Officials of the National Milk Producers federation, however, appealed for approval of the bill at a hearing before the house dairy and poultry subcommittee. Under the proposed system, farmers in milksheds where wholesale prices are regulated by federal marketing orders could be assigned production "bases." A base would represent a farmer's individual share of the local market for bottling milk.

Farmers would be guaranteed comparatively high prices for






