The tinkling tones of its radio carrier wave, which carries coded data signals, were interrupted as the craft was hidden

from earth by the planet.

Bending of the waves by Venus's cloudy atmosphere—which the Soviet Venus 4 confirmed as mostly carbon dioxide and extremely hot—was expected to show the density of the atmosphere and how far it extends from the surface.

The signals stopped at 10:37 a.m. and resumed 23 minutes

During the flyby, instruments on Mariner 5 measured the amount of hydrogen and oxygen in the upper fringes of Venus' atmosphere. From this, U.S. scientists hope to deduce the density of the heavier lower layer of carbon dioxide and thus check the accuracy of the Rus-

sian craft's findings.
Strength of emissions from sunlight-excited atoms of hydrogen and oxygen was a measure of heat in the upper atmo-sphere. Scientists said they could calculate from this the heat on the surface, which Ven-us 4 radioed was 536 degrees Fahrenheit. Estimates of the time it would

take Mariner 5 to have its sig-nals blacked out by Venus had ranged from 11 minutes to 26 minutes, depending upon the





### Of Vital Interest

An election that should be of vital interest to every resident of the city of Twin Falls is coming up Nov. 7. Four positions on the city council are to be filled. Eleven candidates have filed for the four positions and there promises to be a distinct choice for philosophy.

In the approximately three weeks between now and election a clear picture should emerge on just what the various candidates stand for, and just what they promise for the future of this city.

Then the voters of Twin Falls can go to the polls and specify their pref-erence—but only if they are registered voters.

In some past city elections there has been an appalling indifference on the part of the voters. Such happened to be the case two years ago, and as a result, combined with a new law covering registration qualifications, only 875 people in Twin Falls were registered and qualified to vote when the city registration rolls were opened on Sept. 21.

Since then, due to a quickening of interest in this year's election, the number of registered voters has risen to somewhere around 2,000, at last report. However, city officials estimate some 8,000 persons in Twin Falls could be qualified to vote if they would register.

Last Sunday the Times-News published a list of the names of registered voters who were on the rolls and qualified to vote when the books were opened for new registrations. If your name was not on that list, and you, have not been to the city clerk's ofthe electors in municipal government fice to register since Sept. 21, you are not qualified to vote in the coming election, no matter what you think.

You may have voted in a bond election since the last municipal election, but that doesn't count in keeping your name on the city registered voter list. You may have voted in the last general election-that doesn't count

If your name wasn't on the list in Sunday's Times - News, and you haven't registered this fall, you are urged to go to the city clerk's office in the city hall and get your name on the registration book.

If your name was on the list, but you have moved to a different voting precinct since the last election, you must have the city clerk's office transfer your registration to your new precinct before you are qualified to vote on Nov. 7. A map of the city pre-cincts was published in Monday's Times-News.

Don't let your city government be elected and run by default. Preserve your right to be heard on how your city should be run. Be sure you are registered, then on Nov. 7 be sure you go to the polls and vote.

If you grew up in an era when freeloading was a disgrace, it'll be difficult to countenance this: a union of freeloaders demandg your money as one of their

There are 58 "locals" in 31 states with 3,000 to 4,000 duespaying members. They enlist welfare recipients by promising to "show you how to get more" and to "lobby for more welfare legislation." legislation."

Deserving welfare recipients are embarrassed by the sometimes disgraceful demonstrations sponsored by some locals. Case workers are intimidated by harassment and threats from militant spokesmen for this "un-

ion of poor people."

At the recent founding convention for the National Welfare Rights Movement in Washing-Rights Movement in Washington, director George Wiley described the organization as "representing poor people because both its leadership and its membership are poor people."
But he did not explain who

paid his way to Washington or

where the members get the dues which support his organization. There are goals of these professional parasites which sound outlandish, but which they fully mean to accomplish: free rent, free food, free medicine and a guaranteed annual income for

everybody. And supporting this subsidy for lethargy are several government economists who have always tried to butter poor peo-ple on both sides: Leon Keyserling says living above the poverty level "should be consid-

ered a nationwide universal right."
Walter Reuther wants an im-

mediate 50 per cent increase in all welfare benefits.

As it is, the number of Americans on relief has increased 50 per cent in the past 10 years. In our nation's most prosperous era - with every metropolitan newspaper buiging wuth a d s begging for workers - relief rolls continue to increase twice

as fast as our population is inincreasing.

Now 8.2 million are on relief. And while the number of persons on relief has increased 50 per cent, the cost (what you pay) has increased 120 per cent. Guaranteeing every family \$5,000 a year, as the Keyserlings want to do, would cost you about \$40 billion annually.

What I am about to say may sound like a digression, but I think it pertinent. A Catholic missionary priest, 21 years away from the United States, recently returned from India to Chicago.

He said his mission in India formerly gave food to anyone who asked for it. Then they discovered that the aid program tive when the able natives were required to work for the good: "No work today, no food today."

### WAYNE BRANDSTADT, M.D. Sciatic Neuritis

Q—Is sciatica a disease or a complication of some other disease? Is it fatal or crippling?

A—Sciatic neuritis, commonly called sciatica, is a symptom rather than a disease. It may be secondary to an injury, an infection, a slipped disk in the spine, prolonged pressure on the nerve or a tumor. In many cases no cause can be found. The pain may extend from the lower back all the way down to the ankle on the affected side. Q-Is sciatica a disease or a

to the ankle on the affected side. It is not fatal but, when severe, it can indeed be crippling. Q—I have acute sciatica. Will vitamin B-12 help it?

A-The treatment of sciatica is to remove the cause if possible. Vitamins are not likely to help. If such measures as heat, massage, rest and aspirin fail to give relief, injection of hydrocortisone into the diseased disk or removal of the disk is recommended.

Q — What is scleroderma? What causes it? What is the course of the disease? Is it serious? Is there any cure for it?

ous? Is there any cure for it?

A—Scleroderma is a chronic disease, the cause of which is unknown. It is characterized by hardening of the connective tissue of the skin and other organs, and may involve any organ of the body. Its course is variable. Progression of the disease may alternate with periods of spontaneous remission. It may be serious if the heart, kidneys or other vital organs become involved. volved.

Treatment is often unsatisfactory. Good results are some-times obtained with drugs of the cortisone group. These must be given under careful medical supervision. Other drugs that have benefited some victims are potassium para-amino ben-zoate, disodium EDTA and epsi-lon amino caproic acid. These drugs, obtainable only on pre-scription, are of value, however, only when given early in the course of the disease. Q—Having taken vitamin B-12

in a recent column that this vitamin will cure pemiclous anemia. If so, I should have been cured long ago.

A—It would seem that I slipped into the popular usage of the term "cure" when I should have said "control." There is no cure for pernicious anemia but control is the next best thing. Anyone with a disease for which there is no control will agree. will agree.

-My doctor has prescribed Doriden to help me rest at night. What are its side effects? Is it habit-forming?

habit-forming?

A—Glutethimide (Dorlden)
may cause nausea and a skin
rash. Anyone who is taking this
sedative should have a periodic
blood count. Although it is not habit-forming in the usual sense, prolonged use may result in dependence on the drug and unpleasant symptoms if it is with-

drawn. O-I am a man, 66, with hardening of the arteries. I am taking digitalis and Coumadin. Recently my vision has been blurred. Could this be from the medicine?

A—There are many possible causes of blurred vision, including hardening of the arteries. The most obvious and teries. The most obvious and easies to treat is a film of mucus on the conjunctiva which can be washed out with ordinary soothing eye drops. For other causes an eye specialist could be consulted, Neither warfarin (Coumadin) nor digitalis would cause blurring of your vision.
