1966 Horse Show Slated At Gooding

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) — Argentina's military government has accused Secretary of State Dean Rusk and a top aide of interfering in Argentine affairs by criticizing police brutality during the seizure of the University of Buenos Aires.

A protest note said President Juan Carlos Onganía's regime objected particularly to comments by Lincoln Gordon, undersecretary for inter-American affairs. It added without elaboration that the government was displeased by Rusk's comments.

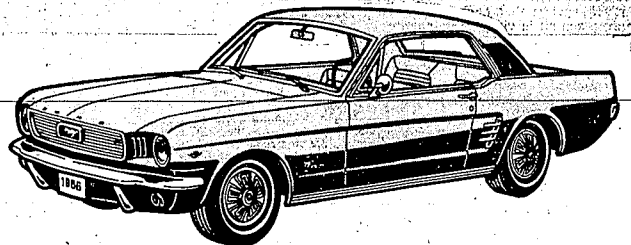

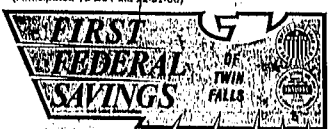

30th Wedding Anniversary Open House Set

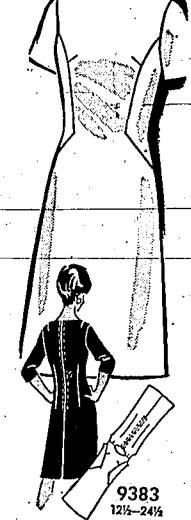

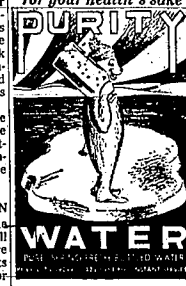

Crash Injury Is Fatal to Ex-Resident

Mrs. Nettie Alma Combs, 62, Boise, former Twin Falls resident, died Sunday night in a Boise hospital of injuries received in a car-pedestrian accident Sunday evening.

She was born June 9, 1884, at Marshalltown, Iowa, and came to Idaho in 1891 in one of the last wagon trains. She grew up in Boise. She and her husband homesteaded in 1908 near Rupert, and in 1907, they moved to Twin Falls, where they lived until 1921, when they returned to Boise.

In 1927, they moved from Boise to Klamath Falls, Ore. She lived there for two years before returning to Twin Falls, where she began building homes.

At the age of 62, she went to Richmond, Calif., where she worked as a welder in the shipyards for three and one-half years before returning to Twin Falls and resuming the contracting business. She built more than 50 homes in the area before her retirement.

About 1960 she moved to Boise where she had since lived. She was a member of the First Christian Church, Boise.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. Frank Hall, Seattle; one son, Robert Edward Palm, White Salmon, Wash.; one sister, Mrs. Ruth Welsh, Boise; five brothers, Charles Coleman and Raymond Coleman, both Boise; Frank Coleman, San Antonio, Tex.; John Coleman, Spenard, Alaska, and William Coleman, Bellingham, Wash.; seven grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 4 p.m. Wednesday at Sunset Memorial Park.

Only two in addition to Robinson are in the .300 class and the way even the top three are going there's going to be a reduction in the number when the final returns are in.

The major league record for fewest, 300 batters is three. It was set by the AL in 1966 and equaled last season, 60 years later, when Minnesota's Tony Oliva won the crown with a .321 average. Carl Yastrzemski of Boston was second with .312 while Vic Davillio of Cleveland got in under the wire at .301.

Oliva leads again this year with .322 followed by Frank Robinson .315 and Al Kaline, Detroit, .310. The No. 4 batter is Brooks Robinson of the Orioles, .308.

Oliva led six points in last week's games, however, collecting only seven hits in 30 at-bats. Robinson dropped four points and Kaline lost 10. Robinson turned in a 6-for-24 performance while Kaline managed only three safeties in 20 at bats.

Matty Alou of Pittsburgh regained the National League lead. He boosted his average five points to .343 with six hits in 13 attempts.

Hearing Set On Clay's Draft Status

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Heavyweight champion Cassius Clay, accompanied by an attorney, experienced in handling conscientious objector cases, scheduled to return here Aug. 22 for another hearing on his draft status.

The Justice Department said Monday the session will be conducted by Lawrence Grauman, a retired circuit judge in Clay's hometown.

Clay will be represented by Howard King, a New York attorney who handled hundreds of Jehovah's Witnesses cases during World War II when that religious group claimed military deference for its members.

Clay, a convert to the Black Muslim sect, spent 20 minutes before his local board March 17 arguing that his beliefs entitled him to the 1-L classification as an objector.

Grauman's recommendations will be forwarded to the Justice Department, which will make another recommendation to the Kentucky appeals board.

This recommendation, however, will not be binding.

Only Saturday Clarke had been upset by unknown Kenyan Nataniel Temu in the six mile run.

In the half mile, Cough, an Australian, timed his kick to perfection, except up for the pack and scored an upset victory over three of the world's top runners.
