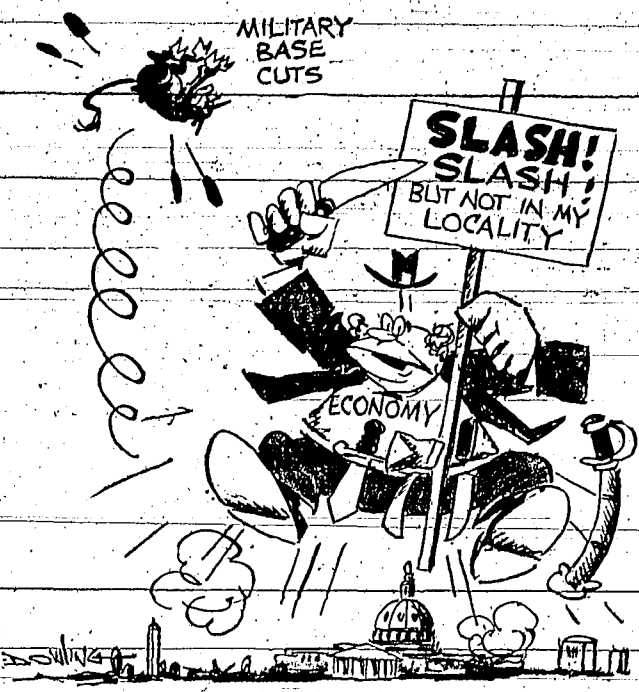

Idaho Safety Director Duane Alters gives the impression that Idaho won't make much headway in its drive against highway accidents until the state has some fancy system of gathering accident statistics. He says Idaho is "behind the times" in handling accidents and accident reports. Mr. Alters can give all the attention he desires to the paper war, but when he has all the statistics he can store in all his filing cabinets, he might discover a much more realistic approach to traffic safety and accident reduction.

There's really no secret to reduction of traffic accidents and greater traffic safety. It's all so simple some drivers wonder why more isn't done along that line. Traffic safety can be promoted quite readily by cracking down on the violators—but not, Mr. Alters might find that every state using the crack-down method has shown an immediate improvement in traffic safety records. Furthermore, traffic deaths have declined abruptly in those states.

These results aren't achieved by coddling drivers; they aren't achieved by easing requirements for a driver's license; they aren't achieved by tapping drivers on the wrist for violation of traffic laws. And such results definitely aren't achieved by permitting children of 14 and 15 years old to drive autos on the state's streets and highways. It's puzzling why Idaho continues to condone the law permitting children to drive cars while the law (the statutes are on the books, anyway) forbids those same children to purchase or consume beer or cigarettes until they're 18. In many cases, the auto has proved far more deadly.

Safety Director Alters might have some thoughts about Idaho's system of "violation points." So far as the law and courts are concerned, a driver is forgiven any violation more than a year old. He can accumulate three or four serious moving violations each and every year without anyone ever challenging his qualifications as a driver. Director Alters is strangely silent on such a ridiculous law. He also has nothing to say about a driver's tag so simple that a child can pass with flying colors.

Perhaps the most ridiculous part of Idaho law concerning traffic violators is the provision that permits a court or the department of enforcement to grant a "temporary" license to those who may have lost their driver's license for a violation. The provision makes a farce of the whole law. Many drivers just go blithely on their way driving whorver and whenever they please by virtue of the "temporary" license. The idea is to avoid working a "handicap" on the violator. It's all wrong. The violator should have to live with any and all hardships resulting from the violation of the law. Obviously, revocation of the driver's license is no sufficient. The law should provide for impounding the car involved in any serious violation.

When Idaho and Idahoans reach the point in their thinking where they really want to improve traffic safety, they'll scream for such stringent measures. And traffic safety will improve almost immediately. In the meantime, Safety Director Alters might find he won't add much with his paper war.

NOW IT'S OFFICIAL

In the wake of the National Reclamation Association's annual meeting in California, there's no longer any doubt about designs on Columbia river water. It was one of the prime topics of conversation. Significantly, Reclamation Commissioner Floyd E. Dominy declined to discuss the subject but those attending the meeting had no doubts where he stands. He believes Columbia river water is the only answer to the problem of providing water to California and Arizona.

The bureau of reclamation is looking for something like 10 million acre foot of water annually. The first step is scheduled in January when Arizona's Sen. Carl Hayden will introduce legislation to authorize the Central Arizona project. Offhand, there doesn't appear to be any special move toward the Columbia, but his bill will contain a directive to start the study of the Pacific Northwest. The object is to find supplemental water to divert to the Colorado river watershed. It's patently obvious that the simplest diversion is from Snake river. Naturally, Idaho will oppose such a plan. But one wonders how effective opposition can be in the face of overwhelming numbers in congress. There's also a question of Idaho's effectiveness in fighting off the federal bureau of reclamation. It remains to be seen what can be done by the new water resources agency approved by voters in this month's election. One thing is certain: Idaho—and perhaps the rest of the Northwest—has a fight on her hands.

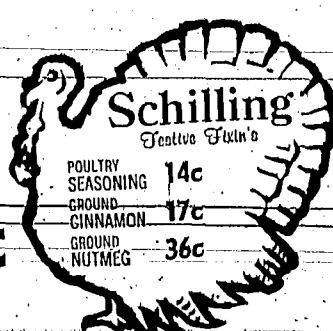

Paper Firm Cuts Price Of Newsprint

NEW YORK, Nov. 19 (AP)—A major Canadian paper producer yesterday cut the basic price of newsprint by \$10 a ton, stunning the industry.

A spokesman for the American Newspaper Publishers Association (ANPA) said the price reduction was the first "I have ever heard of" and a spokesman for the Canadian newsprint industry said it was the first in 10 years. The announcement was made by MacMillan, Bloedel and Powell River, Ltd., of Vancouver, B. C., fourth largest producer of newsprint in North America. The firm has a capacity of 917,000 tons of newsprint a year, a capacity equal to about 9.5 per cent of combined U. S. and Canadian production for 1963.

"Are you kidding?" asked a spokesman for one eastern Canadian paper company when informed of the MacMillan, Bloedel announcement. "There is no economic justification for a price reduction of this magnitude," said Robert G. Rogers, president of Crown-Zellerbach's Canadian headquarters. He said Crown-Zellerbach was studying the cut and had not decided whether to match it.

The new price of MacMillan, Bloedel newsprint is \$124 a ton delivered, down from \$134 on the West Coast. The basic U. S. price is \$135. This last significant drop in newsprint prices in 1964.

Arthur Brooks, head of MacMillan, Bloedel's U. S. subsidiary in Seattle, said in Los Angeles he did not know whether his company swung enough weight to compel competitors to cut their prices. C. T. Hicks, president of Bowater, company, Atlanta, Ga., which operates mills in Canada and the South, said he doubted the lower newsprint prices would spark a new wave of competition wherever it arises.

The Canadian pulp and paper association, of which MacMillan, Bloedel is a member, said it did not have any warning of the price cut.

News Around Idaho

BOISE, Nov. 19 (AP)—Air force authorities outlined yesterday the best coverage of crashes involving military aircraft. Lt. Frank Justo, information officer at Mountain Home air force base, reviewed the rules at a meeting of newspaper and photographers at Gowen field in Boise.

BLACKFOOT, Nov. 19 (AP)—Authorities say they have exhausted all leads in the search for 19-year-old Emma Hansen who disappeared three weeks ago today. They are still awaiting reports from the FBI laboratory in Washington on several items from the family car found parked the night of Oct. 19 several towns after she was last seen. She had left in the car to get groceries. A plane flies daily over the Snake river from Shalee south to American Falls reservoir. So far the clear water has yielded no trace of the girl's body.

POCAHELLO, Nov. 19 (AP)—The Bannock county hospital board plans a \$40,000 addition to the 17-bed Marsh Valley hospital in Downey to bring it up to standards set by the state board of health. The additional 1,000 square feet would provide for separate surgery and emergency rooms, permit storage on the main floor and make the basement one-hour fireproof.

BOISE, Nov. 19 (AP)—The state highway board was told yesterday that unless the federal government stops up its allocation of funds, Idaho's portion of the interstate network won't be completed on schedule by 1972. Ellis Drown, state highway engineer, said there was a backlog of money in the early years, but that construction is catching up with available funds. "There is a possibility we will be waiting for federal funds in 1968 and certainly will be waiting for federal money in 1966," he said. "We are ahead in miles now but behind in money." Idaho has 612 miles of interstate on the nationwide network.

BOISE, Nov. 19 (AP)—The internal revenue service collected \$206,824,000 in Idaho during the fiscal year that ended June 30. That was part of a national total of 112.3 billion dollars, up 5.3 billion dollars from the year before. Idaho's contributions included \$108,890,000 in personal income taxes and \$102,236,000 in corporate income taxes, a total of more than 100 million dollars. Also included were \$2,424,000 in estate taxes, \$141,000 in gift taxes and \$95,000 in tobacco taxes. Other excise taxes accounted for \$5,046,000.

GRANGEVILLE, Nov. 19 (AP)—A coroner and a pathologist testified in 19th district court here yesterday that in their opinion William Mendenhall was shot from behind in August of 1963. Herbert Beesaw, an 81-year-old Kamiah area pensioner, is charged with first degree murder in the fatal shooting of the 49-year-old Mendenhall, a neighbor of Beesaw. Idaho county coroner Dr. William Morrison and Dr. Kenneth Drown, a pathologist, said Beesaw's back was smaller than one in his chest. Beesaw maintains he shot Mendenhall in self defense during an argument in the pensioner's cabin.

BOISE, Nov. 19 (AP)—Gov. Robert E. Smylie has appointed employment security agency director H. Fred Garrett as a special assistant to work with the federal government on programs in Idaho under the anti-poverty act. Smylie advised director Sargent Shriver of the office of economic opportunity that Garrett or his deputy will attend a Dec. 1-2 meeting in Denver on provisions of the system for allocating migrant and seasonal farm workers. Smylie said Garrett's additional duties will be without compensation.

BOISE, Nov. 19 (AP)—The director of the Idaho teachers retirement system is asking the legislature to remove conflicting provisions in the law and to help the system boost a declining membership. H. F. Willmorth blamed conflicts in the law and the drop in members for a \$485,000 overpayment to the system from Idaho's 64 counties in the past four years. He told the legislative council budget committee that a one-mill levy required statewide from the summer term would provide some money that would allow the system from them. Willmorth said the system lost 4,500 members shortly after teachers were brought under social security in 1955, and that membership now is about 3,400. Willmorth said about 3,000 of those are close to retirement age.

Water Levels In Idaho Are Reported

IDAHO FALLS, Nov. 19 (AP)—Snow began piling up on the Snake river watershed this week with 10 inches reported at Island Park, four inches at Moran, Wyo., and eight inches at Ketchikan, Alaska. Henry C. Eaglin, Snake river district 36 watermaster, reported yesterday. Precipitation measured .96 of an inch at Island Park, .44 of an inch at Moran, .56 of an inch at Pallasda, and .52 of an inch at Ashton.

Discharge in cubic feet per second with a year ago comparisons showed Willow Creek near Hirie, Nov. 13—68 and 48; Teton river near St. Anthony, Nov. 12—63 and 40; and Henry Fork near Rexburg, Nov. 12—2,180 and 2,020.

Robinson Named Most Valuable Player in AL

BOSTON, Nov. 19 (AP) — Baltimore third baseman Brooks Robinson, main driving force behind an Orioles' pennant which just missed, was named Wednesday as the 1964 American league most valuable player by an overwhelming margin. The man with the golden glove and 118 runs batted in was the lone player to be named on all 20 ballots cast by the special committee of the Baseball Writers Association of America. BBWAA Secretary Hy Hurwitz announced the results.



On the basis of 14 points for first, 9 for second, 8 for third, etc., Robinson drew 269 for a possible 300 points, with 19 first-place ballots.

Mickey Mantle, who sparked the late New York Yankee spurt to another flag on aching legs, received the other two first-place votes and 171 points.

Yankee catcher Elton Howard, last year's winner, was third with 12 points. He was followed by rookie Tony Oliva of Minnesota, the league batting champion, with 10 and Dean Chance of Los Angeles, the Cy Young award winner in the major's top pitcher, with 11.

Mantle and Howard each were left off one ballot as Robinson broke a four-year Yankee monopoly on the award.

"I'm very happy," said Robinson when notified he was only the second third baseman ever to be honored. Al Rosen of Cleveland was a unanimous selection in 1953.

"I felt that I had a pretty good chance but I never thought I'd win," Robinson said from his suburban Baltimore home. "I like to win but few ever do."

Robinson topped American league third basemen in fielding for the fifth straight year. The miles, hard-working 27-year-old who twice in his career was sent down to the minors for weak hitting, wound up with a .317 average, only six points back of Oliva.

The performance followed a .251 average in '63. Robinson was only one RBI behind major league leader Ken Boyer of the St. Louis Cardinals. He also was runner-up in batting average in '63 and third in doubles with 35 in addition to contributing 28 homers while playing in all his club's 162 games.

"The fact that the Orioles made a good win of the pennant and that the rest of the club had a good year made it possible for me to get the award," said Robinson, who has just started a radio show of his own. "I feel that if your club didn't have a chance, three, you didn't have a chance."

"When I had a lot of doubts as to whether I could come back after my poor season in 1963, I was disappointed and didn't know why I had what was my poorest year."

"Gene Woodling, the coach, and I talked about my hitting and worked on a few things to improve it. I changed my bat from a 33-34 to a 32-33 and used a thicker handle. I sure appreciate the award and in a nutshell I was helped in winning it by the good season the Orioles had."

"I have said and done many things for which I am truly ashamed. I have criticized my teammates and my coaching staff unjustly. I am sorry."

Asked what he thought would happen to him at the end of the season, Cooke replied: "I don't know. It depends on a lot of things."

"I am going to abide by every rule of the club one hundred percent and concentrate only on one thing — to do my job as well as I can for the Buffalo Bills to the best of my ability."

At the hurriedly called press conference, he also apologized for placing the Bills "in such an awkward position."

"In the past," Gilchrist said, "I have apologized to Coach Saban, the finest gentleman and the best coach I have ever worked for," said the 29-year-old 160-pound rushing leader of the American football league. "He has agreed to have me returned."
