Light Plane Feared Down In Colorado

KREMMLING, Colo., June 15 (AP)—A massive aerial search was under way today for a light plane feared to have crashed in the Colorado Rockies in the northwest part of the state.

The Colorado civil air patrol and the plane, a Piper Comanche, was missing on a flight from Hayward, Calif., to Denver. The CAP identified the pilot as A. J. Paul Uitz, Denver, stationed at Lowry air force base near Denver.

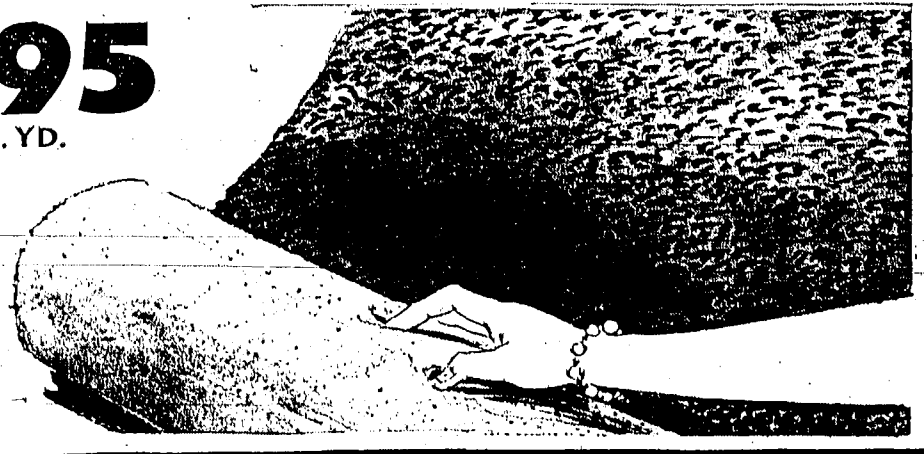

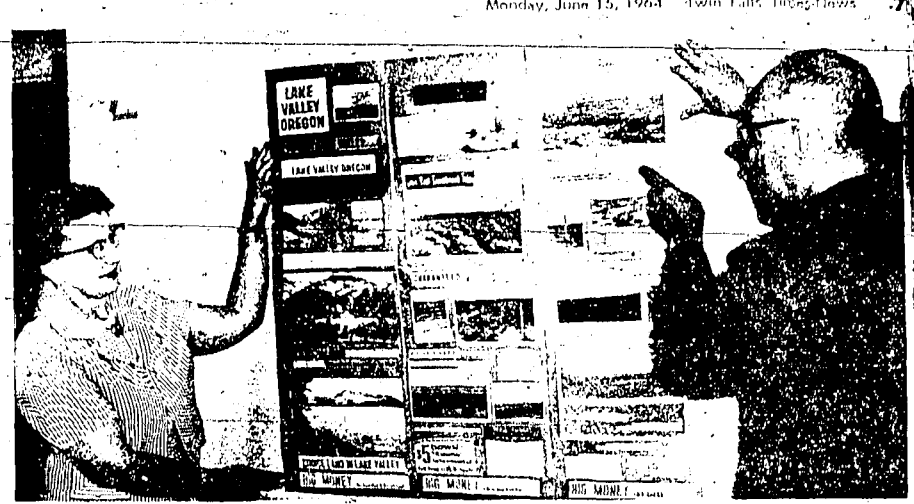

Postal Check Exposes Land Scheme Used Dusty, Dry Lake Bed in Oregon

For only 55¢ down and 55¢ a month a person can purchase beautiful land near a scenic lake and scenic mountains at Lake Valley, Ore. At least that's what the advertisement that came through the mail said, but the beautiful land was exposed by postoffice inspection to be an alkali, dusty and dry lake bed.

Seattle inspector-in-charge of the postoffice inspection service, DeWelles, was arrested after sending out 10,000 postal cards promoting the scheme. An Elko land promoter was sentenced to six months in prison followed by a four and one-half year probation, for mail fraud for selling worthless desert land near Elko.

Postal inspectors accounted for nearly a fifth of the investors who had signed contracts totaling \$250,000 in the belief that the famous Nevada Comstock range was involved. Sanger reports the Lake Valley land price was low but the land was worthless. The postal service is pressing a strong drive against quackery by mail, land fraud promoters and gyp work-at-home schemes.

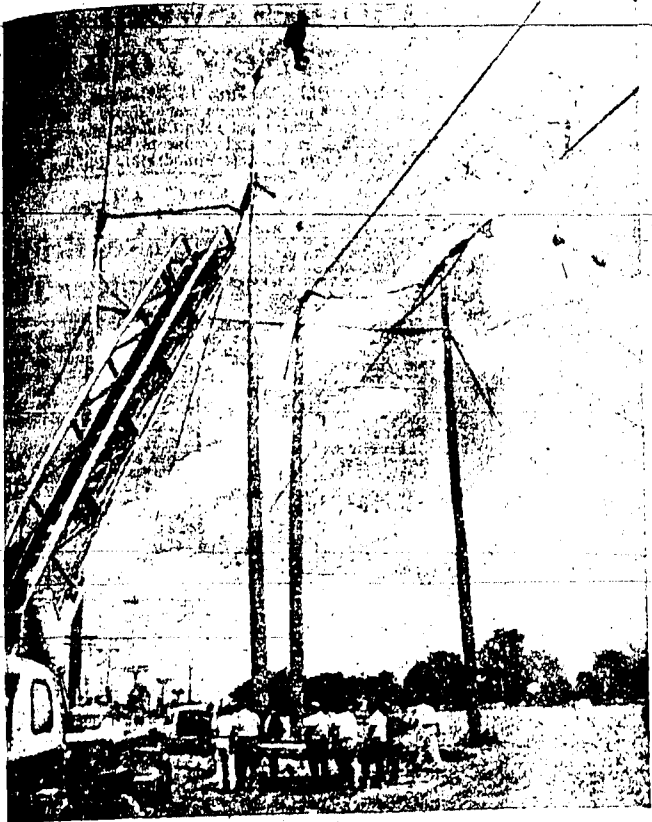

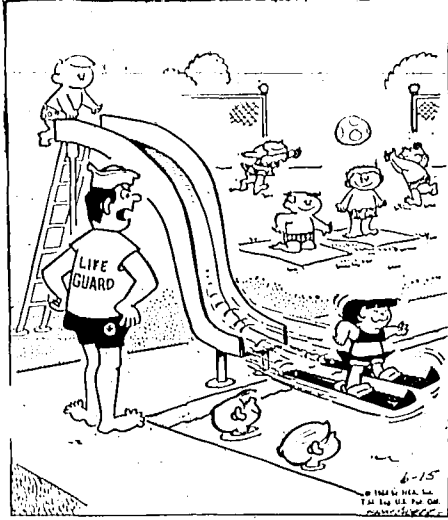
