

That's the word from R. Wayne Robinson, marketing information specialist of the University of Jaho Extension Service. True, pointoes were generally in short supply last year, but that's still a big percentage to go into an industry that's relatively new.

There are several significant factors for Idaho with a spud processing industry that will take half—or more—of the state's total potato output. In the litrs place, it bolsters the market at a time when consumption of fresh potatoes has been silding for years. It also provides considerable employment that never existed before while at the same three reinsteads.

first place, it bolsters the market at a time when consumption of fresh potations here sliding for years. It also provides considerable employment that never existed before while at the same time siphoning off less desirable potatoes that could hart Idaho if marketed for fresh consumption.

From the standpoint of the housewife, the potato processing industry provides potatoes that can be prepared in jig time for the table while at the same time guarding against drastic increases in price such as occurred last spring.

One of the drawbacks of processing such a large percentage of the crop is that unscrupulous operators find it quite easy to use inferior spuds or potatoes grown elsewhere which are palmed off as Idaho's product. The practice is common enough when Idaho has enough fine potatoes to fill the demand, but it gets completely out of land in a year of short production. Barring federal laws and strict enforcement, it's just one of the things Idaho will have to continue fighting if the state is to keep its reputation as a producer of the finest potatoes.


