BOISE, March 4 (7)—A bill authorizing voters to divide a school district if the majority in the smallest portion and a majority of all the voters approve passed the senate yesterday by a 38-1 vote. The measure would help end a "six-year civil war" between north and south residents of a Frement county school district, said Sem. Harvey Schwendiman, B., Frement.

BOISE, March 4 (6—The Idaho senate repealed a tax yester-day—a special tax on express companies that a senator said yields only about \$435 a year. I doubt if this money pays for the cost of bookkeeping," said Sen. Arthur Murphy, D., Sheshone, "and I would point out that this is the senate's chance to repeal a tax." The repeal was approved 37-0.

BOISE, March 4 W.—The largest single spending item before the Idaho legislature—101.9 million dollars for highways passed the house yesterday and was ready for the general signature. The appropriation stirred little controversy because none of the money comes from the state's general fund. The measure authorizes funding of 38.9 million dollars from gas and oil taxes and lipense additional contributions to museling from the federal government in matching distincts. funds and 1.9 million dollars from counties and highway districts,

BOISE, March 4 III—A bill providing for a sweeping revision of the state board of education was introduced today in the Idaho house of representatives. Under the bill, the board would be expanded from five to seven members and would appoint an executive director. The executive director would sit as an ex-officion member of the board and the state board of regents and exercise administrative jurisdiction over the state's institutions of higher education. The duties of the state superintendent of public instruction would be limited to administration of public elementary and secondary school activities and he would be removed as an ex-officio member of the board of regents for the University of Idaho.
