









# Scofield, Miss Taylor Win Top Oscar Awards

 LOS ANGELES (AP)—Brittain's "A Man for All Seasons" topped Hollywood's Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? as Oscar honorees. Academy Awards ceremonies televised Monday night after a late-hour strike settlement.

California Gov. Ronald Reagan and his wife Nancy exulted in the occasion, applauding the presenters from eighth row center and guffawing as master of ceremonies, Bob Hope quipped:

"Tonight we salute Hollywood, the birthplace of pokki-ness. Soon we'll need another category—best performance by a governor."

"A Man for All Seasons," the struggle of Sir Thomas More against King Henry VIII's scheming leutenants, was nominated for best picture. Best Picture of 1966.

Los Angeles Oscar host Paul Scofield, in the title role; its director, Fred Zinnemann; and for color cinematography, costume design and scenic artistry.

Scofield, 45, was in England rehearsing a play—"His Oscar" was accepted by his wife, nominated for her supporting role in "A Man for All Seasons."

"Virginia Woolf," the profanity-studded clash of a couple whose hate is grounded in love, brought a second Oscar to Elizabeth Taylor, 35, who won in 1959 for "Butterfield 8."

"Woolf" was acclaimed also for black-and-white cinematography, costume design and art direction.

Sandy Dennis, the young college professor's wife—"Woolf" received the supporting-actress award.

Stopping onstage with his broken left arm in a cast and his face bruised—injuries received in falling off a motorcycle last Saturday—he said:

"The other day as I was falling off my bicycle, I had the following thoughts: 'I was given a juicy part, allowed to work with talented, exhilarating, beautiful women and receive a great deal of money. Really?—glancing at his Oscar—'don't you think this is going too far?' In his next film, 'The Odd Couple,' Matthau teams again with Jack Lemmon, star of "The Fortune Cookie."

Richard Burton and Miss Taylor were at work on "The Comedians" in France. By telephone, she said she was glad to have won but sorry that her nominee husband hadn't.

Miss Dennis, 23, a Nebraskan born in Hastings and reared in Lincoln, received the award for her victory while dining in a New York restaurant with her husband, jazz saxophonist Gerry Mulligan.

"I'm thrilled. I never thought about winning, but I'm glad to be here," she said, as New York kept her from the ceremonies.

Her high point came when Patricia Neal, in a long purple and yellow gown, limped onstage to make her first appearance since her stroke nearly killed her in 1965.

Given a standing ovation, she said: "It really is wonderful, to be back with you."

Miss Neal presented the best foreign language film award to "A Man and a Woman."

Producing in France.

"The 'edge of a precipice,' he warned. He said the President appeared more interested in race-saving than in ending a barbarous war which threatens the foundations of American democracy."

# Italy Doctors And Interns Are Striking

ROME (AP)—More than 30,000 Italian doctors and interns were on strike throughout the country today, and 60,000 hospital aides and nurses threatened to walk out next week.

Medical services were seriously curtailed although striking hospital doctors maintained emergency service.

Nearly 20,000 hospital doctors have been out since Thursday demanding back wages. About 5,000 interns in university medical clinics started a three-day walkout Monday asking for changes in their pay scale and promotion system. Some 3,000 doctors in state medicare programs struck today for higher salaries.

The hospital aides and nurses scheduled a walkout April 19, demanding salary revisions.

# Dodd Backer Not Worried About Funds

 WASHINGTON (AP)—The man who paid the bills for Sen. Thomas J. Dodd's 1964 reelection campaign says he saw no need to keep testimonial funds and campaign funds separate.

"I didn't care whether I was using testimonial money or campaign money," Edward W. Sullivan, manager of the Connecticut Democrat's Hartford office, told Senate investigators.

A deposition was taken from Sullivan March 27 as part of the Senate Ethics Committee investigation of charges that Dodd diverted campaign funds to his personal use.

It was made public Monday as part of the investigation transcript. The committee has not yet submitted its findings or recommendations.

Sullivan had been subpoenaed to testify at the committee's first hearing last month but was excused because of ill health.

Dodd told the bipartisan panel that testimonial funds raised in 1961 and 1962 were not to raise campaign funds for him but to pay him money for the payment of debts and meet what he called "personal-political expenses."

He said he regarded the testimonial funds as "personal."

Sullivan, questioned in Hartford by counsel for the committee and for Dodd, also said the testimonials were put on by friends who wanted to give the senator financial help.

"Asked what he meant by the word 'testimonial,'" Sullivan said "I think that you're coming there actually make a dinner for the man who the dinner is being held for."

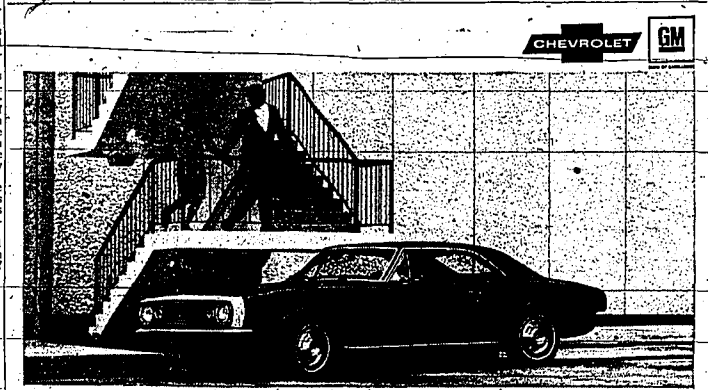

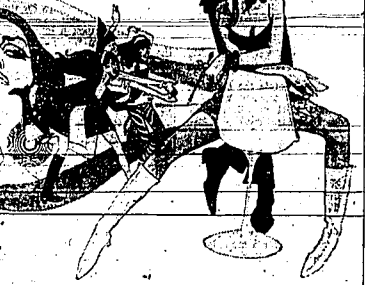

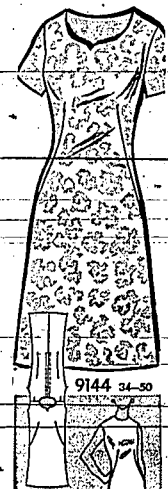

Sophomores on a 60-member board called the plan put forward by King a week ago "a serious tactical mistake" and said King's two movements "will force the cause of civil rights out of peace."

In the resolution adopted at its quarterly meeting, Monday the board said "civil rights battles will have to be fought and won on their own merits, irrespective of the state of war or peace in the world."

King, in a speech here last Friday, urged that the United States withdraw from the Vietnam war and urged Negroes "put whites at good will who object to the American position to become conscientious objectors."
