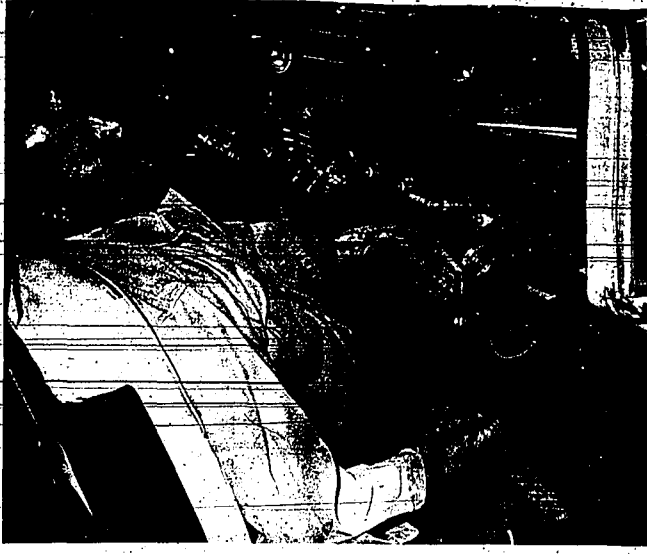
Drury, a publisher, formerly of the Journal of Wisconsin Press, is 65 years old.

**Urgent Need For Nurses**

Sgt. L.C. Gordon T. Snapp, local Army recruitee, announced that week the Army has sent out an urgent call for registered nurses.

"According to Sgt. Snapp, the need for qualified nurses at this time is serious."

He said the Army offers many advantages in qualified registered nurses.

"The registered nurse who volunteers her services at one time will be given training and guarantees," said Sgt. Snapp. Nurses are offered choices of assignments, hospitals in which to serve and at some cases, selection of which overseas country they wish to serve. Nurses now are offered their choice of serving in one of 13 major Army hospitals in the United States or one of three foreign countries—Japan, Korea or Viet Nam.

—As a result of this assignment—Sgt. Snapp—and qualified registered nurses will be given their choice of training in specialized fields such as, operating room, obstetrics, maternal and child health and neuropsychiatry.

—He emphasized that pay of an Army nurse would be more than \$500 a month for a nurse entering the Army for the first time. Nurses are commissioned officers who come on active duty and receive pay, benefits and prestige of an officer in the Army.

"As a non-commissioned officer in the United States Army, I know how vital the role of the Army nurse is," said Sgt. Snapp. "I have seen them at work and know how much America's

Learn syllables which stand before:  
They're prefixes like pre, post, fore.  
Complete the picture, as you should;  
Learn suffixes like ness, y, hood.

So far we have considered many ways of increasing your vocabulary: 1) put old knowledge to work and derive old words from words you already know; 2) find the clues to the meaning of a strange word in the surrounding words and sentences; 3) find a third way to develop your vocabulary is to come to all the reading prepared with a knowledge of the meanings of prefixes and suffixes.

First of all, there are not very many of them; secondly, they occur with very great frequency; thirdly, they occur so frequently that you will not have to make a separate effort to memorize their meanings. Here again, fall back on your old knowledge and make it work for you. Suppose we do just that.

Autobiography, autograph, automatic, automaticity. The common prefix "auto" means "self." What does "self" mean? Find the element that is common to all the meanings of those four words. You discover that auto means "self." "Biography" written by the man himself; "self-moving"; "self-acting"; "self-governing."

Intercom, international, interstate, intersect. The prefix inter, you know, means "between, among."

Now do the same for such prefixes as circum, anti, ante, sub, de, post, ad, trans and whatever few others there are, and you will come to new words prepared at least with a knowledge of what they mean. Now try this method now with words you know and learn the meanings of some suffixes.

Byrond, widowhood, motherhood, knighthood. The common suffix is hood. Examine what each word means to you: "the condition of being a byrond"; "the condition, or state, of being a widow"; "the condition, or state, of being a mother"; "the condition, or state, of being a knight." The suffix hood, whenever you encounter it in a new word, will mean what you have just now discovered for yourself: "the condition, or state of being."

Tactless, faultless, spiritless, needless. The common suffix is less, and the common element in the meaning of each word is "without, lacking in, void of."

There is no point in beating a dead horse. Other suffixes—able, ible, ness, live, ous, y, ful, etc.—may all be learned the same way. Add this additional purpose to your reading: be on the lookout for prefixes and suffixes and derive the meanings for yourself by finding the common elements. The more you practice this, the more deeply imbedded are the meanings of these prefixes in your memory of words, and the richer the storehouse from which you may continue to draw new meanings from old knowledge.

One obvious caution should be mentioned here. Many words have both prefix and suffix; many words have prefix only or suffix only, and many words have neither prefix nor suffix. Use all three methods where the situation allows; where none of these will work for you—see tomorrow's article.

See how well you can do with the following boldfaced words by making use of those words not in boldfaces:

1) irremediable; 2) irresponsible; 3) readable; 4) irresistible; 5) irreverence; 6) remedy; 7) postpayable; 8) syllable; 9) polygon; 10) polylog; 11) polystyrene; 12) cardiac; 13) posterior; 14) posteriority; 15) cardiograph.

No. 1 means "not able to be remedied." No. 7 means "having many syllables." No. 11 refers to the area "behind, or after, the heart." If you missed any of the three, go back and see the clues you could have used.
