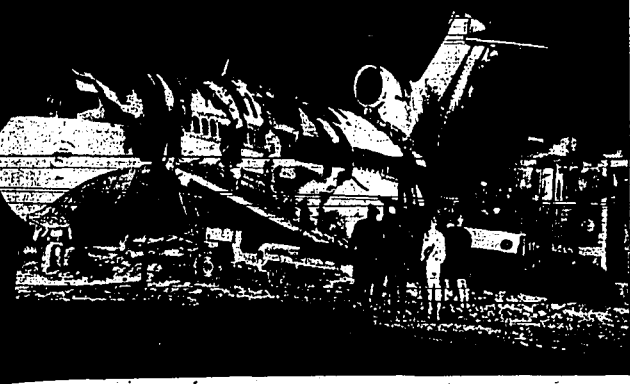

Groups Work To Ease Pain Of Viet War

NEW YORK (AP) — Parading the sound of gunfire, an army of American civilians is working to ease the pain of the South Vietnamese.

These homefront forces labor under the banners of a score of more or less official agencies, some of them providing clothing and other necessities to that battle-torn land.

The value of materials shipped last year reached \$4.6 million, more than a half million above the 1963 figure. This year, it is expected to be more than double.

All of the help goes to South Vietnam civilians. The dislocated of military personnel, widows, orphans and the poor are not included in the aid.

"It's wonderful the way everyone is wanting to help," said a spokesman for Catholic Relief Service, which has created a service for big families.

"The agency is one of the largest providing help. Other major ones are CARE, Memorial Foundation, Foster Parent Plan and Project Concern.

Catholic Service began its South Vietnamese program in 1954. It is feeding more than a half million persons daily. It expects to double the number shortly.

CARE is distributing food, clothing, blankets, tools for agriculture and school supplies. It also plans to help farmers rebuild their war-ravaged lands.

Memorial Foundation is sponsoring construction of a 25-bed hospital and clinic and treating 100 patients daily. They also had out food and U.S. supplies.

Foster Parents Plan is providing social work and counseling assistance to about 5,000 families.

Project Concern operates a 25-bed hospital, a 25-bed hospital, most of its work is with a war-torn mountain people called H'mong. They are helping them out of their own and are saving the victims of the fighting.

Document Blasts War And Weapons

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Vatican Ecumenical Council received today a drastically revised modern world problems document that totally condemns modern war and denounces deterrent policies based on nuclear weapons.

A number of American bishops were reported deeply disturbed at the wording of the new text, complaining privately that they felt it would weigh heavily against the U.S. government's defense strategy.

In the view of these bishops the Soviet government can much more easily ignore any council statement than Washington can.

Other bishops, who had opposed an earlier version of the document, expressed satisfaction with the wording, which eliminates a statement that the possession of nuclear arms as a defensive deterrent is not illegitimate.

Aid Employe Led to Death In Ambush

SUOON, South Viet Nam (AP) — Two apparent Viet Cong agents were killed in an ambush today in a Viet Cong camp, U.S. officials said.

The victims were Peter Hunt, 24, of Oklahoma City, Okla., who was shot through the head in a field while driving in the mountains south of Saigon, a spokesman said.

Two Vietnamese — who were apparently Americans — who were believed to have joined the Viet Cong.

Hunt was a regional supervisor for the International Volunteer Service.

Hunt's civilian vehicle was riddled with bullets. Members of a military convoy that he had joined were also killed. Hunt was found by his bullet-riddled body.

After shooting Hunt through the head, the Viet Cong fired 10 bullets into his body.

Hunt had departed with the military convoy on the date of his death. They were on the way to Can Tho, 20 miles away and about 10 miles south of Suoan.

Earlier reports had said that he was killed when a mine exploded under the vehicle. Hunt was a spokesman for the military.

The guerrillas opened fire on the convoy, but quickly broke contact with the troops returned to Suoan.

2 U. S. Army Specialists Are Missing

HEIDELBERG, Germany (AP)—Two U.S. Army specialists based in West Germany—a nuclear technician and the other in intelligence work—were reported Thursday to have been missing for weeks.

A spokesman for Army headquarters here said the nuclear technician, Chief Warrant Officer Specialist D. Harris Jr., of Penn Yan, N.Y., vanished on home leave in September after delivering classified material to an Army depot in New York State.

The Overseas Weekly private newspaper published in Heidelberg reported the disappearance of Harris and the other specialist, Lt. Col. Robert R. Rohrer, 44, of West Allis, Wis., disappeared after leaving his intelligence unit in Frankfurt Aug. 18 and that the case set back Army espionage in Europe back 5 to 10 years.

In the Harris incident, the Army reported it could not say whether the material he delivered was papers or equipment.

The spokesman said Harris left Aug. 23 and went on for enough after making the delivery.

"The last direct word received here from him was a Washington cable Sept. 21 requesting an extension of the leave.

Due back Sept. 30, he has been reported as AWOL since then.

A German newspaper, Bild Zeitung, said Harris was fully returned on the location and plans for all U.S. nuclear war weapons stored in Germany and knew of nuclear tactics to be used in case of emergency.

Rohrer was only four months short of completing 20 years in the Army. He left his wife and son in Wisconsin.

The Overseas Weekly said Rohrer's car was found abandoned near Weiden, about 17 miles from Czechoslovakia, and bloodstains followed his scent to the frontier.

Newsman Ask Revision of Care Policy

MOSCOW, Idaho (AP)—A Boise newsman today asked a revision of what he called a "policy" in caring for Idaho's mentally retarded.

Sam Day, editor of the Idaho Observer, a Boise weekly newspaper, made this request in a statement prepared for a meeting of the State Board of Education.

He is a member of the Idaho Association for Retarded Children and chairman of a task force of the Idaho Council on Mental Retardation. He told the board, however, he was appearing before it as an individual.

"The present policy states before Day, 'It is the state vocational rehabilitation agency serves far too few of the mentally retarded, the great majority of whom could be placed in remunerative employment if properly trained.'

"The findings of the president's panel on mental retardation indicate that all but about 10 per cent of Idaho's estimated 21,000 mentally retarded individuals are capable of acquiring job skills. And yet almost no organized programs exist to provide them with these skills. . . . Vocational rehabilitation programs should be provided not just to a few selected school districts of the state but to every major district — certainly to every district capable of supporting a special education class."

Cold, Hunger May Prolong Child's Life

LOS ANGELES (AP)—If you know you could prolong the youth of your children by keeping them cool and stumpy, would you?

Well, for one thing, said the scientist, Dr. Charles H. Barrows and Nathan W. Shock if you can read this you're too late to start the treatment.

These experiments indicate that this happens to a greater degree very early in life influences greatly what happens to him later in life," explained Dr. Shock.

The answer then, no doubt, is to turn to the cradle and stumpy boys, that doctor and biologist, R. H. Whitt?

Dr. Barrows isn't too optimistic if it would be possible to get enough children whose parents would follow them to the feeding hall of life, all the other children are getting, he said.

"This probably would be small, but it has practical possibilities," he said.

Dr. Shock and Barrows told newsmen Thursday that their experiments on mice and rats, which they reported, they lengthened certain stages of the creatures' lives, including the reproductive period.

"We regard this as an important finding because it means that we can influence biologically that will influence the period of old age," said Dr. Shock.

"We have now renewed our pledge to share this work with our war veterans and appreciate the hardships they endured to keep us free."

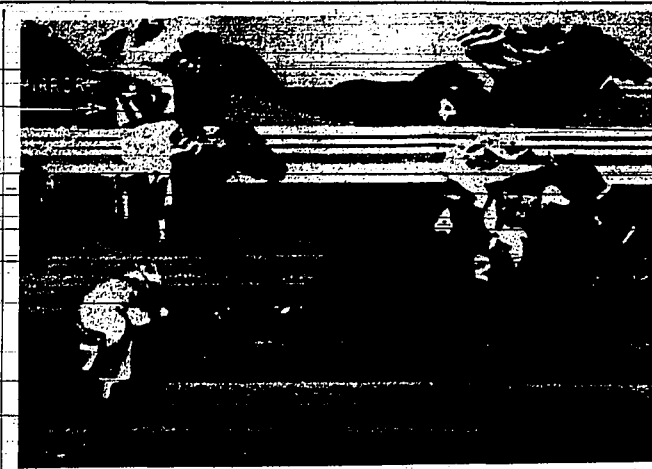

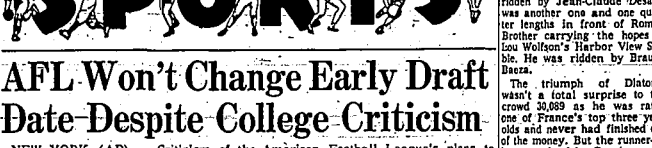

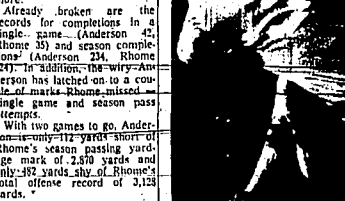
