

# British, Soviet Officials Begin Viet Nam Talks

MOSCOW (AP) — British Foreign Secretary Michael Stewart arrived in Moscow today for talks with Soviet leaders on Viet Nam and the nonproliferation of nuclear weapons. Stewart said the talks are the first of a series which would contribute to the normalization of the international situation. British sources here held little hope of quick results. Accompanied by Communist Party Secretary Leonard Brezhnev, Stewart was scheduled to meet with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko Tuesday. Stewart also was expected to meet with Premier Nikita Khrushchev and Communist Party Secretary Leonid Brezhnev.

# Humphrey Asks Support For Peace

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House should support the United Nations in creating as soon as possible a permanent peace-keeping force in Viet Nam, Hubert H. Humphrey said today. Humphrey took his stand as a member of the House International Cooperation committee which heard the issues of peace in Viet Nam. Humphrey said the committee urged President Johnson to seek international agreement on the peace activity on the moon. There have been signs of American and British flexibility on the tough question. Britain has indicated it considers nonproliferation of nuclear weapons more important than a NATO nuclear force. The United States has proposed a consultation committee that would give other Alliance nations some participation in the nuclear force for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The Soviet Union maintains this would give Western nations unnecessary access to nuclear arms.

There have been signs of American and British flexibility on the tough question. Britain has indicated it considers nonproliferation of nuclear weapons more important than a NATO nuclear force. The United States has proposed a consultation committee that would give other Alliance nations some participation in the nuclear force for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The Soviet Union maintains this would give Western nations unnecessary access to nuclear arms.

Before the participants split into camps to discuss a variety of possibilities of international cooperation, Humphrey said in a message from London calling for a conference of a town meeting of leaders of the nation, and said the direction of the talks was not only to take but also to study your communications with a view to escalation.

WASHINGTON (AP) — A leader of the weekend peace march in Washington, in which thousands protested American involvement in the Viet Nam war, said today that a demonstration doesn't convince anyone. Despite this, Sanford Gottlieb said in a telephone interview, the demonstration was organized by the National Student Reliance Council. Gottlieb is political action director of SANE, which sponsored Saturday's march and picketing of the White House in protest of U.S. policies in Viet Nam. The march was estimated to have peaked at 40,000 to 50,000 people, according to Gottlieb. Future marches are being considered, he said, because "it's a time when a dramatic event is needed to publicize your point of view, there's nothing like a large demonstration."

Nor was there any confirmation from the Indonesian newspaper Asahi that Aidit had been shot and killed Oct. 22 while trying to escape over a mountain range near Sarakata, in central Java. # McNamara Pleased With Fact-Finding Tour in Viet Nam

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara ended his visit to Viet Nam today by declaring that the United States would throw in its many fighting men as needed to wage the war against the Communists. McNamara told newsman Saigon today after his 11-day fact-finding tour that the most dramatic impression is that "we have stopped using the war." He added that the increased ferocity of Viet Cong and North Vietnamese attacks in recent weeks "has not been matched by a corresponding increase in the ferocity of our military strength."

# Holiday Traffic Toll Sets Record at 602

The nation's Thanksgiving weekend traffic toll reached 602 today, the highest death toll for the period in the past 10 years of record-keeping. This year, the highest toll was 554 in 1964. With some states still to verify final figures, it appeared this year's record for the 102-hour period which ended at midnight, might go higher. Forty traffic deaths were reported in New York state, 32 in California and 24 in Texas. Ohio counted 33 deaths.

# Rhodesian Chief Warns Paratroops

HAMBURG, Germany (UPI) — Rhodesian rebel Premier Ian Smith said in an interview published Monday his men would open fire on British paratroops if they dropped on Rhodesia. Smith reportedly told Der Spiegel news magazine he was sure the Rhodesian people would obey his order to fire. "Anyone who enters this country without the right to come will see what happens to him," Smith said. He said anyone who came to Rhodesia could "see with his own eyes." Rhodesians would back him.

# Wilson Holds Emergency Cabinet Meet

LONDON (AP) — Prime Minister Harold Wilson held an emergency meeting of his Cabinet today amid reports Britain was ready to send a Royal Air Force squadron to Zambia bordering rebellious Rhodesia. The meeting was called suddenly after a midnight meeting of ministers directly concerned with the Rhodesia crisis broke up.

### Union Bakers May Extend British Strike

LONDON (UPI) — The Labor government Saturday was faced with the possibility that union bakers would extend their bread strike throughout England and Wales.

Everything appeared to depend on the decision of the 12-man executive of the 32,000-member Bakers' Union, which meets in Birmingham Sunday afternoon.

The strike resulted in long lines outside baker's shops for most of the week in Wales and the midland regions of England. A supporting strike started Friday in the greater London region spread the bread famine to the south.

The bakers want a basic 4% weekly wage—equal to an increase of about 3 per cent. But the Minister of Economic Affairs, George Brown, was insisting on prior consideration of the wage claim of his recently-instituted prices and incomes board.

Prime Minister Harold Wilson's labor government regarded the successful functioning of the Prices and Incomes Board as the cornerstone of its long-range economic planning.

To meet the bakers' demands would risk damaging the wage-price structure and almost certainly would result in a permanent increase in the bread price.
