CSI Duns Counties For Delinquent Fees

College of Southern Idaho trustees have taken an attempt in advising area counties that the college is not in a position to "operate on a credit basis" and have insisted that tuition bills from the various counties be kept current.

Students from counties which are delinquent in their tuition payments will be required to personally pay the full non-resident tuition upon enrollment.

Which revert from the state back to the counties, and up to a three-month period. Of the two counties whose payments are still delinquent for the second semester, one owes only \$1,150. This amount has not been paid, apparently because of a misunderstanding in the interpretation of the law.

It also was pointed out that these delinquencies are for this semester. Each area county was billed Feb. 15 and was expected to make payments by the meeting of their respective county commissioners.

Zap Missile Being Made By Navy

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy is moving swiftly toward production of a new weapon nicknamed the Zap missile. To bolster U.S. capabilities for beating down North Vietnamese antiaircraft guns. The Zap is an acronym for zero antiaircraft potential. Details of the missile's planned capabilities are closely guarded but work is far enough along that officials are being allowed to discuss generally its mission. The Zap, sources said, will be a solid-fueled "hypervelocity" rocket that will fly at speeds around 2,600 miles per hour and detonate with shattering effect over enemy fire sites. Within two years the missile is expected to go aboard Navy fighter-bombers and may also be used by the Air Force. Industry expectations are that production of the Zap will soar to several hundred thousand per year by about 1972 with annual spending of about \$50 million. "We will be the first to plaster the ground with this thing," one officer said. Zap will have a conventional explosive warhead of unspecified size designed to go off just before it hits the ground with a special high-fragmentation effect. The weapon's fantastic speed is critical to the mission. With Zap the pilot of a 1,400-m.p.h. Phantom jet, for example, will be able to launch his weapon almost point-blank at an enemy target while zooming at supersonic speed. "What that ensures called the missile's "instantaneous acceleration" there will be no danger the pilot might overtake his own weapon in flight. Instances of planes being shot down by their own missiles have occurred.

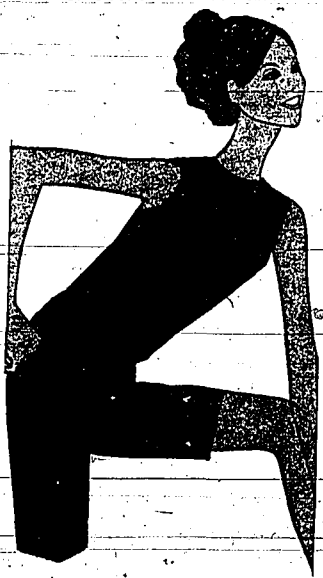
At the same time, with Zap's new discerning warhead the pilot won't have to be too concerned with precise targeting. Looking at it from the standpoint of a Navy pilot assigned to knock out an antiaircraft site in advance of a bombing raid, the officer explained: "I'll be beating down the flak not only for the boys behind you, but for yourself."

Negro's Best Path

The latest orgy of rioting in America's cities accomplished as much for either the short-term or long-term welfare of their inhabitants as did the Viet Cong's assaults against the cities of South Vietnam. And that is nil.
For just as the Tet offensive failed to set off a popular uprising that would overthrow the Saigon government, kick out the Americans and pave the way for a Hanoi-dictated peace...

The likes of Stokely Carmichael capitalizes on this tragedy to further his gospels of hate, and while some whites used the ensuing riots as justification for continued racial segregation, many other Americans found a deeper, truer meaning in King's martyrdom.
At memorial services in Cleveland, a white man approached a Negro. "You don't know me," he said, "but I'd like to stand beside you." They did stand together, arm linked in arm, throughout the program.
This may not mean much. The two men went their separate ways, the one to his wife's job, his white friends, his white neighborhood, the other to his black counterparts. They probably will never meet again.

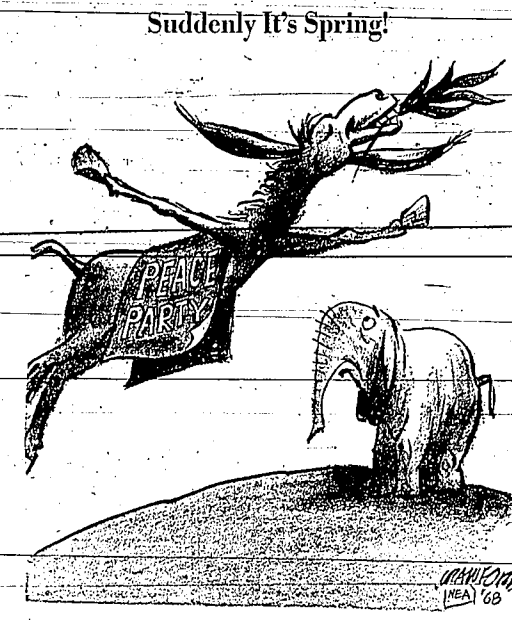
A Prayer For Peace

WASHINGTON — One of the main reasons why the New Breed of political police administrators seems to regard us merely as a job, is that they are not interested in the nation's capital as that every bleeder who can be pricked out of the woodwork is found there to occupying the Pentagon.
For example, the city's new manpower training center — a job, Corps outfit transferred from Nebraska — was hurriedly opened one week ahead of schedule, and politicians of the Bobby Kennedy kind are demanding the spending of new billions to educate and employ the more underprivileged Negroes.
This upsurge reeks with irony when studied alongside a survey made by the Washington Post of the first 110 persons arrested for looting here. The Post found that only 13 of these persons, or a mere 10 per cent, were unemployed, and that the typical suspect was 29 years old, had attended 11 grades of school, and had a job paying \$245 a week. More than half of them were married, a statistic that casts doubt on the argument that teenage hoodlums were the principal culprits.

An interviewer from the D. C. Bail Agency described most of the nearly 1000 persons arrested for looting as "an amazingly respectable crowd." It is curious indeed to apply to rioters, but it is also revealing. It is a far cry from the picture of the amateur sociologists that only despoil people loot stores and set fires.
The National Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders offered a profile of the rioter in the country last summer, as a young, single Negro male, 15 to 24, who dropped out of high school after one or two years.
Washington's looter bears little resemblance to the profile. The 110 studied included five Howard University students, a Virginia Seminary freshman, a three-year-old estate agent, a United Brotherhood Organization counselor, an apartment house manager, and an assistant librarian.
They included a 40-year-old assistant cook and church deacon and a 35-year-old government mechanic with five children. Most of the school dropouts were "runners" — 22 of the 26 arrested on April 21, only six had not finished high school. Twenty-seven others had attended college and two were college graduates.
Eleven of the suspects were members of the Federal Reserve, five of them for the Post Office, which is considered a "status" employer in the Negro community.

Viet Cong Are Red Terrorists

NEW YORK — The Communists, as usual, will seek to gain at the negotiating table the victory that eluded them on the battlefield.
Their basic aim is to subvert and destroy the fragile Saigon regime. Their strategy, to take over South Vietnam by including the Viet Cong terrorists—the so-called National Liberation Front—in "revolutionary government."
Tragically, two leading Democratic contenders for the presidency, Sen. Eugene McCarthy and Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, went on record, supporting Ho Chi Minh's "solution."
In violation of all the rules of diplomacy, Kennedy, it seems, wants to make this crucial concession to the Communists' even before the real bargaining starts.
Kennedy sees the Viet Cong despite "his brutal acts of terrorism"—a "powerful force of Vietnamese nationalism." They must be granted a role in Vietnam's political life, he told crowds of cheering youngsters.

President Johnson also has made it clear that to achieve peace, he is prepared to negotiate with the Viet Cong, among others.
But the President will negotiate with the Communists because they are behind the student rioting and anti-

Russian agitation in Poland and Czechoslovakia.
Kennedy's view of the Viet Cong as nationalists is a sad reminder of the tragic debacle in 1949 and 1953.
In 1949, self-proclaimed liberals in the State Department regarded Mao Tse-tung as a nationalist and "agrarian reformer."
Top American diplomat was horrified when this writer spoke in Havana in 1959 that Fidel Castro was a Communist. "He was drawn in," the diplomat exclaimed. "He is a nationalist. He is the George Washington of Cuba."
Now it is Ho Chi Minh—a lifelong agent of the Red International, trained in Moscow, and the real boss of the Viet Cong—who is described by some liberals as the "George Washington of Vietnam."
To be sure, Communist propagandists, when it serves their purpose, seek to inflame and exploit the nationalist feelings in Asia, Africa and Latin America as a force against the free world.
They are also exploiting nationalism in the Middle East.
But surely men who aspire to high public office should know the difference between true nationalism and communism.

McCarthy: A Rockier Road

WASHINGTON (NEA)—When Wisconsin winners Sen. Eugene McCarthy and his followers break off their celebrating their understandable state of euphoria, they will find that their New Hampshire showing may begin to diminish. The hard challenges are all ahead.
In a little more than a month, on May 7 in Indiana's presidential primary, McCarthy has his first head-to-head encounter with his late-starting rival, Sen. Robert F. Kennedy. Thereafter there follow a series of other contests in Nebraska, Oregon and California.
Indiana looks very tough for McCarthy, complicated for both him and Kennedy by the presence of a pro-administration state senator, Gov. Roger Branigan, originally a stand-in for President Johnson.
Oregon and Nebraska are farther prospects right now, but it is hard to tell whether the late primary states will accept both McCarthy and Kennedy.

The Californian's biggest concern seemed to be that logic had not been paying too much of a role in recent political events.
McCarthy's 57 per cent of the Wisconsin vote on the Democratic ticket was impressive, though President Kennedy's two days earlier had declared his intent not to run for reelection.
Some labor leaders had forecast an even bigger McCarthy edge. It is not clear whether the "nationalist" element were behind the state made too deep a dent in their thinking, or whether they were simply oversteering the outlook to salvage some face for Johnson, whom they were backing but not helping greatly.
Fundamentally, the Wisconsin outcome went according to the late book, since McCarthy's triumph was widely forecast. With Johnson's pull-out, there evidently were far fewer Republican crossover to McCarthy than had been expected.

Nixon ran up 29 per cent of the total GOP vote, identical with his New Hampshire showing. His closest rival was Gov. Ronald Reagan, of California, whose 11 per cent fell exactly within the 10 to 15 per cent range predicted for him by Nixon men.
They also hoped Nixon's total would be close to 35-40 per cent of the general primary total. It reached just 31 per cent, but that was three points better than had been expected.
The candidate who gets around 80 per cent of his party's vote even in virtually no-contest states is not faltering. Many Republican party leaders may still have doubts about Nixon's electability. But they cannot doubt his present high momentum.

The Deep Change

(Editor's Note: Mr. Marlow is this column's Associated Press writer.)
WASHINGTON (AP) — Down the mall from the bright huble of the Capitol dome to the brooding figure in the Lincoln Memorial, Washington looks the same. But a deep change has taken place.
A city that had been slowly hardening into two separate cities, one white and one Negro, has been made scarily aware of it. How it reacts to this awareness may hold an answer for other cities afflicted with racial troubles.
One answer is carefully planned response to looting and burning may be able to achieve results without the bloodshed and violence that marked last summer's riots in Newark and Detroit.
In the early stages of the disorders in the capital, the outnumbered police were without the bloodshed and violence that they would not have to resort to gunfire to protect themselves. They were forced merely by with restraint against the looters and to curb violators by fire hoses.
The result was a minimum of deaths and injuries—and a great deal of money. The reform of the District of Columbia police and the troops has been a far-reaching one. Ramsey Clark and it is likely to set a pattern for the police in other cities.
It was an encouraging sign in the immediate response of the white community to the despair the black community indicated in their ill-tempered reaction.

A—A hand diet omits pepper, mustard, horseradish, vinegar, citrus and sweeteners. It also omits, but it should contain a minimum of roughage—a raw fruit or vegetable. A diet with a small amount of pure vegetable or fruit is sometimes allowed. A reducing diet omits most but not all of what's left. That excludes alcohol, especially beer and other products that give 25 calories per serving and still supply all the nutrients. Q—is it beneficial or harmful to take a little nap after a meal? Could it cause obesity? A—Yes, a nap after the noon or evening meal is an excellent restorative for both muscle and mind. Obesity will not be caused by a nap after a meal. Obesity will be caused by the food you eat. Q—What foods should be avoided to reduce cholesterol? A—The acidity of any food in your body depends on its ash or residue when it is fully consumed. Foods of any kind help to alkalize your system. The foods to avoid are meats (except crabmeats), cherries and rhubarb in spite of the fact that they contain a weak acid and have a low residue. Other foods to avoid are, you should cut down on, but not eliminate from your diet, are butter, salt, meat, corn, peanuts and sweets.

"The auxiliary unit at Hogan Well was started and warmed up ready to be put into service in case the electricity went off. However, the auxiliary unit did not have to be used. There were additional wells which could have been turned on if they were needed for additional water," the mayor said.

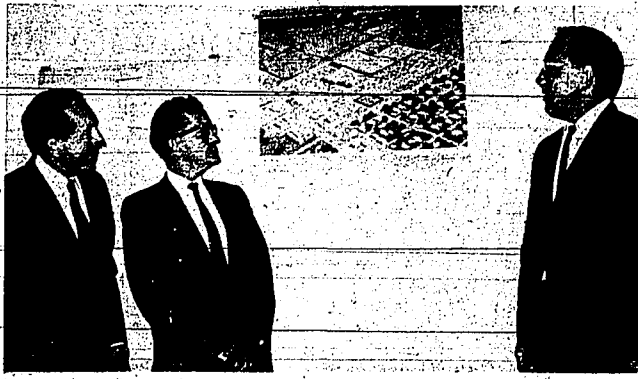
"I hope this clears up the rumor on the water situation during the recent fire," he added.

The Idaho Rating Fire Bureau, Boise, officials were in Burley following the Overland Shopping Center fire and reported to Oils Williams, fire chief, that with the water system in Burley the area-northern No. 6 could be rated between 4 and 5 for insurance rates.

In the last two years, seven and one half miles of water pipe have been laid to upgrade the water system, and 18 fire hydrants have been installed, and many small lines have been replaced with larger lines. This gives almost a complete circulation water system where water can be drawn from another area of town if needed, it was reported.

Special thanks were extended to the fire department, and to firemen from neighboring towns for assisting at the huge Overland Shopping fire.

Burley has six full-time firemen plus the fire chief, and the rest of the firemen are volunteers.

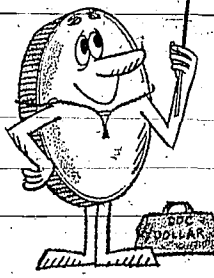

YOUTH SESSION SET

Reagan Going To Make Assessment

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — Gov. Ronald Reagan "will be 'Obviously, I'm going to try and make an assessment' after hearing a report by a Republican political strategist that there is growing grassroots support across the country for a Reagan presidential bid."

"I'm certainly not going to run away and pretend it isn't happening," Reagan told a news conference Tuesday. He outlined a new speaking tour for the Midwest, South and Hawaii starting April 23.

A report prepared by F. Clifford White, a former Barry Goldwater aide now advising Republican "convention" delegates in California, was discussed by Reagan.

"There seems to be an increase in the grassroots movement in my behalf," Reagan said. He said he still considers himself only a favorite son candidate but acknowledged that an approaching tour will make it more difficult to convince people that he is not a presidential candidate.

Reagan said, however, he refuses to "get frightened into staying home and not doing what I can for a cause that I believe is very important because, frankly, I don't believe this country can afford four more years of the lack of leadership that we have had under the other party."

The former actor, in his first term as California's governor, said he would meet with Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York and three other Republican governors to discuss the party platform.

Reagan will act as host to Rockefeller and Gov. Raymond P. Shafer of Pennsylvania, John Love of Colorado and John Chafee of Rhode Island at a meeting May 8 in San Francisco.

Poll of 80 Editors Shows Majority Predicting Humphrey-Nixon Contest

WASHINGTON (AP) — A poll of 80 newspaper editors shows a majority predicting a contest between Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey and former Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

The poll, conducted by the American Society of Newspaper Editors' annual convention, showed 53 percent of editors favoring Humphrey and 47 percent favoring Nixon.

Humphrey, still silent on his political plans, was stamped an incumbent administration party following backing from labor and solid support in the South.

"I think the organization will take it in the end. It usually does," said H. P. Nicoll, editor of the Cincinnati Enquirer, credited Humphrey with labor support.

Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy, D-Minn., like Kennedy a declared candidate for the Democratic nomination, didn't receive a single vote in the sampling.

On the Republican side, Nixon found a majority predicting the only declared GOP candidate was a prohibitive favorite over such potential challengers as New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and Gov. Ronald Reagan of California.

Those picking Humphrey credited him with the advantages of an incumbent administration party following backing from labor and solid support in the South.

Humphrey Strategists Grapple With Problem

WASHINGTON (AP) — With Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey's political strategy strength rising, his delegates are grappling with the problem of how to win the Democratic presidential nomination without New York or California.

The two biggest states together cast 36 of the 1,112 votes needed for nomination at the August convention in Chicago, which Humphrey's strategists believe offers him the best chances of getting more than a handful of free votes in the early balloting are considered negligible.

There is some talk of an effort to swing to Humphrey a California state of candidates put together for President Johnson under the leadership of State Atty.-Gen. Thomas C. Lynch. But Democratic National Committee member Am Alabon has balked at such an arrangement.

In New York, Humphrey's backers expect to pick up scattered support in a 19-state caucus which now is being conducted by Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, D-N.Y., as the base for an effort to blitz the convention into nominating him.

While his delegate hunters are working the field, Humphrey has postponed until next week, and possibly later, any formal announcement of his candidacy. The belief among his strategists is that there is no hurry about giving up his status as a non-candidate. Wes Gallagher, general manager of The Associated Press, called Frings' widow that her husband "dies many of others of the profession of journalism who have given their lives in peace and war so that the public could be kept informed."

Police said earlier they had arrested 21-year-old Rainer Gohs, who was suspected of throwing the stone from behind a bush in a dark park.

Aslet Construction Co. of Twin Falls was the apparent low bidder on a \$100,000 resurfacing project on Interstate 15 from Bassett to the Bonneville-Bingham County line.

An offer by Kimberly Construction Co. of Kimberly was the apparent low bidder on a construction and surfacing project on the Elkhorn Dam extension between the dam and Daniels' Kennedy Paving Co. of Idaho Falls apparently outbid another firm for the construction in three separate paving projects: \$84 miles of U. S. 101 on Henrys Lake Flat; five miles of Idaho 81 between Mack's Inn and Big Springs; and nine miles on Idaho 87 from U. S. 101 to Reynolds Pass.

Educational TV Network Plans Okayed

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Plans for a study of possible creation of a multi-state educational television network were approved Thursday by directors of the Federation of Rocky Mountain States.

A two-day meeting of the federation adjourned Tuesday after calling on the National Educational Television network to extend and improve its service to Moscow, Idaho; Las Vegas, Nev.; and Logan, Utah.

In another resolution, the federation appealed to the Interstate Commerce Commission to include an "equitable formula" in any freight rate increases allowed, instead of the flat percentage sought by railroads.

The federation asked for congressional support in implementation of a Rocky Mountain States transportation plan, recognizing "the need for improved north-south services."

Earlier, the federation adopted a resolution approving efforts "to explore the possibilities and practicalities of a plan for solving water supply problems of the 17 western states and western Canada."

The federation heard a proposal by Lewis C. Smith, a Denver engineer, for transporting water from the Great Slave Lake in Canada's Northwest Territories.

The \$75 billion project would divert water to all of the western United States. The water would be transported across the border via the Columbia River system and distributed to the Salmon, Snake, Green, Colorado, Missouri, Rio Grande and other rivers in the West.

The federation on Monday admitted Nevada to membership. Other members are Idaho, Utah, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana and New Mexico.

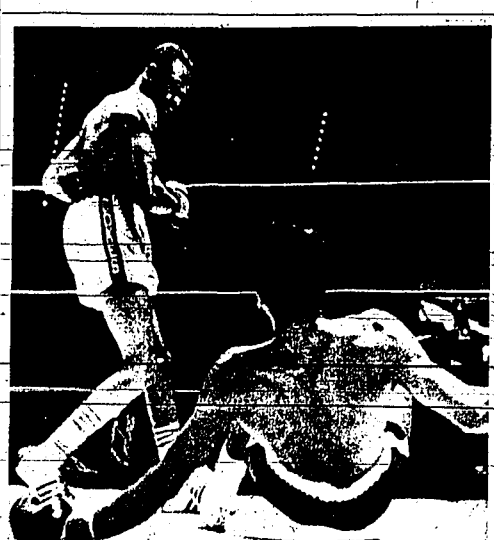
