Congressmen Ask Aid for Gold Mining

WASHINGTON (AP)—A group of congressmen has asked President Johnson for aid in the domestic gold mining industry.

Sen. Frank E. Moss, D-Utah, said Tuesday he was in a group of 18 congressmen which signed a joint letter asking the President to "rescue the now virtually extinct gold mining industry from its desperate straits."

The group said the price of gold has been pegged at \$35 an ounce since 1934 while mining costs have increased continuously.

Moss, in a statement, said Utah mines have a marketable supply of gold, but miners were reluctant to embark on a known money-losing venture.

In another statement, he said that he and Rep. David L. King, D-Utah, were assured that the Bureau of Mines' metallurgy laboratory in Salt Lake City would continue to play a significant role in development of mineral commodities of the west.

He said the assurance came Tuesday at a meeting with Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udell.

The conference was held to discuss the future of Utah mining industry and of the metallurgy laboratory, Moss said.

State law provides that one-half of the liquor tax for the county shall be used for this purpose. If more students apply than there are funds available the first year the county will have to decide which applicants will be able to attend.

The second year the county will be required to pay up to \$300 to provide tuition for all students who want to attend.

Students from outside the county college district, in addition to the \$450 paid by the county, must pay an additional \$300 tuition a year, plus \$36 in fees.

Students within the college district pay \$100 tuition per year, plus \$36 in fees.

### U. S. District Court Takes Military Case

BOISE (AP) — The Air Force asked U. S. District Court here Tuesday to take jurisdiction of the \$250,000 suit filed by Gerald M. Anderson after his release in a sensational murder case.

Anderson, who was held for investigation by the Air Force after his release by civilian authorities, filed suit in district court charging false imprisonment and invasion of privacy.

He also charged that the sensational case reduced his employability.

The Air Force request that jurisdiction be transferred from the state court to U. S. District Court was filed Tuesday by U. S. Atty. Sylvan Jaynesen.

Anderson was arrested shortly after the April 1962 slaying of Mrs. Nancy Joy Johnson, wife of another airman, and her two-year-old son.

Civilian authorities released him the following November after Theodore T. Dickle, a transient laborer, confessed to the murders.

The Air Force held Anderson for investigation for another two months before freeing him.

### Tribute Is Paid To Steverson

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United Nations will honor Adlai Stevenson's memory with a fellowship program paid for by the United States.

The program, proposed by President Johnson and approved by Secretary-General U. Thant, will divert \$100,000 contributed to the organization's institute for training and research for the fellowships.

"At the start — the number is expected to increase — 8 to 10 foreign youths will be given the fellowships to serve as 'interns' at the United Nations."

**TRAFFIC DEATH**  
**BOISE (AP)** — State Police today announced the death of a 19-year-old Pocatello youth, Constantine Assakitis, in a head-on collision between two motorcycles on a motel parking lot. State Police said that because the parking lot was for use by the public the death counts as a traffic fatality.

It increased the total for the year to 175, ten more than were killed in the corresponding period last year.

**DORMITORY TO HAVE TWIN POCATELLO (AP)** — Idaho State University's new women's dormitory will soon have a twin.

Twin Construction Co., Blackfoot, is under way with excavation on the \$1,324,000 dorm which will be nearly identical to one ready for use this fall.

The newest seven-story structure will be ready in another year. It will be connected to the first by a covered walkway. Dining facilities on the main floor of the first dorm will serve both units. Both will house some 320 women students.

Also new on the campus is the fine arts classroom building. Its two floors will be ready for use when classes start in two weeks, but the main floor will not be ready for another week or 10 days after that.

**WADE THROUGH EXHIBITS**  
**BOISE (AP)** — Judges continued to wade through more than 2,000 exhibits today as the Western State Fair entered its second day.

Fair Manager Ambrose Johnson said the biggest in its history was turned out by the figures.

This year's fair will be the last on its present grounds—in use since 1903.

Johnson said the grounds have been outgrown and a new highway route will cut through the parking lot.

**ATTORNEYS NAMED**  
**LEWISTON (UPI)** — Two Boise attorneys were named Tuesday as legal agents in Idaho for Potlatch Resorts, Inc., so the San Francisco-based firm can maintain a legal headquarters in Idaho.

Attorneys T.M. Eboris and W.C. Roden, a state senator from Ada County, were named legal agents.

A company spokesman said the move was only a formality involved in removal of top PFI executives from Lewiston to San Francisco.

**SATISFACTORY CONDITION**  
**NAMPA (AP)** — Two Caldwell High School football players injured when their motorcycle collided head-on with a car were reported in satisfactory condition today.

The athletes — wingback Ronald Dillon and tackle Marlin, both 17 — were hospitalized with multiple injuries.

Nampa police said the car, driven by Fred Carr, 40, of Nampa, was turning left on Orchard Street about two miles west of Nampa when the motorcycle ran into it.

**BREAKS SOUND BARRIER**  
**BOISE (AP)** — Lt. Gov. William Drevlow capped a long flying career last week by breaking the sound barrier at the age of 75.

Drevlow made the flight with Capt. Joe Engle, the man who flew an X-15 into outer space.

It all came about, Drevlow said Tuesday, because the Air Force had promised to return him from Edwards Air Force Base to his home in Craigmont, by noon Sunday before last.

The lieutenant governor had gone to Edwards to make some of its officials honorary citizens of Idaho.

The base commander, Maj. Gen. Irving Branch, put Drevlow aboard a training jet with Engle and away they went at 853 miles an hour.

**ONE BIDER**  
**BOISE (AP)** — The Nelson Landscape Service, Inc., Spokane, Wash., was the only bidder Tuesday on a North Idaho highway landscaping project.

The state highway department said the firm submitted an offer of \$46,028. The project involves placing of topsoil, planting trees, shrubs and vines, and seeding grass on 3,665 miles of the interstate highway 80 belt line at Coeur d'Alene.

**NOT LONELY**  
**BOISE (AP)** — Idaho's primitive area no longer is a lonely spot.

The Idaho Fish and Game department said Tuesday a checkup at the mouth of Loon Creek counted 198 rafter rafts with 857 passengers aboard on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River in little more than a month.

The count was from July 6 to Aug. 11.

**PLEADS INNOCENT**  
**BOISE (AP)** — A salesman for Boise radio station KOTN pleaded innocent today to a charge of violating Boise's anti-racket law.

Dick Hines, through his attorney, also moved to dismiss the charge contending he, personally, was making no sales and thus was not responsible under provisions of the ordinance.

Hines was arrested last Friday in the downtown area, accused of operating a loudspeaker on the radio station's mobile unit.

City Court Judge Roger Burgoyne took the motion for dismissal under advisement pending the filing of a statement against Hines by both sides, outlining the circumstances in the case.

Hines is free under \$25 bond.

**PROCESSING DROPS**  
**BOISE (UPI)** — Potato processing in Idaho dropped 15 per cent last year over 1963 but still was 12 per cent above the 1958-62 average.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture said 1964 saw 27,770,000 cwt. of potatoes processed in Idaho and Blaine County, Ore. Of the amount, 21,073,000 cwt. were used in the manufacture of food products—a new record high and 3 per cent more than was used in 1963.

# Retired Persons Told of Medical Programs

**WASHINGTON (AP)** — Beginning today, 2.5 million retired Americans are getting word from the government on new medical programs available to them under the expanded Social Security System.

The information includes an application card for the voluntary program — the medical plan which provides protection against most doctor bills.

The first of the kits were sent out Tuesday night.

No action is required for the hospitalization and nursing care program. Inclusion is automatic for anyone on the Social Security rolls.

Mailing will continue at a rate of 2.5 million a week until the government reaches the 15 million Americans now under Social Security or railroad retirement.

Another mass mailing to carry out provisions of the new Social Security amendments will begin Sept. 15 and take about a week. This will include checks totaling \$385 million to cover the 7 per cent increase in Social Security cash benefits retroactive to Jan. 1, 1965.

The application card for the voluntary medical plan should be returned to the Social Security Administration in the postage-free envelope included in the kit.

This option must be exercised by March 31, 1966, to qualify. Cost will be \$3 a month. The payment may be deducted from the monthly Social Security benefit check beginning next July.

**Costly Bar**  
**DUBLIN (UPI)** — Michael Terr, 18, was charged Tuesday with causing \$350,000 damage to a candy factory.

Police said the damage was caused by a fire which started after Terr broke into the plant to steal a bar of chocolate.

**Fifth Case of Bubonic Plague Is Reported**  
**SANTA FE, N. M. (AP)** — Bubonic plague is believed to have caused the death of a 14-year-old Navajo boy last Friday.

It confirmed, it would be the fifth case in the Gallup area in northwest New Mexico.

Four other Navajo children are recovering from the plague.

The Health Department received an autopsy report Tuesday from the U.S. Public Health Service Hospital in Gallup.

The department said a delay in contacting the victim's family moved back the autopsy. It was performed Monday.

Identification was still to be completed. The boy's family name was given as Jymn.

The disease is believed caused by a prairie dog extermination program in the Gallup area.

# Mediation Not Possible in Viet Nam War

PARIS (AP) — President Charles de Gaulle expressed the opinion today that no mediation is imaginable now in the Viet Nam war.

De Gaulle's view was relayed to newsmen by information minister Alain Peyrefitte after Cabinet session.

The subject came up following a meeting Tuesday between U.S. Undersecretary of State George W. Ball and De Gaulle. There was some published speculation here that Ball might have asked De Gaulle to mediate the conflict.

Peyrefitte said De Gaulle told the Cabinet "it goes without saying that there can be no question of any mediation because, as it stands now, no mediation is imaginable."

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Warren G. Magnuson and Rep. Thomas M. Jackson said they will testify at a hearing Sept. 9-10 on a bill that would authorize construction of a third powerhouse at Grand Coulee Dam.

### Immigration Bill Slowed In Power Play

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson's immigration bill and Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen's reapportionment amendment were caught up today in a legislative power play.

Sen. Hugh Scott, R-Pa., said that "some liberal Democrats would rather have a tactical victory over Dirksen than to win passage of the immigration measure at this session of Congress."

But Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., another member of the Senate Judiciary Committee where the opposing forces met Monday Tuesday said in a separate interview he does not expect the immigration bill to be killed.

Dirksen blocked committee action on the immigration measure after an 8-8 tie vote stymied his proposed constitutional amendment on redistricting of state legislatures.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Soviet submarine operations have increased in the past year, Navy sources said today.

"We've been spotting them more often," one official said. "Where one or two used to show up, we're sighting three and four."

"They seem to be operating in greater numbers and more openly."

Navy officers said the widening Soviet submarine operations reflect the larger number of long-endurance craft, including atomic-powered vessels, now in the Soviet sub fleet.

### Candy, Toys to Be Dropped To North Viet Nam Children

SAIGON (UPI) — A program is under way here to drop toys and candy over Communist North Viet Nam.

The first experimental toy drop was made this spring. It was secret.

Enough bugs showed up in the experiment to put the program under wraps until it could be made more practical and less dangerous.

Now, sources say, the toy drops are going to begin in earnest and candy will be showered over the north along with plastic dolls and rubber balls.

The object of the Santa Claus style raids will not be just to bring joy to the hearts of young North Vietnamese. The main intention is to show the northerners that their southern compatriots enjoy a higher standard of living than is described by their Communist press.


Psychological warfare experts say toys and candy are ideal for this purpose, because they are the kind of minor luxuries which are almost completely absent from the austere economy of the north.

The toys which land on North Viet Nam will be purchased from Vietnamese suppliers in Saigon and will be accompanied by leaflets pointing out how easily available they are in the non-Communist south.

But dropping this kind of psychological "weapon" is more difficult, expensive and dangerous than they would be imagined at first sight.

Each little package will have to have its own little parachute.



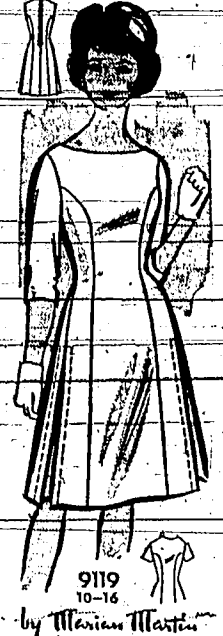

### Household Tasks Can Be Made Most Enjoyable

BY KAY SHERWOOD

NEW YORK (NPA)—When you find yourself sinking into the late summer doldrums and major housekeeping effort seems only the widest yawn, amuse yourself with some of the newer, pleasant tasks that are usually shoved aside.

Last week, I snipped my fingers at the screen windows, entered at the trolley, kitchen floor and played a game of golf (health benefit) and spent some time trying the useful, new self-adhesive plastic coatings.

As an early discoverer of these plastic coverings, I have used them for years to cover tables, sofas, and walls. Now, new textures add new uses to this houseware item.

One new texture is a nubby, felt surface, bonded to the same self-adhesive backing. Imaginative housewives will find many uses for it. For me, it is an easy answer to a minor-but-nagging irritation with pottery or metal pieces with rough-finished bases that scratch the tables or bookshelves.

For about \$1 I bought a yard of the stuff and had enough to cover cache pots which hold household plants, vases and bowls. I simply outlined with a pencil the dime on the paper side of the backing.

Cut out, slightly inside of the outline, peel off the protective backing and smooth onto the surface. The rough edges of vases are effectively smoothed out. I might add, also a good treatment for domestic or imported tiles which you would like to use as trivet. Besides the traditional felt-green, there are a few other colors.

Another new texture has a quilted surface. It is made of two layers of plastic, stuffed with a filling and quilted to make a soft, padded surface. This comes in pastels and a simple pattern. The covering will be a help where you need a soft surface. We used it—my daughters and I—to line the two drawers in their bedroom chests. The padding is good antising protection for lingerie, scarves and stockings, and a pretty background for cosmetics, gloves and the like.

A third newcomer to this group is only now becoming available but it will be a boon to some. This is the self-adhesive plastic wall-tile. These are actually squares of tiled patterns with the adhesive backing and can be installed as easily as the floor rolls but they will be more maneuverable.

A friend of mine, who cut up a roll of the plastic into tile shapes before covering her bathroom wall, in a mumble-pattern told me she hoped someday the makers of this material would make it tile-sized. Now they have.
