# U.S. To Request U.N. War Action

(AP) — The United States is expected to call for a meeting of the U.N. Security Council soon to launch new attempts toward a negotiated settlement of the Vietnam war, informed sources said today. The sources predicted U.S.

Ambassador Arthur J. Goldberg would relay a request from the White House for a meeting of the 15-nation council some times.

Goldberg spent Wednesday in Washington for a Cabinet meeting, and it was generally believed that he discussed the Senate resolution adopted last week asking Pesident Johnson put the war before the United Na-

There was speculation that further U.S. action may bave been delayed by differences which have arisen with Salgon over participation of the Communist Viet Cong in any council debate on Vietnam.

The split came into the open after it was learned that the Viet Cong's National Liberation-Front had expressed a desire in October to send representatives to the United Nations.

A State Department spokes-man referred inquiring news-men to Goldberg's statement to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on Nov. 2. Goldberg said the United States would vote in favor of the Viet Cong participating in a council meet-

ing on the war.





The wheels spin furly ously but in the same old tracks: This is conspicuously true in for-eign policy, with the complaints increasing in volume about the mountain of the State Department and the infrequent mice

The second unhappy characteristic marking the Johnson administration at this point is the difficulty of recruiting first-rate men to fill the difficult top jobs. This has often been true with a President facing an election with the outcome questionable in the light of his declining popularity. It is complicated today by Johnson's demanding work habits, his expectation that the man will be on the job when-ever he happens to call him. whether it is 7 a.m. or mid-



London's major problem is not the value of the pound; it's that British industry hasn't modernized rapidly enough. Management is obsolete. The labor union setup invites production problems. These are the conclusions of U.S. government and business "Britain watchers" talked to by this reporter



# Christmas in Vietnam. Only 4 more shipping days. By air.

Your gift for that very special serviceman can make Christmas Day a lot brighter, even in Vietnam. But it has to travel almost halfway around the world.

To be sure it reaches him in good condition and in good time for Christmas... just follow these important steps.

1. The deadline for mailing by surface transportation, November 11th, is already past. To be sure your package arrives on time, send it air mail—and mail it by December 11th at the latest.

(The Post Office Department and the Department of Defense have been assured that all air mail packages received by then will be delivered to Vietnam by Christmas.)

2. Make sure the name and address is complete and clearly legible, placed lengthwise on the lower right hand side of your package, leaving room for the necessary postmark, notations, etc. Be sure to include the important 5-digit A.P.O. or F.P.O. number in the address to avoid serious delays.

3. It may be necessary to mark the package, "Gift-export license not required." Ask your post office.

4. Make sure the postage is fully prepaid. Your post office can help you determine the amount.

5. If you are using Christmas seals, or other labels in aid of charitable projects, put them on the back, not on the address side of your package. The Post Office issues a special Christmas stamp which is legal postage and should therefore be above the address.

6. Mail the package at the proper window in your post office, not at a letter box.

7. The post office can also tell you what weight limit applies. (It varies by A.P.O. and F.P.O. number.)

8. Be very sure the package itself is secure and substantial. Take into account the contents, the climatic conditions, and the handling within Vietnam. Paper alone or ordinary pasteboard boxes are inadequate. Canvas or similar materials, double-faced corrugated cardboard boxes, solid fiber boxes or wooden containers are recommended. Contents should not shake or rattle.

If you have any further questions, your post office can enswer them for you. But by following these key suggestions, your-serviceman should have your gift package intact and in time for Christmas. And that's the best way to tell him your heart is with him.
