

Pioneer 7 Is Orbiting Around Sun

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—Spacecraft Pioneer 7 raced into orbit around the sun today to reap the "solar wind"—great clouds of radiation that blow through space as a potential hazard to moon-bound astronauts. Pioneer 7 darted into space just a week after the United States launched Lunar Orbiter 1 into a successful orbit about the moon. Spurring a red-hot tongue of flame and a serpentine tail of white smoke, a three-stage Delta rocket bolted away from Cape Kennedy, Fla., at 11:20 a.m. to start the 140-pound package of scientific instruments on its marathon journey at more than 24,000 miles an hour.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House has passed a compromise appropriations measure with an understanding that there will be no spending this year for an extension of the west front of the Capitol.

The House acted Tuesday on a \$214.2-million measure to finance operations of Congress and related activities this fiscal year. When the Senate passed the bill earlier, it included a specific ban to insure that none of the money to operate the Capitol architect's office — included in the legislation — would be used to begin advance work on the controversial project.

Viet Nam Civilians Have No Sanctuary

By GEORGE ESPER SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — There are no sanctuaries in South Viet Nam for unarmed civilians.

Almost daily, guerrilla warfare takes its toll of civilian lives. Civilians are not even safe in the streets of Saigon.

There are no statistics on civilian deaths, but they run into the thousands. More are likely to die.

Incidents last week, including the bombing of a Mekong River delta village by U.S. Air Force jets with the death of 26 villagers and injury to another 121, emphasize the plight of the innocent civilian caught between the Viet Cong and allied forces.

There have been other such killings in which civilians were killed, wounded. Later, a military spokesman said the bombings were apparently the result of Vietnamese officer put it: "The pilots incorrectly identifying their target."

Last September, U.S. jets dropped four bombs in the hamlet of Gia Linh in the southern portion of the demilitarized zone, and Vietnamese police. Allied forces sometimes appear reported that 20 persons per to be less selective than

the Viet Cong. The allies have airpower and artillery, while the Viet Cong have none.

Whereas the Viet Cong might select for assassination one or two key leaders of a government-controlled village, South Vietnamese troops might call an air strike on a village to cut down a Viet Cong platoon or two — 30 to 60 men.

The bombing Aug. 9 of the delta village is an example.

The attack was ordered against the village of Truong Thanh by Lt. Col. Le Cong Thuong, chief of Phuoc Dinh province. It had been reported that 50 Viet Cong were in and around the village.

Col. Thuong called for an air strike. His request was relayed to American forces and sent to a divisional Vietnamese and corps

military levels for approvals, a procedure which must be followed. It was okayed.

The air strike posed the questions: Why so much firepower? Why didn't a company of South Vietnamese ground troops — perhaps 150 men — surround the 50 Viet Cong?

In some cases, civilians killed in military operations are simply listed as Viet Cong.

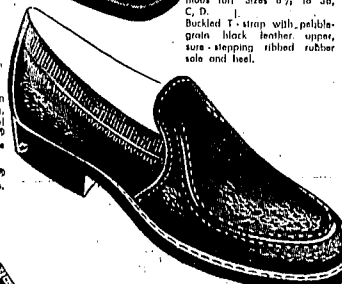

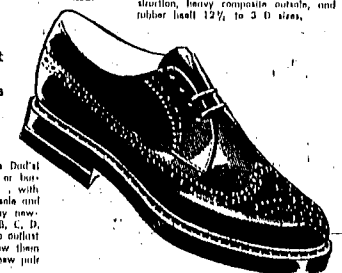

18-Year-Old Girl, Facing Life of Partial Paralysis, Is Inspiration

She has auburn hair, freckles and an infectious grin. She wants more than anything else to go to Switzerland, because she "adores" water, snow and icy cold climates. She is 18 years old and bursting with enthusiasm about water skiing which she loves, people whom she analyzes, and sausage pizza, which she "craves."

Her name is Lee Ann Hone and she faces the possibility of permanent partial paralysis as the result of an automobile accident which tragically disrupted her young life on June 5.

Lee Ann may never walk again.

Undaunted, however, is a word that only inadequately describes Lee Ann's reaction to a situation that many other people would consider inconceivable.

"It's just slowed me down a little—temporarily," she grins. Her infectious good humor has touched everyone who comes in contact with her. Her friends in the 1966 class of Twin Falls High School, of which Lee Ann is a member, call her a "good head." The nurses call her a "terrific young lady."

Doctors, interns, patients and visitors to the hospital—everyone agrees that Lee Ann is indeed a "terrific young lady."

"I don't know what we'd do without her," one of them said. Lee Ann has been at Magic Valley Memorial Hospital since June 17. Prior to her transfer to Magic Valley Memorial hospital, she was at the Salt Lake LDS Hospital. The staff at the latter hospital was nearly overwhelmed by the letters, postcards and gifts sent to Lee Ann from her friends in Twin Falls.

Since her transfer to the Twin Falls hospital, a similar situation has arisen for the staff in this institution. Friends and family daily crowd into Lee Ann's room, often violating, if a tolerant nurse is on duty, the hospital's two-visitors-at-a-time rule.

But Lee Ann loves it. "I think I'd go crazy if I didn't have these kids and relatives to come to see me," she says.

And for one brief moment, the grin vanishes. The days can often be lonely for a hospital patient, and in view of the length of Lee Ann's stay (she will remain in the Twin Falls hospital for at least two months), the loneliness has been somewhat softened.

Lee Ann grins again when she remembers the pizza parties and the fried chicken party that the "kids" have thrown in her hospital room.

When she isn't teasing the nurses or visiting with her friends, Lee Ann busies herself by reading, sewing or "messing around with oil paints on velvet."

"I'm trying to read 'War and Peace' and 'The agony and the Ecstasy' at the same time and it isn't working out too well," she noted.

She notes complaints. But once in a while she pauses for a moment of very serious reflection. And even during these serious moments, her courage shows through.

"I've got my life to be thankful for—a lot more people are a lot worse off," she says.

But a lot more people would be a lot more despairing in a lot less serious situation.

Within two months, Lee Ann will be transferred again—this time to the Elks Rehabilitation Center in Boise, where she will undergo extensive physical therapy. Her stay there could last anywhere from three months to one year.

The second dance is sponsored by the "Help Lee Ann Walk" committee and co-sponsored by CWA Union 8110 and the Mountain States Telephone Company. This dance will be held Saturday night at the Elks Building. The Allen Devries Orchestra will play and the 1966 Miss Idaho, Cheryl Couch, will sing.

Lee Ann will attend both dances. Smiling a little at the picture she will make, chest-high and all, Lee Ann noted that she had been tremendously encouraged by these and other shows of friendship.

"I want to thank the people who are behind me—they make me feel that I've got a lot to fight for... and a lot to live for," she said.

Local merchants have donated door prizes for the Saturday night benefit dance and many other volunteers have contributed their efforts to the preparation of the Elks Building for the dance.

Second-Best Warplane Question to Reopen

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Senate subcommittee plans to reopen the whole bitter question of whether the United States is buying a second-best warplane — the TFX — to save \$1 billion.

Sen. John L. McClellan, D-Ark., chairman of the Senate permanent investigations subcommittee, said on Tuesday in the Senate without specifying just exactly when.

Presumably, however, the hearing will be held prior to the time the Navy has to decide whether its version of the TFX, called the F111B, is useful. The Navy will reach a conclusion next March or April.

In a brief, off-the-floor interview, McClellan said he would propose an amendment, probably today, to the \$59-billion defense appropriations bill forbidding the Pentagon to procure F111Bs through the expenditure of appropriated but unused funds.

The present appropriation bill does not include money for the purchase of the F111B beyond the five included in a research and development contract with General Dynamics of Fort Worth, Tex.

In a statement on the Senate floor, McClellan said: "Four years ago, when Secretary McNamara four times overruled the competent judgment and recommendations of our best professional and civilian experts — approximately 235 of them — and selected 'the second-best' design and proposal which was submitted by General Dynamics, we are now faced with the cost more than it was represented by the Boeing Co. (of 700 would cost?)"

The whole TFX controversy began in November 1962, after an Air Force-Navy evaluation board had concluded that a design for an all-purpose warplane submitted by Boeing was operationally superior — and cheaper — than one designed by General Dynamics.

McNamara selected the General Dynamics design on the grounds that it offered a higher degree of common parts and therefore the supply and production of spare parts would be cheaper over the long run.





Air Force Pays Navy for Retrieving Hydrogen Bomb Off Spain's Coast

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Air Force has paid off the Navy for that splendid bit of fishing for a hydrogen bomb off Spain last April.

A Pentagon spokesman said today the settlement came to \$3.34 million, which the Air Force paid the Navy by check.

This may be a decent wage for hauling on a superunstable hydrogen bomb from 2,300 feet deep in the Mediterranean Sea. It comes out to around \$65,000 a day, considering that the nuclear device was missing for 80 days after it was dropped from a disintegrating B52.

The approved billing isn't a great deal more than the \$5 million claim posted against the U.S. government by lawyers for Spanish fisherman Sumo Oris, proclaimed as "the hero of the recovery" by U.S. Ambassador Angier Biddle Duke.

Oris saw the parachute floating the bomb after the B52 and a KC135 tanker collided. He told authorities it went that way.

It was reason for the Navy to haul it up after an extensive sea bottom search.

By joint service agreement, the Air Force was obliged to pay for the cost of recovery. After all, it was an Air Force bomb, signed for by the pilot of the B52 before he took off on what the United States called a training flight.

Actually, this was one of the daily flights by nuclear bomb-equipped planes the United States keeps airborne — just in case.

The cost of recovery, a spokesman said, included billing for the special equipment that was used and other "out of pocket expenses." But not figured in was the cost of normal operation of 15 or so naval ships nor salaries for scores of naval personnel who participated in the search.

At the end of the fiscal year, the spokesman said, the Air Force came across with the check which covered these major items:

Oceans Systems Inc., which leased the shallow-water operating submersible, the Cubmarine — \$1.84 million.



Trotsky was perhaps second only to V.I. Lenin as a leader of the 1917 Bolshevik revolution that brought communism to power. He lost out in a struggle with Josef V. Stalin and was later murdered in Mexico. He is denounced in the Soviet Union as a traitor.

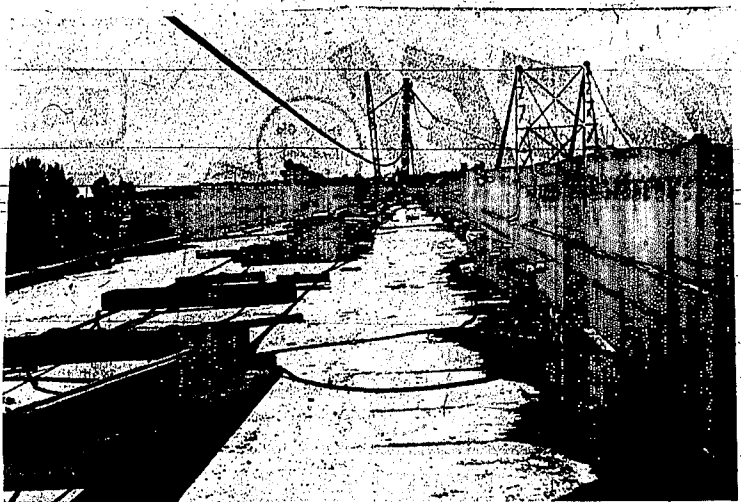

They had been sent to Lamar Jansen's Montana camp not so long ago. But Jansen couldn't get licensed in Montana, so he moved to Idaho, in the shadow of the Teton Mountains.

He didn't have an Idaho license either, so San Francisco Juvenile Court Judge Raymond O'Connor — ordered — the boys home. Three San Francisco juvenile officers, Mrs. Louise Clark, Kenneth Holman and Kenneth Chelton, said they found nothing wrong with the camp except that it didn't have a license.

Jansen has 10 children of his own. He is 49, and nine of his children live with his wife in Pomona, Calif., because he can't find a place for them to live in Idaho.

He and his staff of 15 spent most of Monday night trying to

keep the children from running away. The staff includes two teachers, a registered nurse and 11 full-time counselors.

And Jansen has new problems today.

"I'm out \$20,000 because of all this — the moving and caring for the boys. I'm against it. I don't know how I'm even going to pay my telephone bill. I guess I need an angel."

"But losing the boys — that's the real issue. Ask the people around here. We were making progress. This is the tragedy just when we were getting started these boys are shipwrecked," he said.

HANSEN—William O. Wright assumed the duties of marshal and watermaster Monday for the village of Hansen. He replaces Harold Warren, who resigned effective Aug. 1, but stayed on until a new man was hired to replace him.

Attractive Young Biology Teacher Is Battling Arkansas "Monkey Law"

By BILL SIMMONS
LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — One day when Susan Epperson, an attractive young biology teacher, stepped into a public school classroom, she says she lost part of her freedom of speech.

She wants it back. As a result, she has become the vanguard of the Arkansas Education Association's legal assault on the state's 38-year-old law banning the teaching of Darwin's theory of evolution—one of the nation's last three "monkey laws."

"We just decided it was time for the law to go," says Portia Kozell, head of the association. "It is an unwarranted affront to the ability and integrity of teachers."

Mrs. Epperson, 24, completing her third year on the faculty at Little Rock Central High School, became the association's champion in the courtroom this year. She filed a suit to declare the law unconstitutional. And she won Round 1.

Murray Red, a Chancery Court judge, one step below the Arkansas Supreme Court, held in May that the law must go because it tends to restrain the quest for knowledge by banning "theory that poses no hazard to the community."

The state is appealing to the Arkansas Supreme Court. It has pledged to fight the U.S. Supreme Court, and Mrs. Epperson's attorneys say they will carry the battle as far as necessary to eliminate the law.

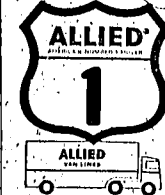

Humphrey Says Economy Is Healthy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey said today the economy is a subject, under intense study within the administration.

President Johnson's anti-inflation policies, Humphrey described the economy as strong and healthy and said "do not think this is the time to apply any drastic measure to it."

"But he added in an interview: 'You can be sure that it is a subject, under intense study within the administration.'"

Sen. Russell B. Long of Louisiana, the assistant Democratic leader, and Sen. Albert Gore, D-Tenn., called in the Senate Tuesday for presidential action to bring down soaring interest rates.

Humphrey said he has long favored low interest rates. But he said he does not believe restrictive measures on the economy are in order now.

"The economy is a delicate mechanism," he said. "One control may affect adversely another section of the economy. It can have a very serious effect if controls are applied to it, especially if they are untimely."

"It's like having your doctor keep a check on your health. You take the prescriptions he prescribes but you don't go around popping pills in your mouth because self-medication can be dangerous."

In another interview, Long urged presidential cooperation with Congress to cut interest rates. He talked in terms of halting this with credit controls, suspension of the investment tax credit and possibly steadily price-wage controls.

Long, who holds the Senate Finance Committee, complained that Johnson is leaning too heavily on high interest rates and a tight money policy in an effort to curb inflation.

Gore predicted in a separate interview that "his interest rate increase may become the biggest issue" in this fall's congressional elections.

Gore said interest rates are the highest since the Harding administration 45 years ago.

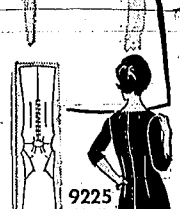
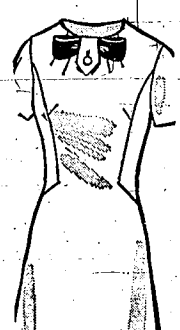

Soviet to Be Shot for Textile Theft

MOSCOW (AP) — A Soviet clothing-factory engineer has been sentenced to be shot and his colleagues have been imprisoned on charges of stealing \$300,000 worth of textiles.

The newspaper Trud said engineer M. Rabinovich, 43, worked in a number of knitting and tailoring plants and in each arranged to have some production left out of inventories. He and his colleagues then sold the extra items, the newspaper reported.

When arrested, Rabinovich had assets of more than \$1 million, Trud said. An associate, D. Dukarsky, was sentenced to 12 years at hard labor and L. Bratmaister was given eight years in prison.

Sukarno Begs U.S. to Leave Viet Nam War

JAKARTA, Indonesia (AP) — President Sukarno called today on the United States to "please get out of Viet Nam." He said if America did not heed his plea, "you, yourself, will land into trouble."

Speaking to a Jakarta crowd estimated at 80,000 on the 21st anniversary of Indonesia's independence from the Dutch, Sukarno said:

"Again I labeled Malaysia a British 'neocolonialist project' and said Indonesia would not recognize the federation until the Borneo states of Sabah and Sarawak vote on whether to remain in it. He said the Bangkok statement signed with Malaysia last week was not a final pact but only one 'which will pave the way to peace.'"

"Denied he had anything to do with the Communist-led coup attempt last Oct. 1.

"Declared 'I am your great leader, follow my leadership, obey all my directives. I am not over-ambitious, I do not seek private gains.

"At this point, nearly 1,000 university students turned and walked away.

Sukarno, reduced to a figurehead since the abortive coup, spoke for more than two hours as armed soldiers guarded the presidential area and held back catcalling students.

Reconstruction of Harmon Park Tennis Courts Begins

Reconstruction of three tennis courts at Harmon Park was begun this week as graders removed the old asphalt surface and cut to a new base level, reports Ronald Scheuffele, city engineer.

The project, which began Monday, includes leveling work to be done by the city and laying an entirely new surface by Boise Paving and Asphalt Co., Boise, which, with a bid of \$4,500, won the contract. Completion of the construction is scheduled in three weeks.

Previously, the courts had been surfaced with a rough asphalt which developed large cracks from climatic changes and erosion. It is hoped the new construction will eliminate these problems because of a deeper base, said Scheuffele.

A one and one-half inch layer of emulsified asphalt will be laid on the subbase. Two layers of slurry seal, an asphalt and sand mixture, will be poured. This will be coated with two layers of Layco seal, a special surface covering.

The playing surface will be painted a light green and lined with white boundary markers. Howard Johnson, parks and recreation superintendent, stated that the city hopes to construct three new tennis courts in various parks during the next three to five years. It also is planned that the courts at Harmon Park will be lighted in the next two years, said Johnson.

One grader, a loader and four dump trucks are working on the court construction at Harmon Park this week.

Boise's Table Rock Cross Gets No Criticism

BOISE (AP) — Residents have seen an illuminated cross on Table Rock outside Boise for the past 10 years, but there has been no loud outcry from Boians that their freedom of religion was being violated.

And an informal poll of Boise clergymen shows that none of them would lead any movement to have the cross visible for up to 60 miles — removed from atop a butte near the state penitentiary.

The situation is perhaps the opposite of that in Eugene, Ore., where a group has been trying for the past few years to have an illuminated cross removed from a butte in the city.

This year, a Portland group, headed by several Protestant and Jewish clergy, opposes the structure on the grounds it violates the constitutional principle of separation of church and state.

One Boise Protestant clergyman said he thought there might be something wrong with erection of the symbol of Christianity, but added that he hadn't objected to it because it was erected by a private group.

The cross is maintained by the Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Strictly speaking," he said, "there is something wrong with it, because there are also Jewish people in the community."

A Jewish layman, well known in Boise, said he did not object to the religious monument.

"I can't see any reason to object to a symbol indicating community respect for religion of Christianity is placed on a sky."

You can't argue with a fact of history," he explained.

Cattlemen Have Mixed Reactions to Booming Cattle Futures Trading

CHICAGO (AP) — Business is booming in live cattle futures trading on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange, but a survey shows that feeders, cattlemen and ranchers have mixed reactions to the market and its effect on prices.

Some believe the market keeps cattle prices from fluctuating and thus prevents producers from enjoying the benefits of any expected price rise. Others contend the market has kept the price of feeder cattle high.

The Mercantile Exchange began trading in live cattle futures contracts in November of 1964. The volume of business has increased steadily.

A total of 84,582 contracts was traded the first six months this year compared with 29,533 in the comparable 1965 period—an increase of 186 per cent.

Exchange officials have de-

scribed the market as a hedge or form of insurance that can protect cattle feeders and producers from unpredictable price declines.

A feeder, for example, can sell cattle futures when he buys live animals to fatten. The futures price is geared to the current live animals to fatten. Thus, if cattle prices have declined by the time the animals are fattened, the feeder's profit on his futures sale would wipe out his loss on the actual sale of his animals.

An Associated Press survey found these varying reactions from men in the beef industry:

Pat Corrigan, cattlemen at Vero Beach, Fla.: "The new feeder cattle futures should help stabilize prices. That is the feeling, too, of cattlemen I have talked to."

"If you know what the prices will be a few months hence, it takes some of the risk out of buying feeder cattle. If you know, say, you'll get 26 cents for choice beef, you know what you can pay for your feeder cattle and still come out."

W. D. Roberts of Immokalee, Fla., president of the Florida Cattlemen's Association: "It's not worth a doodle as far as I'm concerned. What the futures market will do is to keep the price from fluctuating. That way we'll never have high cattle markets any more."

J. C. Holbert, Bettendorf, Iowa, cattle dealer: "It's not for the average man in my opinion. It is of advantage to the large commercial feeders which have cattle going on paper."

to market almost every week in the year. It may be a handicap to the small livestock feeder. The small operator feeding 40 to 100 head of cattle can't do much good trying to hedge on the market. He can't watch it that close."

M. P. Goy of Omaha, a livestock operator, said he is shifting away from cattle feeding to futures trading because costs of handling live cattle are squeezing the profit margin.

Ray Smyth, rancher and feeder operator in Alamo, Tex.: "You won't get rich near as fast by hedging but you won't go broke near as fast as if you weren't hedged."

Howard Schmidt of Luverne, Minn., owner of the Schmidt Cattle Co.: "I've played it on the long side. Been in it about a year. But people have to be educated to this—buying on the board. Most farmers don't understand it—buying and selling cattle."



Premiums will be given on threshed grains and legumes and other crop exhibits. The Amar gamated Sugar Co. will give special awards for the best five bushels and largest bushels of wheat, corn, sorghum, and soybeans.

Livestock exhibits will consist of sheep, fat lambs, swine, fat hogs, dairy cattle, fat beef cattle and beef breeding class. There is also a poultry class.
