Retention Of Extension Agent Urged At Hailey

HAILEY — Hailey Chamber of Commerce members have invited Blaine county commissioner to meet with them March 11 to discuss the termination schedule for July 1.

Jim Eakin, Blaine county agent, told chamber members at a meeting this week at the Mint Cafe that the services of the extension home economist for the county have been terminated because "commissioners did not approve a request from the University of Idaho to raise the county's share of the home economist's salary from \$500 to \$750 annually and the agent's office from \$1,000 to \$1,250 beginning July 1.

All counties were asked for similar increases in their budgets to help provide increased salaries for the extension service personnel. The local county support, approved in most other Magic Valley counties, but also turned down by Minidoka county, would be raised to \$1,500 Jan. 1, 1969.

Mr. Eakin said the last request he submitted for a hike in salary for the county's share of the extension service personnel was made in 1951 when all counties increase their share to \$1,000 for fulltime agents.

The Blaine county home agent also serves Lincoln and Camas counties, both of which have approved the increases, plus the request for the county agent's salary.

Chamber members pointed out

the benefits derived from the 4-11 program alone would more than justify the moderate increase, let alone the impact of improved agriculture methods in the county.

The county agent's office was initiated in Blaine county in 1917 with J. H. Finley the first agent until 1918. J. H. Klingler served from 1918 to 1922. The office was closed between 1922 and 1950 when it reopened with J. E. Wheeler as agent until 1957 when Mr. Eakin served until 1959. Norman Warren was agent from 1960 to 1964 and in 1965 Mr. Eakin again took the position.

It was announced the public health nurse has taken a cut in salary but is continuing her duties. Claude Porter was welcomed as a new member.

Pair Steals Palladium At Airport

NEW YORK (AP) — Two men with forged documents—one wearing a guard's uniform and carrying a revolver in a holster—conned employees at a cargo building at Kennedy airport out of two crates of the rare metal palladium valued at \$508,351.

The men, who were in a series of major cargo hauls at the airport—was staged Tuesday at the KLM Royal Dutch Airlines cargo building.

A panel truck pulled up at the cargo building, and two men stepped out. One identified himself to the staff as a representative of Engelhard Industries Inc., a metals firm in Newark, N.J.

The men had what looked like all the necessary credentials—including a bill of lading—to pick up the crates for the Newark firm, to which the shipment had been sent by a firm in Amsterdam, Holland.

The 11 square blocks of palladium—which is similar to platinum—were loaded into the panel truck. The men signed receipts for the crates and drove away.

Hours later a real representative of the Engelhard firm showed up in a company truck with a company guard to pick up the palladium, which had been shipped from the Soviet Union to the Amsterdam firm which sold it to Engelhard.

The metal is used largely in jewelry, watchmaking and expensive dental work.

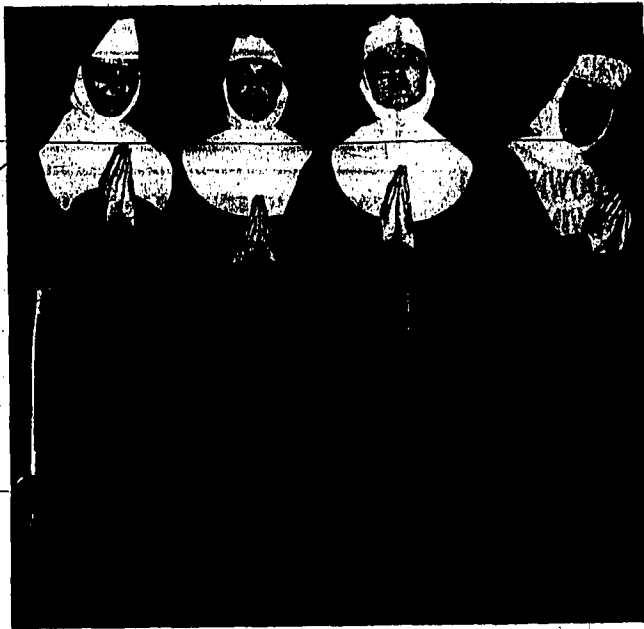

FBI Course Is Aimed At Sex Offender

Law enforcement officers from throughout Magic Valley are attending a two-day training course on sex offenders conducted by two Federal Bureau of Investigation special agents.

The course, which began Tuesday, is being co-sponsored by the Twin Falls City Police Department and the Twin Falls Sheriff's office.

The course is designed to acquaint law enforcement officers with types of sex offenders and the nature of their offenses. The course differs from the usual training sessions because it deals with the offender rather than the offense.

The origin, background and probable crimes of the person with disturbed sexual emotions is being examined during the school. No effort is made to develop scientific theories or medical levels, only to familiarize officers so they can better cope with the offenders.

The course, conducted by Thomas H. Zoeller, Butte, Mont., and Robert R. Rockwell, Coeur d'Alene, was to continue through Wednesday.

Construction Of Turnoffs Is Planned On Highway 25 Between Rupert, Paul

PAUL. — The Paul Chamber of Commerce is working with the State Department of Highways and the Minidoka County School District to have turnoffs constructed along State Highway 25 between Paul and Rupert.

Proposed plans for the project were discussed during a meeting with the chamber.

The chamber is working with Blaine Sessions, district engineer for the State Department of Highways. Mr. Sessions suggested the improvements be made in conjunction with the construction of a four-lane highway through Paul this spring.

The highway department said it would remove the current surface of that highway through the Paul city limits and replace it with new material. The department will take the old material and use it to widen the highway to Minico and construct the turnoffs.

One Tranter county school bus director, and Leonard Martin, chairman of the school board, have asked for turnoffs to be located about every one-half mile between 100 West and 700 West.

They pointed out that with this plan, students will not have to walk more than one-fourth mile to reach a stop. The plan calls for eight stops on one side of the highway and 10 on the other.

The proposed turnoffs will allow school buses to get completely off the lane of traffic during stops. Chamber members point out that currently

the buses are having to stop in recreational facilities.

He noted the county has over \$10,000 improvements into the lake area, including matching funds. The development project has been approved as a five-year project and it has to be carried out as planned in order to receive the matching funds.

The county's share of the development is \$27,180 and the Lake, east of Heyburn, and presented a map.

He explained that the one-half mile for the commissioners approved the entire amount for the mill levy into the park development and said that the

commissioners are just as much concerned about recreation for children as anyone living in the area.

He noted that three chemical restrooms will be installed on the east and a flush type on the west of the lake. A road and barrier will be on the north and parking on the west. Picnic tables will be set up and lawn planted.

Last year the drainage ditch was filled in on the south and a pump was installed with springing facilities.

Rural Electric Co. and the

A caretaker will be hired this fall to live at the lake in a trailerhouse.

Telephone Co. will donate cost of digging holes for the four-foot ties to be placed along the North. He noted the ties will be 18 inches high and will catch on bumpers of vehicles if attempts are made to push them over.

Prediction Made For Drug Bill

WASHINGTON (AP). — The acting chairman of a House Commerce subcommittee predicts the House will overwhelmingly pass the bill to impose penalties for possession of the hallucinatory drug LSD.

Rep. Paul G. Rogers, D-Fla., told a reporter Tuesday the subcommittee probably will send the administration bill to the floor before Easter.

Subcommittee hearings ended Tuesday with assurances by Commissioner of Narcotics Henry L. Giordano that proposed penalties for possession of the mind-bending drug would be aimed at pushers, rather than experimenting students.

"As far as I am concerned," Giordano told a questioner, "these penalties are not aimed at putting young people in jail. They are aimed at the trafficker."

Rep. Tim Lee Carter, R-Ky., who had called the possession moratorium of the bill "absolutely unenforceable," said he would support it, provided it is not used to imprison high school and college students who experiment with dangerous drugs.

The bill provides a maximum one-year penalty for possession of hallucinatory depressants and stimulants, and five years and \$10,000 for manufacturers, sellers and distributors of the drugs. Even stronger penalties are provided for adults who sell them to minors.

South Korea Is Planning Reserve Corps

SEOUL (AP). — The South Korean government plans to organize a reserve corps of 2 million men to curb North Korean military provocations, President Chung Hee Park said today.

One million reservists will be armed by the end of this year, said Park, who predicted a further increase in North Korean intrusions across the border.

"If the reserve corps is well organized and mobilized effectively, we don't have to worry about an attack on South Korea by (North Korean Premier) Kim Il-sung's army," he told a meeting of the National Veterans Association.

South Korea, which has a 500,000-man army, became increasingly concerned about its defense after North Korean commandos tried to assassinate Park in Seoul and the North Koreans seized the U.S. intelligence ship Pueblo last month.

North Korea has an army estimated at 400,000 men and a militia of one million men and women.

Outgoing Defense Minister Kim Sung-oun said today he had outlined the need for more modern weapons for South Korea's regular armed forces in a letter to Johnson and 117 other U.S. leaders asking for an increase in American aid. While not officially disclosed, that aid is believed to run \$200 million to \$300 million a year.

Kim resigned Tuesday because of the North Korean attempt to assassinate Park and the President named former Lt. Gen. Choi Young-il to succeed him.

Cenarrusa Doesn't Plan To Seek Post

BOISE (AP). — "Quite a few" persons have asked Idaho Secretary of State Pete T. Cenarrusa to run for the Second District congressional seat, the former state house of representatives speaker said Tuesday.

Cenarrusa said he doesn't plan at present to run for the seat now held by Rep. George Hansen, R-Idaho, but he said he might if he were convinced that his entrance was necessary to retain the post for his party.

Hansen has said he will run for the U.S. Senate seat now occupied by Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho.

Cenarrusa was a long-time state legislator before he was appointed last April to the vacancy caused by the death of Secretary of State Edson Deal.

Three Idahoans have already said they would try for the Republican nomination to replace Hansen. They are State Sen. Don Loveland of Burley, Dick Smith of Rexburg and Lloyd Webb of Twin Falls.

Ship Harassment By Soviets Is Reported

WASHINGTON (AP)—Soviet ships have reportedly harassed U.S. Navy vessels about a dozen times in the waters off Korea since the Communist North Korean seizure of the intelligence ship Pueblo.

Both the U.S. and Soviet Union sent sizeable naval forces into the Sea of Japan crisis area in the wake of the Pueblo incident.

Most of the harassments have gone unreported officially, sources said, apparently to avoid aggravating American tensions over the situation growing out of the seizure of the Pueblo and its crew.

The only one reported involved a collision, described as minor, between the U.S. destroyer Rowan and a Soviet

merchant ship, the Kapitan Volskhovok, on Jan. 31. The U.S. claimed the Rowan had the right of way.

The unreported incidents were non-missile, sources said. By this, they meant that Soviet ships, mostly destroyers and intelligence-gathering craft, signaled into the midst of U.S. naval formations or sailed dangerously close to American ships.

Both countries have scaled down their naval forces in the waters off Korea recently. At one point, the Soviets had some 14 warships, including two cruisers, operating in the same general area where the U.S. fleet had been built up.

This Soviet naval presence has now been reduced to about five or six destroyers and a few intelligence vessels. The rest

partedly have moved back toward Vladivostok, the main Soviet naval base in the Far East.

The U.S. Navy has meanwhile withdrawn the nuclear-powered carrier Enterprise from Korean waters and sent it into action in the Gulf of Tonkin against North Vietnam. This was the Enterprise's original mission before it was diverted to the sea of Japan shortly after the Pueblo was captured.

Two big U.S. aircraft carriers, the Ranger and the Coral Sea, together with their supporting destroyers and supply vessels, remain in waters near Korea. At its peak, the U.S. naval build-up off Korea totaled more than 20 ships.

The dual problem of Korea and Vietnam is straining the Navy's carrier resources in the Far East.

Shriver's Absence From Slate Spurs Talk Of Appointment

 WASHINGTON (AP) — Sargent Shriver's absence from the Illinois Democratic slate for this fall's elections is spurring speculation here the anti-poverty chief may be appointed ambassador to France.
 Shriver, 52, the former Peace Corps director who is the brother-in-law of Sens. Robert F. and Edward M. Kennedy, once appeared a likely choice for the Illinois Democratic party's nomination for either governor or U.S. senator.
 But shortly after Illinois Democratic leaders announced their choice Tuesday of a Shriver-less slate, the rumor spread quickly in Washington that President Johnson would nominate the di-

rector of the Office of Economic Opportunity for the Paris post. In Austin, Tex., White House press secretary George Christian said he had no information on moves involving Shriver. An OEO spokesman said there was no truth to the rumors.
 It was understood, however, that President Johnson offered Shriver the Paris post several weeks ago but Shriver said he did not want to make up his mind at the time. The President is said to have told Shriver he would not fill the post immediately.
 In an Associated Press interview a little more than a year ago, Shriver indicated he would not be adverse to being named to an ambassadorship.
 Illinois Democratic party leaders chose state Atty. Gen. William G. Clark to be the party's nominee for U.S. senator and Lt. Gov. Samuel H. Shapiro for the governorship race.
 Through a spokesman in the Office of Economic Opportunity, Shriver said he was not offered either nomination. He did not go to Chicago during the weekend to ask the party's backing for either post.
 Clark will oppose Republican incumbent Sen. Everett M. Dirksen, who has announced he'll seek re-election and who has been friendlier to Johnson than many others in the Senate, including Democrats.
 Some Capitol Hill sources said they felt that if Johnson had backed Shriver for either the governor or Senate nomination, Illinois party leaders would have named him to the slate.

Recruit Effort To Be Costly

WASHINGTON (AP) — Pentagon sources say a secret report estimates it would cost \$77 million to meet a presidential riot commission's recommendation that Negro membership in National Guard units be substantially increased.

Top military and administration officials are debating whether to ask Congress for funds to initiate what the sources described as a three-year nationwide recruiting effort.

A congressional expert on military programs said the \$77 million estimate may be low. "Soldiers are an expensive commodity," he said.

Last Aug. 10, less than two weeks after it was appointed by President Johnson to investigate riots in Newark, Detroit and elsewhere, the Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders reported that only 5,000 Negroes were among the nation's 500,000 guardsmen.

This deficiency, it declared, "must be corrected as soon as possible." The commission did not set a specific goal or a deadline.

Johnson immediately sent the recommendation to Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara with the notation: "This is a matter of highest urgency and I know you will give it your immediate attention."

A special panel headed by Brig. Gen. R.M. Williams, the Army's assistant judge advocate, was formed at the Pentagon to study Negro membership in the Guard. Known as the "Williams Board," the panel sent a confidential report to Gen. Harold Johnson, Army chief of staff, on Dec. 1.

The gist of the panel's findings was discussed at a recent meeting attended by several high-ranking officials. One of those present said \$80 million was given as "a round figure" for the cost of substantially increasing the percentage of Negroes in the Guard. This includes, he said, recruitment as well as training and equipping new Negro members. Another source placed the figure at \$77 million.

The estimates include a wide range of items—from the cost of uniforms and pay allowances to advertising programs, officials said.

A National Guard Bureau spokesman, asked about the cost estimate, replied: "I haven't heard that proposal."

Several states have expressed interest in a program similar to a pilot recruiting project under way in New Jersey, another Guard official said, "but we have replied to each one that we would like to hold a decision in abeyance for a few weeks until we know exactly where we are going."

"I'm sure there will be a national program of some sort."

The Pentagon slashed red tape last August and granted the New Jersey Guard if 5 per cent overstrength for Negroes. As of this week, a spokesman said, 480 Negroes had been recruited. Nearly \$30,000 has been spent for newspaper ads, radio commercials, billboards and leaflets directed at more than 30,000 "recruitable" Negro males in New Jersey.

"This is one program that has worked," said Maj. Gen. Winston P. Wilson, chief of the National Guard Bureau, New Jersey's adjutant general, Maj. Gen. James F. Cantwell, said. "We think we've gotten over the hump," he said.

The National Guard Bureau has contracted with a private polling firm to conduct a \$70,000 nationwide survey of Negro attitudes toward the Guard. The survey is expected to be completed soon.

Priest Is Sentenced For Shooting

MANILA (AP) — A Roman Catholic priest who shot and killed another priest during a quarrel over parish funds was sentenced today to 8 to 17 years in prison.

The Rev. Jose Sison Estrada was found guilty of homicide and illegal possession of a firearm by a local court. The shooting occurred in 1965 in Pangasinan province, northwest of Manila.

The victim was the Rev. Isidro Estrada, but the priest was not related.

Father Estrada was also fined \$260 for possessing an unlicensed gun and was ordered to pay damages to his victim's heirs. He was out on bail while his lawyer arranged an appeal.

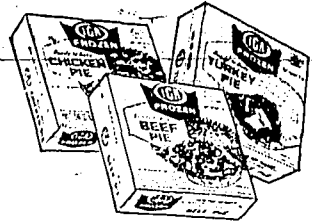

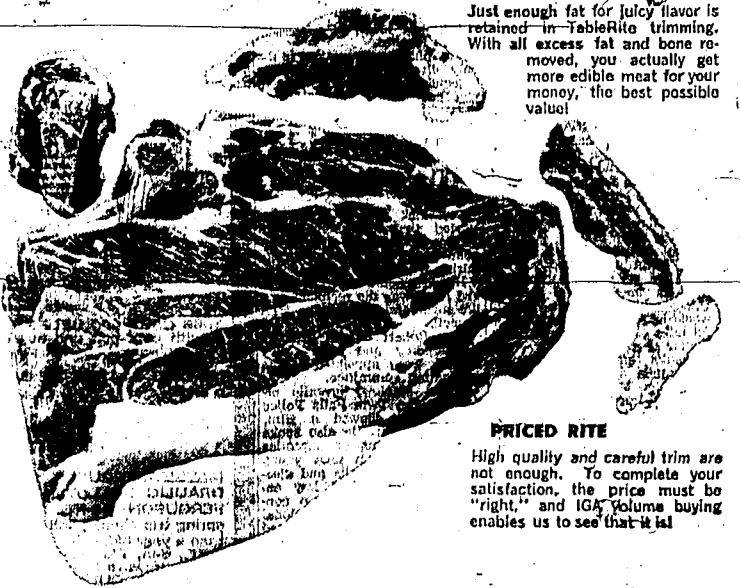

 LONDON (AP) — A move to call a special meeting of the International Olympic Committee to discuss the 32-nation boycott caused by South Africa's readmission to the games is building up, Olympic officials said Tuesday.

Gaule Ovesti, president of the Italian Olympic Committee, has asked Avery Brundage, IOC president, to call a special meeting and other delegates are prepared to back up the request, officials said.

Brundage has said he saw "no possibility of a meeting being called, but IOC rules state that a meeting must be held if one-third of the 71-nation body re-

however, the president of the Belgian Olympic Committee, deplored the way the readmission of South Africa to the games had been handled.

Min. Raul Mallet said, "I personally deplore the policy followed by the International Olympic Committee in this instance."

"I strongly believe they acted lightly in being 'satisfied' with nothing more than a vote by mail on such an important question instead of debating the problem."

The big question still hanging over the controversy is: Will Russia join the Africa boycott? There have been indications that the Soviets might join in sympathy with the Africans, but no official decision has yet been made.

"We had exhaustive debates on the re-entry of South Africa," he said. "We took a postal vote on the issue and the vote was substantially in favor of South Africa's re-entry."

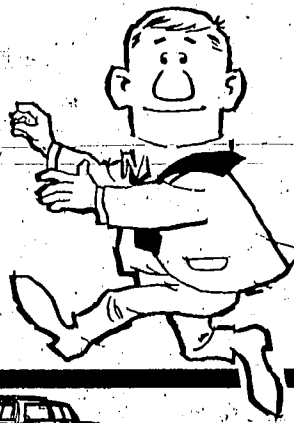

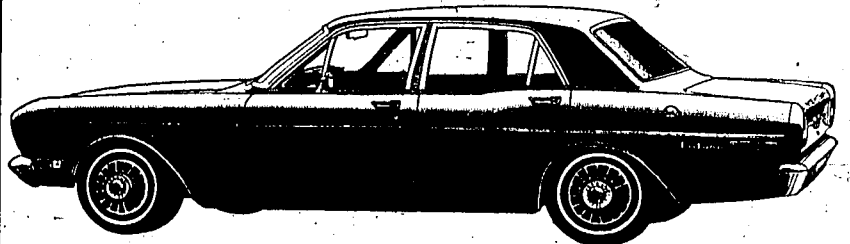

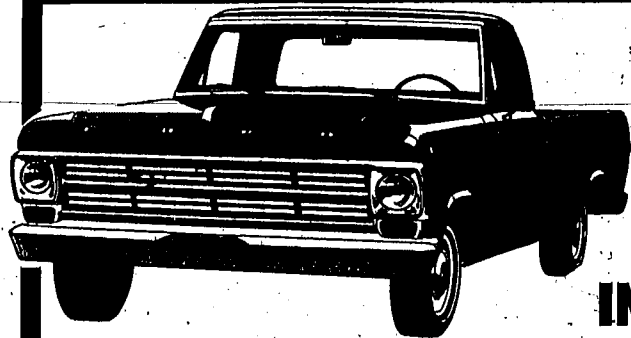

One-Dish Meal Is "Exotic"

1 green pepper, thinly sliced in rings
2 oranges, peeled and sliced
2 bananas, peeled and sliced diagonally
3 cups hot cooked rice
1/2 cups seedless raisins, plumped

In large skillet lightly brown pork and onion in oil. Stir in tomato sauce, pineapple juice, cornstarch and hot pepper sauce. Bring to boil, reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes more or until smooth and thickened. Add green pepper; cook 10 minutes more. Add orange and banana slices; heat gently. Serve immediately with rice tossed with raisins. Makes four to six servings.

To plump raisins, cover with boiling water and let stand about 10 minutes; drain thoroughly before combining with rice.

**Water Users
Vote Against
Moving Plan**

IDAHO FALLS, Idaho (AP)—Upper Snake River water users voted Monday to oppose any proposal to transport water from the Columbia River Basin to any other area.

Delegates to the Users' Protective Union annual meeting apparently were reacting to an endorsement Friday by California Public Works Director Samuel B. Nelson of a plan to divert water from the Snake River to the Colorado River.

Harold Nelson, of Boise, regional director of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, told the meeting "There is simply not enough water for diversion from the Snake River, after presently authorized or programmed projects are utilized."

Nelson formed a new attempt to divert Snake River water for southern California use the result of "faulty hydrology." "Someone has been doing some faulty research. Information in our files in 1964 demonstrated that diversion was impractical, and now it rises again," he said.

He said a report received by Commissioner of Reclamation Floyd Donihy showed de-salted sea water could be piped from an ocean site to Lake Mead (on the Colorado River) for about \$80 per acre foot.

"I have not performed any new extensive studies on the diversion proposal, but I feel confident that diversion costs from Idaho to southern California would exceed the \$80," Nelson declared.
