

McCarthy Is Triumphant With 57 Per Cent In Wisconsin Primary

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (AP) — Democrat Eugene J. McCarthy, triumphant with 57 per cent of the vote in Wisconsin's prelude to battle, turned today toward the areas which pose the real test of his claim that he can win the White House.

Johnson got 25 per cent of the vote, but had announced Sunday he is not a candidate.

House votes are counted next Nov. 5. With 3,273 of 3,291 precincts counted, this was the Democratic picture: McCarthy 466,098 votes for 57 per cent of the party turnout; Johnson 202,818 for 25 per cent.

White House turned the Wisconsin campaign into a million-dollar exercise with no real contests.

Presumably, Johnson could later ask the delegates he won to support an active candidate, possibly Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, who is considered a possible successor to administration candidacy.

That issue was pinpointed in Madison, the university city which was a center of opposition to the war and support for McCarthy.

McCarthy didn't see it that way. "If he had not withdrawn, I think we probably would have gotten a heavier crossover of Republicans," he said.

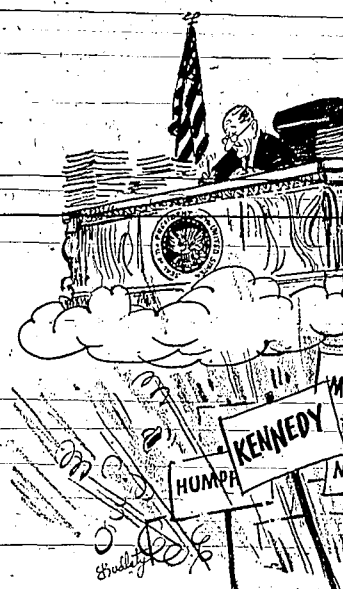

PARIS (AP) — President Charles de Gaulle today described the U.S. move to deescalate the war in Vietnam as "an act of reason and political courage."

In his first public comment on President Johnson's limitation of U.S. bombing of North Vietnam, De Gaulle called the move "a first step toward peace."

However, De Gaulle pointed out that the bombing halt was "neither general, nor unconditional." This seemed to be a reference to North Vietnamese conditions that all attacks on North Vietnam must cease before peace talks can begin.

Demos' Disunity Is Noted

WASHINGTON (AP) — The national disunity which President Johnson cited as the controlling factor in his withdrawal from the 1968 campaign extended far into the structure of his own Democratic Party.

An Associated Press survey carried out just ahead of the President's dramatic announcement, showed some 400—perhaps more—nominating convention votes that could be counted as at least probably anti-Johnson.

And there were eight audible rumblings or defections from Johnson by influential figures in states with enough national convention votes to knock Johnson forces down dangerously close to the 1½ required for nomination.

Some of those trouble sounds were only faint murmurs, but there was definitely no prospect of a great convention landslide.

Johnson in announcing his decision did not discuss such political mathematics. But it is likely that in measuring his problems, he employed his well-used political yardstick. The AP survey that produced the widespread showing of actual or potential Johnson opposition was not pinned to the chief executive's withdrawal. It was an outgrowth of a straight head count, before Johnson's Sunday announcement, of Democratic state chairmen. It showed a virtual solid front for Johnson among the chairmen.

Wallace Gets Few Votes In Wisconsin

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (AP) — George C. Wallace, the former Alabama governor campaigning for president as an independent, Wisconsin's presidential primary Tuesday.

Wallace had a scattering of votes in both party races. The count: Wallace received 3,250 Democratic votes and 1,393 of the Republican total.

With the vote hearing completion, the Wallace share did not amount to even one per cent in either party.

Four years ago, Wallace collected 34 per cent of the Democratic vote, naming himself the runner-up to John W. Reynolds, a stand-in for President Johnson.

Court Asked To Dismiss Ballot Suit

BOISE (AP) — Fourth District Court was asked Tuesday to dismiss a suit which a declaratory judgment in a lawsuit was asked to permit the removal of former Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace to be placed on Idaho's ballot in November's election.

Wallace's campaign workers filed the suit after Idaho Attorney Gen. Allan G. Shepherd said state law did not permit formation of any new political parties in Idaho. Wallace is running for president as an independent or third-party candidate.

Secretary of State Pete T. Coarussa is the defendant in the suit. The Tuesday motion was filed in his behalf by Asst. Atty. Gen. Dan Silvin.

The motion is the result of a declaratory judgment was based on a "hypothetical" situation and "abstract propositions."

The motion also contended that there was no cause for the action against the state because the request for the declaratory judgment was based on an anticipated controversy that "may never arise."

The suit was filed by Wallace, the American Independent Party in Idaho, and by Charles Griffin and A. Watson Connors.

FBI Investigates Accusation On Maritime Administration

WASHINGTON (AP) — The FBI has opened a criminal investigation into an accusation against the head of the Maritime Administration summoned 97 of his top-salary employees to a business-hours meeting and pressured them to contribute to the Democratic Party.

The charge was made last week to The Associated Press by a high-level employee of the agency who said Acting Administrator James W. Gulick held the meeting March 21 in a conference room near his office in the General Accounting Office building.

At the meeting, the employee said, Gulick told those present that each would have to decide for himself how to respond to invitations to a \$250-a-place Democratic fund-raising dinner, then pressed them to contribute to the Democratic Party.

"I would want to make sure that you have a nice, clean file and you can be sure that the file is kept somewhere you know what to do."

Such action would violate a federal law prohibiting a federal employee from soliciting political contributions from another federal employee on federal property, a Justice Department official told The Associated Press on Tuesday.

The FBI moved into the case Monday at the request of the Justice Department's Criminal Division, the official said. He declined to speculate on the length or outcome of the probe.

Gulick has acknowledged calling the meeting on March 21. He also said a second meeting was called the next day because "I heard of the possibility of a mis-undertaking. He denied how it was put any pressure on his employees to contribute to the dinner, scheduled for this Thursday.

"There was no pressure, no solicitation, and whatever they wanted to do was in accordance with their own circumstances and their own positions, Gulick said.

The source within the agency said, "The tone of Gulick's remarks was that I'm a nice guy and I'm not going to do anything to you (if you don't contribute) but . . . I've seen pressure before, but this was the worse I've ever run into," he added.

Each of the 97 employees called to the meeting had a pay-grade scale of GS-3, earning \$18,400 and up. Each had received either through the mail or from a superior, an invitation to the dinner.

MAN SENTENCED MOUNTAIN HOME

Asarco Co. announced a similar price increase last week.



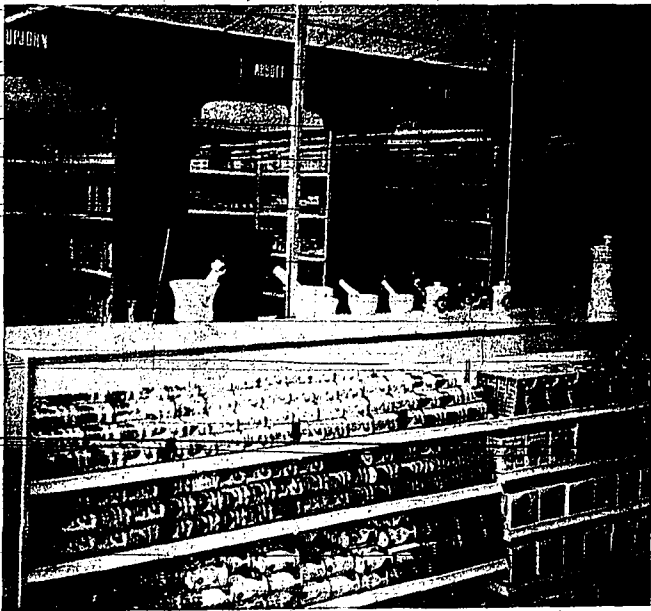

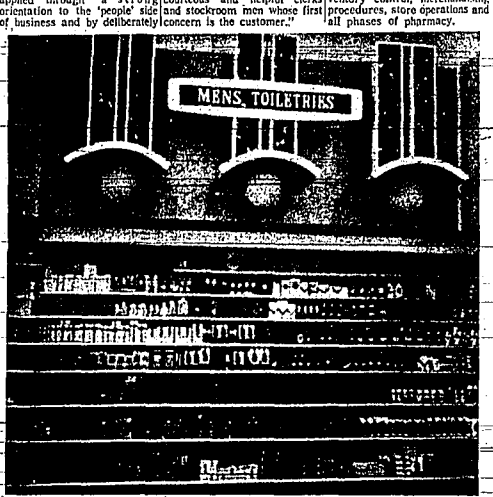

Anticorruption Youth Group Is Having Its Problems

SAIGON (AP) — A youth group whose 3,000 members are supposed to expose fraud and corruption is having trouble. Its top leaders have been arrested for fraud and corruption.

The blacklisted Anticorruption Youth was founded in 1965 by Vice President Nguyen Cao Ky, who was then premier and premier. The organization is still under his wing, and he is reported greatly angered that only 200 members worked for the leaders fell into his hands.

Those arrested March 14 were Dang Van Thu, national chief of the organization; Le Van Kha, inspector general of the group, who once was associated with a student group that tried to depose Ky when he was premier; and Le Van Thanh, head of Anticorruption Youth in Gia Dinh Province.

Unclear is whether the draft exemption cards were valid, which would mean "complexity of government officials or whether they were forgeries."

There are other charges against the youth group. Early in January the Ministry of Youth was ordered by some unidentified official-high in the government to investigate the group.

Farmers Urged To Spray For Poison Hemlock

Farmers and ranchers in Twin Falls County were urged Monday by County Weed Director Wallace Savage to spray immediately for the control of livestock poisoning hemlock.

Mr. Savage said there have been several cattle deaths recently, including one last week near Rock Creek, which has definitely been traced to poison hemlock. At this time the weed is at its most dangerous stage for livestock, he said, and it is at the stage where it can be sprayed effectively by 2,4-D.

Mr. Savage urged farmers to spray ditchbanks and creek bed areas where the weed is inclined to grow, especially if these areas are being used by livestock for grazing.

Additional information and assistance is available from the local weed bureau, he said.

KINGS SQUEEZED AUTOMATICALLY

If you think counting bidding decisions suddenly is crazy, the answer is that North's four-club bid and South's four-diamond reply show the Gebler convention in operation.

Therefore, North settled for six no-trump and set back happily to watch his partner play the hand. South was an expert in a hurry. He counted quickly to 12 and might well have just spread his hand and claimed six but, "hurry" or "no hurry," South was an expert and all experts bear in mind that a no-trump over-lick is 30 points and that those 30 points add up to you get them continually.

Therefore, South did show his hand but he announced, "Seven if the squeeze develops; otherwise I'll just take six."

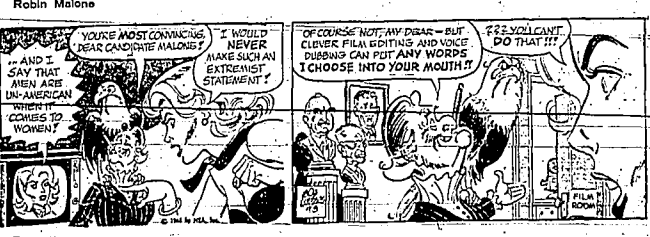
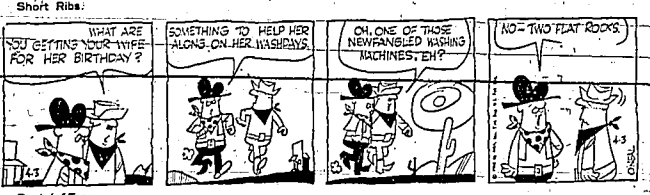
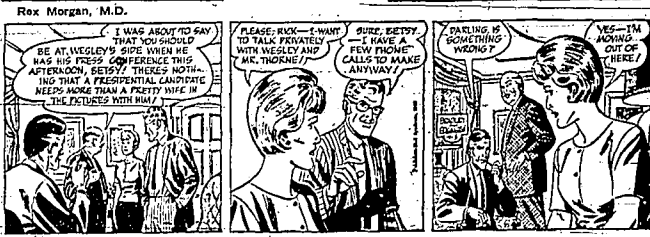
West was also an expert in a hurry. He looked at South's hand and said, "Seven."

If you don't see how South makes seven, you should be able to see it. It is an automatic squeeze that South must fall into if he runs off his club and diamond. South will come down to ace-jack of hearts while North will hold the jack of spades and five of hearts and West won't be able to protect both suits. Of course, West could have opened the king-of-hearts and broken the squeeze, but West wasn't clairvoyant.

Snowpack Remains Below Average On Area Watershed

Snowpack on courses of the Roseworth-Salmon Tract watershed remains well below the 10-year average, officials of the Twin Falls Soil Conservation District reported Tuesday following the April snow measurements.

Soil moisture, they found, is about the same as a month ago, but most of the snow has now melted below the 7,600-foot elevation.

Measurements were made by helicopter by Ellis Fuller, John Pastoor, soil conservation district representatives, and by slides on the Magic Mountain Course by John Pastoor, Lynn Schukler, of the conservation district and Archie Lindsay, U.S. Forest Service.
