Change Seen In Communist War Arms

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — A striking change in the Communist arms and ammunition picture resulted in the early days of the war in Viet Nam.

Building up their firepower, Communist forces spent most of their money on standardized weapons from Red nations: Captured U.S. army ammunition and equipment — once a major factor in guerrilla fighting — are fading into relative insignificance.

U.S. weapons now are often left by the Communists on the battlefield. The Viet Cong seem to support themselves with captured equipment.

Captured American arms still play a role. So do the French Indochina fighting a dozen years ago. But small-arms ammunition is not interchangeable between weapons of U.S. manufacture and those made in Communist nations. The Communists need a source for ammunition if they are to use U.S. weapons.

There is little evidence of clandestine ammunition traffic between Viet Nam and Western countries. The main source has had to be captured material. Possibly there now is another source: ammunition manufactured for U.S. small-arms in North Viet Nam. Competent sources say it is highly unlikely that China makes such ammunition.

The Viet Cong use captured weapons when they must, but there is little doubt now that the Communist forces prefer equipment from the Communist bloc countries. One reason is that they may consider some of the bloc weapons to be superior to the equivalent U.S. makes.

Judge Denies Request in Tuition Suit

HOUSTON (AP) — District Judge Martin S. Young denied a lawsuit in Third District Court a request for an immediate judgment in the lawsuit which seeks to force the University of Houston to honor its nonresident fees.

Forces May be Helicopter-Borne To Battle Heavy Flow of Viet Cong

WASHINGTON (AP)—U.S. infiltration is an evaluation of the capability of Communist forces to sustain their forces in the face of a heavy flow of Viet Cong. This is still an imponderable, U.S. sources said.

U.S. authorities here estimate that the North Vietnamese have about 30 battalions in South Viet Nam. Assuming they double their forces, the sources said, it is estimated it would take about 90 regiments to bring them to parity with the U.S. forces in the area. At this level, 60 battalions would have to be sent to the area.

In the light of this, U.S. authorities consider it highly unlikely that the United States will send troops into Laos to form a fence to cut off the movement of North Vietnamese troops into the area. As one source put it, "It's better to put a bucket under the faucet than to try to mop up the floor."

Within the present policy, sources said, the United States is basically fighting a strategic defense in the efforts to save South Viet Nam from being overrun by the Communists.

The best way to do this, experts said, is to take the tactical offensive to find the Communist troops and cut them to pieces.

This is a course of action which U.S. ground combat forces have been following for months and which apparently will be amplified.

Officials cite the recent bloody battle in the Mang Yang Valley as an example of what could be expected in the future.

In that running fight, troops of the U.S. 1st Cavalry, Alamo Division and their South Vietnamese allies killed nearly 2,300 of the enemy, U.S. officials said, less than 10 per cent of the Communist dead.

There is every indication that the section of the infiltration network extending from North Viet Nam through Laos is in for a heavy aerial pounding.

Merger of 2 Transmission Firms Slated

WASHINGTON (AP) — American Broadcasting Companies Inc. and the International Telephone and Telegraph Corp. have agreed to merge into a \$1.5-billion company in the next few years.

The merger, approved by the board of directors of the two companies Tuesday night, would produce a stock transaction of between \$350 and \$400 million.

Harold S. Green, chairman and president of I.T. and T., and Leonard H. Goldenson, president of ABC, said in a joint statement.

"The consummation of the arrangement will be subject to the approval of the shareholders of each company and the approval of the Federal Communications Commission and other appropriate government agencies and the obtaining of a favorable tax ruling."

The impact of the merger would also be felt strongly abroad. I.T. and T. is a major producer of radio, television and appliances in Europe, Latin America and the Far East.

One of the conditions of the merger, said the joint statement, will be the continued autonomous operation and management of American Broadcasting Company, television and International Telephone and Telegraph Corp.

Assets of I.T. and T. at the end of 1964 were in excess of \$1.6 billion. ABC's assets exceeded \$226.6 million.

A medical team at the hospital replaced all the blood in the intern's body with fresh blood twice as they bled to cure the liver disease known as fulminating hepatitis. The blood exchange took place last month.

Authorities estimated that the Nobel Prize, amounting to \$51,788, will be presented in Oslo University Friday.

It is not unusual for children to receive compatible infants to undergo total blood exchange. "We are not aware of any reports in

Teacher Hits Law on Topic Of Evolution

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (UPI)—A young biology teacher challenging a 1925 state law in a court suit that stifles memories of the 1925 "monkey trial" is losing the teaching of evolution in school.

Mrs. Susan Epperson, 24, filed suit in Chancery state court Monday, trying to get the court to throw out the law that prohibits the teaching of the theory of evolution in public schools.

She is a teacher in Little Rock Central High School.

Forrest Rozzell, executive secretary of the Arkansas Education Association, asked Mrs. Epperson to file the suit and the organization's attorney, George Warren, filed it in her behalf.

She contends the law keeps her from doing her duty as a teacher and discussing various scientific theories.

When she is forced to refrain from teaching some theories, that perpetuates "ignorance, prejudice and bigotry," she contended.

Mrs. Epperson is the wife of an Air Force lieutenant. Her parents are both well known and they are both dedicated Christians who see no conflict between their belief in God and the scientific search for truth," she said. "I share this belief."

The suit recalled the historic trial of a biology teacher at the high school in Dayton, Tenn., in July, 1925, in which John T. Scopes was convicted of teaching evolution.

He was defended by famed criminal lawyer Clarence Darrow and the prosecution was headed by William Jennings Bryan, renowned orator and Democratic candidate for president.

Lovell began his scouting as a Cub Scout in 1928, achieving scouting's highest rank of Eagle Scout at a member of Troop 100 in Milwaukee, Wis., in 1931.

In 1944, Lovell received the Bronze Palm Award and in 1946 the Gold Palm Award when he was a junior assistant scoutmaster.

Mazzone said Lovell also was a member of the Order of the

Arrow, Scout Honor Camping Society and the Alpha Phi Omega, national service fraternity of former Scouts and leaders.

Mazzone said both pilots of the Gemini 7 spacecraft—also were scouts. Walter M. Schirra Jr. was a First Class Scout at Fairfield, N.J., and Thomas P. Stafford was a Cub Scout for three years, then a Boy Scout for four years, achieving the rank of Star Scout at Weatherford, Okla.

Of the first 30 astronauts named, 27 have scouting backgrounds, Mazzone added. Those reaching the Eagle rank besides Lovell are Neil A. Armstrong, Roger B. Chaffee, Donn Jr., Sizable and Elliot M. See Jr.

In commenting on scouting, Astronaut Lovell said, "I owe much of my present career to

the training I had as a Boy Scout. It was through scouting that I first learned self-reliance, leadership and many fine attributes that scouting has to offer."

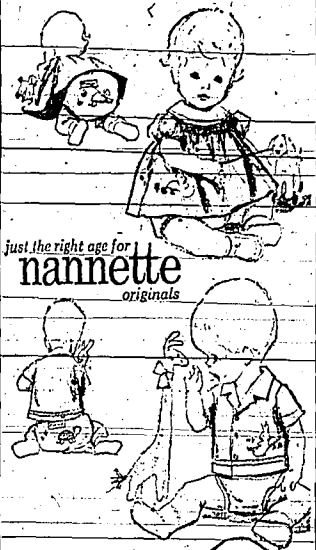

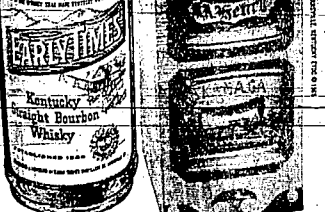

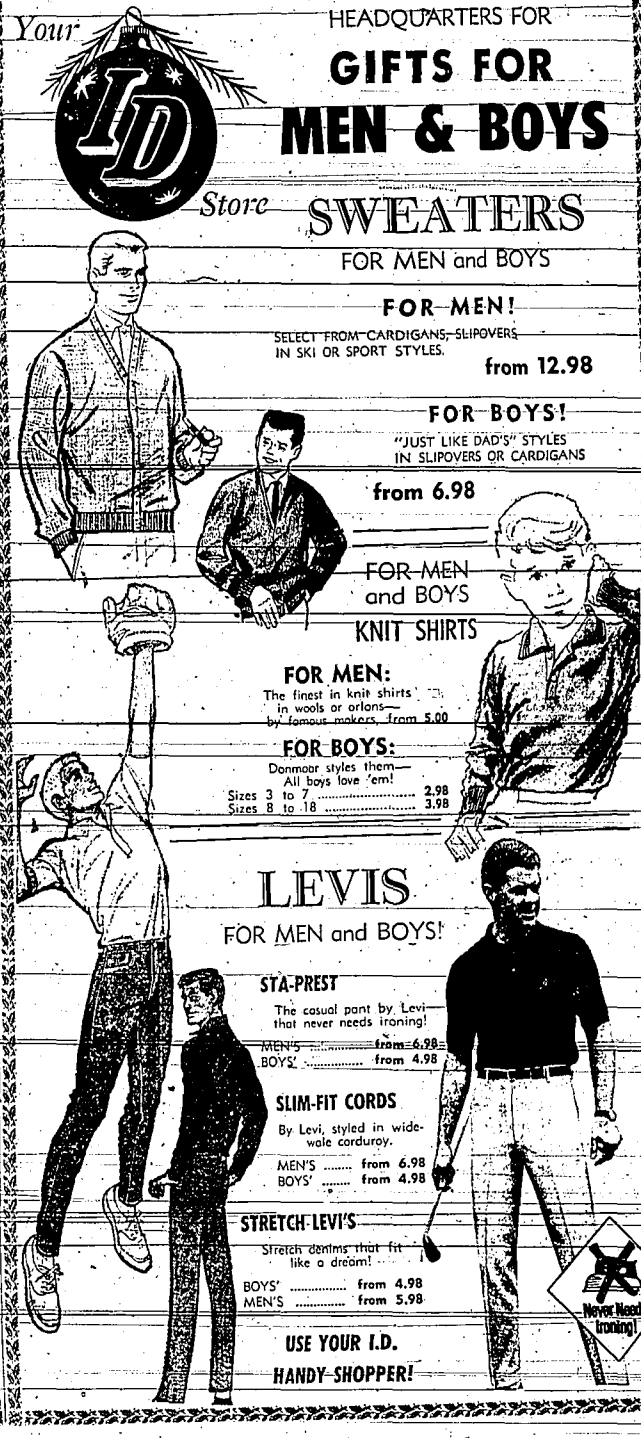

Council Called Significant Event of Year

The Vatican Ecumenical Council was the most significant religious event of this century. It laid the groundwork for changes in the Roman Catholic Church as far-reaching as any sought by Martin Luther at the time of the Protestant Reformation.

As a result of this historic four-year summit conference of bishops from every nation, the world's largest religious body will:

- Conduct its worship services in new ways.
- Decentralize its form of government.
- Radically revise its attitude toward other religions.
- Give greater prominence to the laity as a source of power.

Accord new dignity and importance to the laity.

—Overhaul its seminaries to insure better selection and preparation of priests.

—Put nuns into modern dress.

That's not all the Council did, but it's enough to indicate the breathtaking scope of its achievements.

Not all the changes it wrought will be visible immediately to the observer, however. Changes, it will take many years, in some cases, to implement the broad charter of reform which were laid down by the Council fathers.

Some Catholic traditionalists, who preferred the old ways, are appalled by the whole business. Their viewpoint was vigorously represented in the Council by a small but determined minority of conservative bishops who made up in parliamentary skill what they lacked in voting power.

Their maneuvers succeeded on many occasions in postponing action on important documents. This led to premature gloom-mongering by disappointed liberals and, particularly at the close of the 1962 session, gave rise to a widespread public impression that the Council was foundering on the rocks of conservatism.

Nothing could be further from the truth. The key fact about the Council from the day it opened until the day it closed was the overwhelming size of the majority committed to Pope John's program of renewal and reform. On the crucial votes, the majority for "aggiornamento" (an Italian word meaning "updating") was usually in the neighborhood of 80 to 90 percent.

So this revolution in what for centuries a staid and change-resistant institution cannot be regarded as a coup engineered by a few hot-eyed reformers. It represents the considered judgment and enthusiastic will of most of the 2,300 bishops who of patiently endured endless weeks of Latin debate in order to cooperate with the dogged agenda.

The first fruit of their labor was a sweeping reform in Catholic liturgical practices.

The Council fathers decreed that public worship was henceforth to be conducted in the language of the people instead of Latin so members of the congregation could be active participants rather than silent spectators. Provision was made for revising the order of the mass, purifying it of medieval accretions and redundancies.

BRIDGEPORT, Calif. (AP) — The guard's face twists as he sneers at the American Marine. "You're nothing but a tool being used by superiors who are warmongers sitting back in warm offices. You are nothing but a tool."

The interrogator is applying mental pressure, uncertainty — brainwashing.

The scene, far removed from any battle zone, is the Marine Corps' Survival School — set in chilly desolate isolation in the hills near the California-Nevada border.

For two weeks the sneering guard and his fellows pound U.S. Marines with verbal harassment.

Sgt. Antonio Lopez — the sneering guard — is attempting to teach fellow Marines what to expect should they fall into enemy hands.

To Lopez and the "prisoners," the mock prison camp is no joke. What Lopez teaches them could save their lives — and they are constantly reminded of this.

Thousands of Marines — officers and enlisted men — were trained in the rugged special school, started in 1951 after U.S. servicemen experienced harsh treatment in prisoner of war camps.

Minister Testifies in Slaying Trial

SELMA, Ala. (AP) — A California minister testified today that he was attacked last March on a Selma street by one of three white men on trial for the clubbing death of the Rev. James J. Reeb of Boston, a participant in a civil rights campaign.

"There is no doubt in my mind after having seen these men in person," said the Rev. Clark Olsen, 34, of Berkeley, Calif., who was with Reeb when he was knocked to the pavement.

But Olsen, recalled to the stand in the second day of the murder trial, said he could not identify any of the three men.

Olsen said he was positive that he was struck by Elmer L. Cook, 42, although the witness on cross-examination said he did not remember if he had told FBI agents that another defendant, William Stanley Hoggie, 37, was the man.

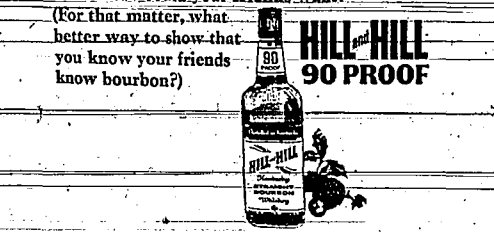
Olsen was interviewed to the stand by the Rev. Orloff Miller of Boston, who also was with Reeb the night of the attack.

Businessmen Raise Plans For Spending

WASHINGTON (AP) — Businessmen have sharply increased their plans for spending on plant and equipment in the past few months, the Commerce Department said today.

Business spending in 1965 is now expected to be 15 per cent higher than 1964, and a further 14 per cent rise is projected for the first six months of 1966.

The Commerce Department surveys thus indicated that outlays for plant and equipment would run at an unprecedented rate for the fourth straight year.

Secretary of Commerce John T. Connor said "it is reassuring to note that the tone of business confidence remains high and that we can count on the continued contribution of American business to the prosperity of the American economy."

He said capital expenditures by business have been "a mainstay of the current business expansion."
