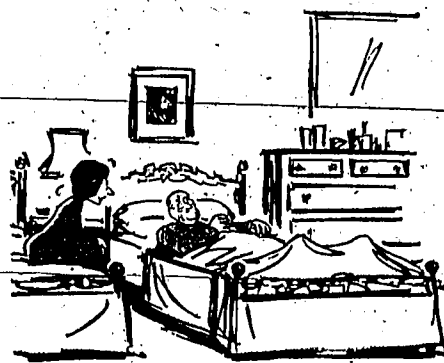

Plane Crash In Atlantic Ends Tour

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Two Kansas City law partners were homebound today, their vacation cut short by a plane crash in the Atlantic where they drifted on a raft for some four hours before being rescued.

Lantz Welch and James Horn told the Coast Guard in Miami they were picked up by a fishing vessel 50 miles at sea Saturday. The Coast Guard, unaware of the rescue, had continued its search through Sunday.

Welch said his engine went dead during a flight to the Bahamas. He said the plane sank three minutes after he and Horn clambered onto a life raft.

They said they drifted for about four hours before being picked up by the fishing boat "San Francisco."

Indiana To Make First Trip To Rose Bowl, Rest Of Bowl Line-Ups Filled

The clock struck midnight last Saturday and, by golly, the Indiana Hoosiers were once again the Cinderella team of college football.

After turning into a pumpkin at the stroke of Minnesota nine days ago, the Hoosiers slipped back into their glass slippers when the Big Ten's athletic directors selected them the con-

ference Rose Bowl representatives.

The Hoosiers made it possible with a stunning 19-14 upset over third-ranked Purdue that lifted them into a three-way tie with the boltersmakers and Minnesota for the conference title with a 6-1 record. Minnesota had with a 21-14 victory over lowly Wisconsin.

Because Purdue went to the bowl last year, Minnesota went in 1962 and Indiana has never made the trip, the Hoosiers are headed for the bowl in California during the holidays. But they can expect no waltz with top-ranked Southern California, the Pacific-8 representative that is certain to be a heavy favorite.

The rest of the bowl line-up was filled Saturday night when Florida State was picked for the Gator Bowl after whipping rival Florida 21-16, Idaho North Carolina State got the invitation to the Liberty Bowl and the University of Texas at El Paso won a Sun Bowl bid by stomping Utah 28-8.

Florida State will play Dec. 30 in Jacksonville, Fla., against Penn State, which slaughtered Pittsburgh 42-6, and North Carolina State travels to Memphis, Tenn., Dec. 10 for a clash with Georgia Tech.

Texas-El Paso stays home Dec. 20 as host to Mississippi, which beat Vanderbilt 28-7.

Elsewhere Saturday, Clemson won the Atlantic Coast Conference crown with a 23-12 decision over South Carolina and Yale completed an unbeaten Ivy League season by nipping Harvard 24-20.

Three upsets spiced the day, highlighted by Syracuse's 37-17 romp over fourth-ranked UCLA as Rick Cassata ran for two touchdowns and passed for two. Mike Stripling threw two second-half touchdowns to send Tulsa over 10th-rated Houston 22-13.

Tennessee, ranked No. 2, warmed up for its Orange Bowl meeting against Oklahoma, No. 5, in Miami New Year's night with a 17-7 victory over Kentucky-aided by five pass interceptions.

Colorado, bound for the Blinn-Dumler Bowl against Miami, Fla., in Houston, Dec. 23, jammed Air Force 33-0. Miami lost to sixth-ranked Notre Dame 24-22 Friday night.

Louisiana State outlasted Tulane 41-27 Saturday night in a tussle for its Sugar Bowl game in New Orleans against Idaho Wyoming.

Oregon State, No. 8, and Alabama, No. 9, which meets Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl in Dallas, did not play.

Arkansas apparently lost a Liberty Bowl bid with a 31-27 loss to Texas Tech.

Indiana, which won its only other Big Ten title in 1945, shocked everyone by winning its first eight games this year. But Minnesota mauled the sophomore-led Hoosiers 33-7 Nov. 18, and looked like a sure shot for the Rose Bowl until the Hoosiers made another amazing turnaround against Purdue, 8-2.

Unranked Indiana, which has squeaked by team after team with last-minute heroics, scored all its points against the Bolter-makers in the first half as Harry Gosso passed for one score and Terry Cole ran 63 yards for one and set up another with a 42-yard run. Four fumbles, including one on the Indiana one-yard line, foiled Purdue.

Minnesota, 8-2, ground out two touchdowns in the third quarter to beat the Badgers.

Kim Hammond, third in the nation in total offense, carried FSU, 7-2-1, by Florida, 8-3, in their battle for the Gator bowl bid. Hammond passed for two touchdowns and ran for a third. Tom Sherman hurried four touchdowns passes for Penn State, which finished the regular campaign at 8-2, as did Colo-

rado with its rout over Air Force behind the running of Bob Anderson and Wilmer Cooks. Georgia, 7-3, fumbled five times against heavy-underdog Tech, but pulled it out as full-back Ronnie Jenkins bulled over for two scores and Kirby Moore passed 66 yards for another in the nationally televised contest.

Billy Stevens of Tex-El Paso fired two touchdown passes for an NSAA career record total of 51. He hit on 23 of 41 throws for 240 yards and finished with career totals of 428 completions in a record 342 attempts for another record 4,485 yards.

Packers Use Breaks To Down Chicago

CHICAGO (AP) — The Green Bay Packers quickly exploited early breaks and clinched the National Football League's Central Division title Sunday with a 17-13 shaming of the scrappy Chicago Bears.

The Packers' second triumph of the season over the Bears, whose brilliant Gale Sayers raced 43 yards for Chicago's only touchdown, gave Green Bay an 8-2-1 record.

That put them 3½ games ahead of the second-place Bears in the Central Division with three games left.

Green Bay's eventual margin of victory was Don Chandler's 38-yard field goal after Sayers fumbled away a Packers punt on Green Bay's 37 in the third quarter.

That put the Packers ahead 17-10 and the only subsequent Bears score came early in the fourth quarter as Mac Percival's second field goal, a 15-yarder.

In a hard-hitting, typical Packers-Bears game, Green Bay got first-half touchdowns on Bart Starr's five-yard pass to Boyd Dowler and Donny Anderson's one-yard plunge.

The first one after a Packers pass interception on the Bear 10 and the second after Travis Williams' 69-yard kickoff return to the Bear 25.

Sayers, a clawing, battling half-carrier throughout, scored his 43-yard run from scrimmage to tie the score at 7-7.

After Anderson's touchdown pass, Green Bay ahead 14-7 at the start of the second quarter, the Bears never could catch up.

The Bears now stand 3-6 after having a three-game winning streak snapped.

Gurney Takes Car To Win At Riverside

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP) — Dan Gurney broke a jinx Sunday when he drove his powerful All-American racer to victory in the first running of the Rex Mays 300-mile race for Indianapolis-type cars.

Gurney, a favorite for years at this Southern California track, drove a spectacular race as he came from behind to take the lead in the final lap.

It was his first win in other than a stock car, although he had competed in sports cars many times.

Second was Bobby Unser of Albuquerque, N.M., who took the lead a few laps earlier when Mario Andretti had to stop for fuel.

England To Meet Russia In Match

LONDON (AP) — England's World Cup soccer champions play Russia at London's Wembley Stadium Dec. 8 in a match billed as a "friendly international" but one that carries much more significance.

Russia has won group three in the European Nations Cup and so has qualified for the quarter-finals of the Nations Cup—one that rates second only to the World Cup as far as European nations are concerned.

England, favorites to win its group, needs only a draw against the Scots at Glasgow's Hampden Park Stadium in Glasgow in February to clinch a place in the quarter-finals.

Granger Led Houston By Patriots 27-6

HOUSTON (AP) — Hoyte Granger traveled 124 yards in 22 carries for Houston Sunday, scoring one touchdown and serving as prime collaborator with the sturdy Oiler defense in a 27-6 American Football League victory over the Boston Patriots.

Granger's 67-yard run was main spring of the Oilers' second-period drive to their first touchdown on his one-yard keeper around right tackle.

The Houston defense allowed Boston's Jim Nance to go 109 yards in 18 carries, passing the 1,000-yard mark for the second year in a row, the first AFL player to do so.

But the closest Boston got was Houston's 23, and Gino Cappelletti's field goals of 40 and 30 yards accounted for the Patriots' scoring.

Houston quarterback Pete Beathard sent home 9 of 23 passes, including a two-yard bullet to Glenn Bass for Houston's second touchdown, in the fourth.

Tarkenton Leads Giants Past Eagles

NEW YORK (AP) — Scrambling Fran Tarkenton fired three touchdown passes—two to Homer Jones—and the New York Giants stormed to a surprising 41-7 National Football League victory over crippled Philadelphia Sunday.

The Giants scored every time they had the ball in the first half, bolted to a 34-7 halftime margin—and then coasted the rest of the way.

The Eagles, playing without injured regulars Bob Brown, Gary Ballman and Mike Ditka, could not get untracked.

The loss all but eliminated Philadelphia from the Capitol Division title race. The Eagles now are three games behind leading Dallas with three games to play.

The Giants now are 6-5 and ninth in second place in the Century Division behind Cleveland.

Tarkenton conducted the Giants on three long scoring drives in the first half and hit Jones with a 63-yard touchdown pass.

Tarkenton also hit Jones on a two-yard touchdown pass at the end of an 80-yard drive and connected with Aaron Thomas on a strike that covered the last 30 of a 78-yard march.

Kelly Carries Browns Over Washington

CLEVELAND (AP) — Swift Leroy Kelly rambled for two touchdowns and ripped through Washington's line for 103 yards Sunday, sparking Cleveland to a wild 42-7 National Football League victory over the Redskins.

The Browns, equaling their highest point production of the season, boosted their record to 7-4 and retained a one-game lead over the New York Giants in the Century Division. Washington fell to a 4-5-2 mark.

Kelly, who scored on touchdown runs of 42 and 21 yards, passed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second straight season. Only six players in NFL history have gained 1,000 yards in a season more than once. He carried 19 times in rigging up his best day ever.

Washington, trailing by five points with 90 seconds left, made a dramatic bid to pull it out. Jurgesen guided the Redskins to Cleveland's 25 with 45 seconds remaining, but after three incomplete passes he was sneared by Bill Glass on the Browns' 34.

Cleveland jumped into a quick 14-0 advantage on Kelly's first touchdown and a 70-yard run by linebacker Johnny Brewer was an intercepted pass.

The Skins battled back to within four points but rookie Carl Ward took a kickoff midway in the second period and scampered 104 yards, longest touchdown run in Cleveland history for a 28-17 halftime lead.

Cleveland led 35-24 after three quarters, before Kelly's final touchdown run sealed the decision.

Baltimore Topples 49ers To Stay Unbeaten In NFL Play

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A tying field goal and two quick touchdowns starting the third quarter gave the undefeated Baltimore Colts a 26-9 victory over San Francisco Sunday and a 9-0 record in the National Football League's Coastal Division.

After Lou Michaels' 12-yard field goal tied the score at 6-6, Lenny Lyles intercepted a Steve Spurrier pass in the open and raced 36 yards untouched to a touchdown.

Baltimore came right back with a 63-yard touchdown drive after recovering its own on-side kick. A penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct put the Colts on their own 37 to start the drive.
