Nixon Depicts Contest

LEBANON, N.H. (AP) — With Gov. George Romney out of the New Hampshire presidential primary, Richard M. Nixon is endeavoring to depict the election as a contest between himself and President Johnson. Nixon closed a speech to a large audience in Lebanon by saying: "Go forth from this room and show the New Hampshire, says that it's time for Lyndon Johnson to go back to Texas and that as New Hampshire goes, so goes the nation."

The audience exploded with applause. Earlier, Nixon referred indirectly to Romney's withdrawal by saying, "Your votes still matter." He told the crowd, "The voters of the nation will be looking to New Hampshire, and the site of the vote on the Republican side will be measured against the size of the vote on the Democratic side."

Nixon took a certain amount of time to consider the registration, the New Hampshire primary can be held in 1968, or disapproval of the Johnson administration. Official 1968 New Hampshire registration figures showed 145,634 Republicans; 122,922 independents, and 87,490 Democrats.

The former vice president has said several times that he believes a "new coalition" is forming across the United States in which Democrats and independents are joining Republicans. Nixon returned to the theme of a Nixon-Johnson contest in an interview with the station in nearby Hanover, the site of Dartmouth College. He reminded the station's listeners that he had been in New Hampshire in 1960 and that Johnson won the state in 1964. Then he said: "In 1968, it will be very interesting to see whether Nixon or Johnson gets the bigger vote. (George) McCarthy, who will not, I believe, make too significant a showing, and my running mate, Gov. Romney, Rockefeller, assuming his write-in does materialize."

350 Attend Meet To Hear About Drugs

HEYBURN — Approximately 350 Minidoka County parents attended a film and discussion on the effects LSD and marijuana have on the body and brain Tuesday night at the Washington Junior High Auditorium. Report.

The meeting sponsored by the Idaho Narcotics Alcohol, Education Foundation Inc. was presented by Robert W. Hoag, Boise, executive director.

The foundation is made up of Idaho businessmen who incorporated 11 years ago as a non-profit organization to sponsor education concerning narcotics and alcohol to Idaho school students.

Mr. Hoag stressed parents knowing where their children are all the time and knowing who their friends are.

Police Chief Ed Culliv warned parents of an existing law stating that any vehicles towed by police containing narcotics will be impounded and sold. One vehicle in the county was recently disposed of by law officials.

Mr. Hoag said the biggest service to the youth is to help them maintain high standards. "You have to stay ahead of kids; they are sharp and will not accept a half truth," he said.

The purpose of the rehabilitation program is to save water lost by seepage and to rehabilitate the delivery facilities required for present day efficient operation of the system.  Using the upper 4.7 miles reach of the main canal, which concrete will substantially reduce seepage losses presently experienced. It is estimated that if this part is lined there will be about eight per cent increase in water delivery efficiency.
 In view of the existing facility improvements to access roads and construction of adequate control structures are definitely advantageous. Construction of concrete farm delivery structures would increase the accuracy and ease of regulating farm deliveries.
 Assistance through the Small Reclamation Project loan will permit the company to eliminate the major deficiencies in the water control and operation procedures, and would also conserve about 4,500 acre-feet annually which is now lost to seepage of which about 3,500 acre-feet will be available at the farm level.



Upjohn Co. Negotiating To Acquire Asgrow Seed

FILER—A major pharmaceutical maker is negotiating for the acquisition of Asgrow Seed Co., whose headquarters are located in Orange, Conn.

According to a recent Wall Street Journal report, the acquisition by the Upjohn Co. would be in an exchange of stock valued at \$20 million based on the price of Upjohn shares.

The Wall Street Journal reports that Upjohn says it would acquire Asgrow as a "strategic" move to expand into the agricultural field. Upjohn makes some agricultural fungicides and feed additives.

According to Corneils Vester, vegetable and seed production manager of Asgrow, the company grows and distributes

vegetable seeds to vegetable growers, and also produces bird seed corn and sorghum seed and some lawn and garden products.

Richard E. Filer, branch manager, says Asgrow will be a subsidiary of the Upjohn Co. if the acquisition is approved by stockholders of both companies, and will continue to

use the Asgrow trademark and name. "Upjohn is impressed with the trademark and what it stands for—Agriculture and Asgrow."

According to the Wall Street Journal, Upjohn says it would issue 400,000 common shares for Asgrow if the acquisition is completed. Upjohn has 14,228,043 shares outstanding.

A tentative agreement calls for the exchange of 0.28 Upjohn shares for each share of Asgrow held, Upjohn said. The agreement is subject to the approval of directors of both concerns and Asgrow shareholders.

Upjohn said shareholders of both companies will vote April 17 on the issue of the acquisition.

Deadline Nears For Wheat, Feed Grain Program Signup

Growers were reminded today that March 15 is the last day for filing applications to take part in the 1968 wheat and feed grain program.

Carl Boyd, chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee, points out that only growers who sign up and then participate in the program will be eligible for wheat certificate payments and for price support and diversion payments on 1968 crop corn. No acreage diversion is provided under the 1968 wheat program.

The national average price support loan rate for 1968 crop wheat is \$1.25 per bushel, available on all the wheat produced on a participating farm. The marketing certificates will be valued at the difference between full wheat parity and the \$1.25 per bushel national average loan value. The certificates will be available for the remainder of the projected production of the farm allotment. (For the 1967 wheat crop, domestic certificates were worth \$1.35 per bushel.)

The 1968 voluntary wheat program provides for: (1) Substitution of wheat for feed grains or feed grains for wheat by growers who participate in both programs; (2) wheat requested by the grower for the purpose of substitution, wheat the establishment of a barley base, and vocational agriculture instruction.

Farm operators are urged not to postpone filing program applications. As the deadline approaches, the county office is likely to be crowded and delays inevitable.

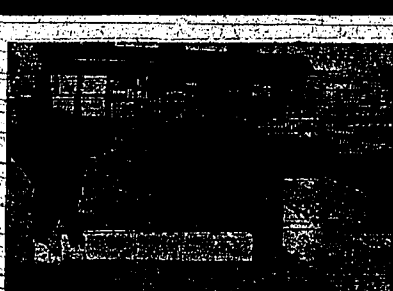
