Rusk Says Reds Losing Strength In Latin America

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) — U. S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk said today that communism has receded in Latin America over the past few years. "I think there is no doubt that it has lost strength in Latin America," Rusk said in an ABC television interview. Rusk, who last visited South America in 1962, said there are indications Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro now "realizes that his type of activity cannot succeed."

Turkey Case

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court again has heard the Turkey case. The justices are expected to decide by the end of the year whether the United States should continue to supply military aid to Turkey. The case involves a federal-state relationship that weighs in with the Federal Circuit Court in New York. Thereafter that court will conduct further proceedings.

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic (AP) — The Armed Forces quashed a rebellion early today in the heart of the Dominican Republic without firing a shot.

President Relaxes After Political Trip

JOHNSON CITY, Tex. (AP) — President Johnson relaxed at his ranch today following a whirlwind political trip to San Antonio where he visited into a crowd to shake hands, give autographs and kiss children. The excursion was in behalf of Democratic Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez of Texas. The president told a shopping center crowd composed primarily of Mexican-Americans they had a right to be proud to have Mexican blood in their veins. In addition to leading Gonzalez as one of his best supporters in the House, Johnson praised Sen. Ralph W. Yarborough, who was present, as having been a close Johnson ally. After the speech, Johnson walked out into the crowd. Twenty minutes later he left the scene and walked behind the buildings where hundreds were gathered behind barriers and in the yards of neighboring homes.

White Lilies Adorn Kennedy Grave on Day of Remembrance

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the drizzle-damp chill of a gray day of remembrance, a bouquet of small white lilies was placed today at the base of the eternal-flaming that flickers over the grave of John F. Kennedy. The lilies, from Jacqueline Kennedy, young widow of the slain President, were delivered by her mother, Mrs. Hugh D. Auchincloss, to the burial site on a hillside in Arlington National Cemetery. Meantime other Americans across the land observed the second anniversary of the President's slaying in ways of their own.

Agreement Signed

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP) — An agreement on sale of 700,000 tons of American wheat to Yugoslavia was signed here today. The agreement was signed by U.S. Ambassador to the Yugoslav Foreign Ministry, signed the agreement valued at \$45,609,000, including part of transport costs. Payments will be made in dollars in 12 annual installments, commencing two years after the shipment has been made. The sale is made on the basis of the American "Food for Peace" program. Tanyu, Yugoslav official news agency, said the negotiations for the agreement were held in a friendly atmosphere which reflects the desire of both governments.

Man Charged In Idaho Slaying of 3

WORLDY, Idaho (AP) — A 22-year-old Idaho man has been charged with the slaying of his mother, father and a nephew. His bodies were discovered in a wooded area Sunday. Killed were Walter G. Boswell, 67; his 63-year-old wife, Minnie, and their 16-year-old grandson, Donald Reddy. (Idaho) County Sheriff John Bender said the Boswell's son, Lawrence, had been charged with first-degree murder. The Boswells lived on a ranch near Worldy on the Clear Fork of the Snake River, about 10 miles southwest of Coeur d'Alene. Sheriff Bender said the elder Boswell was shot twice in the head and once in the chest.

John Garner Notes 97th Anniversary

UVALE, Tex. (AP) — Former Vice President John Garner celebrated his 97th birthday today with a brand new hat and a wish to be 100. National and state officials gathered in this small South Texas town to honor the only man who ever served successfully as speaker of the U.S. House and presiding officer of the U.S. Senate. Garner's birthday wishes by mail and wire. Garner made his birthday wishes known late Sunday in an emotional visit with his son, John Garner, 67, prominent Uvalde business man. "Son, I believe you want me to reach 100 as much as I do," said the elder Garner. "I want it even more, dad," replied the son.

Romania Reds Said Go-Betweens for Viet Nam Peace

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Romanians' Communist leaders are acting as go-betweens for North Viet Nam peace effort, Austrian diplomats say. Sources said Romanian efforts to achieve peace talks began last June after North Viet Nam put out peace feelers through Bucharest. The diplomats said Romanian Premier Ion Gheorghe Maurer reported the moves to Austrian officials during an official visit to Vienna last week. The diplomats said Maurer gave this account: After the overture from Hanoi, Romanian officials approached U.S. Ambassador William Boardman in Bucharest. The results of these contacts formed a basis for follow-up talks between Romanians, Foreign Minister Corneliu Iliescu and Secretary of State Dean Rusk at the United Nations in New York last month. The outcome of these talks was not indicated. Maurer told Austrian officials Romanians are ready to mediate between the United States and North Viet Nam "whenever there is a chance of bringing the war to an end."

Gen. LeMay Tells of Attack Checkrein

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gen. Curtis E. LeMay says there was a checkrein on the way targets in North Viet Nam could be attacked. LeMay, retired Air Force chief of staff, was asked by the Associated Press whether there have been any restrictions against North Viet Nam. "When I left active duty, there were some restrictions on the number of airplanes that could be used on a mission and also on types of ordnance that could be delivered," LeMay replied. Asked for comment, the Defense Department said, "We do not discuss tactics followed in carrying out combat operations over North Viet Nam."

Machinists End Strike at Rocket Site

WASHINGTON (AP) — Striking McDonnell Aircraft Corp. machinists agreed today to go back to work at Cape Kennedy as part of a Dec. 4 pact, federal officials said. The agreement, however, does not affect the strike of some 11,000 machinists against the company at St. Louis, Mo. The company is the prime contractor for the Apollo program. Sen. Jordan Speaks to Retailers Unit

Sen. Len Jordan, D-Idaho, told the Idaho Retailers Association Monday that he would be taking too much of a hand in the management of small business in the United States. Jordan said the growing role of the federal government in the business area rapidly is creating a "bureaucratic monster" which is making matters affecting small business more difficult to handle. "With government decisions made in Washington, D.C., setting the role for small business, it is inevitable that the small retailer finds that he is getting farther and farther away from participation in decisions which affect his business," Jordan said. "It is a particular danger in a particular area or business area left unsolved because big government is incapable of doing it."

Sen. Kennedy Speaks on Viet Nam War

SPOKANE, Idaho — War in Vietnam will be a long and enduring struggle, but the United States can meet the challenge, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., said here Sunday. Kennedy was the featured speaker in a banquet honoring Rep. Thomas S. Foley, D-Wash. The youngest brother of the 1964 presidential nominee received a laudatory ovation from the overflow crowd of 700. "Recently returned from a tour of Viet Nam, Kennedy admitted that the challenge there is a difficult and complex one. "The question is, are we committed to the cause of freedom? I feel that because our actions here in the Southeast Asia. "But we will not end the conflict in Viet Nam until we can see the propaganda media of other countries in Southeast Asia. The only way we can win is by an exposure of the reasons why we are in South Viet Nam," Kennedy said.

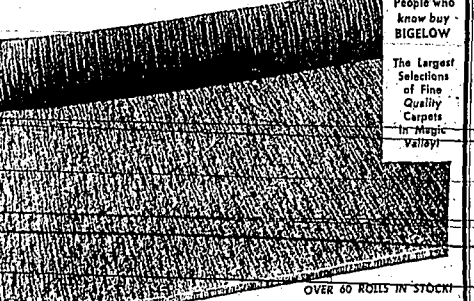
T.F. Church Sets Anniversary Fete

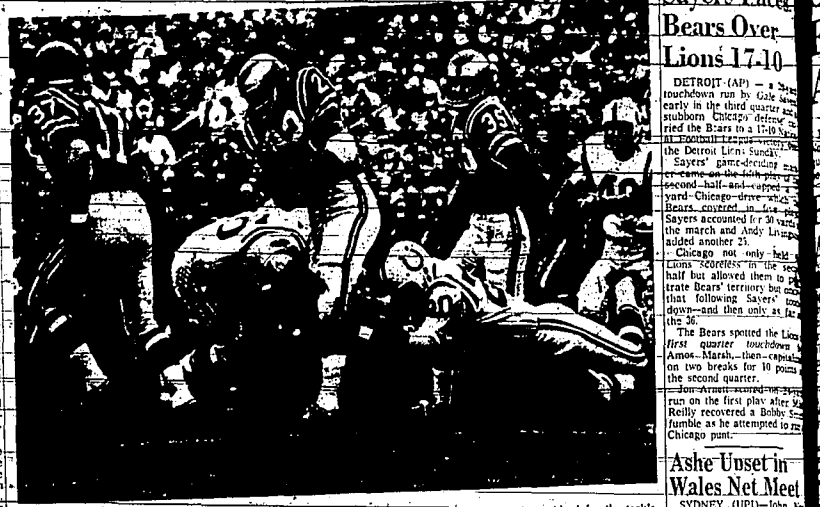

Marker Is Planned for Spot Where Kennedy Was Killed

DALLAS, Tex. (AP)—The spot where President John F. Kennedy was assassinated today will be marked with a bronze marker. The marker will be set in place, only by flowers and objects left by hundreds of visitors.

Within six months, Dallas city park director, L. B. Houston, hopes to unveil the marker memorial, consisting of three bronze panels set in native red granite, and containing a description of the tragedy using words and maps from the Warren Commission report.

The marker will be paid for from park department funds. It will be about 200 feet from the spot where the president was shot. Visitors will be able to glance up at the orange-brick Texas School Book Depository building from which Lee Harvey Oswald fired his rifle.

The plaza north of the assassination site will be known as Kennedy Memorial Plaza. It will contain a modest and dignified memorial in keeping with Mrs. Kennedy's wishes.

County Buildings now on the site will be removed. Estimated cost of the plaza should be completed by 1967.

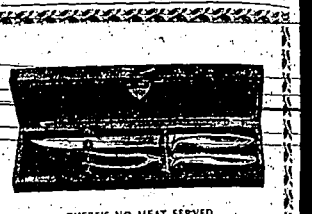

Caution Noted for U.S. Role in Water Resources

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Wayne Aspinall, D-Colo., has sounded a note of caution about the federal government's expanding role in the water resources field.

He said in a recent speech that "an attitude of 'let Uncle Sam do it' is a matter of concern... because, unless the federal agencies of government share the responsibilities and burdens... they abdicate their rights to make decisions which handle some water resources."

Speaking to a group of westerners in Congress, Aspinall said he and other legislators have "been trying to arrive at an equitable division of responsibilities between state, local interests and federal government as well as private enterprise."

Aspinall declared that "this is the first requirement for sound water planning... because the task of development and conservation policy is an essential part of the national defense program."

Development of such a program, he said, "has been hampered because our efforts have been directed toward preventing duplication and waste."

Aspinall declared that "proposals for expanding the federal government's role in water resources planning... have come about because of the failure of the states and the local governments and the private agencies of our country to fulfill the needs of the nation."

"The federal government's growing water role is, in other words, to a great extent a matter of lack of local responsibility and inability of states and localities to resolve their problems or settle their differences over water use."

The federal government should encourage local participation of the states and localities in water resources planning, Aspinall said, but instead "seems to take up to the problem."

Aspinall cited as examples: — Passage of the water resources planning law — only over strong opposition — calling for federal and local participation. — A trend towards federal water pollution control revolving from what Aspinall called "federalism" to "federalism."

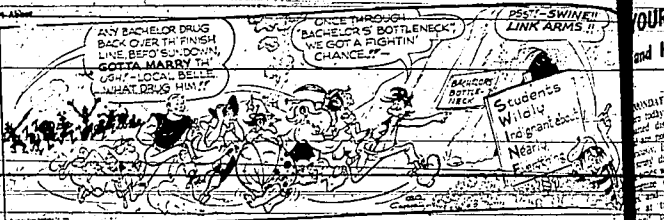
