The U. S. treasury is crowded into a corner where it must defend—now, at least—the price of silver at \$1.29 per ounce or see its money melted up for silver content.

Various proposals are being discussed. Reducing the silver content, now about 90 per cent of halves, quarters and dimes, is being used by western mining men. Others suggest-that silver western mining men. Others suggest that silves be given the boot entirely. Nickel (a Canadian 5-cent piece is pure nickel) has been proposed usually in combination with copper. 
