**SPEAKER SEATED** — Atty. Gen. Alan C. Blyden announced Wednesday as featured speaker for a law enforcement conference beginning Thursday in Boise.

Other speakers during the conference, which ends Saturday, include E. Hoopes, state commissioner of law enforcement; Ralph Haley, Orofino, president of the Idaho Prosecuting Attorneys Association; and John Bender, Coeur d'Alene, president of the Idaho Sheriffs Association.

The conference is sponsored by the Idaho Magistrates Association.

**DAY PROCLAIMED** — Gov. Robert E. Spitzer Wednesday designated Friday as Wright Brothers Day in line with a congressional resolution adopted Dec. 17 of each year to honor Orville and Wilbur Wright who built the first successful airplane in 1903 and held "appropriate ceremonies and activities" throughout the nation.

**BOY KILLED** — A 10-year-old boy was killed Wednesday in a head-on collision between a car taking him to a town and a car coming to pick him up.

The Idaho Highway Patrol identified the boy as Miles E. Rice, 10300 W. Vert-Jones, Morgan Creek, Idaho, rancher.

Troopers said Miles was a passenger in a car driven by Claudia Taylor, 21, a school teacher. They said the car collided with a car driven by James Banteli, one of Jones' employees.

The patrol said three persons, including the school teacher, were hospitalized. The school teacher's car contained three of the dead boy's stepbrothers.

**SHOT TO DEATH** — Daniel D. Carver, 48, Homedale, was killed instantly Wednesday when a .22-caliber rifle discharged accidentally in Guybon, County Sheriff Al Barberis.

Barberis said the rifle was being carried by Keith Volk, 18, Nampa, and apparently discharged accidentally when the two boys were returning to their car.

Volk had been staying in Carver's home for the past three weeks.

The two boys had been target practicing along Succor Creek, a mile northwest of Homedale, Wednesday morning, the sheriff said.

Carver was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Don Carver.

**SIGNATURES GATHERED** — Pocatello (UPI) — Young Republicans at Idaho State University gathered about 350 signatures of support for American Viet Nam policies Wednesday despite a protest by demonstrators at a counter-demonstration.

When the YR's announced their intent to gather signatures, supporters of the American military position there were threats and counter-threats of demonstrations.

He told a Chamber of Commerce group that the nation is in danger of spending too much because of the "increased burden of financing the war in Viet Nam."

**MUST PLAN AHEAD** — Boise (AP) — Supp. of Public Instruction D. F. Engelking said Wednesday a shortage of public school classrooms means he will have to continually plan ahead.

The shortage of 700 rooms was reported by Allen P. Jett, Jr. Tuesday. He is a state official for the department of education.

"I think this is another indication of the lack of education thought to be put into the book at the future planning," he said.

### Bitter Storm Drops Snow In Southwest

A bitter storm in the Southwest dropped 14 inches of snow Wednesday, creating highway hazards and spreading into the western Plains today.

U.S. 86 was closed to traffic in the area of Fort Huachuca, N.M., by a blizzard of snow on an icy hill. Roads across the northern part of the state and in the southern mountain areas had an extensive ice cover.

Action braced for precipitation as Flagstaff measure 10 inches of snow. Almost two feet of snow fell in some northern Arizona points. Maverick had 22 inches and Alpine 22. Subzero temperatures hit sections of northern Arizona.

In New Mexico, a school bus overturned 12 miles northwest of Mesquite. No one was injured. A truck driver was killed when his truck tipped over seven miles north of Lovington.

In Taos ski valley snow measured 20 inches.

The Weather Bureau issued stock warnings and advised motorists that driving was extremely hazardous. Poor visibility Wednesday caused a crash of two switch engines in a Clovis, N.M., rail yard and caused minor injuries to eight Santa Fe Railway employees.

An oilshoot of the storm reached into western Kansas and deposited two inches of snow on Goodland in six hours. The mercury sank to 17 below zero at Welland, Wyo., and Bismarck, N.D., had 3 early today.

### Scientists Say Surface of Moon Is Probably Fine Sand

SUNNYVALE, Calif. (AP) — The moon's surface probably is a loose layer of fine sand-like material. The stuff is at least 10 feet and possibly 100 feet deep.

But it won't cause any significant trouble for American astronauts when they attempt moon landings in their Apollo spacecraft, say Donald E. Gault and William L. Quaide, scientists at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Ames Research Center here.

Gault, a 20-year veteran in NASA aerodynamics research, and Quaide, a geologist, base their theory on laboratory experiments by which they closely matched the moon crater pictures transmitted to earth by the Ranger spacecraft.

The laboratory results were confirmed in field tests with missiles impacting into target areas at White Sands proving ground in New Mexico.

With Ames laboratory guns they fired glass projectiles into 15-by-15-inch targets of ground quartz, pumice, and carbon dust at angles ranging from vertical to 15 degrees.

Their purpose was to simulate the space particle bombardment which they assume the moon has undergone constantly throughout its more than four billion years of existence.

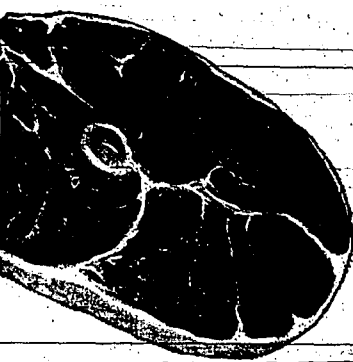

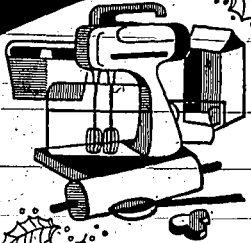

### Business Mirror

NEW-YORK (AP)—Many savers as well as borrowers will be affected by the rise in interest rates. Thrift institutions are beginning to bid higher for the money that savers can deposit.

That the higher costs of borrowing might do to corporate and consumer plans as a result of the Federal Reserve Board's raising its discount rate to 4 1/2 per cent from 4 per cent is being debated before the Federal Reserve committee. The discount rate is what the Fed charges member banks for loans. This is the trend for bank loans to the public.

But across the country a number of savers—if they have enough money—are being told they can get more returns from now on if they leave their money with lenders for a specified length. In a few instances the yield already has risen to the new 5 1/2 per cent ceiling.

Savers also can buy bonds now and get higher yields—because they pay less for them—though interest rates are fixed. And new issues of bonds are expected to carry higher interest rates.

Commercial banks, mutual savings banks, savings and loan associations are getting into the fight to lure the best investors, or at least hold them.

The Fed says it deliberately left the 4 per cent ceiling on what member banks can pay on regular, or passbook, savings accounts which can be freely drawn upon. It says this was to keep from harming other kinds of savings institutions.

But it failed to 5 1/2 per cent on 4 1/2 per cent what its member banks could pay on certificates of deposit and certain other time deposits. These are a large denominations and in the past have been used mainly by big corporations or financial institutions with a few millions of dollars cash they can tie up for stated periods.

Now some commercial banks are lowering their rates on size so as to let individual savers buy smaller denominations of certificates of deposit.

Still conditions, which many an ordinary citizen probably can't meet. The smallest size sold often is \$2,500, and the money must be left in the bank for a definite time—more than 30 days, usually more than 90 days, and often for six months or a year.

Some large banks account for more than two-thirds of the \$18 billion of such certificates outstanding. The Fed thinks that smaller banks will now enter the market, especially with certificates of deposit for individuals rather than corporations.

### Liberalism of Soviet Artists, Writers Cannot Be Reversed

PARIS (AP)—The liberalizing of Soviet writers and artists has reached a point where apparently it cannot be reversed.

Despite periodic setbacks Soviet writers and artists have gained a measure of freedom that is making them more and more a political problem for the Soviet regime.

It still is the announced purpose of the Communist party to obligate writers to help eradicate the people in the direction of communism. To support party discipline, and to avoid those liberal tendencies found in the West.

By their own initiative, writers and artists and musicians have put a new interpretation on their duty. It is to act as the vanguard leading the country away from the old and toward the new.

This correspondent has spent the major part of the past seven years in the Soviet Union, and the changes in that period are of important.

"By a curious turn, the whole new mood of the country is to revive a respect for what is old and historic in the country, and to denounce what is old in communism. Except for the period when Lenin was in control, a short period, most of the recent half century of the old communism is under critical fire. This includes the Stalin era and it begins to include the last succeeding eight years when Khrushchev was dominant.

This doesn't mean that the writers and artists that communism itself had, although a few talk bitterly about life under party rule. It simply means that they want to see changes.

The setback of the present is serious, but liberals are more strongly depressed by it. Two respected writers are awaiting trial on charges of publishing matter abroad which the party leaders considered harmful to the cause. They are Andrei Siniavski and Yuli Daniel, a liberal Moscow magazine (New World); and Yuli Daniel, a

### Policy Backed In Letter by Stevenson

CHICAGO (UPI)—The late Adlai E. Stevenson, in a letter written shortly before his death, supported the U.S. military effort in Viet Nam and endorsed the "purpose and direction" of U.S. foreign policy elsewhere.

The previously unpublished letter was released Tuesday by the ambassador's son, Adlai Stevenson III, "in the interest of history." It had been written to American social critic Paul Goodman in response to a request that Stevenson resign from his United Nations post to protest U.S. foreign policy.

"My hope in Viet Nam," Stevenson wrote, "is that relatively small scale resistance now may establish the fact that changes in Asia are not to be precipitated by outside force."

"This was the point of the Korean War. This is the point of conflict in Viet Nam. I believe Asia will be more stable if the outcome is the same in both—a negotiated line and a negotiated peace."

Stevenson made it clear in his letter to Goodman that he considered China to be the aggressor in Asia and that the United States was resisting it now before "resistance is unavoidable and major war in Asia breaks out."

Adlai III said he was releasing the text of the letter "in the interest of history and in order to carry out my father's intentions."

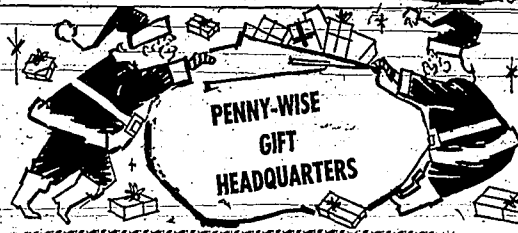

### Food Price Increase Hits Markets

NEW YORK (AP)—There will be little cheer in food bills this week. Wholesale food prices climbed to their highest marks in a decade, and already have spread to the markets.  
Fresh pork prices are high, reflecting an even-greater drop in the pork supply than had been expected earlier. The supply is 22 per cent below last year.  
In the New York metropolitan area, pork prices are up 18 to 24 cents a pound. On the West Coast, they are up 2 to 10 cents a pound; on top of a 1-to-7 cent increase last week.  
Beef production also is down. Lamb supplies are about 9 per cent lower than a year ago.  
Egg prices are up in some areas, matching increases in ham and bacon. The increase is due to a greater consumer demand than expected.  
Turkey prices are resisting the upward trend.  
The seasonal decline in milk prices is expected to be shorter than usual, with production down about 1 billion pounds from 1964.  
Rain damage in Florida and California cut vegetable crops and raised prices. Tomatoes generally are higher because of the shortages.

# Industrial Production Is Expanding

WASHINGTON (AP) — The nation's industrial production continued to expand at a fairly high rate in November with all major sectors registering gains, the Federal Reserve Board reported today.

Production reached 145.5 on the Federal Reserve's index, moving upward for the second straight month following a slight slip after settlement of the steel labor dispute in September.

This means that production is 4.5 per cent higher than the average level during the 1957-59 period.

The November production level, a record, was 7.1 per cent above November 1964.

The board also said output in October was higher than previously reported. Production was 144.4 on the index compared to the previously reported 143.8.

# Song-Writer Was Poor Student

NEW YORK (UPI) — Johnny Marks studied piano for two years when he was a pin-striated kid in the Bronx. His teacher, vexed by the way he mangled Bach and Beethoven, told him he'd never amount to anything in music.

With a ho-ho-ho, Marks recalled in an interview, he went to make his living, writing songs—including "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer," which made him a millionaire.

"I didn't really mangle the classics," he said. "The teacher was just angry that I kept making my own arrangements."

More than 43 million records of "Rudolph" have been sold in America and 20 million more abroad.

Marks first wrote a version of the song in 1947, but he didn't like it.

He threw it out, but typed around with the tune and lyrics off and on for two years, coming up with the hit rendition in 1949.

"People ask me how long it took to write 'Rudolph' and I tell them three weeks—plus 25 years of learning to write songs," Marks said.

"I didn't write it to make money. I just wanted to write great songs. That's the way I've always operated. I always write great songs. I have a bin of rejected manuscripts. I think each and every one is a great song."

When "Rudolph" first caught the nation, Marks appeared on television. One son, then nursery-school age, saw him and asked: "How did Daddy get to that box?"

A school-age son, in a new cr. His wife urged him to put it school the second year of "Rudolph's" reign, came home one day and said: "I heard the bells on Christmas as a Day." "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree." "A Holly Holly—Christmas, When Santa Gets Your Letter."

"We're practicing that song," Marks' first son was written for Christmas. I want you when he was 12—music for joye. Kimer's "Trees." He sent it off to a publisher—it was rejected. But he kept at it.

"Recently, on a television panel show, one of the panelists told Marks — 'Why, I thought you were dead.'"

Marks, 52, was amused. He was not yet 40 when he wrote "Rudolph" and can't understand why some figure an "old man" created the red-nosed reindeer.

The song writer credits Gene Autry's wife with an "Angel" role in the first "Rudolph" recording by Autry—which sold six million copies.

"Gene told me he liked the song, but didn't think it was his kind of song," Marks said. "But he kept it around in a stack of manuscripts to consider."

### Germany Prepares Alleged Fraud Case on Collection

Bonn, Germany (AP)—Germany is preparing an alleged multimillion-dollar case involving an art collection that vanished in World War II.

Held as chief suspect is Dr. Hans Deusch, an Israeli lawyer, publisher and philanthropist. His bail of \$3 million is the highest ever demanded in Germany.

The state prosecutor's office says Deusch, 55, is under suspicion of having fraudulently obtained \$4 million in claiming restitution from the Bonn government.

Deusch is alleged to have admitted false evidence that the Nazis in 1944 stole 200 French Impressionist paintings and 650 prints collected by Baron Felix Hatvany, "prince sugar king" of Hungary.

On behalf of the heirs of Baron Hatvany, Deusch presented a \$10-million bill, based on estimates by two art experts.

Prosecution investigators, who so far have questioned 15 witnesses in many countries, seek to prove that the paintings were hidden off by Soviet troops when they captured Budapest.

They contend that the Hatvany collection was far less valuable than Deusch claimed.

The investigations have prompted a German court to rule at three preliminary hearings that Deusch is under "urgent suspicion" of fraud. No further charges have been filed.

German practice this is not unusual, particularly in a complex case.

Deusch has denied all accusations.

He took over the Hatvany case after successfully representing two other aristocratic
