## T.F. Water Bond Issue Approved

Twin Falls residents approved a \$2.5 million water bond issue Tuesday opening the way for a new source of water and improvements to the city water system. Official results from the five wards gave the issue a 67 per cent majority for the bond with 1,992 voting for the proposal and 606 casting ballots against it. Armour Anderson, chairman of the TWIN (Talk Water Improvements Now) Committee, which boosted efforts to pass the issue, said "I am very pleased with the outcome and the faith of the citizens in following out recommendations of the city commissioners."

## New County Zoning Study Law in Effect

A new law went into effect Tuesday requiring each board of county commissioners to appoint a zoning commission to study county zoning. Twin Falls County Commissioner Morris Carlson said the new law applies to all counties in the state, regardless whether they have had an action or previously appointed a commission.

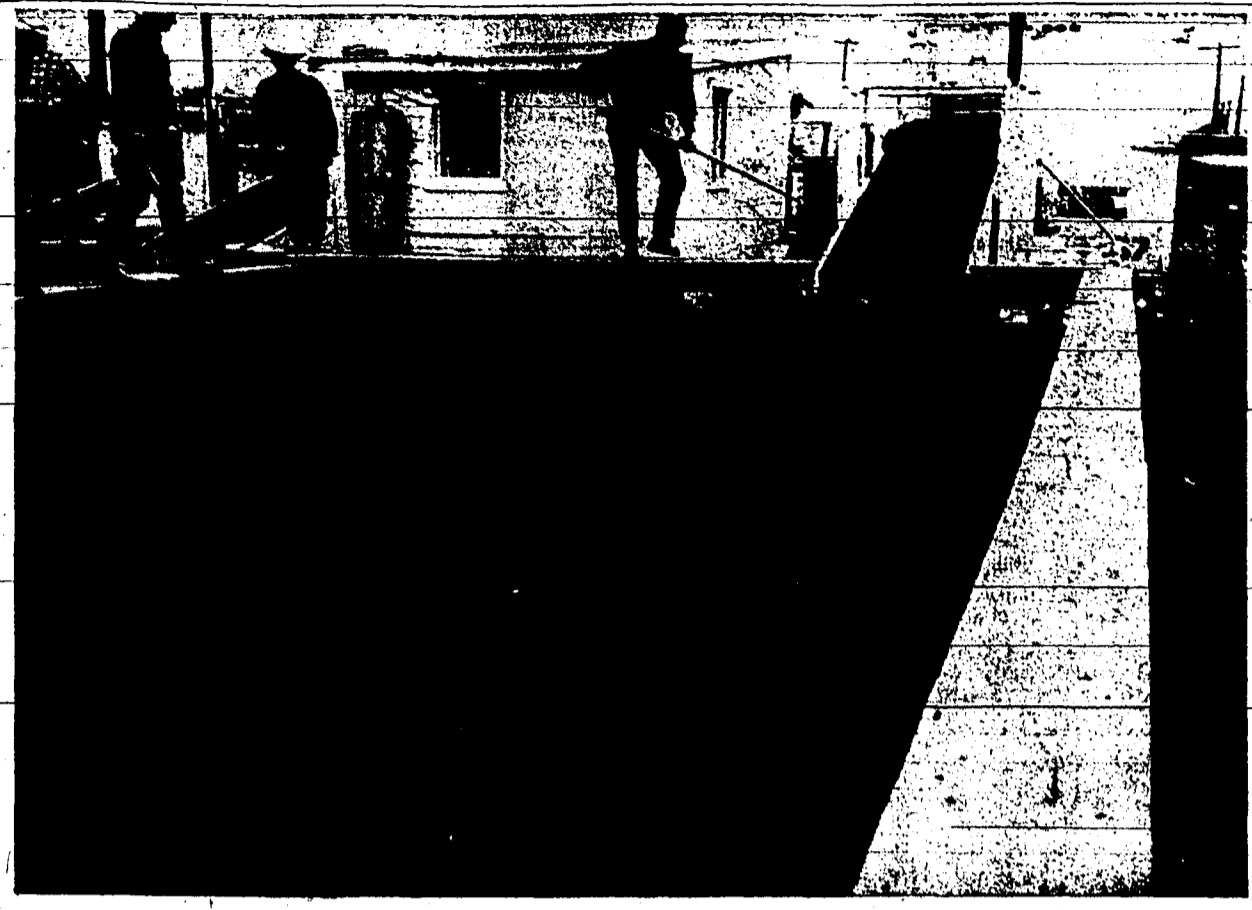
## Runoff Vote Is Planned For Elmore

GLENN'S FERRY — Plans were being made Wednesday for a runoff election for Elmore County voters to determine which of three proposals they want for the county secondary road system. In Tuesday's voting none of the three proposals received a majority vote, with three precincts, Atlanta, Grand View and King Hill, still to report. Results were not available from these areas Wednesday, according to officials at the county auditor's office in Mountain Home. Proposal No. 3, which would set up a maximum of six separate districts independent of the county commission, received the heaviest vote of 468. Proposal No. 2, which would place the system in one highway district independent of the county commissioners, 180 votes. The first proposal, which would place all administration with the county commission, received 419 votes. More than 1,000 county residents voted on the question Tuesday. The secondary road system is presently controlled by three highway districts and the Elmore County Commission. Plans are under way to hold an election on the most favored proposals, No. 1 and No. 3, within the next 30 days, officials said.

## New Trustee Election Set At Richfield

RICHFIELD — Residents in three zones of Richfield School District No. 316 who voted Monday night in a school trustee election will get to cast ballots again, it was announced Tuesday by Supt. S. R. Briggs. A new election was scheduled for June 9 after an error was discovered in the number of votes cast Monday in two zones and it was found that the polls closed an hour earlier than the announced time. Briggs said he conferred Tuesday with D. F. Engelking, state superintendent of public instruction, and with the attorney general's office to obtain a ruling on the discrepancy.

The school board canvassed the votes Monday night and found that 10 votes had been cast in zone No. 1, where only 200 voters had been signed up. In zone No. 2 there were 29 votes and 30 affidavits. Briggs said posting of the election will begin Wednesday. Three trustees will be elected in zones 1, 2 and 3. Petitions will be required to place names on the ballots. Briggs said he conferred with trustee candidates in zone No. 1, where the difficulty arose, and they decided to abide by the opinion. They were incumbent Clifford Conner, whose name appeared on the ballot and received 14 votes, and Bishop Jay Ward of the Richfield LDS Church, who received 15 votes. A special school board meeting was held Tuesday night to canvass the election.

## NRA Hit for Using Misleading Arguments on Firearms Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Johnson administration today opened its fight for a bill to curb mail-order traffic in guns with a charge by Atty. Gen. Nicholas Katzenbach that the National Rifle Association has used "misleading" and "preposterous" arguments against the measure. Katzenbach, lead-off witness before the Senate Juvenile Delinquency subcommittee, devoted a considerable part of his prepared statement to a point-by-point rebuttal of NRA objections to the legislation.

## Amended Rivers Act Assured at Hearing

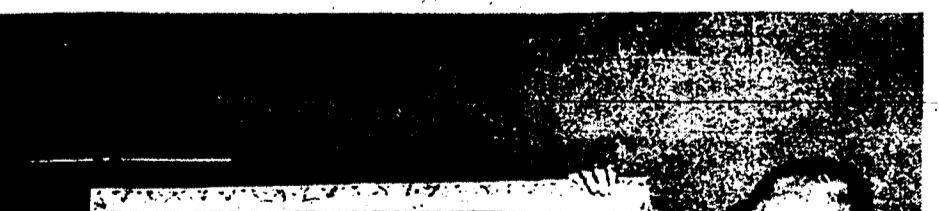
BOISE (AP)—Opponents of the proposed federal Wild Rivers bill were assured Tuesday that the measure would be amended to clear up vague language and to protect property rights of landowners along the affected streams. That assurance was given by Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, during a Senate Interior subcommittee hearing in Boise at which more than 40 persons testified, the majority in opposition to the bill. Idaho streams that would be maintained in their natural state under provisions of the bill are the main stem of the Salmon from North Fork to Riggins, all of the middle fork of the Salmon, the middle fork of the Clearwater and its Loscha and Selway tributaries.

## Jerome Man Injured in 2-Car Crash

JEROME — A 50-year-old Jerome man was listed in poor condition Wednesday at St. Benedict's Hospital after a two-car collision about 8:30 p.m. Tuesday eight and one-half miles southeast of here on U. S. 93. Jay Armenta, 50, Jerome, is hospitalized with serious head injuries. William Albert Eiden, 73, Dillon, Mont., was reported in satisfactory condition and Armenta's son, Charles, 13, was treated and released. Jerome County Sheriff James Burns said Armenta was driving a 1954 Chevrolet south on U. S. 93 with his son as a passenger. He had stopped to let the oncoming traffic pass by before making a left-hand turn into the driveway of the Virgil Lickley home. Burns said Armenta apparently did not see the northbound 1963 Ford driven by Eiden.

## Bombing of Red Targets Continuing

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — Forty U.S. Navy planes destroyed three military barracks today and inflicted heavy damage on other installations in the second consecutive day of air strikes against North Viet Nam, a U.S. military spokesman said. The spokesman said the aircraft from the Carrier Coral Sea struck at two target areas 40 miles north of the demilitarized zone separating North and South Viet Nam. The raid was the second in 24 hours after a six-day suspension of air strikes against the Communist North. Speculation grew that the United States may broaden the air attacks.

## Rocket Orbits 8 Satellites, Paper Reveals

NEW YORK (AP) — The United States secretly launched eight military satellites into orbit with one rocket last March 9, the New York Times said today. This was the greatest number of payloads ever put into space with one booster by this country and it is believed to exceed any multiple launching made by the Soviet Union, a Washington dispatch said. The story also said in part: The satellites were launched by an Air Force Thor-Agena rocket from Vandenberg Air Force Base in California. They were pushed apart from each other by metal springs, a simple technique first used by the Navy's Vanguard satellite launcher in 1958. The satellites are circling the earth in orbits ranging between 581 and 585 miles high. A similar technique will be used by the Air Force several times next year to put eight military communications satellites into orbit at one time from a single Titan-3C rocket.

## U.S. Rocket Explodes in Test Flight

WHITE SANDS MISSILE RANGE, N.M. (AP) — A Little Joe H rocket exploded in flight shortly after launch today, ending in a failure a severe high altitude test of a safety system for moonbound astronauts. National Aeronautics and Space Administration spokesmen said the explosion occurred about half way through the mighty rocket's first burning period of 40 seconds. A malfunction in the autopilot guidance control system caused the Little Joe II rocket to spin excessively and then break up, spreading burning debris across the sky, a National Aeronautics and Space Administration spokesman said. Dr. Joseph Shea, director of the project Apollo program, said the failure probably wouldn't have any serious adverse effect on plans to land Apollo astronauts on the moon by 1970. The test was the fifth in a series of firings at this southern New Mexico army test range to determine how safe astronauts would be should a malfunction occur in their giant Saturn booster during launch toward the moon. The 14-ton space capsule, which was to have been pushed by the rocket to 20 miles above the desert floor, floated down safely under three 84-foot parachutes. Shea said that if astronauts had been inside, they would have survived. The major test objectives, however, weren't met, he said. Four previous firings of the rocket at White Sands were successful.

## Junta Takes Over Rebel Radio Station

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic (AP) — Troops loyal to the civilian-military junta occupied the main rebel radio station today and insurgent resistance in northern Santo Domingo appeared to have collapsed. Units of the Dominican Air Force police moved into the silent Santo Domingo radio station this morning after a brisk exchange of fire with snipers in nearby buildings. The junta, scenting victory in the civil war, turned down Tuesday night a U.N. appeal for a cease-fire which the rebels were ready to accept. Troops loyal to the junta appeared to have control of more than half the industrial-suburban area north of the east-west corridor established by U. S. troops leading to the international zone for refugees. The main rebel stronghold lies south of the corridor.

## Crater Erupts

CATANIA, Sicily (UPI) — Mount Etna's central crater spewed rock and ash several thousand feet into the air Tuesday. Volcanologists said it was too early to assess the eruption threat.

## Need to "Build" Cited at T.F. Visit By Kiwanis International President

EAST ST. LOUIS, Ill. (AP) — Police are questioning eight boys, none over 13, in an attempt to find out exactly how much money the children found while they were digging through a trash pile.

Police said they recovered \$3,000 in \$50 and \$100 bills Tuesday. The investigation began Monday. The food store operator saw an 11-year-old boy drop a \$100 bill. The operator called the boy's mother, who phoned police.

The children told police they found the money at the home of an elderly sister, Florence, and Margaret Graney, who died in March.

Four boys said they found the money and shared it with four friends. Two of the boys told police they had bought new bicycles. Another said he gave a friend \$120.

### Straw Destroyed In Eden Blaze

EDEN — A call was received about 10:15 a.m. Monday by the First Segregation Fire Department to the Chester Jarvis farm located two and one-fourth miles south of Eden, where a burning straw stack threatened surrounding buildings and corrals.

High winds contributed to the blaze in which about 500 bales of straw were destroyed and a corral fence damaged. Cause was attributed to bales of straw too close to an electric fence, according to Fire Chief Milton Cunningham.

### Mont Blanc Tunnel Linking Italy, France Opens in July

COURMAYEUR, Italy (AP) — Six years of backbreaking toil by French and Italians deep under Europe's loftiest peak will be crowned in July with the opening of the Mont Blanc Motor Tunnel.

The passageway linking Italy and France will be in full operation in time for much of the peak summer tourist traffic, speeding vacationers along its smooth 7.2-mile surface in just over 10 minutes. It will cut more than 60 miles off trips between some Italian and French cities — and provide a new all-weather Alpine route.

The jagged spine of the Alps already has been pierced by modern highway engineering. The great St. Bernard Tunnel, 3.7 miles long, was opened a year ago on the Italian-Swiss border.

The Mont Blanc Tunnel means one more time-cutting and trouble-saving ground transport link in the fast-shrinking geography of modern Europe.

Technicians employed in the final stages of preparation have conquered formidable problems of ventilation in the long tunnel 11,400 feet below the snow-covered peak of the 15,771-foot mountain.

Powerful ventilating stations at each mouth—one outside of Courmayeur in Italy and the other near the French resort city of Chamonix — will pump fresh air through the expanse while simultaneously sucking out deadly exhaust fumes through ducts placed beneath

**Two Rescued  
After 32  
Days at Sea**

MANILA (AP)—An American and his son, given up for lost after their raft drifted away from Guam, have been rescued 1,400 miles from home after 32 days at sea.

Frank H. Cushing, 63, a former aviation stuntman, and Frank Jr., 20, were sighted by a police patrol boat Monday off Camiguin Island, north of the Philippine Island of Luzon. Police at first thought they were smugglers.

The Cushings were on a 20-foot raft made of oil drums, using an improvised sail made of blanket and parachute cloth.

The constabulary's northern zone headquarters reported today that both were well. Their provisions and clothes were still intact despite their ordeal.

The two men, who live on Guam, told their rescuers they were searching reefs around Guam for rare fish for young Frank's collection. They anchored off Puto Point on the night of April 15. While they slept, strong currents pulled the raft out to sea.

They woke to find themselves lost.

The U.S. Navy made a search but couldn't find them.

The Cushings drifted all the way to the Philippines over one of the world's most deserted stretches of ocean. The raft was making about 3 knots when it was sighted.

Cushing's wife, Marjorie, had written to the Manila Times appealing for help in finding her missing men. Today the paper's publisher, Joaquin P. Roces, cabled her: "Your husband and son in good health, now on way Manila."

Cushing formerly lived in the Philippines and is well known here. His brother, the late Col. James Cushing, was a guerrilla leader against the Japanese here in World War II.

**Rusk Sees Dilemma in U.S. Relations  
With World's Underdeveloped Nations**

WASHINGTON (NEA)—Secretary of State Dean Rusk sees a basic dilemma in U.S. relations with the world's underdeveloped nations.

These countries in Asia, the Middle East, Africa and Latin America feel crowded aside by the "power and weight" of the technologically and industrially developed nations.

They want to find a new international status by freeing themselves from technical inferiority. Their drive is like the nationalist-sparked industrialization of the U.S., France, Germany, Japan and Russia from 1790 to 1885.

But these new countries are discovering that no nation is able to guarantee its own security except through collective arrangements. They find themselves even more dependent on older nations for economic and technological development.

The underdeveloped nations are thus in an ambivalent position. They want U.S. help and they want more independence from the U.S.

Rusk thinks this attitude should be easy for Americans to understand. The U.S. was the first nation to break away from colonialism. It made its way in the world among other more advanced powers. Toward the struggles of one power against another the early United States "practiced a policy of isolation and reserve."

But as understanding of their attitude as we may be, says Rusk, the dilemma must be gotten around.

The underdeveloped nations want to go forward faster than they can. This hurry leads to frustrations. It gives rise to leaders who feed on these frustrations to promote bitter struggles for armed or subversive expansion. These struggles result in conflicts between one developing country and another. The communists exploit these conflicts to bore into power.

It is in the U.S. interest to help maintain the integrity and independence of the modernizing states in the face of these Communist machinations.

Rusk sees one answer to the dilemma in regional systems of economic development. These could be modeled after the Marshall Plan for Europe, the Alliance for Progress plan for Latin America or some other regional concept.

The central feature would be that the countries of the region

would formulate and carry out their own programs of development. Outside countries, such as the U.S., would help but not run the show.

To help accomplish this self-development, Rusk sees the creation of more area development banks similar to the Inter-American Development Bank already operating in the Western Hemisphere, the just-born African Development Bank and the proposed Asian Development Bank.

Unlike the Marshall Plan, in which outside help came from one nation—the U.S.—Rusk would have aid to these regional programs come from a whole bank of northern countries —

Western Europe, Canada, the U.S. and Japan.

Rusk hopes these regional groups would also provide some means for the peaceful settlement of disputes within each region. The Asian regional grouping of free nations might be the proper framework, for example, for handling Indonesia's expansionism as the Organization of American States is the proper framework for dealing with Cuba in the Rusk theory.

So much for the underdeveloped world.

Rusk is now seeking to find some formula for strengthening U.S. bonds with the industrialized Free World nations of Western Europe, Canada and Japan.

These countries, once heavily dependent on the U.S. for economic and military security, are growing stronger and wish to play a larger role in world politics. The U.S. is in the midst of a complicated process of working out new terms of partnership to reflect this change.

Miss Shaw said she is going to spend her retirement at her old home on the coast about 50 miles from London. Her sister, Betty, lives there.

Miss Shaw started working for Mrs. Kennedy seven years ago. Just after Caroline was born.

### Water Mosquitoes Infest Flooded Areas in Midwest

CHICAGO (AP)—A farmer's son develops lumps as big as baseballs.

A St. Louis pediatrician says he has "never seen it so bad."

A university professor says, "I've never heard so many people complaining."

The incidents concern flood-water mosquitoes, a vicious breed of insect that breeds best on spring flood waters.

Thousands of acres of rich farmland were swamped last month when the Mississippi River flooded its banks from Minnesota to Kentucky.

The flood waters have receded but left an irritating legacy—mosquitoes.

"It's simple," says Prof. W. R. Horsfall, University of Illinois entomologist, "the more area you get under water, the more mosquitoes."

Mosquito outbreaks have been reported in many cities in Illinois, Missouri and Kentucky. Health officials in Benton and Paducah, Ky., have described the situation as the worst in 10 years.

Adding to the complaints is the fear the mosquito-borne encephalitis (inflammation of the brain), which claimed several lives in Illinois last year, may break out again.

St. Louis officials describe the mosquito infestation as possibly the worst in modern history.

Dr. Raymond Hellweg, 33, a St. Louis pediatrician, said he and his colleagues have "never seen it so bad."

"Instead of little lumps, some of the bites cover quite large areas," he said. "A few are as big as baseballs."

The huge bites aren't because the mosquitoes are different, Hellweg said, "but because they're bigger than I have ever seen."

"River cities in northern Illinois, Iowa, Michigan and Minnesota have stepped up mosquito abatement programs."

LONDON (AP)—The cost of living in Britain jumped 2.1 points in April, the Labor Ministry's index of retail prices showed today.

The rise—from 109.9 to 112—was the largest one-month increase since 1955. Since the national election which put the Labor party in power in October the cost of living has gone up 4 points.

Higher taxation in the recent budget was responsible for much of the latest increase.

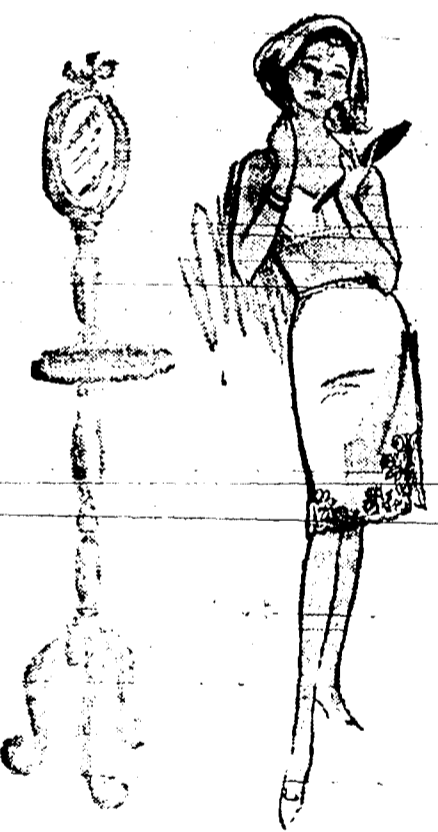

# Harada Cops Title By Handing First Defeat to Jofre

NAGOYA, Japan (AP)—Masahiko (Fighting) Harada of Japan battled his way to a stunning upset triumph Tuesday night, taking the world bantamweight boxing title from previously undefeated Eder Jofre of Brazil in a 15-round split decision. The 22-year-old Japanese

fighter piled up points with an early attack, had Jofre on the verge of a knockout in the fourth round and kept up a fast tempo against the tiring Brazilian in the late stages.

After handing Jofre his first defeat in eight years as a pro, the bull-shouldered Harada agreed with officials on the closeness of the bout: "I was lucky to win. I really didn't know I had won until the announcement. I was only fighting hard."

Referee Barney Ross of the United States, former holder of the world welterweight and lightweight titles, voted 71-69 for Harada on the system that gave five points to the winner of a round and four or less to the loser.

Judge Masao Kato of Japan had his countryman ahead 72-70 while the other judge, Jay Edson of Phoenix, Ariz., voted for Jofre 72-71. The Associated Press scored it 71-69 for Harada.

The winner weighed 117 1/2 pounds and Jofre was at the division limit of 118.

Harada is the first Oriental to have won two world titles. He defeated Pone Kingpetch of Thailand for the flyweight crown in October, 1962, but lost the championship back to Pone three months later.

A slow start apparently lost the fight for the heavily favored Jofre, 29-year-old veteran who had won 32 in a row—the last 16 by knockout.

## Qualifying Slated for U.S. Open

NEW YORK (AP)—Some of the top players on the pro golf tour will become a part of the crowd of golfers trying to earn a spot at a title Monday when qualifying for the 65th U.S. Open Championship begins.

The touring pros wind up the Memphis Open Sunday, then 90 of them move to the nearby Ridgeway Country Club to play 36 holes in the local qualifying round.

This probably is the toughest of the 55 sections set up by the U.S. Golf Association for the preliminary tests. It has only 94 players entered, including four amateurs, but was assigned 40 qualifying places.

The number of places in each section is based on the size and quality of the fields.

The USGA announced the entries and qualifying places for the various sections Tuesday. Local qualifying is scheduled at 48 locations Monday and seven Tuesday.

A total of 2,232 golfers is scheduled to play in the local rounds and 418 will progress to the sectional qualifying rounds, which will be played June 7-8.

In addition, 31 players, headed by defending champion Ken Venturi, are exempt from all qualifying and 41 from local qualifying.

The two rounds of qualifying will reduce the original entry list of 2,304 to the 150 who will begin play in the Open at the Belleive Country Club, St. Louis, June 17-20.

The biggest local field is at Chicago, where 101 pros and 33 amateurs are listed to shoot for 21 qualifying places. Other big ones Monday are Cleveland, 116 entries and 20 places; Detroit, 107-19 and St. Louis, 103-18. Tuesday's biggest field is 94 players trying for 17 places at Westchester, N.Y.

He said 90 million silver dollars were made in 1922 and this would tend to discourage hoarding and speculation. He noted that no silver dollars have been struck since 1935.

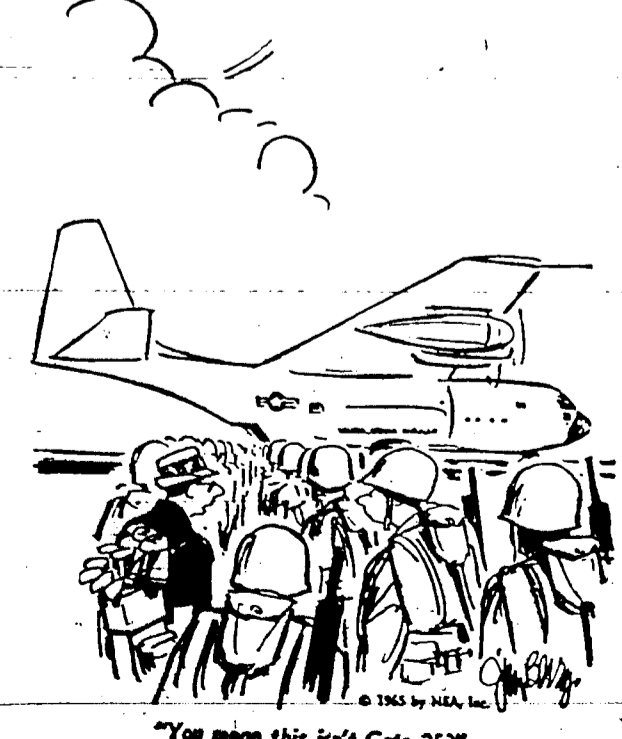
Cannon said by putting the 1922 date on the dollars, it would serve to bring back many of the old cartwheels that are now being saved.

### 21 Still on Subversive Group List

WASHINGTON (AP) — Ten year ago the attorney general compiled a list of 274 organizations which he designated as subversive. Only 21 still are listed as active.

They range from such well-known bodies as the Communist party and Ku Klux Klan to such little-known entities as the Chopin Cultural Center and the Yiddisher Kultur Farband.

The steady dwindling of the active list was disclosed by J. Walter Yeagley, assistant attorney general in charge of the Justice Department's Internal Security Division, in testimony March 4—made public Monday—before a House Appropriations subcommittee.

Although the list has served the purposes of nongovernment organizations, its purpose was to help federal government hiring officials in selecting employees under the federal employe security program. Membership in any organization on the list is only one factor to be considered by officials in choosing their personnel.

An Internal Security Division official, asked about the dwindling of the list, cautioned: "Even though most of these outfits are defunct, past membership would still be something to be considered. So it would be wrong to say the list is obsolete."

The "attorney general's list," as it is popularly known, has not been changed since 1955. Several attorneys general since that year have termed it useless.

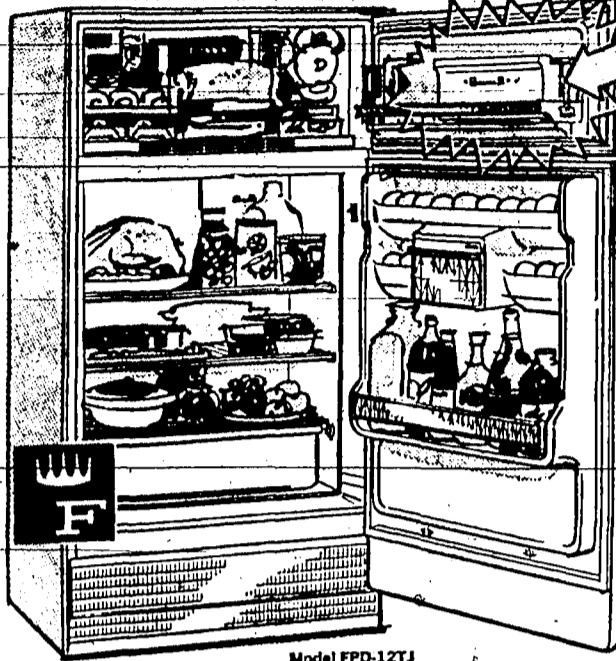

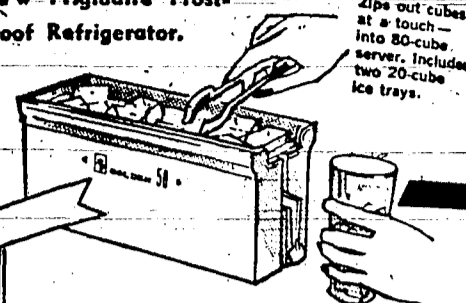

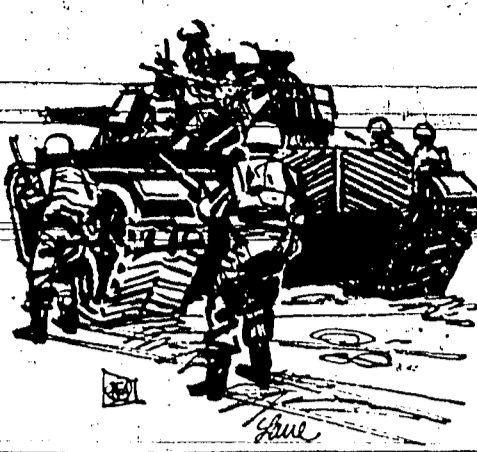

Pro-Communist and Castroite parties were building up. They had money, arms and organization. Their growing power and Bosch's leftist liberals aroused the apprehension of anti-Communist groups, especially in the armed forces. Finally, on Sept. 25, 1963, Bosch was ousted by right-wing officers led by Gen. Wessin y Wessin, and exiled to Puerto Rico. The military insurgents set up a three-man civilian junta headed by Donald Reid Cabral.



Suddenly and unexpectedly, on April 24, 1965, a group of young pro-Bosch officers led a revolt which overthrew the Cabral junta and drove him to seek sanctuary in the Israeli embassy. Bosch expected to end his exile, but the coup backfired. The young officers lost control, all discipline evaporated into widespread violence by armed civilians. In a few days, most of the army rebels quit. But bands of armed ruffians still roamed the streets of Santo Domingo.



Their looting and shooting endangered the lives of thousands of Americans. Word spread that this was incited and encouraged by hard-core Communists trained abroad, seeking to establish a Castro-type state. President Johnson acted swiftly to protect Americans and prevent a Red take-over. So for the first time in half a century the Dominican capital was occupied by U.S. Marines plus elements of the 82nd Airborne Division. Other American land, sea and air units were alerted for action.

## Thieves Take 21 Tons of Mercury

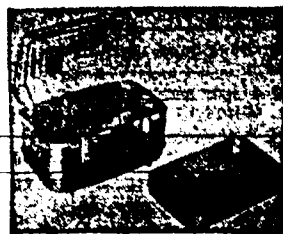
