

## Most U.S. Ground Troops Observe Thanksgiving

SAIGON, South Viet-Nam (AP)—U.S. infantrymen dashed with the Viet Cong today in the jungle north of Saigon, but most American ground troops in South Viet-Nam observed Thanksgiving Day without combat. U.S. military sources reported one of the quietest days in two years in the Drang Valley, where the Communists and U.S. troops last week fought their biggest battle of the war. The Viet Cong kept up pressure, however, against South Vietnamese troops along the central coast, while an Allied force of American, Australian and South Vietnamese troops pressed an offensive 85 miles northwest of Saigon in Binh Tay Province.

## Holiday Road Toll Keeps Normal Rate

Traffic deaths in the million-mile highway system observed Thanksgiving weekend today appeared running about the normal rate for a nonholiday period. The early death toll for the week started at 6 p.m. (local time) Wednesday with 49, five in a highway crash. The traffic death toll for the period will end at midnight today. Heavy rain and snow some parts of the nation added to the toll. The toll for the highways over the weekend, however, the National Highway Council reported, was not as much as long distance driving as on other major days.

## Disarmament Talks Vetoed By Red China

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States has reportedly vetoed a Red China proposal for disarmament talks. The veto was made public after a meeting of the United Nations Security Council. The proposal was for a general disarmament conference to be held in Geneva. The United States has long opposed such talks, fearing they would lead to a general reduction in military spending by the superpowers.

"Four or five more are not expected to live," Sheriff H. R. Delahoyde said today. Most of the other 70 persons in the building were burned or injured. "All our hospitals are filled," the sheriff said. "We had to send some patients to Quincy, Ill.; Burlington and Iowa City."

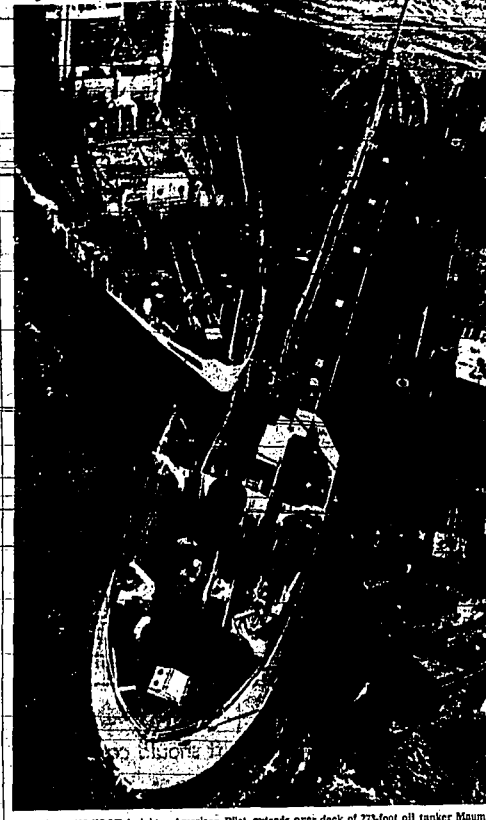

**Some Servicemen Die While Turkey Dinner Awaits Them**

**SAIGON**, South Viet Nam (UPI)—From muddy foxholes to comfortable officers' clubs, more than 15,000 U.S. servicemen in Viet Nam feasted today on traditional turkey dinners. But some died while their turkey was waiting.

The 1st Infantry Division, the "Big Red One," returned from a patrol in the dense, steaming Zone D jungle yesterday. They brought back the bodies of several of their buddies killed in a clash with the Viet Cong.

Helicopters took Protestant and Catholic chaplains to the front lines to conduct Thanksgiving services. One Catholic service near the Chu Lai beachhead, the altar was set up on a sack of "C" ration boxes. The men in the field ate in shifts to insure security.

The U.S. military menu included 156,000 pounds of turkey, 19,000 cans of cranberries, 200,000 pounds of shrimp, 19,000 pounds of fruit cake, 11,000 pounds of hard candy and 8,660 pounds of pumpkin.

Also on the menu were bread dressing and giblet gravy, tamale sauce, green beans, rolls, mince-pie and nuts. Just in case the 12,000 frozen turkeys failed to reach all their destinations, stocks of boneless rolled turkey were ready on a standby basis for quick delivery.

Mess hall details worked overtime. Troops in isolation and remote spots received the ingredients for their dinner by air drop.

## Congress Fighting Losing Battle in Attempt to Keep Shorthand Reporters

**WASHINGTON (AP)**—Congress is fighting a losing battle in its attempt to keep shorthand reporters to record debate in the House and Senate.

"We're a dying breed," says Albert Schneider of the men whose flying pens long have turned the mighty flow of congressional business into the book and squiggles of shorthand. "In another 10 years there won't be a shorthand reporter left."

Schneider is retiring this year after 42 years as an official House reporter. His departure, along with another member of the seven-man House team, has brought into sharp focus the swiftly approaching extinction of the species.

Like many another job, shorthand reporting is being taken over by machines in this case a compact, easy to operate, 21-key device that types words and full phrases phonetically.

It still takes someone to work the machine, and it can't go any faster than a good reporter, but it is vastly easier to learn to operate than to master shorthand, which accounts mainly for its growing use.

It also has the advantage of freeing the reporter's eyes so he can look around and see who is talking; whereas the shorthand reporter has to keep his eyes glued to his notebook.

These advantages have led to a virtual takeover by the machines in the last 20 years.

Old-timers with their pens and notebooks are still scattered throughout the courts and legislatures, but Congress remains their last, though crumbling, bastion.

Acutely conscious of his role in history, Congress has tried to preserve as much of its past as it can. Shorthand and expeditors are still found in the Senate and Thomas Jefferson's rules of procedure still are followed.

There has been a particular abhorrence of mechanical contrivances. There are no microphones in the Senate, although the larger House of Representatives has had to resort to them.

Radio or television equipment is permitted in either chamber during regular sessions. No mechanical voting methods are desired — and no mechanical reporting devices.

The House operates with seven shorthand reporters, the Senate, eight. In the House, each man takes five miles of debate every 30 minutes. In the Senate it is 10 minutes every hour.

## Vietnamese Twins Have Thanksgiving

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — For Nam Thi Hoa and Nguyen Thi Thuan, a Vietnamese girl who turned out to be twins, this is their first American Thanksgiving.

The twins are now Joan and Jean Badey, the adopted daughters of Marine Sgt. and Mrs. James R. Badey. The sergeant found them in an orphanage in Saigon.

Thanksgiving is a lot more personal this year, said Badey. "We are thankful that I am home safe and that we have the children with us."

Badey had told the mother superior at Sacred Heart Orphanage in Saigon he wanted to adopt a child, preferably a girl between two and four, he said.

"When I went back a couple of days later the little girl turned out to be twins," Badey says. "I could have taken only one, but I'm a poker player and I don't split pairs."

So the sergeant, 37, picked up his twins, 4 years old, and flew with them to the United States to join his wife, 25.

"It's the culmination of a long-held hope," he said in his new home at Norfolk.

"We started talking about adoption a year after we were married five years ago," said Mrs. Badey, the former Lucetta Burnett, of Arlington.

The twins, abandoned by their parents, were among some 73 children, most of them less than 18 months old, in the Saigon orphanage nursery.

Food in the nursery consisted almost entirely of bread and porridge, Badey said, and Joan and Jean had never tasted meat. "They were suspicious of it," he said. "They were suspicious of their first meat, but now they like meat best of all," he said.

## Government Lends Support For More Private Housing

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The government comes into the picture in the housing program through the Federal Housing and Urban Development Administration only by insuring a \$7.1 billion investment in the mortgages.

Since its beginning in 1959, the FHA mortgage insurance has brought a great boon to the private home building industry. Banks are much more willing to lend mortgage money with the government guarantee to repay should the homeowner default.

That \$7.1 billion of private insurance has built more than 5.5 million homes and apartment buildings, plus the purchase of thousands of homes.

In comparison with its support of private housing, the government has been "inactive" in other such activities, such as small inroads.

The Public Housing Administration — the new department — helps local housing authorities borrow the money to build housing for poor people. FHA then makes annual contributions to the rents at levels the private tenants can afford.

So far, about 10 million units of government public housing have been built with federal aid. The total cost: \$7.2 billion.

The Urban Renewal Administration lends or gives money to local communities to clear slums. URA is back of 1,500 projects at a total cost of 2.7 billion.

## Maintenance, Not Initial Cost Is Biggest Problem With Missiles

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Like advanced Minuteman II, the more potent weapon than the "daddy" — intercontinental missile — attack system is nearing the point where maintenance instead of installation will be the chief cost.

The U.S. Air Force recently completed its \$4-billion program. This placed these 6,000-mile weapons in 80-foot deep pits — which they can be fired on instant notice — at sites spread over vast areas of the Midwest and Northwest.

Digging of holes — or silos — is stilling from strategic weapons well under way for 200 more

The missile deployment when present programs are finished, will total 1,710, including 54 Titan IIs, the only liquid-fueled type being retained.

The combined explosive force of these weapons is secret. But it probably is about three billion tons of TNT.

By this time next summer, the Air Force will have started a billion-dollar program for converting the 800 Minuteman IIs to the Minuteman II.

However, the conversion is labeled "modernization" and could be considered a form of maintenance. It will cost about

### Balloons Will Be Used for Space Study

NEW YORK (UPI)—Dozens of plastic balloons will be released from an orbiting satellite in an experiment to safeguard man's flight to the moon.

The balloons will be important elements in a study to develop defenses against a major hazard of space flight: micrometeorites, the fastest flying rocks in space.

These space rocks are a threat because they might puncture the spacecraft, causing a disastrous loss of cabin pressure. Or they could rip off a chunk of the heat shielding surface which is an indispensable part of the spacecraft.

Working under a NASA contract, Avco Corporation's Rocket Research and Development Division has started to develop the so-called "moon balloon" approach as a means for analyzing the chemical composition of micrometeorites.

Under this approach, a cluster of plastic 6-inch balloons would be inflated and released

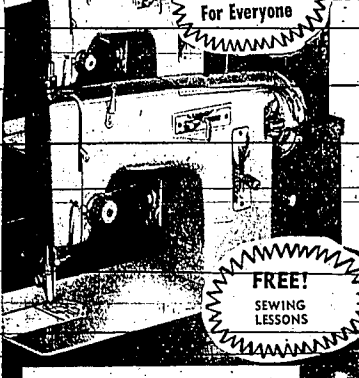

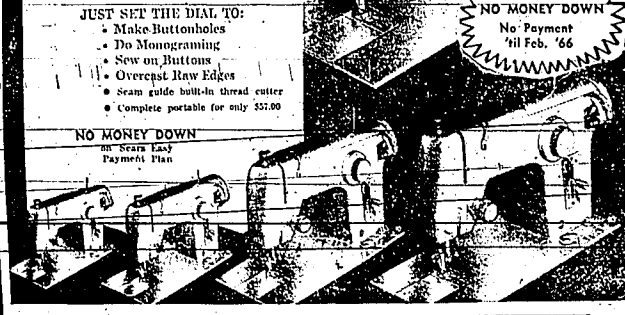

Similar meals — allowing for regional tastes — are being prepared in millions of homes throughout the country.

In Massachusetts, where the Pilgrims started it all in 1621, the State Restaurant Association will hold a turkey dinner in Boston.

In Virginia, which also lays claim to the first Thanksgiving, 700,000 turned out Sunday at the annual Colonial Dames Plantation near Richmond commemorating the service that Dec. 7, 1619.

Thanksgiving was once a day for college football rivalries, but Thursday's lineup is nearly as lean as a pre-war turkey.

The State Park Athletic Association will hold a turkey dinner at the State Fairgrounds in Lincoln, Neb., following 10:30 p.m. for the football game between the Nebraska-Oklahoma State football teams.

Virginia Tech and Virginia Military Institute meet in Roanoke for the football game following 7:30 p.m.

# Waldo Fought Is President Of PTA Unit

SHOSHONE — Waldo Fought was elected president of Shoshone PTA at a meeting Monday night at the Lincoln school auditorium.

Also elected were Kenneth Blackburn, first vice president; Mary Dore, second vice president; Mrs. Barbara Dore, secretary, and Mrs. Elwin Webb, treasurer.

Officers were installed by Mrs. Floyd Kilding, District State PTA vice president.

Superintendent of schools Kenneth Dore presided over the recent legislation that will allow Shoshone and Dietrich schools because of location and enrollment.

The law reads that for each school year after 1965-1966, any consolidation of any continuous high school operating school districts which individually exceed a factor consideration of 1.30 or greater and whose secondary schools are located within 10 miles or less of each other by another route shall be assigned to the secondary operating school district for which they would qualify if their secondary schools were combined.

The school boards are given authority and power by this same law to levy the taxes to make up for the loss from the state in the curback. They may do so without an election.

Shoshone schools will lose about \$100,000 and Dietrich about \$5,000 under this new law, and the school board is not to be dissolved down to where there are 100 or less.

Superintendent Crothers stated he was not making any proposals nor recommendations for consolidation; only giving facts and results under the new law.

The big savings to the district consolidated, he stated, would be in faculty salary, the entire Dietrich high school could be absorbed into the Shoshone system and most of the additional classrooms and with only one of one additional teacher.
