

Historic Landmark Of Elegant Days In Gooding Goes Up In Smoke And Flames

GOODING — A 60-year-old landmark in Gooding came tumbling down in tongues of flame and belches of smoke Monday morning.

The Lincoln Inn, stately edifice of earlier days, and even as the acrid smell of smoke filtered over the city, old timers and not-so-old timers were reminiscing about events that had been held there.

The building first was opened in 1908 on Lincoln's birthday in 1908. There was great fanfare and celebration, and Mr. Gooding, then out of the governor's chair, entertained heads of state. Guests were served in the elegant French restaurant. Ladies wore red gowns from New York and Chicago in honor of the event.

On Feb. 1, 1913, Gooding became a county, and on Sept. 18, 1914, Mr. Gooding died. Originally, Gooding dominated part of the hotel, so that Gooding might have a courthouse, instead of allowing it to be located in another part of the county, which then included the present Lincoln, Gooding, and part of Jerome counties.

Gooding Courthouse Offices To Be Set Up In Tuberculosis Hospital

GOODING — Gooding county employees were busy Tuesday still removing usable items from the fire-ravaged Gooding Courthouse which was partially destroyed in a fire Monday that razed the historic Lincoln Inn. Firemen were still patrolling the smoldering ruins.

County commissioners, meeting in an emergency session Monday afternoon, obtained permission from Gov. Don Samuelson and the State Board of Health to set up temporary county headquarters in the first floor of the old section of the State Tuberculosis Hospital here.

Pat Swinney, Gooding fire chief, reported the fire began in a shop in the basement of the Lincoln Inn, but the exact cause still is not known. He said the dynamiting of the breezeway during Monday's fire deterred the flames from spreading to the Kendrick Drug Store and accomplished its intended purpose.

Cleo Faulkner, owner of Lincoln Inn, said the blaze was discovered by two maintenance men who found the shop filled with flames when they opened the door. They grabbed a nearby fire extinguisher and thought they had the fire out, but when they returned with another extinguisher, were unable to enter that section of the basement. No furnishings were saved from the hotel, which also included a dining room, coffee shop, two bars and the Chamber of Commerce office.

Court Affirms Divorce For Dr. Saviers

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court Monday affirmed a Fifth District Court divorce decree which favored Dr. George B. Saviers and granted no alimony to his ex-wife, Patricia P. Saviers.

Mrs. Saviers had sued her husband for divorce, but the court granted Saviers the divorce instead, dividing the community property equally and giving actual custody of the couple's three children to Mrs. Saviers, providing she remains in the family home at Kelchum.

The unanimous supreme court opinion said the district court was not abusing its discretion in failing to award permanent alimony to Mrs. Saviers because, it said, she was the spouse primarily responsible for the marriage's failure.

The high court said Mrs. Saviers was also fully able to support herself as a professional architect.

Saviers was awarded legal custody of the children and his wife retained actual custody. In the supreme court's opinion, the district court was upheld in forbidding Mrs. Saviers from having any social visitors in the family home except members and friends of the children.

Nonwhite Youths Are Without Jobs

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government says nearly one-third of job-age nonwhite youths are unemployed in the nation's 20 largest metropolitan areas.

A newly completed Bureau of Labor Statistics breakdown on unemployment shows the jobless rate for all potential white workers is at least triple that of whites in six of the cities.

It says 32.7 per cent of nonwhites aged 16 to 19 were without work—compared with 11 per cent jobless rate for white teenagers in the same 20 metropolitan areas.

The report, based on unemployment last year but believed to accurately reflect current urban employment patterns, appears certain to generate concern as the nation's big cities face another summer of predicted racial violence.

In the St. Louis metropolitan area, the over-all nonwhite unemployment was more than four times the white rate.

No city-by-city breakdown was provided on teen-age unemployment by race.

The figures on total unemployment varied widely from area to area.

In Detroit, Pittsburgh and St. Louis, more than 10 per cent of the nonwhites in the work force were unemployed.

In Washington, only 3.2 per cent of the nonwhites in the work force were unemployed.

Nonwhite unemployment was at least three times that of white persons in Chicago, Detroit, Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Baltimore as well as St. Louis.

The officer said a 1961 vehicle driven by Larry Williams, 17, Route 1, Buhl, was passing another vehicle and did not see the Clark automobile approaching. He attempted to pull back to his own lane of traffic but was too close to avoid the oncoming vehicle.

Both vehicles were demolished, officers said, and a wheel from one of them was torn off and crashed into the front of a nearby home owned by Mrs. Leonard Hudson, Route 1, breaking a window and damaging plaster on one wall.

War News Restrictions Investigated By Moss

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman John E. Moss of the House Government Information subcommittee, saying he's investigating new U.S. restrictions on release of Vietnam war news, contends reports of the war's progress must not be censored.

"It is more important now than at any time since our involvement here that we be fully informed about the war," the California Democrat said Monday night in an interview.

"Moss said he has asked Phil G. Goodrich, assistant secretary of defense, for a full explanation of the restrictions, which were imposed in Saigon Monday.

In addition, Moss said, his subcommittee staff is asking for a complete file on all cables and other messages between Saigon and Washington dealing with the matter.

The U.S. Command imposed restrictions on release to the press of information dealing with American casualties, damage done by enemy gunfire and the number of enemy shells fired when such information is considered to be of intelligence value to the Communists.

A Pentagon spokesman said the restrictions are not expected to affect the daily release of casualty lists and the Defense Department's weekly report on the overall totals of men killed and wounded.

There was no immediate indication of full censorship on news dispatches, as was the case during World War II and the Korean War.

Brig. Gen. Wm. S. Sledge, chief of information for the U.S. Military Command, issued the directive. He planned to meet with Saigon newsmen today to clarify it. Among questions expected to be asked were:

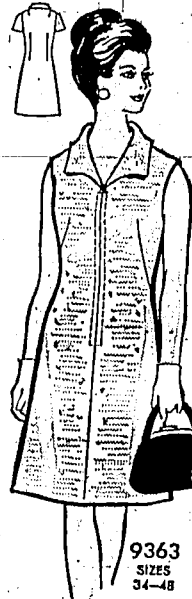

More Britons Turning To Surgery For Birth Control

The Simon Population Trust, set up in 1957 to probe problems of over population, said at least 10,000 British couples sought sterilization within the past two years. The trust said that in almost every case it is the husband who undergoes the operation.

The surgery, which is not available under Britain's state health service, costs \$38 to \$120.

The trust said it is now getting about 200 inquiries a month. It added that surgeons were cautious at first, but the trust now has dozens on its books prepared to carry out the operation.

Trust director Dr. Lawrence Jackson said many inquiries were from couples who married young and found themselves with three or more children.

"They write to us saying they find existing methods of birth control somewhat nasty and inconvenient," he told a newsman.

Jackson said the trust always made it clear to the husband that the operation was virtually irreversible.

No one operated on has so far complained of a drop in sexual potency or of any adverse effects on their sex life, he asserted.

NEW YORK (AP) — "Whatever privacy remains for the American citizen, it remains because the federal government is presently too inefficient to pull all its personal information files together..."

This statement, made by the head of a congressional subcommittee, Sen. Edward W. Long, D-Mo., contains a critically important word: presently.

The fact is that this inefficiency can be eliminated almost immediately by the electronic computer, a tool made precisely for this job of gathering, processing, interrelating, comparing and retrieving files.

And, as might be expected, pressure is now being applied to apply this computer tool to the job of creating a federal data bank from which could be drawn personal information on citizens by the mere tap of a finger on a console button.

The information on personal history so retrieved from the millions of Social Security, police, FBI, military and income tax files would be used by business, government and the professions ostensibly to serve man.

This "service" would include better government planning for health and welfare, federal marketing methods by industry, perhaps tighter federal budget estimates, more efficient personnel practices in business and so on and so on.

But, a growing number of critics believe that in turning the machine on "files" mankind is endangering the rights of personal privacy.

In the view of critics, the electronic computer's hunger for facts, its almost unlimited ability to regenerate these facts for an endless number of uses, and its amorality, have now brought it to a confrontation with man, its creators...

At issue are profound questions regarding man's future. Does man, for example, really wish to have his life so completely and simply belittled into a file in the machine because it is there? Is the machine tricking man into creating the need?

At the University of Chicago conference on privacy recently held, the world of concern became the central concern.

Prof. Arthur Miller of the University of Michigan illustrated at least one of the many dilemmas involved by reminding his audience that the "freedom of information" act was passed "in furtherance of the public's right to know..."

However, he continued, this right also could be a danger, if a great deal of information that originally was created for government use was kept confidential, and a considerable amount of personal data would be a sensitive citizen would consider private.

This information is, of course, available right at the moment without a central computer set-up. But the danger, as many see it, is that the centralization of this information and its retrieval for thereby using it as an excuse for thereby using it as an excuse for thereby using it as an excuse...

Egypt Rejects Israeli Talk Offer

By JOSEPH E. DYNAN
CAIRO (AP)—An Egyptian government spokesman rejected Israel's offer of direct negotiations under U.N. auspices Monday night, saying the Israelis should comply with peace proposals already approved by the U.N. Security Council.

Dr. Mohamed Hassan of Zayat said Israel appears to be intent on imposing its own peace terms on the Arabs.

The Security Council called last November for Israeli withdrawal from Arab lands captured in the war last June. It also called for a Palestinian refugee problem and free navigation through international waterways in the area.

Swedish diplomat Gunnar V. Jarring was appointed to seek a permanent Middle East peace based on these principles.

Israel had said it would accept Jarring only as an emissary to bring the two sides to the conference table, but it announced Monday it is willing to meet with Arab diplomats at a place of Jarring's choosing and with the U.N. envoy acting as chairman for the talks.

"What we Arabs care for is not a form of negotiations with Israel," Zayat said. "We want Israel to accept United Nations peace efforts to settle the Middle East problem, especially with regard to the refugee question."

"If it is a matter of a victor seeking negotiation with a vanquished, if Israel seeks to exploit United Nations resolutions for its own interests, then there would be no need whatever for the Jarring peace mission."

The United Nations Secretary-General U Thant said he was recalling Jarring for conferences on "prospects for entering a new stage" in the peace effort. After the talks in New York, Jarring will return to the Middle East, Thant's office said.

Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban told his Parliament Monday that his government still insists on direct talks with the Arabs as the only basis for reaching a settlement to their longstanding "conflict." But by agreeing to negotiations with Jarring as chairman, he said, "we have made a maximal contribution to advance the international peace mission."

"We shall regard the readiness of the Arab governments to sit down with us face to face as a test of their actual desire to make peace," Eban said. "A refusal to meet face to face is to be interpreted as a refusal to make peace."

Egypt and Jordan have refused all along to meet with the Israelis, and Syria, the third Arab nation defeated by Israel in June, has refused even to meet with Jarring.

Eban said security and recognized borders for Israel are the key to peace.

Eban also told the legislators that Israel plans to intensify development programs in Africa despite a resolution last week by the Organization of African Unity demanding unconditional Israeli withdrawal from occupied Arab land.

Some Israeli newspapers had demanded an end to aid for African nations that voted for the resolution.

Eban said Israel had received support from 18 of the 27 non-Arab African nations in the United Nations after the Arab-Israeli war and the country "must show patience. . . in its efforts to consolidate the assets of friendship and cooperation in Africa."

Hansen Feels All-Out Force Is Necessary

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Special)—Congressman George Hansen said in Washington today that President Johnson should further escalate the war in Vietnam if he is not prepared to do what must be done to protect our ground forces and to bring the war to a speedy conclusion.

Hansen, who noted that General William C. Westmoreland, the United States military commander in Vietnam, has asked for 50 to 100 thousand more troops, said, "General Westmoreland knows the situation, he knows what is needed, and the troops should be sent. However, it is more to the point that we start taking his advice on other matters, taking tactical policy making away from civilian advisors who have probably done the worst job in our history of conducting a war."

Hansen said, "former President Dwight Eisenhower has said that when a nation applies force as we have in Vietnam then the force should be overwhelming. This we have not done. We have under President Johnson escalated the war piecemeal without closing the major supply routes. This has resulted in prolonging the war at a tragic cost to American lives."

"I agree wholeheartedly with a House Armed Services report that says United States military forces must take the offense if the war is to be brought to an end. The report says the enemy must be denied access to all war material and supporting supplies, and if necessary to achieve this end, all routes should be closed or destroyed."

Hansen said, "McGuire, Go Home!"

BUDAPEST, Hungary (AP)—Representatives of 66 Communist parties began discussions today without being able to agree on an agenda for their meeting because of looming controversy.

The meeting, which formally opened Monday, is a step in the Soviet drive to arrange a world Communist conference in hopes of restoring Soviet-line unity to the divided Communist movement, badly fractured by the Russian-Red Chinese split, Communist parties of China, North Vietnam, and 13 other countries were absent.

The communique listed the 66 parties represented but was silent on those missing from the 81 eligible. Naming the absentees appeared to be a controversial subject. They are missing for various reasons.
