

New Land Laws Are Discussed at Hearing in T.F.

Provisions of new laws governing retention or disposal of public land were endorsed generally Friday morning by a dozen witnesses who testified at a hearing held in the American Legion hall by the department of interior, bureau of land management.

Senator Jordan's statement, read by his assistant, John Martin, Emmett, urged that "the task of classification of lands" be approached "with an open mind."

Annual Youth Legislature Starts Meet

BOISE, April 9 (AP)—Delegates to the annual YMCA youth legislature were called on today to "strive for our purpose" and "to shoulder our responsibilities and to reach a high goal for Idaho."

Joe T. Fallini, Boise, state director of the bureau of land management, gave a lengthy testimony in which he stated that public lands of the U.S. "shall be retained and managed or disposed of all in a manner to provide the maximum benefit to the general public."

He said the act "cannot be construed as restricting prospecting, locating, developing, mining, entering, leasing or patenting the mineral resources of the land," but that "actions inconsistent with continuing mining and mineral leasing are authorized by the act subject to certain requirements."

**SYNOPSIS AND AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY**  
Low pressure and stormy weather will continue to dominate this area today, Saturday and probably Sunday. Snow on the mountains with rain and occasionally snow in the lower valleys will be heavier in central and eastern parts of southern Idaho. Temperatures will be considerably cooler, particularly during daylight hours. Maximums today are expected to be in the middle 40s to middle 50s and mostly in the 40s on Saturday. Temperatures tonight will drop to the lower 30s. Little change in temperatures is expected for Sunday.

Rain or snow and wet soil will likely delay fieldwork, especially on heavier going through the week-end. Afternoon in most sections with high ranging from the middle to upper 50s in Magic Valley. Overnight temperatures were slightly warmer over much of the area with lows mostly in the upper 30s or low 40s. Measurable rainfall occurred over most sections in amounts of .15 to .25 of an inch, but only traces were reported in most of Magic Valley.

# FIVE-DAY FORECAST

Low pressure conditions will continue at the surface and aloft keeping temperatures cool and allowing recurring periods of rain and snow during the next five days.

It will be a wet and rather cold week with some further cooling in daytime temperatures and with snow on the mountains and rain or snow in the valleys in substantial amounts Saturday and Sunday. The weather will be cloudy with recurring periods of rain or snow through the first half of next week.

Temperatures Saturday through Wednesday will average at least four to eight degrees below normal with cool days and only slightly below normal nighttime temperatures. Normal maximum and minimum temperatures for this period are Gooding 62-35, Twin Falls 64-34 and Burley 61-32.

Precipitation will be above normal in all sections with amounts ranging from a trace to possibly half an inch or more in some parts. The larger part of this precipitation indicated to fall during the week-end. Below normal temperatures will lessen the danger of immediate heavy runoff from the mountains.

Slices will be cloudy much of the time with sunshine less than 50 per cent of possible with an average of 3 of the sky covered by clouds.

Wet soil will interfere with field work most of the period. Soil temperatures will show little gain and may cool slightly during the next two or three days.

Falls, president of the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association, an organization which has several hundred members in Twin Falls county, said his group gives its full and complete support of the multiple-use portion of the act.

"Rules and regulations to implement these principles of multiple-use should fully recognize the needs of fish and wildlife and accord them a high priority," Malberg declared.

He pointed out that fish and game have been under double pressure during the past 25 years. He said there are more people taking part in hunting and fishing, on the one hand, and fewer game preserves due to the demands of agriculture and development.

These developments, he noted, have caused game departments and other agencies to greatly improve game management techniques, but he stated that this is not sufficient to meet the demands of hunters and fishermen.

"It becomes apparent that in order to continue to furnish the public this healthful recreation and habitat must be preserved and developed and increased where possible," Malberg said, and declared that "on public lands administered by the BLM" rules for classification should give high priority to wildlife use of these lands and their suitability for wildlife habitat.

He urged that lands now used for fish and wildlife habitat be retained and that lands suitable for such usage be retained for that purpose.

A. J. Teske, secretary of the Idaho Mining association, said that for the mining industry the public lands are the "last frontier." He requested that regulations under the act be written and administered so that exploration and mining of public lands will be permitted until they are disposed of.

Ernest T. Day, Boise, representing the Idaho Wildlife Federation, said his organization generally endorsed the proposed rules of the multiple-use act. He recommended that some provisions be made for public access for hunting and fishing on lands disposed of for private development.

The proposals were endorsed by Bruce Bullard, Boise attorney, and by Robert L. Seiler, assistant director of the Idaho fish and game department, who was speaking for John R. Woodworth, director.

John Sanborn, Hagerman, former U.S. congressman, spoke for the Idaho Farm Bureau federation which he said is committed to "a policy of multiple-use."

He declared, "We urge the elimination of undesirable vegetation and reexamination of ranges and pastures." He said the Farm Bureau is interested in having public lands developed agriculturally.

"I feel the land should be made available for higher use and certainly agriculture is a much higher use than grazing," Sanborn declared.

A letter from the Camas Prairie, Rod and Gun club opposed the sale of recreation lands.

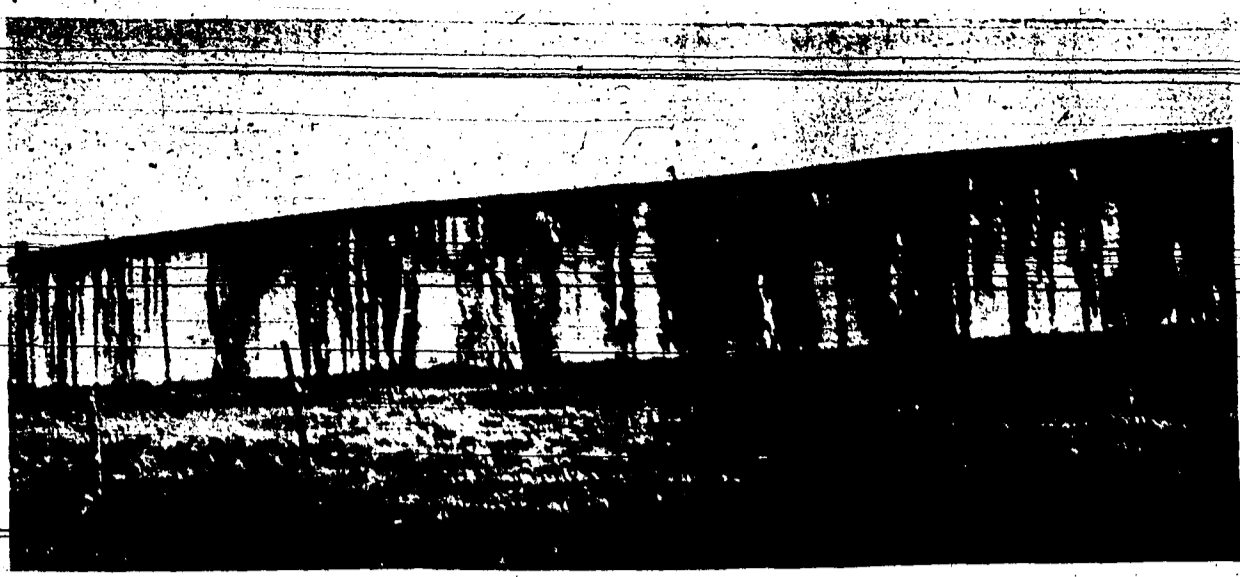

### T.F. Reservoir Inadequate To Supply Necessary Water

A five-million-gallon reinforced concrete reservoir, located about two miles south of the city limits on state highway 74, stores the water for Twin Falls. The maximum water level in the storage reservoir is such that water flows by gravity from the clear well at the water treatment plant to the reservoir.

Constructed in 1939, the open reservoir was a considerable improvement over the old earth reservoir just east of the filter plant, but many objections have been made in the past few years.

Morrison, Materie and associates, consulting engineers, Helena, Mont., noted that the reservoir should be covered for sanitary reasons. The uncovered reservoir is subject to pollution from dust, bird droppings and other sources.

There have even been reports of people swimming in the water. In addition, the engineers said the action of sunlight causes depletion of the chlorine and encourages algae growth.

According to the consultants' report, submitted in 1963, the existing reservoir lacks about one and one-half million gallons of the recommended storage for the recent population and is nearly four million gallons short of the design requirement for 1985 for fire reserves and peak hourly demands.

The five-million-gallon storage tank would not even provide enough water for one new large industry, according to H. L. (Herb) Derrick, city manager.

The consulting engineers for the proposed new water system have recommended the construction of a new five-million-gallon reservoir at Frontier tract to provide adequate storage for fire protection and variations in demand.

Under their plan the existing reservoir would be maintained as an essential part of the system, but it would be covered.

KING HILL, April 9—Denver Allred is convalescing at his home here in King Hill from injuries received in an accident on Mercury hill west of Glenns Ferry Tuesday afternoon.

Allred was hauling gravel for William and Dodge Construction company, Mountain Home, from a gravel pit in Pasadena Valley. He was returning from Mountain Home to the gravel pit when he started to pass another car on highway 30 west of Glenns Ferry. He saw that he couldn't pass so he slowed up and the 1965 Diesel International truck he was driving jackknifed on the slick pavement.

Allred was thrown out of the truck, which went into the borrow pit.

The gravel is being hauled to the Reddi-Mix Concrete company, Mountain Home. The truck was demolished, officers reported.

### Veterans Advised On Tax Policies

Practically all veterans' benefits are tax-free and need not be reported on income tax returns, Loryn E. Papan, director of the Boise veterans administration center, stated Thursday.

However, interest earned on GI life insurance dividends left on deposit with the veterans administration is not classed as a benefit, but earned income, and must be reported on tax returns. Both proceeds of the GI policy and the dividends are tax-free.

Other veterans' benefits not taxable are education and training allowances, subsistence payments to disabled veterans in vocational rehabilitation training, compensation and pension payments, grants to veterans for so-called "wheelchair" homes and motor vehicles, and all benefits to families of deceased veterans.

# NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON APR 9—Those bleeding heart knuckleheads in congress who seek to turn this into a country where any mumbly illiterate can vote apparently are to be taken in hand by the more responsible types among our lawmakers.

Now that the hysteria over President Johnson's voting rights speech has subsided, it seems to have dawned on Capitol Hill that we still have a Constitution and that the right to vote properly should be extended only to citizens who qualify. Johnson's proposal would include the registration of both Negroes and whites who can neither read nor write; let alone prove that they graduated from some primitive first grade.

**NO UNDERSTANDING NECESSARY**—It's all there, in section 3B defining the voting tests which would be prohibited under the administration bill. The phrase test or device shall mean any requirement that a person... demonstrate the ability to read, write, understand or interpret any matter, demonstrate any educational achievement or his knowledge of any particular subject, possess good moral character.

This is about as idiotic a rejection of reason as has ever been submitted to the congress, and God knows congress has debated some pips. As the law of the land, it would enfranchise cretins who not only would have no idea of whom they were voting for but would have trouble making a simple X on the ballot. It would create a fresh supply of voters for demagogues to march to the polls every election day.

**SOME CONGRESSMEN ALERT**—Fortunately for the public weal, such level-headed politicians as Illinois' Sen. Ev Dijken, Senate Leader Mike Mansfield and New York's Rep. John Lindsay have acknowledged the bill needs a head lock. While emphasizing the need for swift surgery to end discrimination against the Negro voter, these men yet are reluctant to hand over the nation to a horde of oafish imbeciles—black or white.

Apparently, lawmakers on both sides of the aisle have been apprised of some of the more illogical aspects of Johnson's bill, especially the section which says illiterates are eligible in some states but criminal in others. For example, Louisiana would be penalized because it has a literacy test and because only 47.3 per cent of all persons of voting age voted in the 1964 election. But Texas would be immune from punishment despite the fact only 44.4 per cent of its eligibles voted in 1964—because Texas does not have a literacy test.

**THREAT OF ANARCHY**—There is, too, the case of New York state, which has a literacy test demanding proof of an eighth-grade education. But New York is untouchable because more than 50 per cent of its eligibles voted in 1964. No one least of all this fault-finder will deny that some southern states have voter qualification tests to discriminate against the Negro. But anarchy is better than the congress decides to try any such vote who can get to the polls. At the minimum, a voter should be able to write his own name and perhaps recognize a few written words, like cat and rat. It would be nice, too, if he knew something about his country's system of government, but in this lunatic era I do not aspire to Utopia but merely seek to disqualify the most pathetic cases in the nation's insane asylums.

## Views of Others

**SCHOOLBOOKS AND INVISIBILITY**  
Six or eight years ago, at a meeting of American book publishers, the conversation at one table turned to textbooks. A publisher pointed out that he could not afford to bring out a textbook that did not have a chance of acceptance in more than one region of the United States. Others came up with examples of how the phrasing in books had been altered, or information omitted, or made unattractive for a region that had or might have objections.

"The first time a textbook contains a picture of white and Negro children in the same classroom," said one publisher wryly, "it will be a mistake." They all agreed that no textbook publisher, knowing the southern market, would print such a picture deliberately.

Now such pictures are being printed deliberately, even though one pioneering publisher is reported to have succumbed to pressures and produced a "de-integrated" version of its book for the South.

It is too early to say that the tide of realistic—or frightened—accommodation has been reversed. But gradually publishers seem to have raised the threshold of compromise. And, indeed, they now face growing public and educational pressure on the other side—that is, the side of representing Negroes accurately in proportion to their role in society.

The latter has also been the aim of efforts in movies, television, and advertising. Negroes have for too long been "invisible" in representations of American society. Negroes persuasively claim the effects can be subtly demoralizing.

The "invisibility" has extended to textbooks. Not only has it wrongly implied an inferiority on the part of Negroes. It has also made learning difficult for Negro children trying to learn reading, for example, in stories only about white children, remote from their own experience. White children, too, can hardly help suffering educationally from a schoolbook presentation of their world in which a significant minority is neglected.

Bureaucratic integration proceeds in actuality, it should be accurately reflected in the media of communication and in the books of the nation's schools.—Christian Science Monitor.

**ATTACK 'WASTELAND' OF TV**  
The chairman of the federal communications commission gave broadcasters a good recipe Tuesday for improving the quality of television programming: Educational television, free competition in the industry, and a carefully controlled degree of federal regulation. Since the ingredients are sound, one wonders why the FCC itself has bypassed one of them in its recent effort to reduce the stifling censorship of the TV schedules.

Free competition in the industry would permit wide-scale experimentation with pay television, which thus far has not received the support it deserves from the FCC. Instead, the commission—admittedly under heavy pressure—has tended to stand aside while the industry knocked down every attempt to give pay-TV a chance to try its wings.

The FCC now has decided that television could be much improved if more control over programming were given to the sponsor and less to the networks, and it has voted to reduce the degree to which networks can hold financial interests in program "packages." It will leave sponsors free to shop around among producers for the shows they want, but this was the way it was in the days when a former FCC chairman, Newton N. Minow, was referring to television as the "vast wasteland." As one critic has observed, putting the programs back into the hands of the advertisers is like rescuing the baby from a wolf and handing it over to a tiger.

The FCC now has before it an application of Zenith Radio corporation to establish a national network of subscription television stations. The application is sure to be opposed by the industry, and there are some doubts whether subscription television is the answer to the present moribund state of TV. But it offers a fresh approach to a problem that has not proved susceptible to the old ones.—Lewiston Tribune.

## Interpreting the News

WASHINGTON, April 9 (AP)—Spring is the vague time in Washington, that busy-busy-period when much is adding and little is finished, but few springs have been vaguer than this.

To begin with, President Johnson has four big proposals pending in congress: Medical care for the aged, federal aid to education, a voting bill to make sure Negroes can go to the polls, and some measure to curb the Ku Klux Klan.

But more vague than anything is the unfinished business in Viet Nam.

Johnson probably never expected to get medical care, aid to education and the voting bill, in precisely the form he asked, and he is not likely to "shirce" some revisions are inevitable after full house and senate consideration.

But it seems certain he will get all three in a form still satisfactory to him, and perhaps even more far-reaching than he requested.

All of which is a great tribute to his extraordinary ability to get congress to see things his way, an ability which involves personal meetings with most or all members of congress, personal telephone calls and messages, and visits from his aides.

If any president was able to get just one of those pieces of legislation through in any one year—say aid to education—it would be considered a great triumph.

But to get aid to education and medical aid through in this one year will be a dazzling performance.

The crackdown on the Klan is still in its baby stage if only because the house committee on un-American activities is going to investigate the Klan and not much in legislation can be expected until that is finished.

It is in Viet Nam that the country is left guessing and there are no prophets around glibly or confidently predicting the outcome there.

In the past few weeks there have been rumors around Washington—perhaps rumors is not as good a word as murmurs—that the North Vietnamese communists would like to start talking about a settlement.

But there is nothing definite—publicly known, that is—to indicate any such desire by the Reds who have been stoically under American bombing as one week of it follows another.

The bombing has had the obvious purpose of pressuring the North Vietnamese into seeking a settlement. As time goes by, and the Reds show no signs of bending, the Johnson administration's inclination to extend the bombing—ever deeper into North Viet Nam—seems sure.

At this time the Soviet Union and Red China, despite some grumblings and half-hearted threats, have been unusually quiet, too, and all this only adds to the guessing.

No one is pretending to know what Red China will do if the Americans, for instance, finally decide to bomb the North Vietnamese capital of Hanoi.

When all this is added up it comes down to phenomenal success for Johnson at home and a great, brooding uncertainty about what may happen overseas.

## The Doctor Says

Easter, coming as it does in the spring of the year, is for many persons a time of renewal and increased hope. You can make it a time of renewed hope for all—cripples of all ages by supporting the Easter Seal campaign.

Although most people know about the Easter Seal, few know about the work being done by the organization.

Medical science has provided preventive and curative measures for many diseases but in spite of these advances the number of persons in this country who are either crippled from birth (an estimated seven for every 100 births) or later through disease or accident has steadily grown.

One reason for this is the increase in the total population. Another is an increase in accidents in and around the home. This takes an especially heavy toll among the preschool children. Furthermore, medical advances themselves, by saving the lives of persons who would otherwise have died, have increased the number who are alive but crippled.

Our job as citizens is to see to it that these persons are not saved for a meaningless or helpless existence but are given a chance to realize their highest usefulness. The potentialities of our cripples are often amazingly great. The key to helping these persons lies in a single word—rehabilitation.

The many techniques of rehabilitation, although available for over 40 years have received a

Alaskans might well wonder how their own Senator Gruening would react to continued appeasement in Southeast Asia. It makes no more sense than an Eskimo horse opera and is as dangerous as a camel's kiss.

Many of us may forget the United States has a border on the Soviet Union. Alaskans don't. Russia's forces stand there breathing down every Henry J. Taylor Alaskan's neck. They're even closer than in Cuba.

The international date line in Bering Sea is the boundary. That was agreed to in the U.S.-Russian convention of 1867. It puts Russia's out island of Diomedes only 22 miles from Alaska's Seward peninsula. And today Diomedes reportedly bristles with red planes and missiles.

Actually red forces stand closer to the United States than they do to the Germans (93 miles) on the Rhine.

With world-destruction in its heart and head, communist imperialism operates on the principle of "divide et impera." Divide all allies, divide each country within itself, rely on the prestige of violence and then proceed to threaten the next place.

By sheer proximity, any red appeasement anywhere should be receipt for alarm in Alaska.

Backdowns only embolden the bully. We've had all the backdowns our nation can stand: President Kennedy's backdown in Cuba about on-site inspection and the withdrawal of Russian forces demanded in the 1952 "confrontation" of Communist Cuba.

There's a lesson in the fact that the U.S. has not been able to defend Russia's forces remain there two years after the President of the United States told the world that they must leave.

The backdown in Laos. The backdown about the Berlin wall. We'd become a nation that first shook its fist, then its finger and then shook its head.

The Viet Nam situation. President Johnson inherited it a direct result of this. Nearly anyone should know such a soft, soft slide to oblivion must stop and that appearances cannot forever overcome the facts. Well, time has now run out on this.

Walker Raps Opposition to Voting Bill

"Governor Smylie, the leader of Idaho's Republicans, has vigorously repudiated this right wing thinking and has taken a position with other responsible Republican leaders in the nation, Senator Jordan and Congressman George Hansen should make their positions as unmistakably clear by denouncing Mrs. Barnett and joining modern America."

Adequate pre-building geology surveys could have averted the disaster, he said. 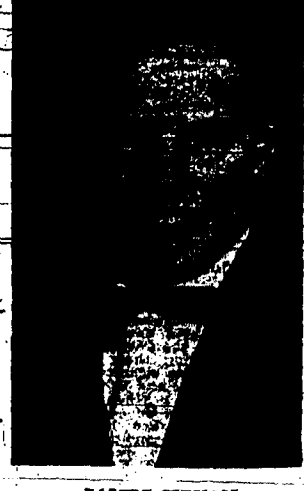

# Odors From Plant Cause Complaints

**RUPERT, April 9**—Members of the Rupert city council discussed plans for correcting the odorous conditions existing at the Rupert sewage treatment plant, during their regular meeting Tuesday at the city office.

Several complaints of the odorous conditions of the city and attention of the city and an investigation conducted by the state department of health indicates the problem is caused by the rapid breakdown of an organic material because of an overload causing rapid fermentation.

Waste from the Rocky Mountain Chemical plant has assisted in the overloading of the plant. Robert Hamilton of Hamilton, Robert Pocatello, made recommendations for getting the waste drain properly and suggested the effluent be checked periodically at the chemical plant to help control the effluent being placed in the city sewer.

He also offered to talk with officials of the plant to help enforce recommendations made through the state health department.

Laboratory analysis in the past shows the treatment facilities are capable of providing satisfactory treatment if operated correctly.

A letter was read from the state highway department authorizing the city to use a portion of the state storm sewer with the city standing any expense for material, cost of installation and labor on "A" street and Reed avenue.

The city had applied to the highway engineer recently to connect city storm sewer to existing state highway storm drains.

Council members saw TV pictures of sewer pipes and the methods used of seeing leakage and damage of lines. A follow-up of this program is scheduled later on with possible pictures of sewer lines with filtration.

George MacDonald, councilman, reported on plans under way in the county which would provide schooling for children of migrant workers coming into the area.

Purchase of a Dodge pickup truck at a cost of \$450 was approved by the council for use by the city dog catcher.

Announcement was made of a 12-hour school to be held in Burley on the proper way to handle accidents. The council approved sending a member of the police force to this school.

It was reported the drain line for the swimming pool at Neptune park has rusted and suggestion of a new drain on the V of the floor of the pool with a concrete covering was approved by council members.

A letter was read from William Schoen, manager of the Rupert city basketball league. Schoen thanked city recreation departments for cooperating in the tournament in Rupert and Burley and for the sportsmanship trophy donated to the league.

Bethor Gonzales, representing the El Cello Lindo cafe, received approval and continuation of a beer license, and Chester Dalpas received approval for an addition to a garage at an estimated cost of \$550.

# LENTEN GUIDEPOSTS . . . An Act of Courtesy

Last week a tiny elderly lady from Virginia visiting in New York asked me to help her shop for gifts to take back to her family.

After a tour of stores she remarked how courteous the salespeople were. But I noticed that in this rushed and noisy and often harsh metropolis it was her own courtesy that had induced courtesy in return.

When she spoke, softly and graciously, irritability vanished and voices turned gentle. Unconsciously, her manner influenced theirs.

Later in the afternoon, she asked to stop at my local dry-cleaner's. Here, I was sure, the ill-tempered manager would ruin her illusion that all New Yorkers were polite.

She wanted 24-hour service on a dress, a request which would normally send him into a small fury. But again, the little miracle occurred. "Anything for a lady," he said, and opened the door for us as we left.

So do simple good manners beget good manners. Most of us, though quite unaware of it, are imitative. We react—almost instantly to the spirit of the other person and take our cue from his behavior. Thus, when we are yelled at by a motorist, we retaliate. No wonder that at the end of a day nerves are raw and tempers hot. But it is all so needless even in the rush hours of a big city.

In London, for example, traffic is fully as tangled and hectic as in Chicago or New York, but a calmly agreeable mood prevails throughout the day. Rather than try to beat one another onto a busy people line up in orderly fashion, waiting their turn, and heaven help the rude old who tries to cheat. He is rarely rebuked, but the concerted chill of the British glance would freeze an Eskimo.

As a woman bus-conductor explained to me when I marveled at how smoothly this system worked: "We don't queue up just for buses, we do it at the green-grocers or any place that's busy."

I said "You've used courtesy to organize, to streamline. And it's such a gracious system."

"Well," she said practically. "I don't know how gracious it is, but it sure saves everybody time."

# Water Going Over Gates At Reservoir

**SHOSHONE, April 10**—Magic reservoir contains 177,000 acre feet of water and there is more than 3,000 second feet flowing out of both open gates and over the bottom of the spillway.

The spillway boards, which are five boards or five feet high, have been taken out as a precaution against any sudden inflow. So far this Magic reservoir water has not flooded any land to any extent. Most of the water is coming from Camas-prairie. Big Wood river above Magic is slightly above normal.

Board members for Big Wood Canal company announce water will be turned into canals and laterals about April 15 unless the recent rains postpone the demand for water.

Preparations are being pushed as fast as possible since the December flood left so many small projects that have to be repaired.

The board also announces water will be turned into the Miller-Gooding canal Saturday. Starting water now is going to be particularly difficult because weed burning has been curtailed by the recent rains. Water will be turned in as planned if at all possible.



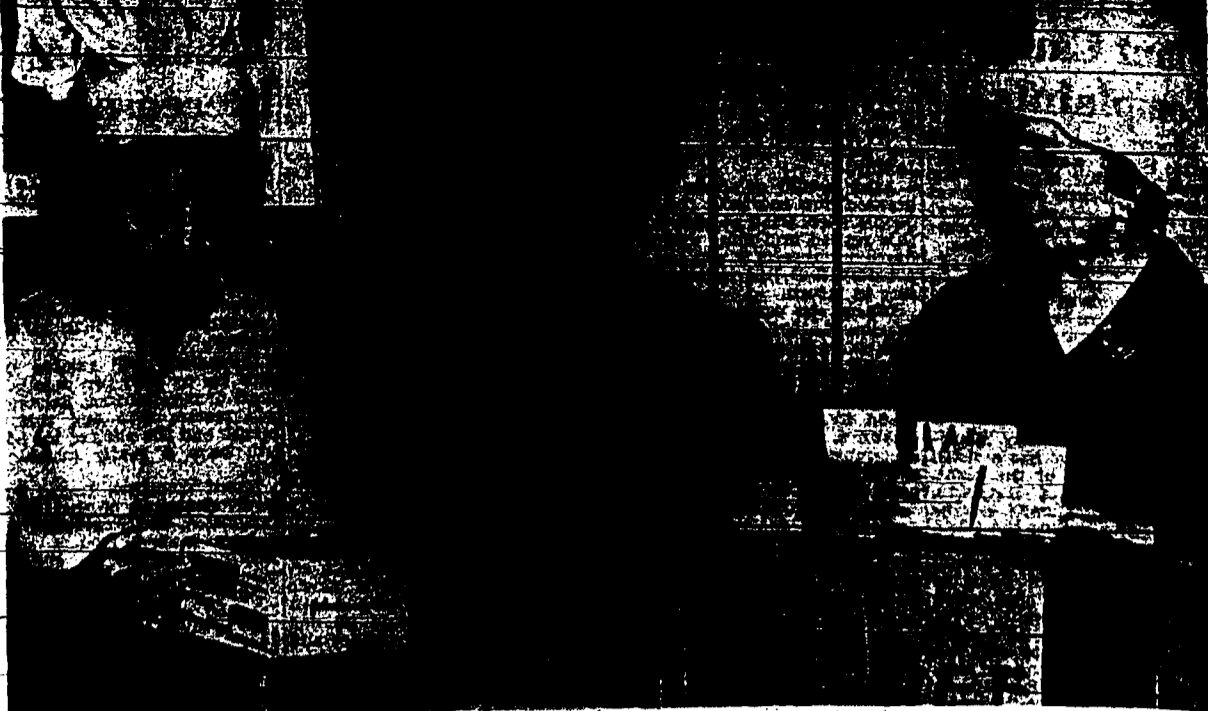

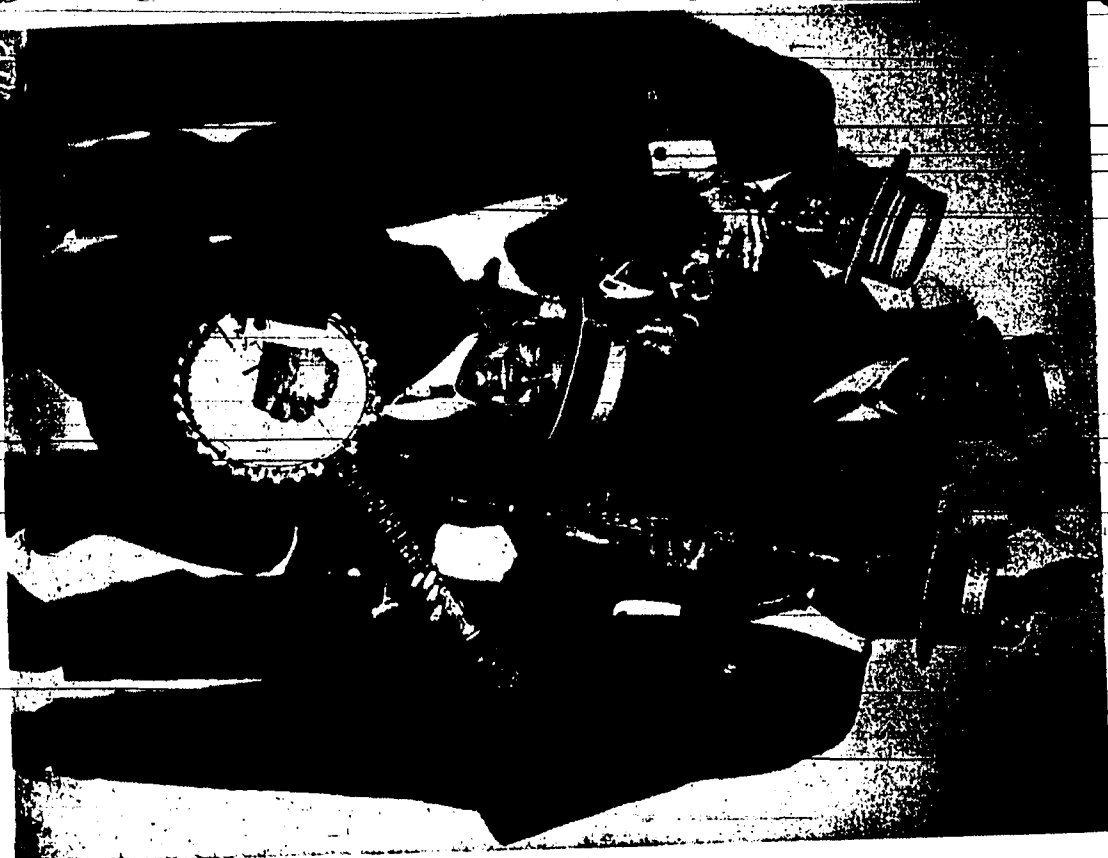

## Administration Farm Bill Is Not Long Range Answer

This conclusion is seen in the fact that the White House proposed that its new commodity legislation run only for two years. Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman and his aides at the department had hoped for programs of four years' duration. One farm official said it was apparent the plans are intended to "hold-the-line" while a blue-

ribbon study commission yet to be organized looks into long-range policy proposals.

Another official emphasized the administration proposals were not stopgap in character. He said administration planners believed conditions changed so rapidly that they want to be in a position to keep farm programs in step with current phases of the economy.

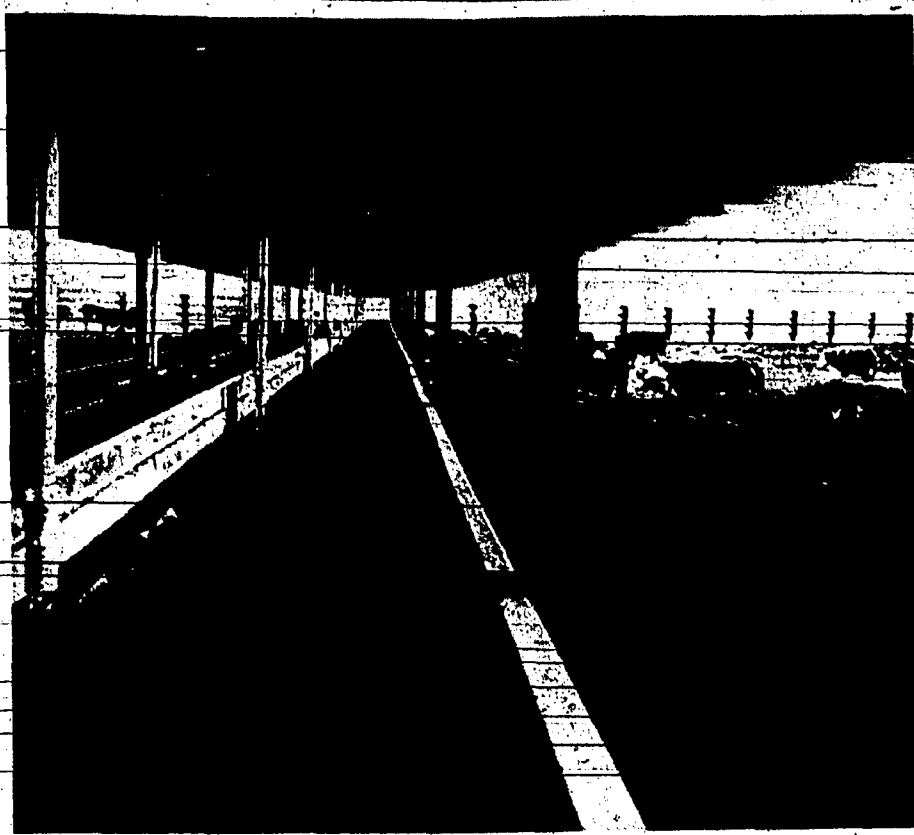

## Automated Cattle Feeding Installed by T. F. Farmer

Push button cattle feeding will become almost a reality for Willard Garrard, Twin Falls area farmer, who recently installed an automatic cattle feeding system built around two Harvestore structures.

In addition to the two large structures, Garrard has installed a programmer, mixing pit, a Butler building for grain storage and overhead augers to deliver the feed to the feed bunks. Garrard's goal is to fully control his feeding program.

It is one thing to harvest feed, stack it and feed it to livestock and then weigh out the cattle at the end of the season. It is another thing to know precisely what the cattle ate, what put on the gain and exactly how much it cost.

Under an automated system, the feeder knows just exactly how much feed is mixed and in what combination. Under an automated system it is possible to alter and change the feed ration depending on weather and other factors which affect livestock eating habits.

The big advantage is that an automated system is a labor saving system. It is also a cost saving system in that control usually goes hand in hand with proper storage methods.

## Potato Growers Reject All Contracts Processors Offer

RUPERT, April 9—Members of district six of the Idaho Potato Growers and Marketing association have rejected all growing contracts offered by the processors in the area by an overwhelming majority. It was announced today.

It is stated by the growers that any contract less than \$1.75 per hundredweight field run will not give the farmer a fair profit over cost of production on an average crop.

Keith Thomas, negotiating committee member, stated "There is no reason for processors here in Idaho to contract to California farmers for potatoes at \$2.50 per hundredweight for shipment to Idaho, and offer Idaho growers less than half that amount. If these processors can afford to pay this for California potatoes, they can surely pay Idaho growers the cost of production."

Joe Houska, Hazelton, district chairman, said that it would seem reasonable that processors could afford to pay local growers a fair price to keep them in business, when it appears these processors are forced to develop new land at high costs to obtain needed supplies of potatoes.

These processors are developing thousands of acres of new land in Elmore and Owyhee counties and planting potatoes there.

"It would appear that these acres are replacing acres formerly grown by farmers in this area, therefore, should we as farmers subsidize these processors by signing a less than cost production contract?" The time may come when this new land can no longer produce potatoes and they will need our land," Houska stated.

Freeman indicated this quantity would not require presidential action to invoke meat import quotas.

### Chamber Board Hears Plan To Aid Salmon Tract Water

Members of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce board of directors, Tuesday afternoon head Ellis Fuller and Leslie Jones representing the Salmon River Canal company, explaining the proposed supplemental water program for the Salmon tract.

The meeting was held in the Idaho room, Griggs hotel, and after the regular order of business the two men presented their program.

Jones told the chamber board members it appears the supplemental program is married to a proposal to rebuild or raise American Falls dam.

Should the bureau of reclamation decide to replace the dam at American Falls, it is likely an increase in upstream storage would furnish adequate water.

The Salmon tract would need a little more than 100,000 acre feet of water to adequately supplement the existing situation.

The proposal to rebuild the dam will not be put into the hopper for processing until the bureau and private companies finish studies and surveys. These studies should be completed this fall.

Fuller and Jones told the board members they have been pushing for stage development of the supplemental project. This is meeting some resistance, they said.

The proposed supplemental project would lift water from Milner and pump it into newly constructed canals which would start south of Kimberly. One of the big problems still facing the canal company is the method of pumping the water and power costs. This will have to be resolved when the project is authorized and money allocated for the job.

Fuller pointed out that it is almost impossible for a Salmon tract farmer to plan any kind of rotation program when the supply of water varies from year to year.

He noted that in a good year the tract will gross three and one-half million dollars. In a short water year the gross will drop two million dollars or more.

Local support is necessary and needed, said the two men, and this is the reason they are talking up the proposal.

The board of directors voted to send necessary letters to indicate the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce is supporting the move by the Salmon tract to secure additional irrigation water.

The board named a committee to coordinate the workings of the two groups.

...wheat as foreign consumers. The farm leader asserted. "Under the wheat certificate plan proposed by the administration, wheat prices would again be increased because processors would have to pay \$1.25 processing tax for every bushel of wheat that goes into domestic food use. There is need for action to help farmers get better prices in the market place, but it is quite another thing to ask consumers to pay higher food prices to perpetuate a program designed to keep producers dependent on government handouts."

The federation president said "certificate" programs for wheat and rice would have a "terribly destructive effect on the U. S. position in current trade negotiations with the European Economic Community."

"The President's proposal for a cropland adjustment program is unrealistic," Shuman said. And he added:

"A cropland retirement program superimposed on the current feed grain, wheat, and cotton programs would of course be doomed to failure. Fundamental changes must be made in the current programs for these commodities if cropland retirement is to be effective."

Shuman noted that the nation's largest general farm organization is supporting farm program bills introduced earlier this year by over 40 senators and representatives of both parties. "We are confident that our proposals for truly voluntary programs will be well received by farmers, and will be far less costly, much less complicated to farmers, simpler to administer, and much more effective than present programs," he said.

Shuman said the Farm Bureau, with its 1,647,000 member families in every section of the country, will oppose vigorously the administration's farm proposals "because they are inconsistent with the principles we support."

### Farm Bureau Blasts Administration's Program; Labels Farm Bill "Hoax"

CHICAGO, April 9—Charles E. Shuman, president, American Farm Bureau federation, said the administration's proposals for farm legislation are a "hoax" designed to trap both farmers and consumers.

"Without Johnson's farm proposals," Shuman said, "would make farmers more dependent than ever on government subsidies for their livelihood, and at the same time raise the price of food to consumers, especially those with low incomes."

Shuman called the President's farm bill a "Freeman-Brannan plan with a bread tax twist."

"It would be a market manipulator's dream," the federation president said. "The administration's bill would continue Secretary Freeman's authority to wreck markets by allowing government stock of grain."

"The secretary would be given even wider discretion than he now has to:

- Set price supports,
- Set the level of the "bread tax" and the "rice tax."
- Determine the amounts of rice, wool, soybeans, and other commodities that farmers would be allowed to produce, and
- Manipulate export prices of farm commodities."

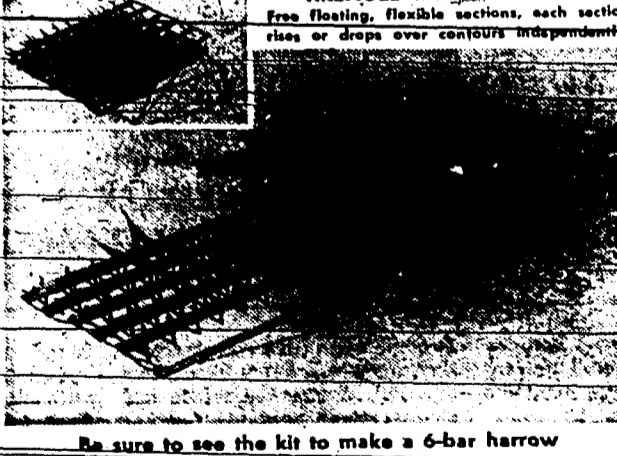

### Potatoes Used as Top Lure To Attract Buying Public

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, April 9—Potatoes and other produce items do a good job of bringing customers into the store. At least, food-store managers think so. They give produce more advertising space than it actually earns on the basis of total store sales.

Produce contributes about eight per cent to gross food store sales. In the 5,063 food ads analyzed, the produce department received nine per cent of the total advertising space. This is true in only one other department—meats—which contributes about 20 per cent of sales volume and receives 24 per cent of ad-space.

Potatoes are featured in ads more often than any other produce item and are more likely to be featured by themselves, the study shows. They were featured in 811 ads, they were the only featured produce item in 167—or about 10 per cent of the total ads studied.

The indication is, then, that store managers feel potatoes have enough consumer appeal to pull customers by themselves.

Overall, potatoes were included in more than 25 per cent of the ads, 1,535 of the 5,063. Most often, the stores advertised U. S. No. 1 grade in 10-pound bags. Red potatoes, russets and whites were mentioned most frequently.

Only 640 ads mentioned the state in which the potatoes were produced. But when a state was identified, Idaho was listed more than a third of the time. The only producing state close to this total was California, home state of two of the newspapers included in this study.

Potatoes are one produce item which still shows a traditional seasonal pattern. They are the most-featured item in January, February and April and rank second in March. In summer months, traditionally not good potato month, they are not featured as frequently but still are advertised frequently. It is significant that Idaho potatoes, identified as such, are featured in April, May and June, as well

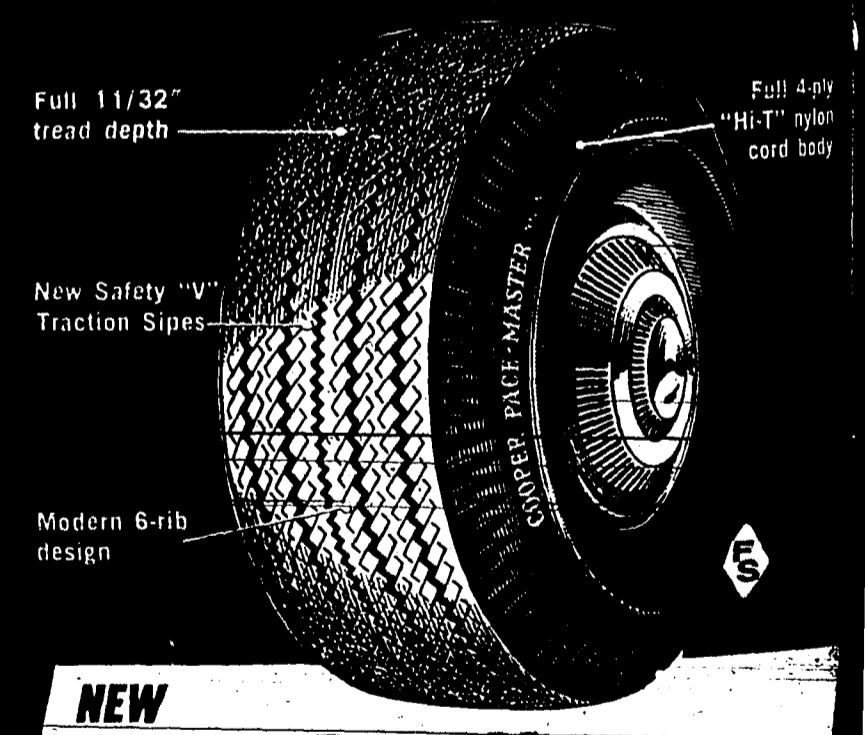

## Agriculture Official Eyes Africa as Undeveloped Market for U.S. Produce

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI)—The agriculture department is looking toward the African continent with its 57 countries and territories as a prime market for U.S. farm products.

There are numerous difficulties and hazards in Africa for the U.S. exporter. The roads are

not much. Modern transportation and storage facilities are not first class. There is a low density of population. Cultural differences are great. The average per capita income is about \$100 a year. There is political unrest.

David L. Hume, assistant administrator for export programs, foreign agricultural service, said that even so, returns could be high for the enterprising exporter with an eye toward the future. That would be the businessman who gets in on the ground floor in molding consumer tastes and building a reputation for efficient servicing of trade needs.

Hume does not count as an insurmountable barrier the fact that African countries have largely agricultural economies whose primary goal is agricultural self-sufficiency. This self-sufficiency may be a long way off, Hume said, and may never be obtained. He noted that France, the biggest farm producer in Europe, imports more than two billion dollars in farm products annually. Closer to home, the United States is the world's largest farm

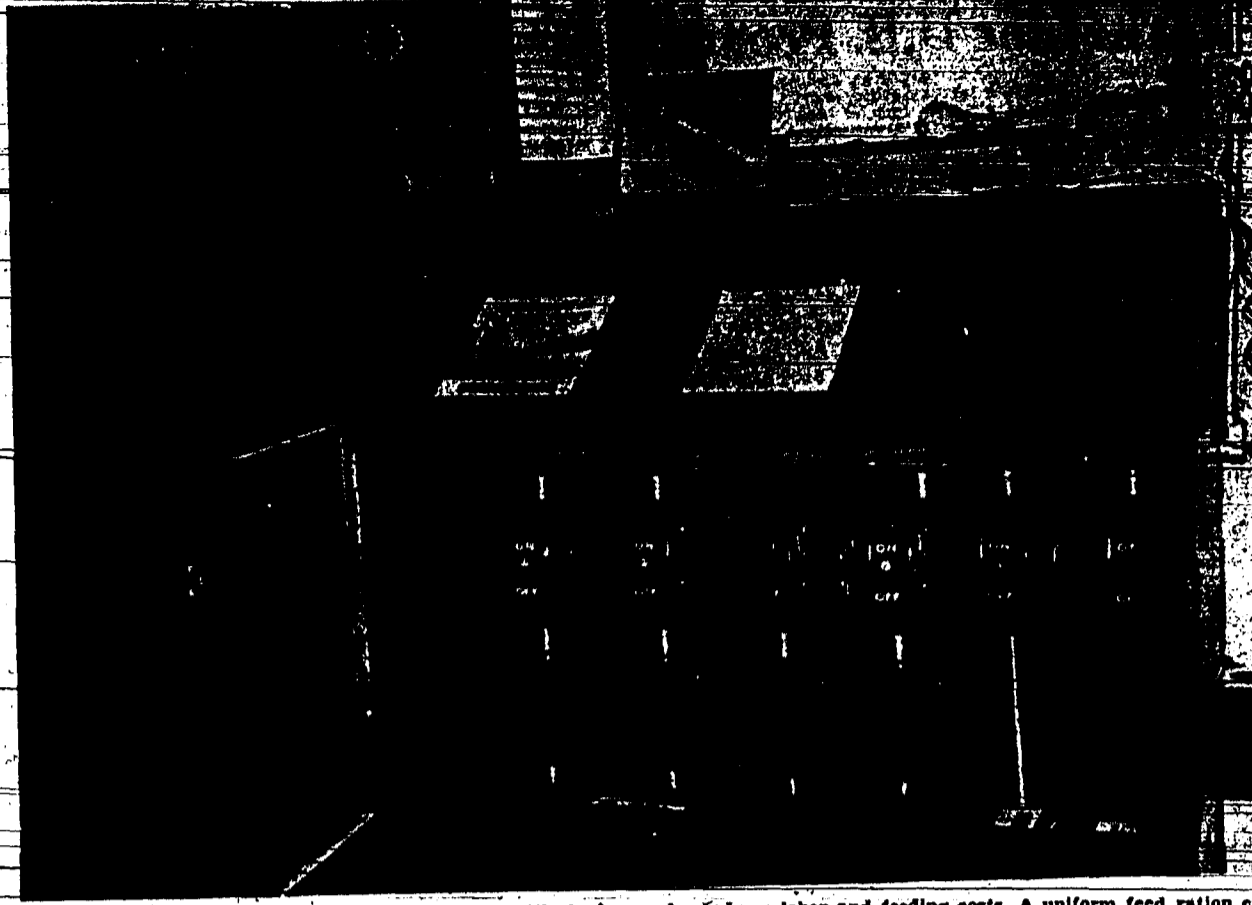

### Corn Rootworm Costs U.S. Farmers Untold Millions

CINCINNATI, April 9—One of the American farmer's most formidable insect foes is the corn rootworm. It has cost Corn Belt farmers untold millions in lost crops and reduced corn yields. The three species of rootworm (Southern, Northern and Western) feed on corn roots, denying the plant moisture and nutrients.

The adult beetles eat the silks, interfering with pollination. Since 1961, the Western rootworm has increased rapidly; its resistance to insecticides began to show up as early as 1959 in Nebraska. Where aldrin or heptachlor have been used in continuous corn for seven or more years, the rootworm is developing resistance.

An article in the last issue of the Farm Quarterly details the rootworm menace and the various ways of combating it. The article points out that fields which had no root damage last year, but were infested with adult Western corn rootworm beetles, may be infested with resistant rootworm this year, especially if some resistant populations were reported in the area.

In this case, it is recommended that the corn grower switch to one of the new organophosphate insecticides such as diazinon, Thimet, Parathion, Niran 10-G or Aldrex.

To determine if sidedressing applications of the organophosphate insecticides is necessary during the growing season, dig up several off-color or somewhat discolored corn plants about the middle of June and examine the roots and soil around them. Where eight or more larvae are found per plant it is a good bet that sidedressing applications of organophosphates will be profitable.

Experience has shown it is doubtful that these applications will do any good after June 24 in the mid-Corn Belt states or after July in the northern Corn Belt states.

According to the article, any practice which promotes good root systems such as proper fertilization and thorough seedbed preparation will provide some defense against all rootworms.

Farmers are urged to plant as early as possible so roots will get a headstart on the rootworms. Earlier silking also prevents heavy adult beetle damage.

Hilling up corn plants gives brace roots better anchorage. Sidedressing with about 60 pounds of actual nitrogen in so-

### Early Lamb Crop Appears Larger, Says Economist

BOISE, April 9 — Idaho's crop of early lambs is larger this year than in 1964 because more ewes lambed early and produced a higher percentage of twins, Wayne Robinson, marketing information economist of the University of Idaho extension service, said in the April issue of "Economic Facts for Idaho Agriculture."

Weather was favorable during most of March. Wet days and flooding in several areas during December and January did not cause serious reduction in numbers of Idaho sheep.

In contrast with Idaho, the number of early lambs in several leading sheep states is estimated to be two per cent below last year. They had fewer ewes at the start of the season and a smaller proportion of ewes lambing early.

Feed supplies for sheep and lambs are considered adequate in nearly all states, including Idaho. Reports have suggested a favorable outlook in 1968 and for another two or three years, Robinson said. "The forecast is based on reduced U.S. slaughter

### New Record Is Set With Soybean Crop

WASHINGTON, April 9 — The foreign agricultural service said the world soybean production was a record 1.1 billion bushels. This was three per cent larger than the previous record in 1963 and 20 per cent above the 1955-59 average.

Early lambing calves and lambs were small because of favorable weather.

Turning to another agricultural field, the economist said prices of dry beans have gone up sharply since harvest. Idaho is a bean-producing state. Pintos have advanced the most, but small reds and flat small whites have also gone up substantially.

The major reason is a short crop throughout the world. It is 30 per cent below 1963. On the other hand, the world crop of peas—another Idaho crop—is 10 per cent larger than a year ago.

Sheep in the community band belong to Leon Baird, Earl (Tuff) Baird, David Baird, Max Barton and Cloyd Baird.

A band of yearlings belonging to Pete Canarrusa also have left for the desert.

### Breadgrain Production Sets Record

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI) — Estimates show world breadgrain production in 1964 at record 309 million tons, up 10 per cent, or 27 million tons, from 1963.

The record breadgrain output was made up of 9.17 billion bushels of wheat and 1.23 billion bushels of rye. These harvests compare with 8.31 billion bushels of wheat in 1963 and 1.18 bushels of rye.

The USSR was the largest producer of the two grains, — 10 billion bushels of wheat and 1.5 billion bushels of rye.

### Cooperation Results in Herd Change

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI) — More than 400 graceful pronghorn antelope have survived the hard northwest winter, thanks to federal-state cooperation, the department of the interior said today.

A few weeks ago, herds of the little animals were plodding through hip-deep Montana snow, scouring farmlands for food, nuzzling and pawing ice-crustered fields for scraps of sustenance. Some died. The others neared starvation.

Today, the survivors are flourishing in a kinder habitat. Their new homes on the range are on the domain lands farther back.

The antelope were driven south from Curdsville by one of the bitter winters on record. Death stalked them in the areas near Brook and Malta, Mont., where hunger halted their migration. There they gathered last January to fight a losing battle for survival, and there they were discovered by agents of the Montana fish and game commission. The commission decided to transplant them, and the most likely spot was public rangeland south of Malta, where the snow depth was less and the natural vegetation more ample. A quick agreement was reached with the interior department's bureau of land management, and the roundup began.

Using planes, helicopters and rifles, BLM and state hands teamed up to drive the animals to trap nets. Then they loaded them into trucks. About 125 antelope were taken into Utah, to be established in new herds on open federal and state range. The majority were set free in eastern Montana grasslands to add their color to the range.

Antelope were once nearly as plentiful as bison on this continent, but by the turn of the century their numbers were very low. The herds are now replenished, and the species out of danger, but the memory of depletion moves resource managers to emergency acts of mercy.

### Total Grain Supply Hits Year-Low

WASHINGTON, April 8 (UPI)—The total grain supply in the principal exporting countries on Jan. 1 was the lowest in the past seven years, according to the foreign agricultural service of wheat, rye, barley, and corn in the four countries were estimated at 242 million tons. This is 17 million tons less than the supply on Jan. 1, 1964, and 36 million tons lower than the record supply of 283 million tons of the five grains. In addition to the five grains, the United States had stocks of 1.1 million tons of sorghum grain. The U.S. total for the five grains on Jan. 1 was 173 million tons, or 10 per cent lower than a year earlier. Total grain stocks in Canada were 37 million tons, 1.4 million less than a year earlier. Argentina grain supply, at 1.5 million tons, compared with 1.3 million tons, a year earlier. Australia's grain stocks totaled 1.1 million tons, against 1.2 million tons a year earlier.

### Beef Grades Revision Set by Secretary

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI)—Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman has announced that beef grades will be revised to reflect more accurately consumer preferences. The principal effect of the action will be to reduce the amount of fat or marbling, which has long been considered a factor in determining the grade of beef. Freeman said the agriculture department is instituting a program and optional standard which can be used to determine the amount of closely trimmed fat cuts of meat that a beef carcass can produce. These revised carcass and cutability standards are scheduled to go into effect June 1.

### Farmers Are Increasing Credit Use

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI)—Farmers and ranchers are increasing their use of mortgage credit at an accelerated rate, as indicated by reports from the presidents of the 12 farmer-led federal land banks at their semi-annual conference in Denver. Glenn Browne, deputy governor and director, land bank credit, farm credit administration, said the farmers had 3.8 million dollars in long-term mortgage loans outstanding from the land banks on Feb. 28, an all-time record.

The presidents reported several reasons for the brisk demand for farm mortgage credit. "Most frequently mentioned causes were farmers' efforts to modernize their farms and enlarge their acreage by buying more land to make more efficient use of heavy equipment," he continued. "Other factors were farmers' efforts to balance their long and short-term credit (long-term credit is usually cheaper than short-term), and replacing or remodeling farm homes, barns and other farm buildings. Farmers were also shifting the land banks from other sources, as farmers borrowed additional funds in order to gain right to pay off their loans any time without penalty," he commented.

The conference here ended with the presidents went to New York City to meet in connection with their plans for the sale of bonds to finance bank lending operations. Their next issue will be offered to the public in April. Browne emphasized that the banks borrow their lending funds from investors without any government guarantee.

### Program Is Pepped up

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI)—Pepped-up domestic food demand during the first half of the fiscal year were reported by the U.S. department of agriculture — a 10 per cent increase over the same period a year ago. Schools received 23 per cent more, not counting food purchased by consumer and setting service especially for the national school lunch program. Dairy product donations to about 250 million pounds which 84 million were butter, 11 million cheese, and 85 million pounds of dry milk. About half of the butter went to schools.

### Secretary Says Farmers Should Get Boost at Market, Not From Government

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI)—Agriculture Secretary Orville L. Freeman said the farmer should increase his income by getting a bigger return from the marketplace rather than from government subsidies. The secretary conceded that this philosophy may be criticized by some as harmful to the consumer. But he said that when the American public realizes that farm prices have been dropping while the cost of living has been going up, it "will support the desire of the family farmer to get a fair return."

He said that in the same period, the cost of living has gone up 15 per cent. Freeman appeared before the committee to discuss the president's farm bill submitted to congress this week. The legislation would extend current wheat and feed grain programs, and add a price support system for rice similar to what now in effect for wheat. The bill also would continue a wool subsidy program and provide for a long-term cropland adjustment plan. Freeman said the effect of proposed higher returns to farmers from the marketplace for wheat and rice would increase the cost of these foods about \$1.87 a year per person. He said all economic signs sug-

gested that "there will be no hardship because of the commodity programs we are proposing today." Several committee members were critical of the farm plan during questioning of Freeman. Rep. Charles M. Teague, R., Calif., said the bill was inadequate because it did not propose enough help for the small farmer. He said he was "distressed" because the bill did not deal with sugar beets or the farm labor problem. "The large farmers are going to come through this all right," Teague added. But he said that many small farmers may go bankrupt if they suffer a sharp drop in income. Committee chairman Harold D. Cooley, D.-N.C., told newsmen later he thinks the administration proposal for higher domestic wheat prices will "not be too controversial." But Cooley said he expected considerable controversy over some other sections of the administration's new omnibus farm bill — particularly those dealing with a 40 million-acre land retirement program and provisions allowing farmers to lease or sell their federal acreage allotments.

### Spokesmen Urge Congress To Reject Dairy Program

WASHINGTON, April 9 (UPI)—Spokesmen for two major farm organizations urged congress to reject a bill to allow dairy farmers in federally-regulated milksheds to adopt a new pricing system designed to discourage over-production. Officials of the National Milk Producers federation, however, appealed for approval of the bill at a hearing before the house dairy and poultry subcommittee. Under the proposed system, farmers in milksheds where wholesale prices are regulated by federal marketing orders could be assigned production "bases." A base would represent a farmer's individual share of the local market for bottling milk. Farmers would be guaranteed comparatively high prices for milk they delivered within their base allocations. All milk delivered in excess of the base would be sold at a relatively low "surplus" price. The plan could be used only in milksheds where

it was adopted by vote of the local dairymen. An American Farm Bureau federation spokesman, Percy Hardiman, Madison, Wis., president, told the house subcommittee the pricing plan "could reverse the trend toward higher dairy farm income." Reuben L. Johnson, a National Farmers Union official, contended the bill would do little to boost farm income unless it was amended to cover dairymen who produce "manufacturing" milk, which is used in butter and other dairy products. The National Milk Producers federation contended it would merely authorize a new method of distributing milk income among dairy farmers, and would "in no way increase the price of milk to consumers or add to the tax burden."

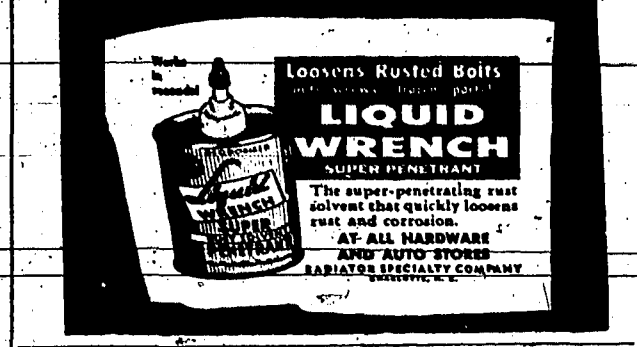

### March Price Index Climbs

BOISE, April 9—During the month ended March 15, the Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Feed advanced two points to 86 per cent of its 1947-49 average, reports the crop reporting service. The March index of this year is the same as the March index

of a year earlier and is three points above average. Compared with a month earlier alfalfa hay led the increase as prices paid for this commodity were \$1.50 above those paid in February. Cottonseed meal, 41 per cent, and scratch grain were the only commodities with lower average prices. Compared with a year earlier increased prices for cattle and hog feed were equally offset by a general decline in poultry feeds.

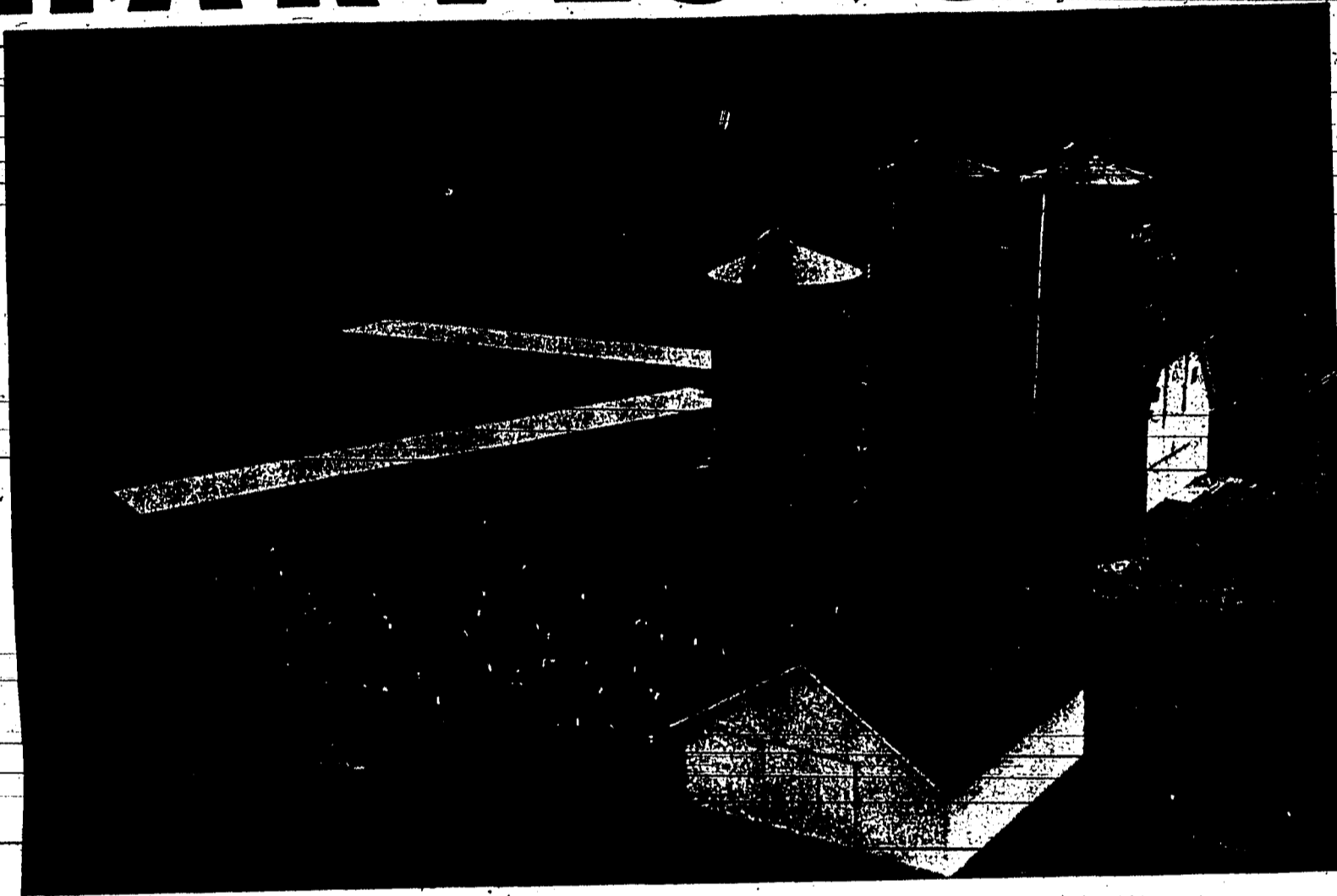
