Red Party Registration Said Unlawful

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court today declared unconstitutional a requirement that members of the Communist party must register with the government.

The requirement is contained in a section of the 1950 Subversive Activities Control Act.

Justice William J. Brennan delivered the 5-4 decision.

Specifically involved in today's decision were William Albertson of Brooklyn, N.Y., and Roscoe "Oinky" Penick, of Oakland, Calif. The Subversive Activities Control Board in 1952 ordered Albertson to register. A similar order to Penick was issued in 1951.

The Justice Department said Penick was a member of the Communist party's national

committee and was on the New York State post-1950 board.

The Communist party of New York expelled Albertson on July 7, 1951, calling him a "police agent." He asked, however, that the Supreme Court rule in his case as well as that of Penick.

Albertson and Penick appealed to the high tribunal after the U. S. Court of Appeals here upheld the board orders.

They contended the individual registration requirement violates the fifth Amendment privilege against self-incrimination and impinges on first Amendment rights of freedom of belief and association.

The Supreme Court was told that outcome of the case would affect board orders against 21 other persons and seven similar cases pending at the board.

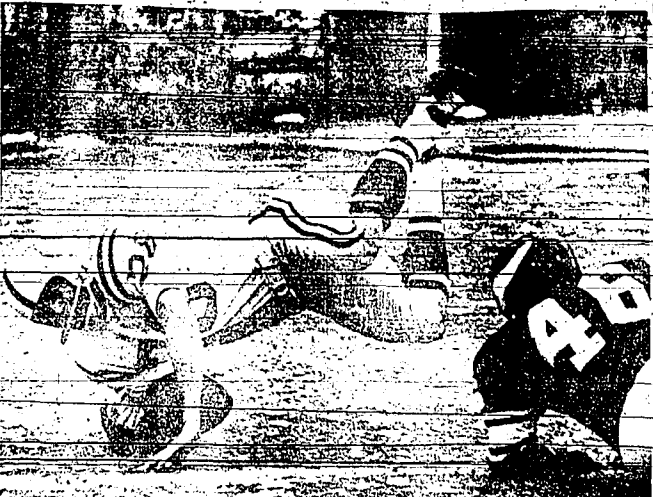
