# Who Pays Bill For Clearwater Area Fire?

OROFINO, Idaho (AP)—When a fire breaks out in the Clearwater River drainage, who pays the bill? Right now, nobody knows for sure. But at a meeting of key organizations involved in administering the area, it was decided Monday to ask Idaho Atty. Gen. Alvan Shepard for his opinion. The decision was the outcome of a daylong meeting of Army Engineers, the Idaho Land Board, the Clearwater-Potlatch Timber Protective Association and the Idaho Forestry Department at remote Boehl's Cabin, 50 miles upstream from here on the North Fork of the Clearwater. Meeting against the pressure of the approaching fire season, they wrestled with what suddenly has become a vital question.

## Boise Man Is Charged With Murder

BOISE (AP)—A Boise man who pleaded innocent to arson was charged Monday with first degree murder in connection with a fire that killed his wife. Edward Quinlivan, 41, was arraigned on the murder charge before Justice of the Peace J.F. Cronwell, who set further proceedings for Thursday. Quinlivan's 36-year-old wife, Blanche, died Sunday of burns received in a fire at the couple's home on June 16. Quinlivan since had been held on a charge of arson. He pleaded innocent to that charge in District Court Monday and trial was set for Nov. 27. Police said they were summoned to the Quinlivan home June 16 by a telephone call which reported Quinlivan was chasing his wife around the house with a knife. Officers said when they arrived a neighbor told them the house in flames and Mrs. Quinlivan crawling toward the front door. The neighbor said he pulled the woman from the burning house, then wrapped her in a blanket to put out the flames. Since his arrest Quinlivan has been held in jail. He had been set at \$5,000 on the arson charge. A person charged with first-degree murder is not eligible for release under bond.

## Re-Enlists

CHARLOTTE, N. C. (AP)—Leonard Smith Jr., who won a Purple Heart as an Army paratrooper, before he was 18, has re-enlisted in the Army and hopes to go back to Vietnam. Smith, now 17, had enlisted illegally when he was 15. He was awarded a Purple Heart for shrapnel wounds in his right leg in Vietnam on Aug. 26, 1966, 17 days before his 16th birthday. He was discharged after the Army learned his true age. Monday he re-enlisted for three years.

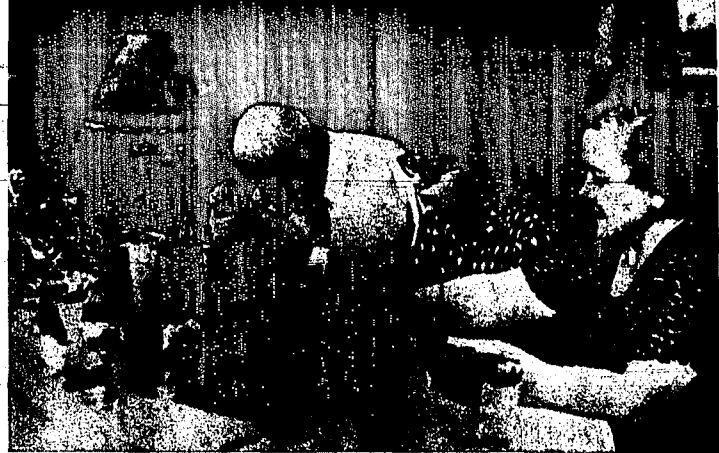

## Plans Made To Beef Up Hot Lunches

The hot lunch program at O'Leary Junior High School is in no danger of closing down, according to Ernest Ragland, school superintendent. Attendance at "hot lunches" had fallen off so sharply this spring that the program at the school was closed down for the last few days of the school year. Dr. Ragland said students and their parents had several complaints about the program at O'Leary Junior High School, including crowded quarters, uncomfortable seats and dingy surroundings. About \$4,000 is being spent this summer, the superintendent noted, in an attempt to alleviate these problems and upgrade the program. He said about 700 square feet of space has been added, new furniture ordered and personnel changes made.

## GOP Group Makes Plea For Unity

OLYMPIA (AP)—The State Republican Central Committee chairman appealed to party workers Monday to stop scrapping about party leaders and programs after decisions are made and get on with winning elections. C. Montgomery Johnson, writing in the Republican Report, official organ for the Central Committee, said "We expect ideological conformity. But without organizational unity there is no team." He urged Republicans to "keep your eye on the ball and on the target. The ball is Republican . . . the target is Democrats. There's a difference and our people sometimes forget it . . . at party expenses." Johnson made no direct reference to the latest skirmish in intraparty squabbling—the action taken by the Central Committee asking Washington's GOP national committeewoman, Fran Cooper of Seattle, to quit attacking other Republicans. The committee also adopted a resolution supporting Johnson. Mrs. Cooper demanded his removal in a letter in May.

## Cuban Group Demonstrates For Exile

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Cubans carrying suitcases inscribed, "Let us fight Reds or we go away," demonstrated Monday night for fellow exile Felipe Rivero, who faces ouster from the United States because of anti-Castro violence. On the eve of a scheduled U.S. ruling on whether Rivero stays or remains, about 100 followers carrying valises and torchlights marched before the John F. Kennedy Torch of Friendship. Rivero has been in jail since May 12, when the Immigration Service arrested him for belonging to an organization advocating violence. Americans ransomed Rivero from Cuba for \$100,000 after he was captured in the unsuccessful 1961 Bay of Pigs invasion.

Almost all of Florida is a bird sanctuary and the menacing mockingbird is protected. ### Administration Rejects Nigerian Aid Call

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Johnson administration rejected a request for military aid just as edgy congressional leaders began fuming that such help, coupled with earlier dispatch of U.S. planes to the Congo, could invite Communist meddling in Africa. A congressional uproar Monday greeted Sunday's announcement that three transport planes and 150 men had been sent to the Congo, torn by a mercenary-led rebellion. Hours later, just as Capitol Hill began sounding off against a hint that such aid might go to Nigeria, too, the State Department turned down Nigeria's request, saying its rebellion was purely internal. In almost the same breath that some congressmen expressed fears of a Vietnam-type involvement in Africa, they disapproved the optimistic report from Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara that the military war is going well in Vietnam. Some said they expect McNamara's visit to result in dispatch of more troops to Asia and a tax increase to pay for them. With both Vietnam doves and hawks criticizing the Congo action, the Senate Armed Services and Foreign Relations committees summoned Secretary of State Dean Rusk for a private explanation today of the administration's position. Chairman J. W. Fulbright, D-Ark., of the Foreign Relations Committee challenged a State Department spokesman's contention that the United States is obligated to uphold the "territorial integrity and unity" of Nigeria and the Congo. "This business of guaranteeing the territorial integrity of nations all around the world is being carried too far," Fulbright said. "What treats do we have that call for our intervention in the domestic affairs of other countries? So far as I know, there are none that apply in Africa." A portion of Nigeria has proclaimed itself the independent nation of Biafra. Fulbright, a vigorous critic of Johnson's Vietnam policies, said he supports even the Congo aid as a "wide open invitation to the Russians and the Red Chinese to stir up trouble in Africa."

### First Comedy Of ISU's Summer Season Slated

POCATELLO (ISU) — "Barefoot in the Park," the first of Idaho State University's summer season comedies at Sun Valley, to be directed by the visiting New York theater personality Betty Bendyk, opens at 8:15 p.m. Wednesday in the resort's Holiday Hut. It will be repeated Friday and Sunday nights. "Barefoot in the Park" by Neil Simon is a hilarious account of a struggling young couple facing a housing problem in New York. The critic of the New York Journal-American called the play "absolute tops in fun" and his counterpart on the New York Herald-Tribune described the long-run on Broadway as "three, amiable, idiotic and irresistibly funny."

### Court Rulings Don't Hamper Law Agencies

SEATTLE (AP) — U. S. Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark said Monday the recent Supreme Court decisions involving the rights of suspects do not hamper the work of law enforcement agencies. The Justice Department chief also urged some form of federal gun control. Clark spoke to the Washington Citizens Council, a unit of the National Council on Crime and Delinquency. Referring to use of confessions in the Miranda decision, Clark said, "We don't need such confessions. Of the five persons who were freed under the Miranda decision, four now stand convicted again." As for gun controls, the attorney general said there were 6,200 murders and 8,000 suicides by guns last year. Turning to another subject, Clark said Negro rioting is not limited by Communists or black-powder advocates. "The outbreaks are spontaneous," he said. "The environment is a potential factor in rioting. There is no evidence of anyone instigating a riot." Justice Rector, director of the NCCD, also spoke at the day-long conference on crime. He warned that organized crime could infiltrate the Northwest. "The Northwest has so far remained spotless, but the economic boom will make it easier for a syndicate to come in unidentified," he said.

### MOTION FILED

BOISE (AP) — A motion for a new trial was filed Monday against Idaho Secretary of State Pete T. Conrassus. The motion was filed by Gene G. Mileck, St. Maries. Mileck, chairman of the "Victory in Vietnam Committee" which is attempting to recall Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, filed the original suit early in June. It was dismissed June 30 in Fourth District Court by Judge J. Ray Durtschell. The suit alleged that Conrassus had failed to provide copies of correspondence to Mileck.

The suit was designed to remove Conrassus from office for alleged failure to perform his official duties. In his motion for a new trial filed Monday in Fourth District Court, Mileck alleges that Durtschell's dismissal of the suit "is against the law and the court is in error."

### APPOINTED

BOISE (AP) — Three new appointments and reappointments of a current member of the Department of Law Enforcement advisory board were announced Monday by the office of Idaho Gov. Don W. Samuelson. Reappointed to the Law Enforcement Advisory Board for a three-year term was J. J. Broderick, Coeur d'Alene. New members are Buster E. Goode, Rupert; Wilson C. Fritz, Boise; and Ivan Bell, Boise.

Sworn in as members of the Board Commission were Jerry Gentry, Twin Falls, and Gerard K. Baker, Hazelton.

### YOUTH ARRESTED

BOISE (AP) — A 19-year-old Boise youth has been arrested by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents and turned over to Ada County authorities for desertion from the U.S. Army. Robert L. McConnell Jr. Boise, allegedly deserted from the Army in October, 1966, and has been living in Boise since then.

McConnell was arrested by agent R. W. Christensen, referred to military authorities and turned over to Ada County authorities. McConnell has been previously charged with burglary of a Boise furniture store last Feb. 4. He is currently serving a six-month jail sentence for burglary. The desertion charge is pending his release.

### REPORT NEARS

BOISE (AP) — A report on Idaho education which will be the basis for a decision on whether Idaho teachers will refuse to sign contracts for the 1968-69 school year is expected late this month. Idaho Education Association Executive Secretary Wayne York said he recently talked to the National Education Association researchers who this spring made a survey of Idaho's public schools. They told York a preliminary draft of the study will be ready before the end of July.

The executive committee of the IEA will use results of the report to determine whether to ask the NEA to invoke sanctions against the state. The committee was authorized to do so by the IEA delegate assembly which met in April.

### LAND IS SOLD

BOISE (AP) — Sale of 206 acres of grazing land formerly owned by the state in Lemhi County for \$18,000 was announced by the Idaho Department of Lands Monday. The sale was to M. M. Mellon, Salmon. The land, appraised by the department at \$4,592, is located 12 miles south of Salmon.

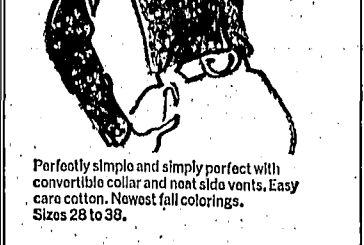

WASHINGTON (AP)—Republicans on the House Commerce Committee hope to revise the Senate-passed bill for a nonprofit public broadcasting corporation to insure its freedom from governmental—especially presidential—control.

The Senate bill, passed by a voice vote May 17, would create a public corporation to establish one or more noncommercial radio and television networks to distribute educational programs.

Rep. William I. Springer of Illinois, ranking GOP committee member, made this clear in an interview today as the panel prepared to hear initial testimony from John W. Gardner, secretary of health, education and welfare.

Springer said he supports the concept of a public, nonprofit educational broadcasting corporation and that he expects the committee to approve "some kind of bill."

### Filing Time For Election Will Begin

OLYMPIA (AP) — The filing period for candidates in the first municipal elections ever to be held in Washington State in November will begin July 31, Secretary of State Lud Kramer said Monday.

There will be elections Nov. 7 in 92 of the state's 95 cities of the first three classes, in 172 fourth-class municipalities or towns and in all districts except public utility districts.

The 1963 legislature enacted a law providing for all general elections to be held in November—those for the state in even-numbered years and those for cities and districts in odd-numbered years.

The law became effective for school districts in November, 1965.

City elections were held in March, 1964, under the old schedule. City officials elected that year and in March, 1962, whose offices are up this fall are serving 3 1/2-year terms. In order not to lengthen those terms, new officials will take office immediately after the elections, this November and

in November, 1969. They will also serve longer terms than usual because, beginning with the 1971 election, winners will assume office in January.

The five-day filing period for office will close July 31.

Cities not holding elections this year are Wenatchee and Olympia, where the next elections will be in 1969 under a system of staggered terms applying only to third-class cities with the commission form of government.

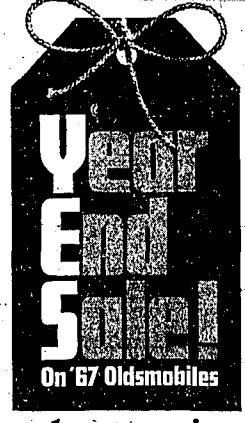

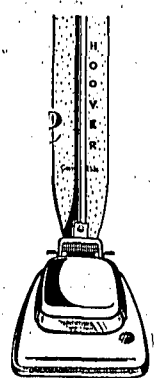
