Rep. George Hansen Opens Headquarters

"Open season on doves" started, Sept. 1," Rep. George Hansen quipped Monday during his talk at the opening of Twin Falls County Republican Headquarters in Twin Falls.

He was accompanied by his wife, Connie, to whom he attributed the "dove remark," and Pete Cenarrusa, secretary of state.

Rep. Hansen used the occasion to launch a hard-hitting attack on his opponent's voting record.

He said Sen. Frank Church has voted for \$30 billion in foreign aid and the only time he has voted against such programs was last year.

Rep. Hansen slammed Sen. Church for his stand on banning the bombing in Vietnam. He pointed out what a bombing pause had done in the past and said it wasn't worth the loss to allies.

He said, although Sen. Church may have talked about the gun control measures earlier, "it was the first to do something." Rep. Hansen said he made his stand in the House in 1965 and it was two years later when Sen. Church "did something."

"How can you trust a man with Idaho's water when he was willing to give away all the ocean floor resources to the United Nations?" Rep. Hansen asked. He pointed to this as another of the Senator's proposed giveaways. "My opponent was willing to give away all this without really realizing what is there."

Mr. Hansen also hit Sen. Church for his support of the nuclear non-proliferation treaty. "We still don't know where he stands on the ABE Fortias case," Rep. Hansen said. "We know where Len Jordan stands and it seems that there should be one man qualified to have that position (Supreme Court Justice) that wouldn't stir this much controversy."

Rep. Hansen called his opponent "a big spender."

"We cannot afford his type of representation," Hansen said.

The senatorial aspirant said, if elected, he would strive for positions on the agriculture committee and the joint atomic committee.

He said Sen. Church has only served on two major committees and pointed out that Sen. Jordan, with less seniority, is serving on four.

In concluding his speech, Rep. Hansen complimented the Republicans for their "teamwork." He asked for their continued help and support.

Earlier a telegram of support from Sen. Len Jordan was read. Following Rep. Hansen's appearance, State Sen. Orval Hansen, Republican candidate for Congress, paid a visit to the headquarters.

State Sen. Hansen said, "A complete change in national leadership with the election of Richard Nixon as President offers the best hope for bringing the war in Vietnam to an honorable end."

"The Administration's Vietnam policy has been a failure," State Sen. Hansen said. "For the past four years the present administration has had greater military and economic advantage than any nation has ever had over another. But, such military, economic, diplomatic power has never been used so ineffectively."

"American young men have fought with great courage and thousands have died," the senator noted. "Yet after all of this time and all of this sacrifice, there is still no end in sight."

"The time has come for the American people to turn to new leadership that is not the captive of mistakes and policies of the past," State Sen. Hansen declared. "It is time for America to adopt a policy that will prevent more Vietnam."

State Sen. Hansen made campaign stops in Jerome and Rupert Tuesday morning before heading to Boise for Richard Nixon's appearance.

Other proposals, all of which must be voted upon by the full council and next year's legislature, included county- or local-option extension of liquor hours from 1 to 2 a.m. and limited Sunday sales.

Hubert's Just Not Ornery Enough

WASHINGTON — It seems incredible in an era when the air is filled with caterwauling about the urgency of succeeding the deprived, but Hubert Humphrey just may not be mean enough to be elected President.

What Frank Roosevelt once called "that touch of the SOB indispensable to the national politician." We are assured by their critics, and even by some of their supporters, that both Dick Nixon and George Wallace are satisfactorily ornery. But, Hubert

Many an actual or borderline alcoholic refuses to admit that a drinking problem exists. Yet when a person becomes dependent on alcohol, whether he drinks a lot or not so much, he is still an alcoholic in the true sense of the word.

Yes, within limits, for everything except the beer. Avoid that in-your-face attitude of "I'm not over the limit causes distress. This is a vigorous exercise program for a person with congestive heart disease.

Official Asks Water Shift From Arctic

EDMONTON, Alta. (AP)—A United States water authority said Monday a portion of 180 million acre-feet of water flowing into the Arctic could be diverted to Canadian provinces and the U.S. for municipal and industrial purposes. Lewis G. Smith of Denver, Colo., said the water could be stored in a huge storage reservoir in southern Montana, then shipped to needy areas in the Western United States. Smith and J. R. Bingham, an executive director of the Western States Water Council, were discussing the idea with Edmonton trustees, provincial and civic government officials. The scheme, to divert water from the Mackenzie Basin is relatively simple, Smith said. A portion of the water should also be diverted into the Athabasca and Smoky Rivers, then turned southeast into the prairies. "The water would be carried 900 miles through British Columbia, on the west side of the Rockies, through the lake behind Bennett Dam and southward past Mica Dam and into the U.S.," Smith said. Cost of the project was estimated at more than \$7 billion for Canada over a period of 30 to 40 years. The U.S. expert said the total cost would be about \$50 billion.

Senate Vote Insures Cut In Farm Fund

WASHINGTON (AP)—An effort to exempt agricultural imports and Medicaid from the \$9 billion federal spending cut ordered by Congress has been defeated in the Senate. Sen. John J. Williams, R-Del., a chief sponsor of the 10 per cent income tax surcharge to which the spending cut order was tied, argued before the vote Monday that "nothing will be left of the \$9 billion tax cut if you adopt this amendment." "The Johnson administration never intended to cut expenditures if it could help it," Williams charged. "It led in the American people when it said it would support this."

Legislative Panel Studies Requests For Liquor Sales

BOISE (AP)—An Idaho Legislative Council committee heard conflicting advice today on whether to allow liquor by-the-drink licenses outside municipalities. The committee took no action but scheduled a closed-door meeting later in the day. At present licenses for sale of liquor-by-the-drink may be issued only within incorporated cities and at lake resorts, golf courses and airport terminals. The council's liquor law study committee earlier proposed removing the ban, and authorizing county governments to issue liquor-by-the-drink licenses. Sen. H. W. Hulbert, R-Lewis-ton, proposed today that the committee reverse itself and retain the out-of-city ban. He said licenses might be issued to establishments just outside the city limits, making it difficult economically for the other places. But Richard Cade, state liquor law enforcement director, said he favored broadening of the law. He said it would make enforcement easier. Rep. Margot Tregoning, D-Wardner, also urged against any change in the committee's recommendation. She said she believed state law should not be used to control economics. The committee scheduled an executive session during the afternoon to consider the proposals. The committee discussed at length the problem of controlling sale of beer to persons under the legal drinking age of 20. Cade said there is a conflict in existing law as a result of a Supreme Court ruling. He said Idaho law, interpreted under terms of the court ruling, permits anyone to be in the public area of a bar, if the bar itself is not accessible to them. Cade said that drinks may be served in the public area in which there may be dancing. Teenagers legally can be in that area, he said, and enforcement of the law prohibiting them from drinking beer is difficult. Cade also urged revision of Idaho law which now makes manufacture of illegal liquor a misdemeanor. Federal law makes it a felony. Cade said present procedure is for state authorities to turn such cases over to the federal government for prosecution. He said having the state law conform with federal statutes would expedite enforcement. Rep. Allan F. Larsen, R-Blackfoot, was named chairman of the committee, replacing Robert Green, R-Boise, who resigned as a state legislator.

Dam Plan Stirs Ire Of Jordan

By The Associated Press.
The proposed use of a nuclear explosion to quarry rock for a dam on Idaho's Boise River may result in "an \$80 million boom doggie," Sen. Len B. Jordan, R-Idaho, said Monday.
The Army Corps of Engineers had said it would use nuclear power to provide material for earth-filled dam on the Boise River. It has announced it will call for bids next month for exploratory drilling at the dam site.
Drilling would determine whether the nuclear explosion, but Jordan said the engineers' announcement "indicates to me a complete lack of consultation with my office by the Corps of Engineers."
The Idaho Water Resources Board is now studying the state's water resources, Jordan said, and "when these studies are completed we will then set priorities for orderly development."
"In the meantime, I do not propose that the Corps of Engineers set the priority for Idaho water resources development," Rep. James A. McClure, R-Idaho, told a Boise civic group that America's policy in Vietnam tells the North Vietnamese that "we do not intend to win."
The 1st Dist. congressman said the policy followed by the United States in Southeast Asia shows that this country hopes it can "keep the North from winning and further hope that they will tire and negotiate."
"The lives of nearly 30,000 Americans lost in Vietnam demand a better solution," McClure said. "The Johnson-Humphrey administration is unable to give it to us, then it is time to change administrations."
Sen. George Hansen, R-Idaho, said his opponent "has voted 13 times for favorable trade concessions with Communist nations."
Hansen opposes Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, in his bid for re-election.
The Republican told a Boise group that some of those votes were cast "at times when these nations were supplying war material being used to kill American soldiers."
Church voted for legislation giving trade concessions to Poland, Hansen said, "while three of that nation's ships were unloading war goods in Haliphong Harbor."

Official Urges School Fund Provision

BOISE (AP) — Passage of a proposed amendment to the Idaho Constitution to allow changes in investment of the Idaho School Endowment Fund was urged Monday by John D. Silva, state finance commissioner.
Silva, speaking for the Public Employees Retirement System Board, said the board endorsed the proposed amendment, which he said would permit broader and more flexible provisions for investment of the \$75 million fund.
Interest from investment of the fund is used in support of Idaho's public school system. However, the state constitution only allows investment in government securities, which draw 3.5 to 4 percent interest.
Economic conditions have changed since the constitutional limit was adopted, Silva said. Other types of investments are now just as safe and far more profitable, he said, but the amendment will have to pass in November's election to allow them.
"The waste of potential revenue is now being offset by taxes," Silva said. "Education would be the prime beneficiary of the broader investment policy permitting higher yield and return on the dollar invested."

Mr. Carlson said that most western states are members in the association. He stated that about two thirds of the area in the western states is public land.

At St. Mary's Hospital in Evansville, Ind., she said, "the husband is included in all phases of the delivery."
"The well-informed husband will be a strong support for his wife."
Sister Mary was keynote speaker at the Conference on Obstetric, Gynecologic and Neonatal Care. The conference ends Wednesday.
She noted she had helped design an eight-week prenatal care course for husbands and wives at more than 30 hospitals.
She criticized laws in some states which prohibit older children from visiting their mothers in hospitals after childbirth.
Dr. Roy G. Holly of the Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia, said iron is the most important nutritional need of pregnant women.
Inadequate diets, Holly said, "may be directly correlated to the percentage of premature births and complications in pregnancy."
He said 50 per cent more iron is required during pregnancy.

Dual Protests Harass School

BOSTON (AP)—Negro and white students continued their protests today against separate clothing regulations at Boston English High School.

Some 300 young persons—boys and girls, black and white—stood outside the school yelling, chanting and singing songs. Most of the Negroes gathered on one side of the street, and the white students on the other.

The Negroes were protesting the withdrawal of permission for them to wear African garb to school. The white students were protesting the requirement that they wear neckties.

Most other students were in the school, and officials, closed and locked doors there after classes began. Police were present outside.

Louis Welch, an assistant superintendent of schools, said some of the 300 demonstrators were not students at the school. "Now, this is a police problem," he said.

On Monday, Welch revoked

concessions that had been granted to Negro students last year against separate clothing regulations at Boston English High School.

Malone, after Negro demonstrators picketed the school, gave Negro students the right to wear African clothes and said they would be permitted to organize an all-black student union.

Demonstrations, necktie burnings by white students and a number of false fire alarms disrupted the city school system Monday.

Across Avenue Louis Pasteur, Headmaster Wilfred O'Leary of Boston Latin School heard Negro demands Monday similar to those made at Boston English. O'Leary turned them down, saying that any student organization in his school must be open to all students.

Boston Latin, founded in 1835, is regarded as the nation's oldest secondary school. Boston English was founded in 1821. Both are public high schools.

"I am the headmaster of all the boys who come from all sections of the city," O'Leary said, "and no one group from one area will dictate the policies of the school."

Back at English, as word of the aboutface spread, some 200 boy and girl demonstrators began circulating outside the school, shouting to students to "come on out, come on out."

Some did, jumping out windows. Others crossed to the Latin school seeking refuge for their protest. Some demonstrators passed out circulars urging a school strike.

Fire Rips Refinery In Texas

PORT ARTHUR, Tex. (AP)—Fire raged for hours after several explosions in the Atlantic Richfield Co. refinery today, injuring three men seriously and forcing evacuation of two small housing developments.

Although flames still leaped fiercely, a plant spokesman reported the blaze appeared to be contained by 6 a.m. in a small chemical unit and a surrounding field of gasoline tanks.

Heat was so intense that four houses caught fire across the street from the refinery and three cars were destroyed, firemen said. Fires in the dwellings were quenched.

A police-fire department dispatcher in the neighboring town of Groves, J. E. Veik, said concern over a possibility of chlorine gas escaping was one reason for evacuating the Fairlea and Winwood additions beside the mile square plant site. Veik said he was told the gas was stored on the ground near the flames.

The first blast occurred shortly after 1:30 a.m. while about 50 men were working in the refinery, police said. It shook the neighborhood awake and hurled debris 200 yards to the nearest highway.

Newsmen estimated 1,000 persons were forced to leave homes in the two additions, which are on adjacent sides of Port Arthur and Groves. The refinery itself extends from the east edge of Port Arthur into Groves.

The three injured were John C. McKague, 29, Nederland; Seagal Stewart Jr., 40, Port Neches and W. S. Bond, 55, Port Arthur.

Atlantic Richfield spokesmen said all employees were accounted for and there apparently were no other injuries of consequence.

Witnesses said the original and heaviest blast occurred as a tank of premium gasoline exploded. Thereafter the fire spread to a series of smaller tanks.

There was no immediate word on the cause of the initial explosion or the amount of loss.

Indian Tribes Open Conference

OMAHA, Neb. (AP)—Representatives of the nation's remaining Indian tribes gathered here Monday for the 25th annual convention of the National Congress of American Indians.

There was a last-minute switch in the presiding officer. Mrs. John Robinson, Bartlesville, Okla., will preside for the association president, Wendell Chino of the Mesquero Apache Tribe in New Mexico, who was unable to attend because of ill health.

Mrs. Robinson is first vice president. An association spokesman said it was most unusual for a woman to preside at an Indian congress.

FBI Seminar On Crime Set In Twin Falls On Wednesday

Bank robbery and other crimes will be discussed at a special law enforcement conference sponsored by the FBI Wednesday at the Twin Falls City Hall.

John W. Burns, special agent in charge of the regional office of the FBI, said similar conferences are being held throughout the United States.

He said the conference will be attended by area law enforcement officials, prosecutors, and representatives of banks, savings and loan associations and credit unions.

The agenda will include discussions on what law enforcement officials can do to prevent bank robberies, burglaries and larcenies.

Church Accepts Debate With Foe

BOISE — Sen. Frank Church said he had accepted the latest invitation from the University of Idaho to appear with his opponent on statewide radio and television.

Church said he had accepted an invitation to appear at the University of Idaho Oct. 24 and agreed to ground rules proposed by the university and the Moscow Chamber of Commerce and "Campaign Countdown" committee.

"There has been some discussion of Oct. 15 as an appropriate date, but since this studio is being used for educational television programs the university set the later date," Church said.

The senator said the 24th is the date originally set for the appearance. He first agreed to the date in August and wired his confirmation Monday.

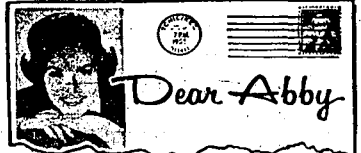

GUESS BASED ON OVERCALL

It is so uncomplicated to get to four hearts with the North-South cards that we imagine almost every pair in the nationwide charity game got there. Some North players will respond one spade but the majority will make a forcing raise in hearts. The ordinary players
