WASHINGTON (AP)—Liberal Republican John V. Blumenthal won the mayoralty in New York City today while Democrats rolled to storm in victories in New Jersey and Virginia. With his triumph in heavily Democratic New York, the 43-year-old Lindsay zoomed into a spot among national GOP leaders. His victory was sealed when Democrat Abraham D. Beame conceded defeat. "A hell of a victory," New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller termed it.

Viet Cong Attack on Outpost Fails

SAGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Hundreds of Viet Cong fighters swarmed down from the jungle today and made an unsuccessful attempt to overrun a government outpost in Quang Nam province. U.S. sources said an estimated 500 to 600 Communist troops attacked the outpost three miles from the government base. The Viet Cong, who were armed and trained—the Communist groups as they retreated at day's end, but there was no estimate of enemy casualties.

Magic Valley Voters Throng to Polls to Elect City Officials, Approve Three Special Issues

Voters in Magic Valley towns elected municipal officials and approved three special issues in Tuesday's election. Turnout of voters was reported to be high in many towns, especially where there were contests. At Shoshone, Mrs. Myrtle Burdett was defeated after 12 years as mayor. Other towns where new mayors were elected include Ketchum, Filer, Gooding and Glens Ferry. At both Richfield and Oakley new trustees were elected for the village boards and at Oakley the three incumbents were defeated by newcomers. Voters at Buhl approved an advisory dog leash law.

Jurors Are Sought for Red Trial

WASHINGTON (AP)—Trial of the U.S. Communist Party was further delayed today as court officials tried to find in the federal city 23 potential jurors who have never worked for the U.S. government.

Judge William B. Jones has ruled that no past or present federal employees may sit on the panel that will decide whether the party is guilty of failure to register as an agent of the Soviet Union.

Once the panel is selected, its members will listen to a long list of questions aimed at determining unacceptable jurors.

Judge Jones decided it would be wrong to ask a potential juror only whether he is a member of the Communist Party. The question has to be phrased in more general terms. As a result, no members of the party, including its leaders, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, Ku Klux Klan, American Nazi party, or American Citizens for Action will survive the questioning.

Any of those called for possible jury service who are not in the county jail will be notified by mail. Jones Jones decided whether any of its members belong to these organizations will not be required to identify the organizations to which they belong.

This way, Jones said, no Communists who may be among the prospective jurors will interfere themselves or subject themselves to prosecution by admitting party membership.

Social Welfare Meet Focuses on Adoption

Idaho adoption laws are in need of updating to prevent "irreparable emotional harm" to many children, the president of the Idaho Conference on Social Welfare declared Wednesday.

Mrs. Ruth Bondurant, Kimberly, said she hopes the organization's annual meeting, scheduled for Thursday and Friday in Twin Falls, will focus attention on the question of reforming the state's adoption procedures. The meeting will be held by a panel discussion on adoptions.

Featured speakers during the two-day conclave will be Dr. Ernest W. Hartung, president of the University of Idaho, Moscow, and Dr. John A. Pennock, professor of sociology at Utah State University.

Dr. Hartung was appointed president of the University of Idaho in August of 1963. He was formerly vice president of the University of Rhode Island. He holds a master and doctoral degree from Harvard University and an honorary doctor of laws degree from University of Rhode Island.

Dr. Pennock is currently completing a project for the California Probation Department in preparing a series of training tapes as an in-service training program.

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Georgia police chief testified today the Federal Aviation Agency once had an office in a building owned by a Ku Klux Klan unit, but broke its lease when it learned of the ownership.

Howard W. Smith, chief of Clayton County police in Jonesboro, Ga., told the House Committee on Un-American Activities that the building in Jonesboro was owned by the Clayton Civic Club. He identified the committee as chairman of the Klan. Chairman Edwin E. Willis, D-La., observed that the use of a cover name by the Klan could "hoodwink" some people.

Agreeing, Rep. Charles L. McNair, D-Mo., said he would like to see the Klan's activities investigated.

Johnson Wants Electoral College System Tightened
WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson has passed the word he wants Congress to act on his proposal for a constitutional amendment aimed at tightening up the Electoral College system.
The failure of more than 100 previous attempts to Capitol Hill to change the method by which presidents and vice-presidents are elected, Johnson said today, has led him to believe that the amendment now may be in the mood to pass.

Johnson proposed last January that the Constitution be amended to abolish the Electoral College and to permit state officials to transmit to Congress the number of electoral votes cast for the president and vice-president.
The amendment would give each state-casting one vote. The number of votes would be determined by the number of senators plus the number of representatives.
Under the new proposal, if no candidate gets a majority of the electoral votes, the Senate and House would meet in a joint session to elect a president and vice president by individual vote of members, from among the three with the highest electoral votes.
The amendment would also provide that if the president-elect died between Election Day and inauguration, the vice president-elect would be entitled to be elected president.

Johnson proposed last January that the Constitution be amended to abolish the Electoral College and to permit state officials to transmit to Congress the number of electoral votes cast for the president and vice-president.
The amendment would give each state-casting one vote. The number of votes would be determined by the number of senators plus the number of representatives.

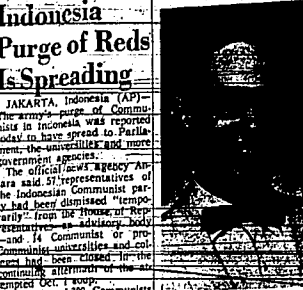

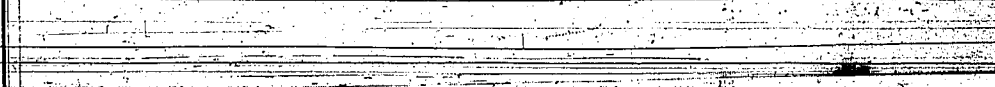

Revenue Rule On Violators Is Questioned

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Justice Department has questioned an Internal Revenue Service ruling that permits arrest of violators on triple-damage penalties for income tax evasion.

A congressional study committee, making public the differing views, recommends that the provision be amended by law, at least until there are more actual convictions of anti-trust law violators.

The Justice Department did not dispute the ruling, which stands, but Ally, Gen. Nicholas Katzenbach said in a letter dated last Feb. 7, "It is not necessary for the only one which this department would have reached had it been changed—with the responsibility."

In a letter dated last Feb. 7, appended to the committee study, Katzenbach said the consequences of an anti-trust violation should not be made "so light that potential violators would be justified in treating them as a business risk."

He contended that legal cases under the law tend to control laws tended to support the revenue service's ruling, but added:

"We would have been prepared to defend in court a rule of civil contempt which would allow the revenue service ruled in July 1964 that the same rule apply to business expenses and therefore deductibles. According to firms recover nearly all their damages in savings on their income tax."

The revenue loss to the government can run to many millions of dollars in cases like those of electrical companies found to have conspired in restraint of trade.

Pentagon Is Looking at 17-Year-Olds

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Pentagon is taking a closer look at 17-year-old service men who are being drafted into Vietnam. It is learning that many of these young men are being assigned duty in Vietnam or elsewhere overseas.

The only exception is in the case of youths who volunteer for the draft to go to the service. These youths are held back from overseas duty until they reach 18.

ARMED with consideration being given to pulling out use of 17-year-olds in Vietnam, the Defense Department is exploring the possibility of a study now under way on this general subject. No decision has been announced.

The study is being carried out by officials who set manpower policies for all the armed services.

"We don't know exactly how many 17-year-olds there are in Vietnam," Pentagon authorities said.

According to official statistics, 1.8 per cent of the enlisted men service-wide are 17. This includes young men still in basic training.

The official said odds are slight that many youths of that age are in the war zone.

Under the law, no member of the armed forces, regardless of age, may be shipped overseas until he has finished at least four months of basic training or its equivalent.

Military authorities noted that 17-year-olds are allowed to enlist only with the consent of their parents.

It is assumed, these officials said, that such parents realize their sons may be subject to duty overseas, including being shipped to the basic training.
