Youthful Senator Remains Critical With Head Wound; Assailant Held

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A gunman shot down Sen. Robert F. Kennedy today moments after he proclaimed victory in California's Democratic presidential primary election. After more than three hours of surgery for removal of a bullet from his brain he was in "extremely critical condition."

Doctors said one bullet struck near the right ear and entered the brain. Another hit in the shoulder. The third apparently grazed his forehead. Kennedy's press aide said after the surgery that no further effort is planned for removal of the remaining bullet fragments. Some fragments of the bullet and bone went to the center of the brain, the brain stem, he said, and the eyes—but not the thinking processes.

Kennedy was moved, unconscious, to the hospital's intensive care unit. Police set about immediately trying to reconstruct the shooting about 3 hours and 40 minutes.

Officers said they believe there was only one man involved. The man being questioned, they booked him as "John Doe" on suspicion of assault with intent to commit murder. The man under arrest was seen in the crowd directly behind John Doe and ball was set at \$250,000. Police had earlier booked him on suspicion of assault with intent to commit murder. The arraignment was on six such counts.

NEW YORK (AP) — Neurosurgeon Dr. J. Lawrence Pool, Wednesday quoted Dr. Henry Cuneo, one of three surgeons who operated on Robert F. Kennedy, as telling him by telephone, "He might not make it. There is a real chance of his recovery."

Kennedy was taken to Good Samaritan Hospital near downtown Los Angeles. There a team of six surgeons began brain surgery at 3:12 a.m. that lasted for about 3 hours and 40 minutes.

Hearing On U.S. Trade Continues

WASHINGTON (AP) — The chief U.S. trade negotiator faces another barrage of congressional questions as to whether he has been tough enough in bargaining away special restrictions on export of U.S. goods to Europe and Japan.

The House Ways and Means Committee, conducting hearings on the whole range of foreign trade, recalled Ambassador William M. Roth as its sole witness today. He shared the stand Tuesday with other high ranking administration officials.

Several members concentrated on Roth with questions about weight taxes that make big U.S. cars especially costly in Europe and restrictions set by Japan on many American goods. Rep. James Burke, D-Mass., told the ambassador the saturation point has been reached in import of footwear. "Watch out," Burke said. "Your whole trade program may go down the drain."

Mrs. Beck observed her 100th birthday anniversary Wednesday at Hazel Del Manor with friends. Her birthday anniversary was observed late last week by her family with a special dinner, birthday cake and gifts.

Attending were Mr. and Mrs. J. Will Beck, Murtaugh, Mrs. Beck's son and daughter-in-law; Mr. and Mrs. Paul Beck, a grandson and his wife; Mr. and Mrs. Horace Holmes, parents of Mrs. Paul Beck and Flo Aarning, a friend and former nurse, and several members of the Hazel Del staff.

Mrs. Beck came to Twin Falls in 1857 following the death of her daughter, and resided with her son and daughter-in-law until ill health forced her to move to Hazel Del. She was one of the first residents to move into the new Hazel Del building and has been there since that time.

Mrs. Beck's parents traveled down the Ohio river more than 100 years ago and before the days of railroad in Ohio. They settled in Southern Indiana about five miles from the river and developed a small farm. Mary Gestring Beck was born June 5, 1868, and spent her early life on the farm near Clyde, Ind.

On Sept. 23, 1886, she married Joseph Beck and they farmed near the farm of her parents.

Mrs. Beck is the mother of two children. A daughter, Mrs. Elsie B. King died in Colorado in 1887. In addition to her son, J. Will Beck—Murtaugh—and grandson Paul Beck, Twin Falls, she has a granddaughter, Mary Helen Jenkins, Colorado Springs, Colo., and seven great grandchildren.

During World War I, Mrs. Beck was active in Red-Cross work. She enjoyed raising flowers, and until just recently was able to read much of the time. Her family reports she enjoys reasonably good health but is frail and requires a great deal of rest.

America Seen As Place Of Politics And Rat Race

LONDON (AP) — Viewed through various foreign eyes the United States is a place where life is a rat race, "new politics" is an expensive version of the old variety and British tourists may run into financial difficulty.

"Life in the United States of America, in fact, is a veritable rat race and only those who can stand the pace make it to the top," Malaysian-Finance-Minister Tan Siew Sin told a financial management seminar in Kuala Lumpur.

"Whatever may be the shortcomings of the mightiest and richest nation in the world, we must at least admit that they work hard from the very top downwards," Tan said.

In an Associated Press sampling of foreign opinion, a warning to Britons thinking of visiting America came from Ivor Key, New York correspondent of the London Daily Express.

"Don't come," he wrote. "Unless you have a friend or relative to stay with."

Key said two plane-loads of British tourists in New York recently had trouble getting by on the \$16 their government allowed each of them for a 15-day holiday.

"Before setting off, they were told by an airline that if they stayed in a modest hotel they would have about \$5 a day to live on, and might even be able

to afford a boat trip around Manhattan and ride up the Empire State Building, but with hamburgers and the cheapest sandwich costing 84 cents and a glass of beer 60 cents they are cutting their budget a bit fine," he wrote.

"One of them insisted on taking an American friend for a few drinks and dinner at a modest restaurant. It cost him \$30 and almost broke him for the rest of the trip."

Peter Jenkins, covering the American presidential campaign for the British newspaper Guardian, discussed the new politics.

"There does seem to be some desire for greater political participation and it may grow within a few years half the population of America is going to be aged under-25," Jenkins wrote.

"All of the candidates are conscious of a situation of changing political patterns and are staking out special claims to the shifting elements. But it's far too simple, and almost certainly not true, to see this as a struggle of the people against the politicians. It looks more like a struggle between one set

of politicians and another, between the 'outs' and the 'ins' and there is nothing very novel about that.

"What are called the 'new politics' strike the observer as very much like the old politics practice."

"God help us," said a GI in Vietnam. "What the hell is going on back there?"

"I feel just like the last time," said another, referring to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Princess Lee Radziwill said she had spoken to her sister, President Kennedy's widow, but "she tells me the news is pretty confused so far."

Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy was at her New York Fifth Avenue home when the shooting of her brother-in-law occurred.

She was not available for comment.

News of the shooting caused "acute sorrow" at the Vatican, the chief press official there said.

He said Pope Paul VI was being kept informed constantly of the condition of the senator, who is a Roman Catholic.

"It's a nightmare—it's terrible," said a Russian woman on a Moscow street.

"It is a great pity that you live in such a country where any person can be shot," a Russian man told an American in the Soviet capital.

Tass, the official news agency, reported the shooting briefly and without comment.

Italian President Giuseppe Saragat expressed shock and dismay and told the Italian Embassy in Washington to keep him constantly informed of Kennedy's condition. Aides termed the shooting "a nefarious and vile attempt."

The news reached Europeans first by radio and television broadcasts. News agency offices were besieged by telephone calls. First editions of London afternoon papers spread the news in huge black type across their front pages.

"This is horrible, horrible," said a spokesman for the Swiss government in Bern, where the cabinet was meeting when the news broke.

"The same thing all over again," said a diplomat in Bern. "Horrid, horrid."

Army Tells Of Damage To Center

TOOELE, Utah (AP) — The Army disclosed Tuesday that winds a week ago leveled two dozen storehouses and damaged 30 others in the Desert chemical storage area of the Tooele Army Depot.

A. T. Roberts, post-information officer, said the buildings were empty. He said the Army has 100 million pounds in concrete warehouses and underground igloos and these were not damaged in the May 29 windstorm.

The windblown buildings were made of aluminum. "They were no good to us standing and they're no loss to us now," Roberts said.

The Tooele Army Depot is located about 35 miles southwest of Salt Lake City, not far from the Dugway Proving Ground where chemical warfare tests are conducted.

"There's no way of knowing how many buildings were blown," Roberts said.

William T. Chapman, chief meteorologist at the Weather Bureau in Salt Lake City, said the Army did not report the damage to his office.

"We didn't think it was worthy of reporting," the information officer said.

Roberts said the demolished and damaged buildings were called "transitory shelters" by the Army, constructed in the late 1940s for the now disbanded Chemical Warfare Service.

Some 250 of the storehouses remain standing in the Desert area, he said.

A work party will be held at the site at 6 p.m. Monday. Since the arena will benefit the community, community help is being sought by the committee.

The Rodeo association and the Buhl Jaycees will combine efforts this year for an even bigger Sagebrush days celebration than in the past on June 28-30. The tentative schedule of events includes special promotions by the merchants, a rodeo-all three evenings at parade, an adult and teenage dance, free barbecue, and carnival and concession stands.
