SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — A flight to less than 10 miles above the moon's surface will be undertaken next year by a crew of space veterans, officials disclosed Wednesday.

This Apollo 10 flight will include operations in lunar orbit of the U.S. moon-lander and a descent to within 50,000 feet of the moon's surface. Officials have said privately the flight plans possibly could be changed later to a lunar landing.

Crewmen will be Air Force Col. Thomas P. Stafford, the commander; Navy Cmdr. Eugene A. Cernan, lunar module pilot; and Navy Cmdr. John W. Young, the command module pilot.

Stafford and Cernan will transfer to the lunar module and separate it from the command module, leaving Young to pilot the command module in lunar orbit. Stafford and Cernan will fly the lunar module to within 50,000 feet of the lunar surface.

Then they'll rendezvous with the command module, rejoin Young on-board, separate from the lunar module and return to earth.

Apollo 8, scheduled to fly next month, will orbit the moon 10 times at an altitude of 69 miles. It will not have the lunar module on board. Apollo 9 crew members are Frank Borman, James Lovell and William Anders.

The command module and lunar module combination will fly manned for the first time on Apollo 9, scheduled for launch early next year. The Apollo 9 crew will be Eugene A. Slayton, Fred S. Schweickart and David Scott. They will then space walk from one spacecraft to the other.

Apollo 8 will be the last Apollo mission to use the command module returns to earth.

SAIGON ORDER Halts Presses At Newspaper

SAIGON (AP) — The South Vietnamese government closed one of Saigon's three English-language newspapers today, charging it failed to give the government equal billing with the United States in their dispute over the Paris peace talks.

A spokesman for the information ministry said the Saigon Daily News had splashed a story on U.S. Defense Secretary Clark Clifford's news conference Tuesday across the top page one but played down the Saigon government's response.

"They printed the truth under their headlines," a spokesman said.

The Daily News is the first English-language paper hit by the government's latest crack-down on the Saigon press. In the last three weeks 10 Vietnamese language papers have been suspended or closed permanently on charges of criticizing the nation or "failing to support the national cause against Communism."

The Daily News on Thursday carried an account of Clifford's news conference two columns wide at the top of page one with the three-column headline "Clark Clifford Hits Saigon."

Next to this story, in the third column under the headline, was a story titled "Information Minister Tries To Tell U.S. News Conference Replying to Clifford's Charges." It was headed "Thien: Clifford Distorts."

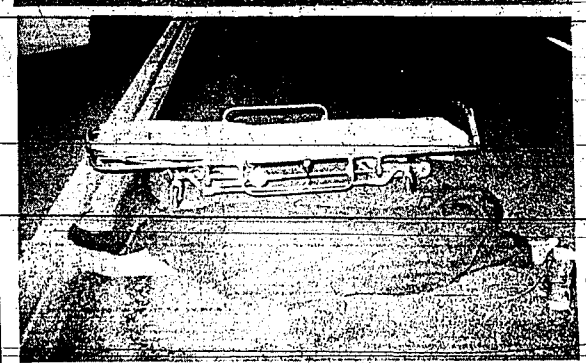
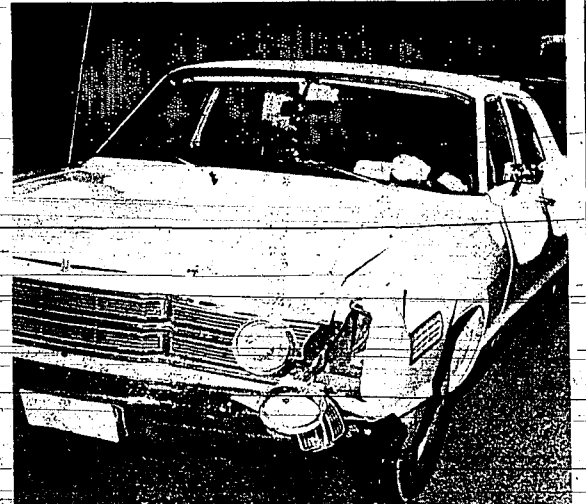

Flares Light Scene As Allies Struggle With 1,000 Enemy

SAIGON (AP) — While U.S. planes and helicopters rained down flares, bullets and bombs, the North Vietnamese army fought off about 1,000 North Vietnamese troops near the Cambodian border through the same general area near the border. Two Americans were reported killed and five wounded on the small ranger camp 60 miles north of Saigon produced the Vietnam war's heaviest fighting in weeks, with 120 of the enemy dead found inside the camp's barbed wire.

The other bodies were strewn over the cratered approaches which had been blasted by the Americans' 155mm guns inside the camp and the U.S. planes and helicopters circling overhead.

Four South Vietnamese were reported dead and 23 wounded. No American casualties were reported.

The North Vietnamese were reported to have an estimated 15,000 to 20,000 North Vietnamese troops believed massed along the border. Dot was held by a battalion of South Vietnamese soldiers and U.S. howitzer batteries.

The North Vietnamese made their first charge about midnight under cover of a heavy mortar barrage to pin down the defenders. Within about an hour, two thrusts had breached the camp's barbed wire defense perimeter.

The attackers made four assaults through the night, holding on for seven hours before the U.S. and South Vietnamese forces captured the area.

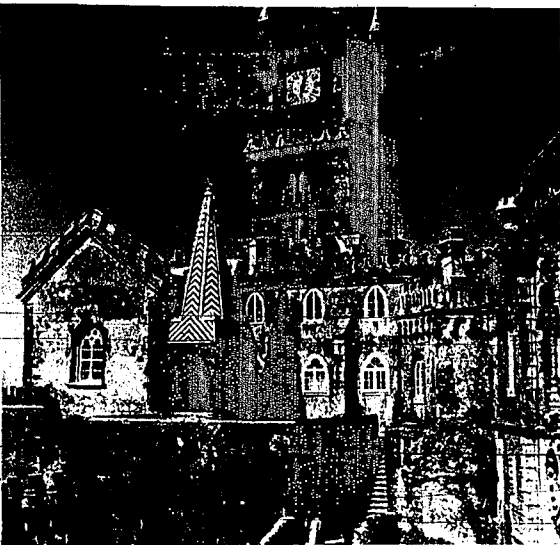

WASHINGTON (AP) — Pat Nixon says a tour of the White House with Lady Bird Johnson revealed that the executive mansion is "a house that shows someone cares." "I have been here several times, but I have never seen the house as I have today," said Mrs. Nixon Monday after seeing the house with Mrs. Johnson as guide. Mrs. Nixon, who will become the first lady in January, said the visit gave her a chance to see renovations completed during the Kennedy administration. The girls came here as tourists, stood in line and went through the house on various occasions," said Mrs. Nixon. "The two wives paid a good deal of attention to the closets, according to Mrs. Johnson's press secretary, Elizabeth Carpenter. "The tour brought out the first word that the White House closets were undergoing complete refurbishing by the New York firm of Hammacher Schlemmer as a gift to the nation.

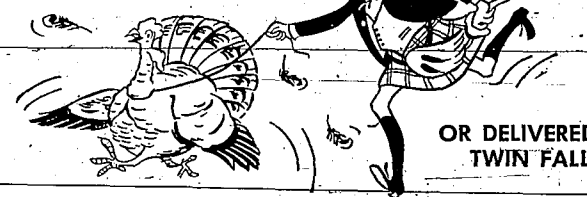
"This is a great house, beautifully run by a staff that will do everything possible to make you comfortable and happy," Mrs. Johnson told her guest. The two viewed the 14 rooms

and six baths on the second floor and nine guest rooms and seven baths on the third floor. Mrs. Nixon said afterwards she hadn't seen so much of the White House, even during the Eisenhower administration, when her husband was vice president. When the Nixons move in they won't have to bring much furniture of their own, Mrs. Carpenter pointed out that the only furniture belonging to the Johnsons are bedroom suites used by their daughters, Luci and Lynda. The rest of the furniture, including the President's four-poster bed, are permanent fixtures of the White House.

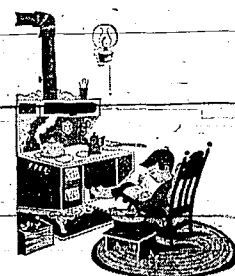

Cong Move Supplies South By Bicycle

NEW YORK (AP) — A National Broadcasting Co. news program says a bicycle convoy is moving supplies through Cambodia to a Viet Cong encampment in South Vietnam.

The film shown Wednesday night on NBC's Huntley-Brinkley Report, shows the convoy carrying supplies from a Cambodian border town identified as Ba Vet to the Viet Cong stronghold, said to be less than 50 miles from Saigon.

NBC News correspondent Dean Brelis, one of the members of the team, said in narrating the film:

"As the bikes pass through the official customs barriers, they were ignored. It was as though the traffic was normal. But it was not normal. It is how the Viet Cong and the North Vietnamese keep supplied in order to fight."

"The flow of the supplies was uninterrupted and unimpeded by the barriers."

Newsmen Chief Huntley said the four-man camera team discovered the convoy last week in the town of Ba Vet, which he described as one of the biggest Communist installations along the Cambodian border.

The news team said it watched the bicyclists for a full day as they delivered supplies from the Ba Vet marketplace to the Viet Cong camp.

The newsmen said that most of the riders appeared to be Cambodian, but that others were believed to be Viet Cong. The Viet Cong supervised the movements of the unloaded bicycles to the marketplaces, NBC said.

Brelis said that some of the riders wore GI clothing and that others wore the black pajamas of the Viet Cong.

He said his team followed the convoy about 100 yards into Viet

Cong territory under the full view of uniformed Viet Cong guards. The team stopped when it reached a barbed-wire barrier around the Viet Cong camp.

"Apparently we had surprised them and only got as far as we did because they didn't know we were there," Brelis said.

He said the newsmen did not dare to take any pictures inside the Viet Cong-controlled area.

NBC said the bicycles carried medicines, rice, vegetables, cooking oil and kerosene. They were uniformed men on the road, Brelis said. "They allowed the bike convoys to pass through unchallenged, but any other traffic was stopped."

"It was clearly a Viet Cong stronghold," he said.

The NBC newsmen said that at least 200 bicycles, a number of motorcycles, four American cars and two French cars were parked along the road.

They said a battle was being fought nearby and that, United States helicopters could be heard making combat assaults. But no one seemed to be afraid, they said.

The other members of the news team were Grant Wollkill, a cameraman who spent a year as a prisoner in Laos; Ron Steinman, the network's foreign news director; and Yoshiko Waku, a soundman.

Peace Talks Hang In Balance

DMZ Attacks Bring Warning

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States has warned North Vietnam that continued violations of the demilitarized zone separating North and South Vietnam could wreck the Paris peace talks.

The warning given to North Vietnamese representatives in Paris by U.S. representatives was disclosed by the State Department in a cautiously worded statement Wednesday.

Officials said that beginning last Saturday there had been at least three instances in which American or South Vietnamese forces near the demilitarized zone had been hit by artillery shelling from enemy forces inside the DMZ.

The statement said the United States takes a serious view of such incidents and "our representatives in Paris have brought this situation forcefully to the attention of the North Vietnamese."

"As the President and Secretary of Defense have made clear," the State Department added, "our position is that serious talks could not be conducted if the DMZ were abused."

The statement issued by State Department press officer Carl E. Barth was mainly designed to provide some fresh assurances to Saigon that the United States does not intend to grant special status for the Viet Cong's political arm, the National Liberation Front, and does not consider the NLF to be an independent entity in South Vietnam.

In addition, the statement rejected implied claims of North Vietnam in recent statements that U.S. reconnaissance flights over North Vietnam violates the understandings which led to President Johnson's decision Oct. 31 to halt bombing and other attacks on the North.

"The activities that we understand to be the use of force," the statement said, "are not agreed to by the use of force. This precise phrase was used repeatedly with the North Vietnamese in contrast to the words they suggested simply because reconnaissance is not an act involving

the use of force. The North Vietnamese accepted this phrase."

South Vietnam has so far refused to send a delegation to participate in the Paris peace talks, President Nguyen Van Thieu has instead sought arrangements which would clearly treat such a delegation as representatives of a sovereign government and treat the NLF delegation as part of the negotiating team of North Vietnam.

One other aspect of the bomb halt understanding was touched on in the statement. There have been reports of what the statement called "indiscriminate attacks on major cities" of South Vietnam. The statement said that "we are following the situation very closely indeed."

One of the conditions laid down by President Johnson for stopping the bombing was Hanoi's understanding that indiscriminate attacks on the cities would have to cease.

Joan Baez Rakes Campus Protests

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Folk singer Joan Baez sparked a new, short-lived campus protest and a new opinion of campus demonstrations. They are "downright silly" and "irrelevant," she said.

Miss Baez, 27, who took part from time to time in the University of California at Berkeley student rebellion in 1967 although not a student there, told a news conference that there "might be a time or a reason for campus demonstrations, but I haven't seen it yet."

"If you're going to do anything really revolutionary, you're going to have to leave the campus," she said.

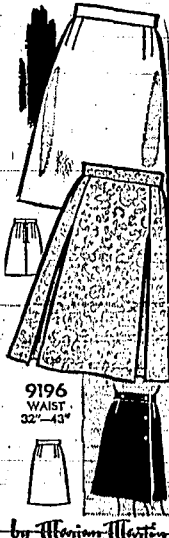

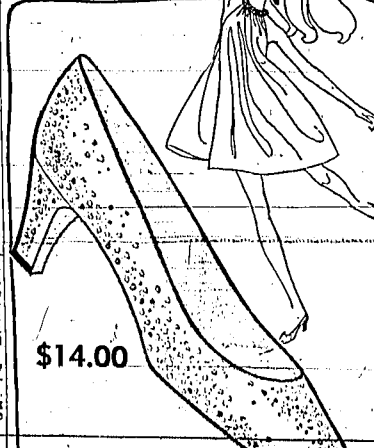

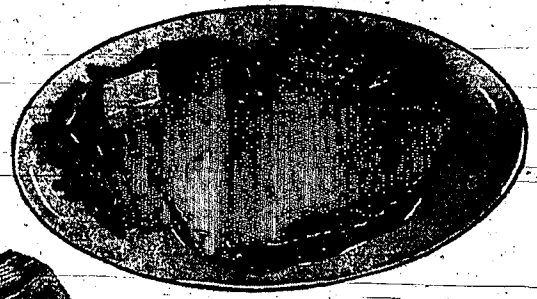

Some observers said the Dow Industrials had climbed 21 points since election day and the price-earnings ratio was 15. Xerox held a 7-point gain, clipping its initial rise of 10% on news that merger talks with IBM were terminated.

C.I.T. Financial remained untraded late in the day due to an unexpected change in ownership.

Hart Schaffner & Marx went down 4 in reaction to an anti-trust suit aimed at divesting the company of 48 of its retail stores.

Pan American World Airways climbed nearly a point after a published prediction of a sharp decline in passenger traffic. Steals were fairly steady following their string of losses. Rubbers gained fractions despite the drop in auto stocks.

Prices continued to rise in hopes of a more favorable financial atmosphere, including low interest rates, under the Nixon administration.

In points, Gibson had 242, 235 edge out Rose with Willie McCovey, San Francisco's slugger first baseman, at 135, and Curt Flood, the Cardinals' fleet center fielder, at 116.
