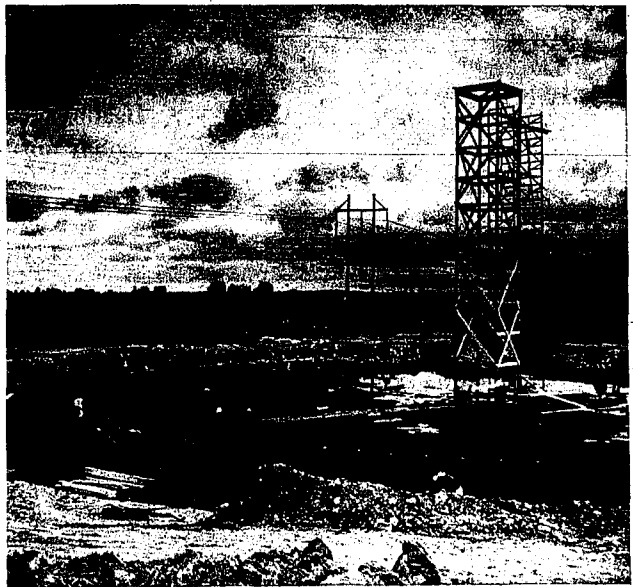

## Israelis Reply To Fire Of Arab Machine Guns From Inside Gaza Strip

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Arab mortar and machine gun fire from the Gaza Strip first today on farmers and soldiers inside Israel and the Israelis answered with machine guns as Israeli tank army spokesman said in Tel Aviv. While the firing ceased after 40 minutes, the incident served to heighten the feeling of imminent crisis in the Middle East.

The feeling of imminence grew Sunday when President Gamal Abdel Nasser announced he would never retreat from the blockade of Israeli shipping in the Gulf of Aqaba. Israel's premier, Levi Eshkol, declared his army is ready to fight aggression, including a blockade.

The firing of Israeli oil from Gaza apparently was begun by Egyptian irregulars and men will launch a major assault on the Sinai peninsula in Egypt. They are believed marching the front lines with Egyptian regulars along the coast of the Gulf of Aqaba.

It was the first such incident reported along the Gaza Strip since the Egyptian Army pulled out of frontier positions last week at Egypt's request. The army spokesman in Tel Aviv made no mention of Israeli retreat fire into the strip.

## U. S. Officers Foresee Israeli Land Assault If Ship Is Sunk

ATHENS (AP) — Officers of the U.S. 6th Fleet believe Israel will launch a major assault on the Sinai Peninsula in Egypt, sinking a ship bound for Israel in the Gulf of Aqaba, Israeli officials said today.

The Israelis have virtually no naval capability to compete against the Egyptian navy, which controls the mouth of the Gulf. Their link to East Africa, Iraq and Iran is by air.

U.S. Navy officers therefore expect Israel would use its high mobility army to penetrate into the Sinai and eventually into the entire Egyptian peninsula, breaking Egyptian grip on the port. It is at the head of the Red Sea, the port handles the only 15 per cent of Israel's shipping. Elath receives virtually all of Israel's oil from the Middle East.

## Sir Francis Chichester Settles Down To Enjoy Delights Of Shore Life

PLYMOUTH, England (AP) — Sir Francis Chichester, the British mariner of the new 33-foot yacht Gipsy Moth IV, is settling down today to enjoying "some of the delights of shore life."

Behind him was an epic 28,500-mile, single-handed circumnavigation of the globe in his 33-foot yacht Gipsy Moth IV. For the 107 days of the outward voyage, he was the sole navigator and the 119 days of the return voyage around Cape Horn. He was alone with the sea and the sky.

But the 65-year-old seaman said as he stepped ashore Sunday night that he was looking forward to some peace and quiet.

He is the best dinner, by the best chef, in the best surroundings and the best company—after four months of my own cooking.

"There are so many things, but that is one thing I am quite certain about," he added.

He spent his first night ashore in a second-floor room at a four-story, where Georgian mansion within sound of the sea. From his window he looked down on a statue of Sir Francis Drake, the first Englishman to sail around the world, from Plymouth in 1577, during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I.

The queen conferred knighthood on Sir Francis when he sailed from Sydney Jan. 28. Chichester sailed from Plymouth last Aug. 27 and is the first man to complete a solo round-the-world voyage with only one stop.

The first solo voyage around the world was by Capt. Joshua Slocum in 1891. He sailed from Boston in 1891. Slocum, 51 when he started his voyage, was 33 years when he completed it.

Stagnant Press?

The next best thing to taking a good look at yourself is listening to what others have to say about you. Sometimes it is a little hard to take and it may be on the shocking side but then everything just can't be a bed of roses.

A newspaperman gets a fixed impression of the paper on which he works. He tells himself that the paper is doing things the right way, is accentuating the stories which should be headlined and is reporting the news as it is—unbiased, truthful and with the idea that everyone should read it.

So it was with somewhat mixed emotions that the Times-News editor read that the responsible magazine Newsweek had made a survey of hundreds of students in American colleges and had come up with the disclosure these students called the great majority of inaccurate or falsified newspapers.

Seventy-eight per cent of the students had "only some" or "hardly any" confidence in the press and only a few had a "great deal" of confidence.

The figures are more alarming when it is realized that Americans under 30 outnumber their elders and that, by 1970, 100 million Americans will be in that age group.

The first criticism—the two-pronged accuracy and credibility—is a real problem for all newspapers. The poll showed that about 30 per cent of the students said they had experienced their local news papers inaccurately reporting events in which they participated.

This generation is, we realize, a generation which "does" and because of this increased participation comes up with an increased sensitivity to evaluation and reporting by newspapers.

A University of Kansas graduate was asked to give an answer to the poll when he said that (concerning the New York papers) "the news can be read in 10 minutes. The rest of the paper is plaburn, crosswords, funnies and good columns."

And more major criticism was directed at the editorial page and the "gutless refusal to take a stand." Papers often, the students complained, take editorial positions for peace, against poverty, against pollution, against inequity, but against a "but." They charged few papers pull out the stops on any single issue.

Right or wrong, true or false, surveys such as these provide food for thought. It is sobering, once in awhile, to find out what people think about you, the paper you work for and the "fourth estate" in general.

Like all newspaper editors, we of the Times-News could blame the mistakes which we made on someone else—perhaps the source of the news concerned.

Answers can be found to all criticism and that would be that. But would it be any better for you? You know, these young people could be right in their appraisal of the press. It leaves us a little uneasy.

And, if nothing else comes from it we at least have a little better understanding of busy students actually read our newspapers and are letting us know what they want.

That's your job—to give our readers what they want.

WASHINGTON — President Johnson received personal assurance from Premier Kosygin that the Soviet Union would "do everything in its diplomatic power" to bring about a truce between the United Arab Republic and Israel, I learned from a source here.

In several conversations with Kosygin on the "hot line" between Moscow and Washington, the Soviet leader has issued a public statement which would not intervene militarily. Kosygin refused to do so, but he added that he would issue such a statement in the event of a full-scale outbreak of hostilities as an "international" disaster.

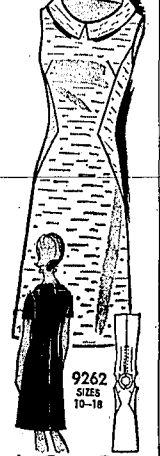

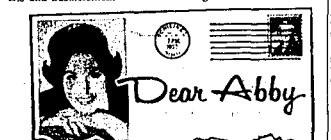

Among the critics whose fate will hinge on the election are Sen. Frank Church of Idaho, Joseph P. Clark of Pennsylvania, J. William Fulbright of Arkansas, Ernest Gruening of Alaska, George McGovern of South Dakota, William Morris of Oregon and Gaylord Nelson of Wisconsin.

As the party's nominee, Johnson is not only a likely winner of their states in the campaign, thus avoiding publishing the Vietnam policy criticism that has been between them.

But no presidential candidate could afford to bypass states like Oregon, Nevada, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania, which are swing states.

New York, Ohio and Indiana, however, have some of his most vigorous Vietnam critics who would be likely to defect.

With the polls indicating that a majority of voters support the President's course, it is likely that the dissenters will be re-elected.

In this situation, the Democratic dissenters are praying hard for some break which could lead to a re-election.

Any development of this sort could lead to a happy reunion with President Johnson, who would be re-elected.
