## Lawmen Told To Use Report As Strategy Basis

WASHINGTON (AP)—Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark told more than 600 law enforcement officials today they must make the National Crime Commission's report the foundation for a national strategy to arrest and then reverse the trend toward lawlessness. Clark's speech opened a two-day conference on crime control. The meeting, attended by law enforcement officers, judges and corrections personnel from every state, was called to start at 9 a.m. today.

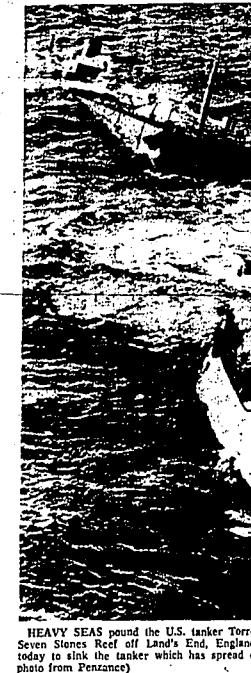

# Mao's Wife Asks Violence Be Curtailed

**TOKYO (AP)** — Bowing to the moderate policies of Premier Chou En-lai, Mao Tse-tung's militant wife has called for an end to violence in her husband's national struggle.

The New China News Agency said Chou sat alongside Mao's wife, Chiang Ching, told a congress of 10,000 young Red Guards in Peking Saturday that "the struggle must be conducted by reasoning, not by coercion or force."

Goaded by Chiang Ching and by purge chief Chen Biao, the Red Guards had humiliated, spat upon, derided and manhandled Mao's real and imagined opponents including the white-haired President Liu Shao-chi.

The violence softened after Chou called for an end to the excesses of the Red Guards and less harassment of his ministers. But Mrs. Mao apparently held out against him for months, as evidenced by the fact that though she addressed the congress, she did not read official reports of her speeches were distributed.

The congress Saturday appeared to have been called in order to bring the unruly Red Guards under greater control and persuade them to return to their studies.

Chiang Ching demanded that the struggle for control of the schools continue, saying: "The phenomenon of our schools being dominated by the bourgeois intellectuals must be completely changed."

The congress made clear that Chou continues to be the most important figure in the day-to-day running of the country and of the purge, while Mao appears to be the mastermind behind the scenes.

# Marine's Life Sentence Is Reduced

**DA NANG, Vietnam (AP)** — A Marine Division has reduced a Marine's life sentence for the murder of a Vietnamese man to 25 years at hard labor.

Maj. Gen. Herman Nickerson Jr. extended the clemency of Pfc. Charles W. Keenan, Nitro, W. Va., who was convicted on two counts of premeditated murder by a Marine court-martial at Da Nang Jan. 4.

The two Vietnamese, Nguyen Thi Co, and her brother-in-law, Nguyen Qu, were killed Sept. 22 while a U. S. Marine patrol was on a combat reconnaissance mission from its base camp at Chu Lai, 50 miles south of Da Nang.

Another Marine, Col. Stanley J. Luzzo, 20, Gardner, Mass., was convicted of premeditated murder in the death of the woman and given a life sentence which Nickerson must still reduce.

# Clay Gains Delay In Bout With Armed Services

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Heavyweight champion Cassius Clay won't have to report to the Army induction because he's now a Texan. Clay had his case transferred to Houston, his new home, and gave himself more time to continue his fight against military service. "The Houston board will set a new date for Clay's call-up," a spokesman for Board 47 in Louisville said Monday, "but that's all. They have no other jurisdiction in the case."

The spokesman said that when the papers are received the new call will be used for Clay telling him when and where to report. Clay and his lawyers appeared before the Houston board last Friday at which time the transfer request was granted. Clay established his change of residence through an affidavit signed by a Houston attorney, appearing after the champion's attorney, Hayden Covington, accompanied the transfer request.

A hearing is scheduled Wednesday on a suit challenging the original induction because of alleged discrimination by Board 47. Covington contended there were no Negroes on the Louisville board, said board said it has one Negro member. Covington also has asked the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals at Cincinnati for a permanent injunction to block the induction. The case was argued in Chicago, Clay's manager, Herbert Muhammad, said all negotiations for fights are at a standstill pending Clay's new induction notice.

# Court Denies Hearing On Bribe Scandal

WASHINGTON (AP) — Former basketball star Jack Molinas, convicted in a game-fixing scandal, was denied a hearing by the Supreme Court Monday on his claim that he was unjustly convicted. The case, involving a \$100,000 bribe, was argued with a listening device. The concealed electronic recorder was given Dennis M. Burke of the Green College player, by the New York County district attorney's office in 1962 when Reed went to Molinas' office in the guise of consulting him as his attorney, Molinas claimed. Molinas, subsequently disbarred, was then practicing law. He said Reed elicited incriminating statements from him while carrying the listening device. Molinas claimed his constitutional protections against unreasonable search and seizure and self-incrimination were violated. The high court turned down Molinas by an 8-1 vote. Justice William O. Douglas said his appeal should have been heard. The onetime Columbia University and National Basketball Association player was convicted in New York in 1962 on conspiracy, bribing Reed and inducing perjury. He was sentenced to 10 to 15 years in prison. The term subsequently was reduced to seven to 12½ years. Last March, Judge Harold P. Burke of the U.S. District Court in Rochester, N.Y., ruled that admission of the taped statements into evidence did not infringe on Molinas' constitutional rights. Burke rejected Molinas' application for a writ of habeas corpus and said Molinas had induced Reed to reveal nothing about the basketball fix and if called before a grand jury to lie about the crimes. Because Molinas was not then under arrest, Burke said, "The prosecuting authorities were free to question him either directly or through an agent such as Reed."

Burke's ruling was upheld in January by the U.S. Circuit Court in New York City.

NEW YORK (AP) — Mario Andretti, 28-year-old winner of the grueling Daytona 500 auto race, was named Monday professional athlete of the year by sports writers and sportscasters throughout the nation. He automatically earned the balloting at the end of the year for the S. Rae Hickey Professional Athlete of the Year Award. Bart Starr of the Green Bay Packers was the January winner.



# Detroit Appears To Have Best Shot At Orioles, If Pitching Is Better

LAKELAND, Fla. (AP) — If anybody is going to beat the Baltimore Orioles this year, it could be the Detroit Tigers. Mayo Smith, returning to the managerial ranks after an eight-year lapse, can make a big play for the Tigers. The one big change in the Tigers this spring is the shift of shortstop Dick McAuliffe to second base. Most of the rival managers who have seen the experience in exhibitions rave about McAuliffe's work at the second base. However, Ray Oyler, the new shortstop, must do much better than his 171 of last year to make it stick.

### Red China's Cultural Revolution Faces Acute Crisis On 2 Key Fronts

The Chinese Cultural Revolution, which began in 1966, appears to be building up to a crisis on two key fronts: the national economy and the border areas.  
The country's leaders are trying to break the "power seizure" movement so that massive calamity a few months hence can be averted. The "seizure" movement has been driven to a party "authorities" resisting Chairman Mao Tse-tung's policies.  
"There will be no seizure of power among production teams and production brigades... in those where power should be seized, so that spring farming can be carried out well," Premier Chou En-lai announced last week.  
This suggested that the "power seizure" struggle in the provinces badly damaged prospects for spring farming at a time when much damage already had been wrought by drought, pests and other natural plagues. Party leaders ousted an anti-Maoist group in the provinces and returned to office to carry out counterattacks in "revenge."  
Chou counseled. At the same time, word went out that those who reported their sins privately and produced more in those where power should be seized, so that spring farming can be carried out well."

### 'Checkless Society' Foreseen By Federal Reserve Official

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the near future, a "checkless society" may be in the making, according to a Federal Reserve Board official.  
The forecast of George F. Mitchell, a member of the Federal Reserve Board, in what he and the banking community term a "cashless society" is "it's coming very, very fast."  
Mitchell said today in an interview with the early 1970s, the system might be set up so that people find out it's easier and more convenient to do business this way they'll take to the change."  
Mitchell said computers will make the new system feasible, but won't eliminate coins, dollars or some checks. But he and others foresee the "cash card" or money instrument of the future.  
Mitchell said it will have an excellent side effect — some checks which might bounce. Coins and currency make up slightly more than 2 1/2 billion a total supply of money exceeding \$17 billion. The remaining \$13 billion is in 70 million checking accounts.  
Mitchell, who is working on the checkless society idea for the Federal Reserve Board with paper, processing these checks, he said, is expensive, time-consuming and geared to a completely obsolete technology.  
Basically the checkless society would be:  
- Propriating \$195,200 from general fund to governor's office.  
- HB297 (Appropriations) — Appropriating \$425,800 from general fund to state auditor's office.  
- HB299 (State Affairs) — Establishing a state board of eugenics to ease sterilization of incurably mentally deficient or mentally retarded persons.  
- HB300 (Appropriations) — Appropriating \$435,735 in dedicated funds to reclamation administration and ground water.  
- HB301 (Appropriations) — Appropriating \$33,000 from general fund for capital postal system.  
- HB302 (Appropriations) — Appropriating \$51,374 from general fund for noxious weed eradication and range improvement.

### Atress Files Cross-Complaint

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Actress Betty Hutton has filed a cross-complaint against her landlords asking \$300,000 in damages on grounds of libel.  
In the suit, Monday, Miss Hutton named David and Barbara Simmons of Laguna Beach, from whom she leased a home.  
The Simmons, in a suit earlier this month, asked for \$19,000 in back rent and damages from Miss Hutton and her estranged husband, musician Pete Candoli.  
The Simmons' suit accused Miss Hutton of "having a bad reputation" and of being addicted to barbiturates and alcohol.
