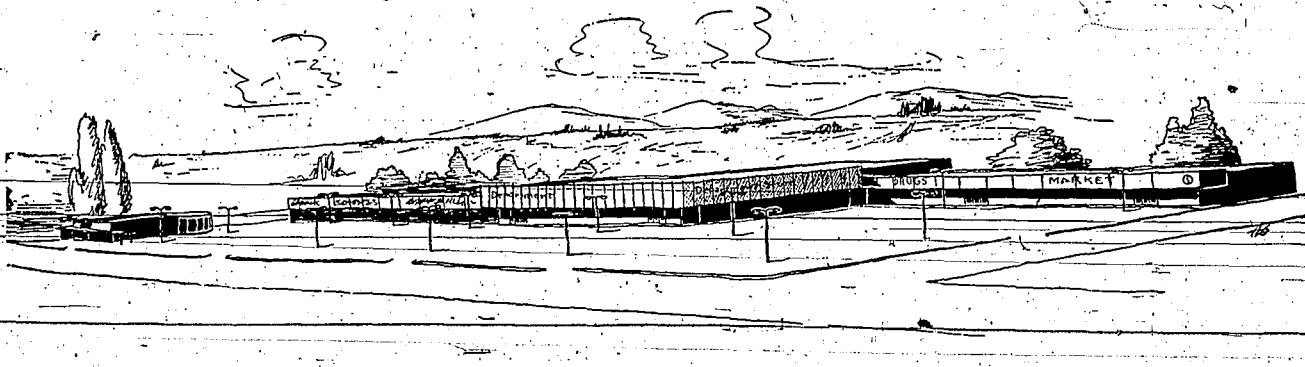

In its annual report, the House committee on government operations reported Sunday that the government owned \$11.5 billion more in assets than it owed in liabilities.

The report says the government's net worth is \$11.5 billion more than it owes, a figure that is a conservative one.

For example, the 18 acres of White House grounds was listed on federal books as worth \$1.00.

Although the committee did not explain why the White House grounds were valued so low, it says the "government-owned property is valued at its original cost."

House Plants Program Given At Club Meet

Keeping house plants healthy and how to use them in home decoration was the program given by Mrs. Howard Gillette and Mrs. C. W. Dainch when the Twin Falls Garden club met at the Buhl chapter, New York court-recreation hall.

Mrs. Nelson laid the main emphasis on soil conditions and said light was the most essential, according to the natural habitat of the plant. Vase plants, she said, need more light because so little chlorophyll in the white areas lessen their ability to manufacture food.

A temperature range from 50 to 70 degrees suits most plants. Humidity may be increased with use of shallow trays filled with water and gravel.

Ventilation is necessary to foliage and roots. Stirring the soil will help aerate the roots, Mrs. Nelson said.

Pruning and training will result in a well shaped plant. Members were advised to lead the habit of the plant to water sparingly and to use a fungicide filter during the resting or dormant period. At other times, a water-ecce-fer-tilizer is recommended.

Mrs. Gillette gave directions for caring for poinsettias and Mrs. Dainch showed a leafy plant against using too much water. Geraniums should be kept in a sunny room. Mrs. Gillette said cuttings should be taken from a plant that has just begun to grow in the top. The base can be discarded.

Mrs. Gillette commented on control of aphids, mealy bugs and moody soil conditions.

Mrs. Dainch reviewed a list of Flowers in Interior Decorating, by Better Homes and Gardens, and discussed the use of house plants may serve as effective room dividers, colorful window treatments and conversation pieces.

House Plants Program Given At Club Meet

In a pre-race interview, Weatherly, speaking of safety equipment, said he did not use a shoulder harness.

About 80 per cent of the stock car drivers use the device.

Said Weatherly: "I believe there's a greater chance of snapping your neck with a shoulder harness. I'd rather take my chances slipping around than just the seat belt."

Sunday's crash was not his first.

At Daytona Beach, Fla., in 1961, Weatherly overturned his compact car, but emerged unharmed and went on to win the 200-mile, 25-mile sprint for 140 trophies.

On the same track, Daytona International Speedway, he took his NASCAR victory in 1962, edging Richard Petty of Daytona Beach by a hair.

In Sunday's Riverside race prior to entering the 500-mile race held here last year, and told news men:

"I haven't seen Riverside, but I believe in Winston-Salem to bounce all over all kinds of roads. I don't mind turning right and left."

Track officials said it took five minutes to get Weatherly out of his car. He suffered severe facial injuries. Officials said he apparently was killed instantly.
