Harry Eaton Is Honored For 50 Years With Bank

Harry Eaton, president of the Twin Falls Bank and Trust Co., chairman of its board, was honored by a reception given him at the bank's 50th anniversary afternoon, the 50th anniversary of his association with the bank.

Eaton started working for the bank in 1910 after graduating from Twin Falls High School. He remained there until he left to attend the University of California at Berkeley, studying business administration. He returned to Idaho and worked in the Buhl State Bank until 1916.

In 1916 he returned to the Twin Falls Bank where he has worked there since, rising from bookkeeper in 1916 to assistant cashier, vice president and finally president. Two years ago he became chairman of the board.

The bank was started by W. S. McCormick in 1905, called McCormick and Company, located in the building now housing Alexander Clothing.

Remodeling along the original bank's exterior was done in 1930, store hours changing through the winter; and coin counters that had provisions for gold pieces.

The building was small, he recalled, and Saturdays the bank was closed. The surrounding areas were bison, elk, deer, moose, antelope, pronghorns and cattle to the back of the bank and a weekly auction would be held. On Oct. 1, 1905, the bank was incorporated into


Father of 7 Gets 13-Year Sentence

WINNIPEG, Man. (AP) — Kenneth Desimone has been sentenced to 13 years after pleading guilty to two bank robberies and aiding in an attempted bank robbery conspiracy in the \$183,000 gold bullion robbery at Winnipeg Airport.

He was sentenced Tuesday to serve 10 years on one robbery charge and concurrent one-year term for the jailbreaks. His parole on a previous bank robbery conviction was revoked, adding six more years.

Desimone, 34, a father of seven, escaped from a detention home Sunday and was recaptured 10 hours later. On Sept. 1 he broke out of a provincial jail and flew to Indiana in a stolen plane. He was captured after a gun battle in Gary, Ind.




Two Infants Die In Auto Blaze; 3 Others Saved

DEDICATION SERVICES are slated at 4 p.m. Sunday for the new \$83,000 United Presbyterian church at Wendell. Church leaders from throughout Idaho will participate in the services and Dr. Frank L. Reznick, Boise, will deliver the sermon. Open house is planned after the services with tours to be conducted. Ground for the new structure was broken Oct. 17, 1965. The structure, made of wood frame construction with decorative quartzite rock used both inside and out, is the result of four years of planning, according to Rev. Jack A. Jennings, local pastor.

Is Distorting the Jordan Record

One of his pet tricks is to take some statement and, by leaving out words, phrases, sentences and even paragraphs, convey a meaning exactly opposite to that intended. Examples of the Harding technique are seemingly endless, but here are a few:

In an advertisement in the Farm Bureau Newspaper Ralph Harding misquotes Sen. Gordon Allott of Colorado as follows:

"Sen. Jordan is truly a water statesman . . . Jordan has, therefore, proposed that Congress and the Federal water agencies study plans for bringing water . . . of the Columbia overland to Lake Mead for use in the Colorado basin . . ."

Now notice the dots. These indicate omissions. Let's fill in some of these with words left out of Senator Allott's statement. The end of the quotation, or rather misquotation, should read "for bringing water . . . now wasting to the ocean at the mouth of the Columbia etc." By omitting these underscored words Ralph Harding changes the meaning of Sen. Allott's statement.

Ralph Harding's disregard for editorial accuracy is also reflected by his omission of Senator Allott's strongly worded remarks (from the same speech) which read, "He [Jordan] is firm in his conviction that every drop of water that originates in a state should be used by the state until all its needs, present and future, are met." Now why didn't Ralph Harding quote this paragraph? Was he afraid of Senator Jordan's real position?

Here's another Harding masterpiece of deception. Mr. Harding quotes Senator Jordan as saying, "A study to determine the economic feasibility of exporting water from the Columbia to the mid-southwest is inevitable and no altogether disconcerting . . ." Again notice those darned dots.

In this case the Harding technique calls for "chopping off the end of the sentence." Insert the words "Provided adequate safeguards are recognized and applied" and you have the true quotation.

In this same speech by Senator Jordan, Mr. Harding conveniently omits the following statement, "Should it ever become necessary, I shall go to whatever detail is necessary to convince this Committee, (the Sub-Committee on Irrigation and Reclamation), that Idaho's ultimate requirements will leave no water for export to other basins from the Snake River."

Here's another example of Ralph Harding's tactics. Mr. Harding misquotes Senator Jordan, "I firmly believe that we cannot forever refuse to go along with a request for a study of the economic feasibility of exporting to another basin . . . the unused water of the Columbia river . . ." Again, those dots.

The master of misquotation really changed this one. In a departure from his usual losing battle with accuracy he omits both the beginning and the middle. What Jordan really said was, "I use the word 'unreasonable' because I firmly believe that we cannot forever refuse to go along with a request for a study of the economic feasibility of exporting to another basin a reasonable percentage of the unused water of the Columbia river. Again the underscored words were omitted by Ralph Harding.

No one, including Senator Jordan, knows whether it is economically feasible to utilize water which is wasted to the sea at the mouth of the Columbia. If, however, it can be shown that this waste water, which merely dilutes the Pacific ocean at the fantastic rate of 150 million acre-feet per year, can be salvaged, it makes sense, as Len Jordan has pointed out, to turn the thirsty eyes of Californians to the mouth of the Columbia. Ralph Harding's unpardonable campaign tactics could turn them in the direction of the Snake.

Programs May Be Shifted to Labor Unit

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Washington Post says negotiations are under way to shift programs aimed at creating jobs for the poor from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to the Labor Department.

The paper quoted Bertrand M. Harding, deputy director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, as saying "it's not up to anyone's part" and would not jeopardize the anti-poverty agency.

Other unidentified OEO officials said Post was probably referring to a memo issued by the Post as planning some thought that the new Department of Housing and Urban Development would eventually become chief anti-poverty agency.

Young Marine Gets Second Purple Heart

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Pfc. John R. Klein, a Purple Heart recipient, Michigan, a battle-scarred Marine who is only 21, was presented a second Purple Heart medal Tuesday. The first one he got with a buddy in Donaumate, Vietnam.

Klein, recovering at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital, lost a leg after he stepped on a mine near Da Nang, South Vietnam, last June. For his work in the Purple Heart.

On Aug. 14, one of Klein's buddies, Pfc. John Edgerly, was killed when he was struck by lighting in Vie Giang, a body which flew him and Klein, in a wheelchair, went to the funeral. He pinned his Purple Heart on the American flag covering Edgerly's coffin.

Utah Hospital Administrator Views Recent Rate Increase as Paradox

By The Associated Press — It's going to cost more to be patient's operating costs. Salaries increased by roughly 70 percent and it seemed "probable" that one hospital administrator thinks that's a paradox.

Hospitals in Idaho this week accepted a new administrator. Sister Ann Josephine, 55, has also become more expensive, costing patients between \$3 and \$10 per day more than last year.

Few Utah hospitals have had increases, but many say they are considering the move around the first of the year.

Mostly, it's because salaries are going up and supplies are being more expensive, said Jack G. Glipin, president of the Utah State Hospital Association and administrator of Coltonwood Hospital in suburban Salt Lake City.

"It's a paradox," said Glipin. "People seem to think it costs too much for medical care. And at the same time think nurses should get more money."

Olpin said nurses salaries account for two-thirds of his hospital's operating costs. Salaries increased by roughly 70 percent and it seemed "probable" that one hospital administrator thinks that's a paradox.

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) — A post-season college football proposal, proposed Monday by Michigan State Coach Duffy Daugherty, received preliminary approval from the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

Koufax Has Best Pitcher Award For Third Time

NEW YORK (AP) — Sandy Koufax, the arthritic and astute left-hander of the Los Angeles Dodgers, Tuesday was named the winner of the Cy Young Award as the best pitcher in major league baseball. It was an unprecedented third time. The stylish 30-year-old southpaw who posted a 27-6 record for the National League champions added the 1965 award to his collection by a unanimous vote of the 20-member panel of the Baseball Writers Association of America "just as he did in 1963 and 1965."

Koufax, apparently seeking no trophy, refused his exclusive trophy. The Cy Young Award is the annual citation given to the best pitcher in the major leagues. It was originated in 1956.

And he may have become the last pitcher to win the award as now designed, covering both the Major League and the National League.

— WASHINGTON (AP) — The said in interviews Tuesday night killed by Jack Ruby in a car, Kennedy family.

Family of President John F. Kennedy said they gave the National Archives pictures taken in connection with the autopsy performed after his assassination. The pictures were intended for use in the trial of Lee Harvey Oswald, named by the commission as Kennedy's assassin.

The 65 pictures and X-rays, which were not examined by the Warren Commission during its investigation, were presented to the archives under conditions which virtually precluded public viewing of them for many years.

A Justice Department spokesman said Tuesday night the department had asked for the 14 X-rays, 25 black-and-white photographs to complete the government's collection of assassination material for the historical record.

"The — Navy pathologists performed the autopsy," the Dallas Tex., Nov. 22, 1963. Two days later, Oswald was shot and

killed in a car.

The spokesman said the pictures, authenticated by Humes and Bowswell, are the only ones

members had asked whether the pictures were needed in connection with the pathological testimony. "We felt they were not," he said.

Asked whether the pictures disclosed anything new, he said:

"Crade J. Thornton Bowswell, who conducted the autopsy, told us in the deposition, 'All they would do would be to document what we discussed. I am sure the photographs would corroborate our testimony.'

Bowswell added: "They were disclosed yesterday in court at the Oswald trial. Oswald was still alive at the time of the autopsy."

The Justice Department spokesman focused on the fact that the commission did not see

any autopsy pictures.

One commission member,

Allen W. Dulles, said his division had no objection to the disclosure of the commission's decision

not to examine the pictures.

The Justice Department spokesman said he did not know

when the X-rays and pictures

were turned over to the government.

A letter dated Oct. 29 and signed by Burke Marshall, representing the Kennedy family,

gave the government possession of the pictures.

Marshall, former head of the Justice Department, lives in New York City and has handled other matters for the Kennedy family.

Veterans of
"Cold War"
Enter College

WASHINGTON (AP) — Nearly 250,000 of America's "cold war" veterans have streamed onto college campuses this fall to continue their education with the aid of the new GI Bill, officials said yesterday.

Settlements of the Viet Nam war and the subsequent return to civilian life of many of the 335,000 troops now committed to the conflict would send the total moving upward, they said, perhaps to 400,000 or even overcrowding in some schools.

Under the measure — commonly known as the "Cold War GI Bill" — signed by President Johnson on March 3, somebody who served with more than 180 days active military service since Jan. 31, 1953, are eligible for educational, housing and other benefits.

The program, approved by Congress without a dissenting vote, amounts to an extension of World War II and Korean War GI benefits, but at a reduced scale.

Veterans Administration said 211,000 October benefit checks had been mailed by last Friday to veterans enrolled in colleges, universities and other educational institutions or business schools. Files of 35,000 applicants were being processed Monday, a spokesman said.

VA officials said they expect the figure to level off at about 240,000 this school year. About 64,000 veterans attended summer classes after the program went into effect June 1.

Some 15,000 ex-savers-veterans who served in the war in Viet Nam, VA officials said their records do not show how many veterans of the Viet Nam conflict are benefiting from the measure.

Under the new program, an unmarried student can collect \$100 a month in educational aid — married students will no child support, room and board and rent with two or more dependents \$150 monthly.

A veteran is entitled to one month's benefits for each month spent in college, up to a maximum limit. Thus, a veteran with three years of active service can receive payments spread over four nine-month school years.
