## Air West's Good Folks

The people who work for Air West, the regional airline, are great people. Most of them give their job just a little more than they are expected to do.

Most of them, like those who are employed by Air West and who are stationed in Twin Falls, do their part toward bettering the community.

The pilots who fly the planes used by Air West, the mechanics who keep them going, the girls who are stewardesses — in fact all the employees — are trained and experts in their field.

So with everybody up-and-down the line apparently doing a good job, why is the operation losing money?

The only possible answer is that something has been wrong with the top management.

## Pueblo's Mission

It would be wonderful to think that the release of the 52 surviving members of the crew of the USS Pueblo in time for Christmas was a gesture of good will toward men on the part of the North Koreans, a sign that the spirit of the season, which is not an exclusive Christian possession, had permeated even behind the Bamboo Curtain.

Unfortunately, the tales the men have recounted of 11 months of brutal treatment, verified by their debilitated physical condition, preclude any such assumption.

Perhaps it is enough just to be thankful that all of the men but one, who was killed at the time the ship was seized, are alive and in fair health. Their bodies will quickly re-

cover from the ordeal under the loving care of their grateful families, though the invisible mental scars they bear may be another matter.

The United States paid a price for their release by signing an apology for the intrusion of the Pueblo into North Korean waters. It has no more validity than the confessions tortured out of accused witches in the Middle ages, which is about as far as the Asian Communists have progressed on the scale of civilization.

The experience of these men at the hands of the North Koreans is sufficient demonstration of why they had to be where they were when they were captured.

WASHINGTON — House Republicans lead the pack in calling for a House committee to investigate the seating of Adlai E. Clayton Powell as chairman of the party's formal caucuses.

In preparation for waging a determined fight to bar the homophile Hartemite, a group of veteran legislators have drafted a resolution to postpone the opening session of the new House — when the entire membership takes the oath of office in a mass ceremony.

sary to force a seat claimant to "step aside." Such a demand would be tantamount to a vote of no confidence against Powell.

Under the opposition resolution, the committee that excluded from membership in the 91st House of Representatives — and his seat declared vacant. The Speaker of the House would be directed to nominate his replacement to the state of New York of the existing vacancy.

Republican leaders are scarcely more enthusiastic about having a homophile Powell in the 91st Congress. They have been private, but in the 90th, the party's 12 caucuses

Powell but is now strongly against him.

The signs are clearcut and foreboding that more large-scale spending for foreign aid is headed for just as rough a time in the new Congress as in the last.

The recent Congress slashed the foreign aid budget to a record low of \$1.75 billion. President Johnson asked for \$2.5 billion, the amount Congress declared 1967-68. It is a cut of around \$1 billion from what he

wanted. Congress is increasingly disillusioned with large-scale foreign aid spending and wound up lopping off another \$1.15 billion — an all-time low in the 20-year history of the foreign aid program.

Now, with the new Congress not yet underway and the Nixon administration still to take office and the new president to present his views on this issue, the opposition to foreign aid is already taking the offensive.

Representative H. R. Gross, R-Iowa, influential member of the Foreign Affairs Committee and leader in the fight to cut the foreign aid budget to the bone this year, is serving notice there will be no let-up in this effort in the new Congress.

Gross' uncompromising stand is based on the principle that the new president should pay little attention to the demands for additional billions to be cast to the U.S. Treasury by foreign aid.

Significantly, Gross, a strong Nixon supporter, bluntly advises the new president to "pay little attention to the demands for additional billions to be cast to the U.S. Treasury by foreign aid."

(1) That he "uniquely participated in the campaign payroll," which included \$100,000 (McNamara, C. Powell) from August 14, 1964, to December 31, 1966, during which period either she performed or such duties were performed in Washington, D. C., or New York, or both.

These charges are similar to those that led to his being kicked out of the House early in 1967 by an overwhelming 307 to 116 vote.

Robert McNamara, now head of the World Bank, urging President-elect Nixon to provide more funds for international development.

Better still, why shouldn't these foreign governments take over the financing of the 'poorer' countries for a few years and give the poor old American taxpayer a chance to put his financial house in order?"

# County Officials Work On Budget

The Twin Falls County commissioners, working steadily for more than a month now, are putting together a 1969 county budget.

By the middle of January the tentative budget will be finished and released to the public. Between now and then, county commissioners are hopeful that all interested persons will visit with the commissioners and express their views which will be contained in the new budget. The commission meets every Monday and Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The 1968 budget was in the amount of \$3,565,285 and for the year before the budget was \$3,237,120. But the 1968 budget cost of more than \$35,000 to handle general election expenses.

The budget has to be approved by the commission every February.

Hearings on the budget will be held by commissioners, who will report and adjustments must be made in the tentative budget arrived at by the middle of this month.

The budget annually includes requests from the school districts, the cities in the county, the highway districts and county departments, the county board, sinking fund and the various county levies.

County levies are for current expenses, charity and judgment expenses, the agricultural fair,

## Utah Group Backs Session On Budgeting

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The Utah Foundation, a private governmental research organization, says legislative budget sessions may deal with legislation other than fiscal matters.

Under a constitutional amendment approved by voters in November, the Utah Legislature will hold budget sessions every two years with the general session beginning in 1970.

The foundation said Wednesday organizations in five states similar to the Utah Foundation "reported that their legislatures hadn't effectively limited budget sessions to consideration of only budgetary matters, and that virtually every type of legislation had, on occasion, been considered."

On other subjects, the foundation said:

— Utah's population, at mid-year was 1,034,000, an increase of about 12,000 from the 1967 figure, and Utah's 1968 growth appears to have been slightly (from 1.2 percent) greater than the national average.

The cost of living increased about .36 per cent from 1967.

— Per capita personal income in Utah was \$2,604 up \$109 from 1967, but Utah fell from 35th to 36th in the nation.

— Population growth at elementary and secondary schools has tended to flatten out, but at schools of higher education has turned sharply upward.

— Highway maintenance costs were \$3.3 million, up 16 per cent from 1967.

the county health unit, the hospital operation, weed eradication, parks and recreation and for the airport.

The cost to the taxpayer varies with the location of the taxpayer within the county.

A taxpayer in Burley, for instance, may be required to pay more taxes than a taxpayer in Twin Falls because the city and highway district taxes are higher there.

The commissioners also have to consider the junior college, the College of Southern Idaho. These levies are set by the state, but the county is still liable for paying its share of the amount collected into the junior college district which CSI represents.

It is anticipated that taxes will not increase this year, and county commissioners are making an effort to keep tax rates in line with those in the county.

It was reported that county employees will be getting raises this year and county commissioners were busy Monday releasing the salaries paid each county employee.

County Clerk Harold Lansen said recently he didn't anticipate a single raise in taxes in 1969.

However, a recent Tax Commission ruling from Boise indicated that property will be assessed above the 1968 ratio of 14 per cent.

This is in light of Legislative and court action that requires Idaho property to be assessed at 20 per cent of its value by 1972.

Property could be assessed at 16 per cent for 1969. With this requirement, more tax money would brought in even though the county is not asking for additional money.

County officials have expressed a desire to keep the taxes in line or below those of recent years, and to do this they may require cutbacks in levy requests from some taxing units, such as cities, highway districts and school districts.

Commissioner Lansen is presently working on this and the results should be known within two weeks, it was learned.

**Draft Changes In Foreign Aid**

NEW YORK (AP) — Republican lawmakers are drawing up a drastically revised foreign aid program, shaped along lines suggested by President-elect Nixon and his advisors, the New York Times reported today.

In a story from its Washington bureau, the Times said that the program, subject to revisions by a special committee to be named by Nixon after his inauguration, would include these main features:

— More emphasis on technical assistance programs, especially in such fields as agriculture, health and education, to give developing nations the benefit of modern technology.

— De-emphasis on large capital outlays and more utilization of arrangements between the United States and other donor countries in which the latter would be expected to supply more funds than in the past.

— A greater role for U.S.-private enterprise, capital through expansion of the present investment bank, and for U.S. citizens and foreign investors in developing countries against loss from revolution, expropriation and other causes.

— A greater concentration of U.S. aid among fewer developing countries, and the linking of all aid programs more closely to U.S. foreign policy interests.

Bookmobile service has been inaugurated to Twin Falls public library by the Twin Falls Public Library, according to Robert Bruce, librarian.


"This is a service which the senior citizens and civic-minded residents have been asking for," he said. Mr. Bruce said that this is part of the movement to "take the library outside of the walls."

**BRIDGE ERRORS NOT PERMANENT**

Everyone makes mistakes in bidding and play. One test of a good player is his ability to recover from them.

East's ace of diamonds took the first trick. South faltered with the eight. He had paid

If West had started with five diamonds, East would not have another card to lead. Instead, West led the queen of spades. By this time South had worked out a line of play to make up for his carelessness at trick two. He let the queen, jack and South let that card hold. West continued with the jack and South let that card hold also. At this point, clubs became the control and have defeated the contract—but West played a third spade and South was able to make the hand with a Vienna coup.

He cashed three spades and the king of diamonds and discarded four hearts from dummy. East had to make three discards. The first was a club, the second a heart. It was impossible. He could not afford to throw another club and so let a heart go.

Now South led a heart to dummy's ace, dropping East's king. He returned to his hand with the ace of clubs in order to cash his 10 of hearts. Dummy's king and queen of clubs were then good for the last two tricks.




