U.N. Given Nuclear Treaty-Draft

WASHINGTON (AP) — William C. Foster, director of the United States Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, said today a nuclear nonproliferation treaty draft has just been placed in the hands of the United Nations.

He said that signing may be possible within two or three months.

Foster said he is happy to be able to say today that the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, which the 18-nation disarmament conference has just reported a complete nonproliferation draft text to the United Nations for consideration.

"I hope that, following U.N. consideration, the treaty will be open to signature some time in May or June."

Foster testified on the administration's request that the fiscal years 1969 through 1971. The House has already voted 241 to 161, to reduce this three-year authorization to two years and scale the appropriation to \$20 million.

Sen. J. Fulbright, D-Ark., committee chairman, asked Foster how much of a role his agency was given in recent months for decisions such as the one to proceed with a "thin" antiballistic missile defense system.

Sites Viewed For New Minidoka School

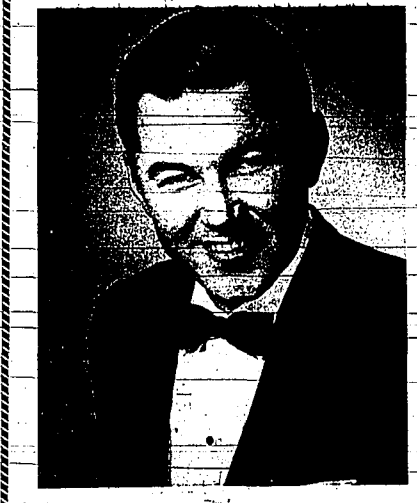

Employees Group Being Investigated

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House Committee on Un-American Activities is probing an organization of federal employees who oppose the U.S. role in Vietnam.

The group, "Federal Employees Against the War," has circulated a petition protesting the war. A spokesman said Monday more than 900 workers have signed the petition and added the signatures are collected during off-work hours.

"If such a thing is going on within the government itself, the country should be advised of the facts," said Chairman Edwin E. Willis, D-La., of the Committee on Un-American Activities.

Willis also said he is sponsoring a bill to give the President authority in time of war or armed conflict to suspend, and after a hearing, dismiss, certain government employees whose activities are judged to have increased the burdens of or endangered the lives of U.S. fighting men.

Sen. Edward W. Brooke, R-Mass., told newsmen in Los Angeles he thinks President Johnson might ask Congress for a declaration of war against North Vietnam.

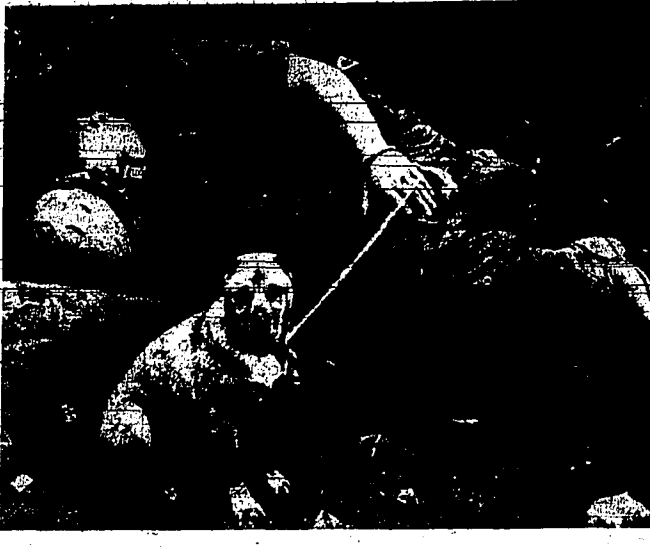
